SUPPLEMENT TO THE "A" VOLUME OF THE
DISTRICT GAZETTEER, GODAVARI.

Chapter I, "Physical Description," page 1, paragraph 2.—
Add the following note:—

"The territorial limits of the district have been recently revised by the transfer to it of the Nugur taluk from the Central Provinces. A readjustment of the areas of the old taluks of Amalapuram and Nagaram has also been made, resulting in the formation of the Razole taluk in place of the Nagaram taluk. As at present constituted, the district consists of eight taluks and five Deputy Tahsildars' divisions."

Chapter IV, "Agriculture and Irrigation," page 91, end.—
Add the following as a fresh paragraph:—

"A Deputy Director of Agriculture is located at Rajahmundry to give advice to the ryots in agricultural matters free of charge. There are Veterinary Hospitals in charge of Veterinary assistants at Rajahmundry, Cocanada and Pittapuram and a fourth will shortly be started at Amalapuram. There are also three touring Veterinary assistants in the district who visit the several taluks and villages. A Government breeding bull is supplied to the Rajahmundry taluk."

*Chapter V, "Forests," page 96.—*After line 6 insert the following as a fresh paragraph:—

"The scheme for the reservation of Rampa forests has been finally sanctioned in G.O. No. 140, Revenue, Forests, No. 7, dated 15th January 1914. An area of about 300 square miles of "inaccessible" forest which is at present subject neither to exploitation nor to "podu" will be surveyed and demarcated and all felling and "podu" in that area will be prohibited. In the remaining area of "accessible" forest in which podu is not to be interfered with, fellings will be restricted and brought under control by localising them every year, by raising the seigniorage rates on timber by 50 per cent. by employing a special land revenue establishment to mark the trees selected for felling, and by paying the Muttadars concerned two annas for each tree felled as a reward for preventing the felling of unmarked trees."

*Chapter VI, "Occupations and Trade," page 103, first paragraph.—*Add the following note to this paragraph:—

"There are two cotton presses in Rajahmundry where cotton is ginned and the lint is exported to England."

Page 105.—*Add* the following paragraphs at the end of the page under the head “Metal work.”

“Consequent on the location of a D.P.W. Workshop at Dowlaishwaram, many of the local people are receiving training in improved methods of iron work; and as a result, iron safes are being made in Dowlaishwaram and Rajahmundry.

“The manufacture of aluminium vessels has become one of the flourishing industries of the district. Aluminium sheets are imported from England and vessels are made out of these. Rajahmundry is the place where this industry is carried on on a fairly large scale and the vessels prepared there are, besides being sold throughout the district, exported to the neighbouring districts and also to the Nizam’s dominions. The people finding these vessels much cheaper than those of other kinds of metal, are using them to a great extent. Small waste pieces of this metal are melted and converted into bars and ornaments for the legs are made out of them. As these ornaments look more or less like silver ones, they are largely worn by women of the poorer classes.”

Page 112.—*Insert* the following note at the end of paragraph 1:—

“The workers have since increased, their number being about 700 now. The weekly output of lace is valued at between two and three thousand rupees.”

Page 114.—*Substitute* the following for lines 1 to 17 on this page:—

“being 3,966 yards on the north and 4,400 yards on the south side. Of this extent 2,700 yards of revetment and 87 yards of groin on the north and 2,500 and 260 yards of revetment and groin respectively on the south, had been erected as early as 1855, and the groins were extended considerably in 1887 and very largely in 1893. The north groin was further extended by 600 yards since 1905. To remove the difficulty experienced from the mud creek mentioned above, the main channel was diverted into the former, thereby forming an entirely new channel which was designated the ‘Hammick channel.’ This was opened by Sir Murray Hammick, the then Governor of Madras, in August 1912. A portion of the south groin was demolished, and the stone thereof utilised for the bund, put across the old channel connecting the old north and south groins. The latest extension of the old north groin thus became the south groin and a new north groin 500 yards long, was erected from the eastern extremity of the Hammick channel. Further extension of both the groins into seven feet of water is now under consideration. But in view of the heavy outlay involved in the scheme and of the present

“ financial condition of the Cocanada Landing and Shipping
 “ Fund, it is more than doubtful whether the scheme can be
 “ carried into effect in the near future. Since the new channel
 “ was brought into existence, communication between the shore
 “ and the shifting in the anchorage has been far more satisfac-
 “ tory than it had been for some years past, loaded boats
 “ proceeding out of the new channel at all times of tides, except
 “ in the months of March and April when the tides are very
 “ low.”

*Chapter VII, “ Means of communication,” pages 127 and 128—
 Water carriage—the rivers— last paragraph of page 127.—For the
 fourth sentence substitute the following :—*

“ One of the two steam ferry boats working in the
 “ Gōdāvāri at Rajahmundry having gone out of order, the right
 “ of plying the two steamers was leased out by the District
 “ Board in 1909 to contractors for a period of 15 years on
 “ condition of having the necessary repairs executed at their
 “ own cost. The lessees accordingly got the necessary repairs
 “ done at considerable expense and both the steamers are
 “ now in good working condition. The crew are paid by the
 “ lessees.”

