defining self-sufficiency in food has been the urgent need since Independence and has received the highest priority in any development programme. Since the land resources are limited the problem can be solved mainly by producing more from the available land. It is wellknown that irrigated farming is the surest means of producing more food. as all inputs give maximum returns with assured water supply. Government have, therefore, invested huge amounts in increasing irrigation potential during the three Five Year Plans. What is now necessary is to utilise the irrigation potential expeditiously so that the investment gives fair returns and the country marches towards achieving self-sufficiency.

The Irrigation Commission has recommended that the period of development of irrigation should be reduced to 8 years from starting of construction work or 5 years from starting of irrigation. This is possible provided action is taken simultaneously with construction work, for development of land in the command area. This would involve a number of steps to be taken in a systematic manner and the same are enumerated in this manual on land development for irrigation for the guidance of the concerned staff.

## Introduction.

Whenever construction of any irrigation project is undertaken, action should be taken simultaneously to develop the command area so that fields will become readylyo receive irrigation as soon as it becomes available. At the outset, it may be said that all the area under irrigation command will not and should not need the same treatment. Areas with uniform slope upto 2 per cent may not need any levelling but only land grading, field channels and drains, to follow contour furrow irrigation. On the other hand, undulating lands with more than 2 per cent slope may require to be levelled and provided with field channels and drains. Very much cut up lands and low lying fields subject to water-logging may have to be converted into bunded fields for growing paddy. Levelling and bunding operations involve considerable earth moving and restoration of soil fertility by green manuring may become recessary. land development costs in such areas will be much more than that involved in mere gigging of field channels and drains. will thus be observed that no rigid procedure can be laid down for land development in command areas but there are certainly a number of steps which have to be taken in a systematic manner. The first such step would be to carry out a rapid topographical survey of the land from land development and utilisation points of view, followed by preparation of financial estimates for the project as a whole and making money available for land develop--ment work. The next step would be to carry out detailed survey of the land under each distributory, prepare plans and estimates and execute the work. Different items of work will be carried out by different agencies and it becomes not only necessary to list the items of work to be carried out but give detailed instructions for the guidance of the land development staff for carrying them out in the best way possible. The various steps involved in land development are mentioned below:

- (3) Estimation of financial requirements and the procedure to be followed to get the same from the Maharashtra State Apex Cooperative Land

  Development Bank through the Agricultural Refinance Corporation.
- (4) A detailed contour survey of the fields coming under the command of each distributory by Soil Conservation Section.
- (5) Preparation of plans and estimates for field channels, diversion boxes, drop structures, channel crossings, Road crossings, drainage ditches, levelling, grading etc..
- (6) Execution of land development work.
- (7) Preparation of recovery statements.

# Topographical survey of the command area by the Land Utilisation Survey Unit.

- 1.1 As soon as it is decided to undertake topographical survey, the Land Utilization Survey Officer should contact the Executive Engineer of the project and get from him the map showing the command area of the project and its canal system etc. If 5' contour survey has been carried out by the Irrigation and Power Department, a map of the same may also be obtained. Similarly, if soil survey has been done by the soil survey division of Irrigation and Power Department, a copy of the soil survey map showing Murum Isobaths also should be secured. It is then essential to get the list of villages coming under the command so that land utilisation survey could be undertaken in those villages.
- 1.2 The Land Utilization Survey Officer should then distribute the villages among the survey parties, each consisting of 1 Agricultural Supervisor, 3 Agricultural Assistants, 1 Tracer and 1 Attendant. The villages should be so distributed among the survey parties that the whole survey and categorisation of land could be completed within stipulated time.
- 1.3 The Land Utilization Survey Officer should initially demonstrate and train the survey parties under him in land survey so that they can carry out topographical survey and categorisation of land with confidence and accuracy.
- 1.4 The Agricultural Supervisor/Agricultural Assistants should be asked to get maps of villages to be surveyed from Talathi, Mamlatdar of Taluka concerned or District Inspector of Land Records. If the village maps are not available with any of the above officers, the Agricultural Assistants may be asked to trace the village maps from the maps with local Talathis and also prepara from the record of the Talathi, a list of Khatedars, survey numbers and area coming under the command of the irrigation project.
- 1.5 The Agricultural Assistants should then survey the area by traversing each field and using 'Abney' level for classifying the survey numbers according to slope, in the five following categories:

