## APPENDIX C.

### MESSAGES.

The following Messages were received by the  
A. I. C. C. office for Tripuri Session.

1. The Venerable Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya had sent the following telegram to Shri Subhas Chandra Bose, the Congress President :—

“My greetings to you and all fellow Congressmen assembled at Tripuri. I deeply regret that health does not permit of my attending the Congress. I am distressed at the serious differences which have arisen among leading Congressmen, which threaten to pull down the great edifice built up by the labour of love and devotion of the best men of the country, for over half a century. I beg you all to save it and to enhance the dignity and influence of the Congress by uniting all Congressmen in the service of the motherland (1) to fight against the demon of communalism which is working great havoc in the country, and (2) to fight the Federal scheme as embodied in the Government of India Act and help to establish suitable forms of popular Government in Indian States. We require all our united wisdom and mutual goodwill to solve these and other vital problems which affect the well-being of 350 millions of mankind. I pray that God may show us the right course and give us the strength to pursue it.”

2. Prof. Shelly Wang of the foreign office at Chungking, in a telegram to Pandit Nehru, expressed his inability to attend the Congress for want of time and wished success to the Congress, a bright future to the Indian Nation and good health to Mahatma Gandhi, Poet Tagore and other Indian Leaders.

In his telegram Prof. Wang further gave a brief review of the position in China. He said that under the command of Marshal Chiang Kai-shek and due to the heroism of their soldiers, and the unity and determination of the people, China was confident of ultimate victory despite their unprecedented sufferings at present. Though they had withdrawn from the coastal provinces they were consolidating their position and carrying on guerilla warfare in the Japanese-occupied areas and the local Governments were maintaining close relations with the Central Government. They were, at the same time, extensively developing their industries in the south-west and north-west provinces.

Prof. Wang declared that the aid rendered to China by all peace-loving peoples of the world had greatly strengthened China in her struggle.

“ We are specially grateful to you for your boycott work and also for the medical unit which is working indefatigably in our country,” added Prof. Wang and believed that after the conclusion of the Congress Session the boycott work would be further pushed. “ A victory for China meant also victory for you and all peace lovers,” he concluded .



3. The President of the Indian National Committee, Japan, said :—

“Greetings from compatriots. Success comes to those who take opportunity which comes not always. Forget not our martyrs.”

4. Mr. Rashbehari Bose, said :—

“With request for Congress efforts for immediate Indianisation of land, sea and air-forces and Indian, Burmese, Siamese, Chinese and Japanese friendship.

5. Zanzibar Indians conveyed greetings and wished success. “Gratified at the satisfactory outcome of Mahatma Gandhi’s fast. The colonial Indians ardently desire that the Congress should lead the country to the ultimate goal under Mahatma’s guidance”.

6. Indian Seva Sangh, Colombo, said :—

“Overseas Indians’ honour depends upon the mother country’s Independence. Praying she will attain it during your Presidentship and under Gandhiji’s able guidance”.

7. George Arundale, in a message hoped that unity would be established in the country.

Several other messages were also read by the General Secretary on the opening day of the Congress Session.