And *substitute* the words “ these steamers ” for the word
 “ they ” occurring in the third line at page 128 of the “ A ”
 Volume.

*Chapter IX, “ Public Health.”—Add the following note to
 supplement information in regard to the medical institutions in
 the district :—*

“ The Lady Havelock Hospital for women and children at Cocanada has
 “ now a maternity ward called ‘ Sri Raja Rava Mangayamma Rao Bahadur
 “ Memorial Lying in wards ’ attached to it. It is well-equipped and accommo-
 “ dates six patients. The Raja of Pittapuram has generously defrayed the cost
 “ of its construction.”

*Chapter XI, “ Land Revenue Administration,” page 180, line
 13.—Add the following paragraph :—*

“ In 1908, the village establishments in Government
 “ villages were again revised. Madras Act II of 1894 has been
 “ extended to all the proprietary and whole inam villages in the
 “ district.”

*Chapter XIII, “ Administration of Justice,” page 191.—
 Insert the following note to supplement the information relating
 to Registration in the “ A ” Volume :—*

“ The District Registrar’s jurisdiction has, since 1st January 1913, been
 “ extended to the Revenue district of Vizagapatam. He is assisted by a Joint
 “ Registrar attached to his office. He is stationed at Cocanada. The Sub-
 “ Registrars’ offices at Cocanada and Coringa have been abolished and a new
 “ Sub-Registrar’s office opened at Samalkota. The District Registrar and all
 “ the Sub-Registrars are also Registrars of births and deaths under Act VI of

" 1886. The District Registrar and the Sub-Registrars at Amalapuram, Rajah-
 " mundry and Ramachandrapuram are *notaries public*. The Sub-Registrars of
 " Draksharamam and Samalkota are Special Magistrates.

" The Registration Act was extended to the Nugur taluk in 1909 and the
 " Taluk Head Olerk is the *ex-officio* Sub-Registrar."

" *Crime*.—" Polavaram taluk is no longer the chief place
 " for dacoities.

" *Yanadis or Nakkalas*.—The registration as criminal
 " gangs of these people was discontinued in 1910. There are
 " at present 236 male Nakkalas known to the police and they are
 " scattered over the Rajahmundry, Peddapuram, Ramachandra-
 " puram, Cocanada and Pittapuram taluks and are formed into
 " 19 gangs. Four of these gangs residing at Ramachandra-
 " puram, Peddapuram, Alamur and Mamidikuduru, who were
 " found to have been habitually addicted to crime have been

" *Other Criminal classes*.—Of the criminal classes mentioned

 " tered as C.I.D gangs in 1910. There were 130 registered
 " members with 119 females and 171 children. These two
 " gangs were registered as criminal tribes under the Act and
 " sent to the settlement at Kalichedu (Nellore district) and
 " Seethanagaram (Guntur district)."

Police—*The existing force*.—*Substitute* the following for the
 existing paragraph :—

" The existing police force is in charge of a District Super-
 " intendent of Police stationed at Rajahmundry, aided by two
 " Assistant Superintendents one at Cocanada and the other at
 " Bhadrachalam. The head-quarters of the District Superintend-
 " ent of Police will be removed to Cocanada as soon as the
 " required buildings are constructed there. The three taluks,
 " viz., Nugur, Albaka and Cherla of the Central Provinces were
 " transferred to this district in 1909 and were formed into a
 " Circle in charge of an Inspector.

" The reorganisation of the police force recommended by the
 " Police Commission of 1905 has been introduced in the district.
 " According to this scheme, the old divisions were formed into
 " circles. All the police stations are in charge of English-
 " knowing Sub-Inspectors. The force has also been consider-
 " ably increased. There are at present 35 police stations and
 " 8 out-posts. A separate patrol police consisting of one Sub-
 " Inspector (European), one head constable and two constables

“was sanctioned in 1911 to prevent the pilfering of cargo between ship and shore at the port of Cocanada.

“Two armed reserves are maintained, one at Rajahmundry and the other at Rampa-chodavaram. The strength of the former is one Inspector, three sergeants, 11 head constables and 129 constables. A portion of this will be retained at Rajahmundry with a sergeant in charge when the head-quarters is removed to Cocanada. The strength of the Rampa reserve is 5 head constables and 54 constables. This reserve is in charge of a circle Inspector and performs the ordinary duties of the station.

“An emergency force of 5 head constables and 60 constables is kept at Rajahmundry and another force of 2 head constables and 24 constables at Rampa-Chodavaram.”

Chapter XIV, Local Self-Government, page 198, last paragraph.—Insert the following with reference to this paragraph:—

“It is under contemplation to introduce a proper supply by the construction of water-works and investigation to this end is now going on. It is also under contemplation to improve the drainage system.”

Page 199, last paragraph.—Add the following:—

“The bund has since been constructed.”

Chapter XV.—“Gazetteer” “Nugur taluk.”