- (a) Flat lands and lands upto 1 per cent slope.
- (b) Lands having 1 to 2 per cent slope.
- (c) Lands having 2 to 3 per cent slope:
- (d) Lands having more than 3 per cent slope and ravine and cut up lands.
- (e) Rocky, hilly lands unfit for cultivation.
- 1.6 One Agricultural Assistant should be able to categorise 100 acres every day or 2000 acres per month. When the whole village is surveyed, he should prepare a statement showing (i) names of cultivators, (ii) survey numbers and Pot-hissa numbers, (iii) area surveyed and (iv) category of the land with reference to slope, in the form attached (Land Utilisation Survey Appendix I). He should also prepare a map showing areas under different categories of slope mentioned in the statement along with Survey and Pot-hissas etc., a specimen of which is shown in Land Utilisation Survey map 1. The information shown in maps prepared by the Irrigation Department shuld be helpful in showing existing bunds, trees, wells and such other important permanent features in the map.
- 1.7 While carrying out the survey, the Agricultural Assistant should also note down soil depths as observed in borrow pits, cuttings, gullies etc. and mention depth of soil in the remarks column along with any other special feature.
- 1.8 From the statement in Land Utilisation Survey Appendix I, he should classify cultivators into different groups according to irrigated area held by them (a) upto 5 acres, (b) 5-10 acres,
- (c) 10-15 acres, (d) 15-20 acres, (e) above 20 acres and submit the information in the statement showin in Land Utilisation Survey appendix II. In order to know the extent to which sub-division and fragmentation has taken place and judge the urgency of consolidation of holdings, the agricultural Assistant should mention the total survey numbers and total number of pot-hissas in each village.
- 1.9 As shon as the surey of a village is completed, the Agricul-tural Assistant should hand over the village map and village
  record along with Appendices Land Utilisation Survey I, II and
  Land Utilisation Survey map 1 to the Agricultural Supervisor.
  1.10 The Agricultural Supervisor should physically verify and
  exercise complete check over all items in at least 30 % area that
  would be surveyed by his party in a month and submit his check

report every month to the Land Utilisation Survey Officer in the prescribed form Land Utilisation Survey Appendix III. 1.12 The Agricultural Supervisor should verify all areas categorised as unfit for irrigation by his party and correct the categorisation wherever necessary.

- 1.12 The Agricultural Supervisor should prepare fair copies of statement-s and maps of villages surveyed by his party and submit them to Land Utilization Survey Officer within a week after completion of survey of a village.
- 1.13 Survey work should preferably be carried out villagewise. As soon as survey of one village is completed by the Agricultural Assistants and verified by the Agricultural Supervisor, he should move the party to nextvillage. He should see that his party is adequately equipped with survey and drawing instruments, stationery articles etc..
- 1.14 He should submit monthly progress report to the Lam Utiliza--tion Survey Officer in the prescribed form Land Utilisation Survey Appendix IV.
- 1.15 The Land Utilization Survey Officer should carry out frequent inspections of the survey work and give necessary guidance to the staff. He should personally carry out physical verification and exercise check over all items in at least 10 % area that would be surveyed by the parties in a month and submit his check report to the Superintending Agricultural Officer with a copy to the Department in the form Land Utilisation Survey Appendix III.

  1.16 The Land Utilization Survey Officer should also send a monthly progress report to the Superintending Agricultural Officer with a copy to the Department, giving villagewise abstract of the area surveyed during the month in the form shown in Land Utilisation Survey Appendices I and II.
- 1.17 After completion of the survey work of the command area of any project, the Land Utilisation Survey Officer should submit to the Department complete record consisting of village maps as per Land Utilisation Survey Map 1, Survey records and a final report giving villagewise abstract in the form of Land Utilisation Survey Appendices I and II and record of any relevant observations.

## Soil survey of the command area

2.1 Before land development operations are undertaken, it is essential to know (a) the nature of soils, (b) their revenue classification, (c) soil depth, (d) number of wells in the command area and water levels in the wells during summer and rainy seasons. Much of this information can be obtained by the Land Utilization Survey Officer while carrying out topographical survey of the command area of the project. Soil survey division, Poona of the Irrigation and Power Department carries out soil survey. of command areas of irrigation projects. The Soils Specialist, Department of Agriculture, Sholapur also carries out soil survey in some areas in every district. The State Government has also recently sanctioned a fullfledged soil survey organisation for undertaking comprehensive soil survey of the State as a whole and it is expected that when it goes in action, soil survey of command areas of irrigation projects would be given first priority in view of the urgency of Area Development Programme. | Necessary information on soil types from the above sources would help in deciding the type of land development work to be undertaken and the crop pattern to be adopted. 2.2 The Land Utilization Survey Officer should contact the Officer-in-charge of the concerned Soil Survey Division of the Irrigation and Power Department, and obtain map showing classifica -tion of soils into (a) light soils with soil cover between 0-18", (b) medium soils with soil cover between 18" and 8' and (c) deep. soils with soil cover more than 8' deep, as well as a copy of the report prepared by him. Similarly, he should write to the Soils. Specialist, Sholapur to make available a copy of the report in case he has carried out any soil survey in the command area concerned. He should also contact the Officer-in-Charge, Soil Testing Laboratory, College of Agriculture, Nagpur/Poona and get the extracts of the analytical report of the soil samples from ... the command area concerned. He should also contact the Soil Survey Officer (Padegaon) under the Sugarcane Specialist/Chief Sugarcane Development Officer who is carrying out detailed soil survey of the sugarcane area and get a report from him of the area so surveyed in the project concerned. The Land Utilization Survey Officer should send all these reports to the Department under intimation to the Superintending Agricultural Officer.

Mamlatdar or District Inspector of Land Records and get a copy of the settlement report of the district in which the concerned command area is located and copy any useful information concerning the nature of soil and its revenue classification viz.,

Mai (Gravelly soil), Barad (sandy loam), Retad (sandy soil),

Bagayati (Alluvial or loamy soil), Kali Bhari (clay), Kali

Madhyam (Clay loam) etc.. The settlement report also contains other useful information regarding agricultural and industrial development of the area. If it contains any relevant information useful for writing the "Irrigation Utilization and Agricultural Development report" of the project concerned, the same may also be copied and sent to the Department.

2.4 The Land Utilization Survey Officer should also instruct

the Agricultural Assistants to collect information about wells in the command area in each village and other relevant informa--tion from cultivators at the time of topographical survey such as (a) number of wells in the command area, (b) whether the well is in use or out of use along with the reasons in case it is not in use, (c) whether water is sweet or saline, (d) the water level in the well at the time of his visit, and in summer as ascertained from the owner, (e) cropwise area irrigated, (f) means. of irrigation, (g) whether the soil is well drained or waterlogged. The villagewise abstract of information regarding wells should be submitted every month to the Department under intimation to the Superintending agricultural Officer by Land Utilization Survey Officer in the form shown in Soil Survey Appendix I. The Land Utilization Survey Officer in the course of his inspection of topographical survey should observe carefully the general topography of the command area and soil depths as observ--ed in borrow-pits, cuttings, gullies, excavation from wells and send a brief report mentioning the number of spots so observed and the cases in which soil depth was (i) less than 9", (ii) (ii) between 9" and 18" and (iii) above 18" and his general impression regarding the depth of soil in the command area, and particularly whether the soils are well drained and the extent to which they can be irrigated without creating waterlogged conditions.

Estimation of financial requirements and the procedure to be followed to get the same from the Maharashtra

State Apex Co-operative Land Development Bank, through the Agricultural Refinance Corporation.

3.1 / Land development is one of the costly items to be undertaken by cultivators and it is generally observed that cultivators with small means are not in a position to incur this expenditure on their own. In order to utilise irrigation water speedily, it is necessary not only to carry out land development work. but to sanction loans for doing the same. For this purpose, certain allotment is sanctioned every year for soil conservation and land development in the budget of the Agricultural Department. Land development is carried out by the Soil Conservation Staff under Land Improvement Schemes Act, by incurring expenditure out of the allotment mentioned above. Cultivators' share of cost is subsequently recovered in suitable instalments with interest. Since a big programme of soil conservation and land development in and outside the command areas has been undertaken, it has become necessary to get additional finance from the Agricultural Refinance Corporation. For this purpose, a suitable scheme for land development in the command area of a particular project is prepared giving financial outlay for land development by the Maharashtra State Apex Co-operative Land Development Bank, and forwarded to the Agricultural Refinance Corporation. The M Agricultural Refinance Corporation after satisfying about feasibility of the scheme sanctions loan to that extent, and makes available the amount by floating debentures to the District Land Development Bank in whose jurisdiction the project is located. The District Land Development Bank sanctions loans to cultivators to the extent of expenditure incurred on development of their lands and passes on the amount to the Agriculture Department for reimbursing the expenditure that it has already incurred on land development out of its own allotment. This system has been found to be convenient, both from the execution of work point of view as well as accounts point of view, since it does not hamper organisation and execution of land development programme by the soil conservation staff as well as the sanctioning and subsequent recovery of loan by the District Further details about the preparation Land Development Bank. of recovery statements and their transmission to the Land Development Bank for sanction are given in Chapter VII