This taluk is a long narrow strip of land lying on the left bank of the Gōdāvāri river from the end of the Bhadrachalam taluk for a distance of about 66 miles; it nowhere exceeds 16 miles in width. On one side the deep water channel of the Gōdāvāri forms its boundary with H.H. the Nizam’s territory, on the east and north it marches with Bastar state and its south, and abuts for a distance of 6 miles on Bhadrachalam taluk. It comprises a narrow belt of alluvial land along the river and range of hills ending in a scarp near the Taliperu and marking with its highest points the boundary with Bastar. This range is in fact a plateau with precipitous slopes on the western side, down which in the wet weather fall several beautiful cascades; on the eastern side the land falls away gradually to the Bastar territory.

The only river of importance besides the Gōdāvāri is the Taliperu, a broad stream running down, from Bastar and intersecting the taluk, but there are many ‘vagus’—hill streams—which, having a short precipitous course to run from the hills to the river, have cut out through the alluvial land deep channels which form a serious impediment to travelling by road.

The cultivation is almost entirely confined to the fertile land along the river margin. There are however a few isolated patches in enclosures in the forests which occupy the greater part of the taluk. Even on the river bank the cultivation is not continuous but is interrupted by forest extending to the water edge. The cultivation is in the main identical with that of Bhadrachalam taluk, the only notable difference being that the 'Podu' cultivation countenanced in Bhadrachalam is strictly prohibited in Nugur. Cholan is the staple crop but there is also a fair amount of paddy, while the cultivation of tobacco in the rich lankas is rapidly extending mainly through the efforts of the ryots from the lower district.

There are no indigenous industries. Older accounts of the taluk make mention of silk culture but there is now no trace of this, although it is still carried on to some extent on H.H. the Nizam's side of the river.

A considerable amount of fish is taken from the Gōdāvāri and its affluents, chiefly the Taliperu, but the manner of their capture cannot be commended. The main kinds taken—laboo, mahseer, carnatic and other carp are caught by driving them into a bay with a large net, and then either catching them with a circular cast net or hitting them on the head with sticks. At other places traps of sticks and bamboos are erected while a common trick is, where a suitable place can be found, to enclose the river with small bunds and then poison all the fish with a certain bark. Such methods are extremely destructive particularly as fish of all sizes are taken but the small fry are never of course put back.

The revenue administration is similar in almost all respects to that of Bhadrachalam, although the taluk is still governed by the rules and regulations developed in the Central Provinces, involving the use of terms largely foreign to Nugur. The Koyas of the hills are however more restricted than their brethren of Bhadrachalam. Their "podu" cultivation has long been prohibited and they are not, as their relatives of Bhadrachalam are, allowed to distil as much arrack as they can drink. They must obtain it at the recognised arrack shops. The taluk is divided into two Revenue Inspectors' firkas; there are five patwaris' ranges and a patel and kotwal to each village.

There is at present one superior proprietor of Yelama family over the whole taluk. He resides at Naspur in H.H. the Nizam's territory near Sironcha, and never sets foot in Nugur, for there is a family tradition that he will die, if he crosses a stream a few miles to the north of Venkatapuram. His father and grandfather are both reputed to have perished there.

At about the end of the seventeenth century, the ancestors of the present zamindar obtained possession of the estates which through various vicissitudes have been retained by the family. The major portion of the property is on the Hyderabad side but in the territory handed over to the British, they held the

Surdehmooks of Sironcha, Nugur, Albaka and Cherla and are now recognised as the superior proprietors of these lands. The estates are in the hands of a Naib under whom in Nugur taluk are three Kamdars, petty ill-paid officials of considerable affluence.

At the time of the settlement by Captain Glasfurd, the local managing agents in Nugur, Albaka and Cherla were recognised as inferior proprietors. They were in effect minor independent chiefs whose main occupation appears to have consisted in raiding the surrounding country, so that in the case of Cherla and Albaka they became the curse of all their neighbours. The family of the Cherla Rajas however died out and no trace remains of them but an evil memory and a few earthen mounds pointed out as the remnant of their fort at Cherla. The superior proprietor bought in the rights of the Albaka Dhorwa and now only the Nugur inferior proprietor remains. This family also was in danger of expiring but the heiress married a Kshatriya from the plains and the disaster was averted. The present inferior proprietor manages the estate in a careful business-like manner and has shown commendable public spirit in the development of Venkatapuram, the head-quarters of the taluk and of his estate.

Venkatapuram.—Situating close to the Gōdāvāri is now the taluk head-quarters. The taluk office is in course of construction together with a hospital, a rest-house, a police station and quarters for officers, clerks, constables and peons. The village is being carefully laid out, particularly the new suburb Elwinpeta. A weekly market has been instituted and the village is in a prosperous condition. There is also a Sub-Registrar's office, the head clerk of the taluk being the ex-officio Sub-Registrar.

Cherla.—Once the head-quarters of the inferior proprietor, includes a police station and a post office. Here is also a decayed Saivite temple, the only temple in the taluk, but it is hoped that the institution of a weekly shandy at Glassonpet, a mile from the main village, will restore a little of the faded lustre of this ancient village.