"Preparation of Recovery Statement".

- 3.2 For preparing the scheme for land development in the command area of a particular project, it is necessary to make as accurate an estimate of financial outlay as possible. Topographical survey and general observations of the soil type etc. carried outby the Land Utilisation Survey Officer are useful for this purpose. These give classification of land in relation to slope and type of soil and of cultivators with respect to size of holdings etc. Other information on crop patterns, financial condition of cultivators, cooperative structure etc. required for preparing the scheme is obtained from the "Irrigation Utilisation and Agricultural Development report" of the concerned project. This material is useful in preparing a fairly accurate estimate of cost of land development.
- 3.3 In sanctioning loan for land development Agricultural Refinance Corporation and Land Development Bank will charge the economic lending rate of interest. Cultivators will, however, be charged concessional rate of interest. The difference between the economic lending rate and concessional rate of interest would be borne by Govt. Cultivators share of cost of land development would be recovered in suitable number of instalments in the manner prescribed by Govt. from time to time.

# A detailed contour survey of fields coming under the command of each distributory by Soil Conservation Section.

- Land development in command area of a project will be carried out by the Soil Conservation Section of the Department of Agriculture. Depending upon the magnitude of work involved in any project a full subdivision or one or two charges of the subdivision working in the area adjoining the command area of the irrigation project will be allotted for this work. Sub Divisional Soil Conservation Officer will be directly in charge of land development work and will be under the control of the Divisional Soil Conservation Officer. In case bulldozers are required for levelling, he will requisition them through the Divisional Soil Conservation Officer and get the nacessary work done as per his instructions. He will keep record of work done by bulldozers in Survey Numbers of individual cultivators and apportion the cost of bulldozing among them for preparing recovery statement. The first step in planning land development work is to carry out detailed contour survey. The Sub Divisional Soil Conservation Officer should contact the Executive Engineer of the project and obtain from him 5'. feet contour maps of the command area of the project if available. He should also obtain from him map of the command area values of Bench marks laid by the Irrigation and Power Department, and information of areas coming under command of different distributaries and their water courses with their discharging capacities. Zimilarly he should obtain village maps showing topographical survey from the Land Utilization Survey Officer on the Directorate of Agriculture. He may hand over these to the Agricultural Supervisors (SC) for further work.
- 4.2 <u>Detailed contour survey</u>: Since 5' contour maps of cormand area of a project give only broad idea of the topography of fields, it is necessary to have more details both of the contours as well as permanent existing features viz. survey boundaries, trees, wells, roads, rock out-crops etc. 1' contour maps are, therefore, very essential for preparing land for irrigation. All area under command of an outlet of a distributory/water course should form a block for this purpose. These blocks should be formed by the Agricultural Supervisor (SC) and allotted to the Agricultural Assistants (SC) for obtaining consents of owners of land to the prescribed extent (i.e. 67%)

in the form attached (vide appendix L.D. I). In case stipulated percentage of cultivators are willing to get the land development work done, the Agricultural Assistant should prepare a survey estimate at the rate of Rs. 0.50 per acre, in the form attached (vide L.D. appendix II) and submit the same to the Sub Divisional Soil Conservation Officer for approval through the Agricultural Supervisor.

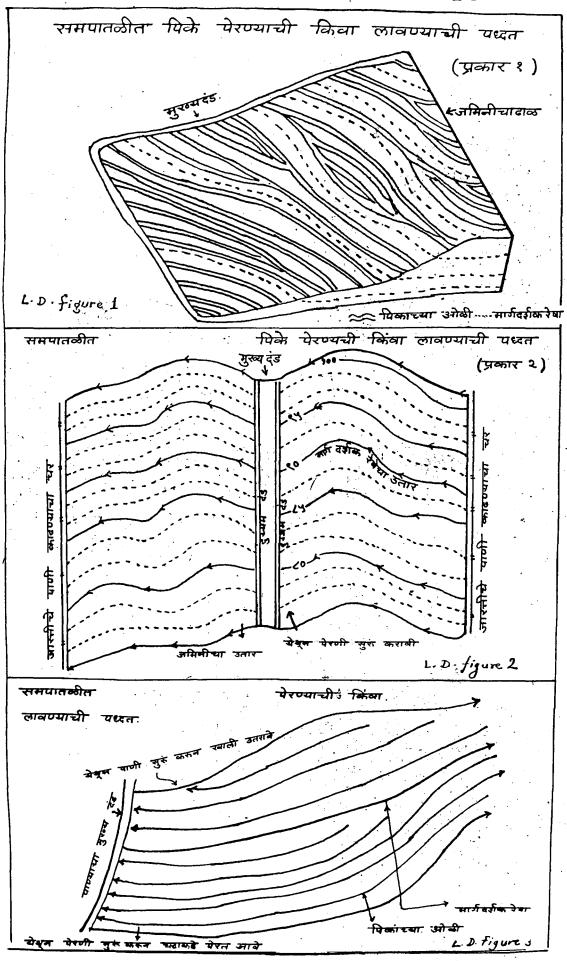
4.3 Base Map: The Agricultural Assistant should prepare from the maps obtained from Agricultural Supervisor (SC) a correct map of the whole area under command of an individual distributory or its minor, called the block in this case, as it is the most important step for further work. It should be enlarged to a scale of 1" - 220'. If the area is too large the map can be drawn in two parts. Locate the details of land features by traversing the area e.g. survey boundaries, pothissas, trees, buildings, wells, roads and cart-tracks, rock outcrops, permanent gardens, fencing, river or nalla, large gullies etc. and mark them on the map. This map will be known as the base map. (See L.D. appendix No. 1). One more copy of this should be taken out for preparing the contour map.

As all the development is dependent upon the level at which water from an outlet would be available, it is necessary to have the same datum for levelling work as is taken by the Irrigation and Power Department. Survey work must, therefore, start from the Bench Mark laid by the Irrigation and Power Department.

4.4 Contour Map: Use the copy of the base map for preparing contour map. After obtaining approval to the survey estimate, the Agricultural Assistant (SC) should undertake detailed survey of the block. Survey should be carried out by square method with a grid of 110'. Bench marks should be laid at the rate of one for every 25 acres or part thereof. Starting bench mark must be one of those laid by Irrigation and Power Department for construction of canal, distributaries and value of this Bench Mark should be the same as that derived by that Department. In addition to the levels at each square point, levels should be recorded of gully banks, gully bed, top and bottom of existing bunds and where there is a sudden change in slope of land.

Locations of cart-tracks, temporary and permanent sheds, wells, trees, outcrop of rocks, channels; drains and any other permanent land features as shown on the base map, should be verified and corrected. In fact the map should depict an actual state of affairs existing in the field for incorporating correct design. of work, and avoiding modifications at a later stage. pollate contours at 1' interval. This map will then be known as contour map ( See L.D. appendix No. 2). It should also show areas that are too shallow and se underlain with rock or areas that have levels equal and above that of irrigation outlet sill level. All information on base map is thus available on the contour map along with one foot interval contours. Sill level of the outlet and its discharging capacity should be shown on this map and in addition irrigable command area should be demareated. One more copy of the contour map should be taken out by the Agricultural Assistant (SC). The contour map should be checked by the Agricultural Supervisor (SC) and then submitted to the Sub Divisional Soil Conservation Officer for preparing the layout map.

- 4.5 Layout Map: The Sub Divisional Soil Conservation Officer should study the contour map with the help of the Agricultural Supervisor (SC) with reference to ridge and valley lines for water channel and drain alignments and show on it the required irrigation features as directed below. This map will thus show all physical features and contours as shown in the base map and contour map respectively, and also layout of field channels and drains and will be known as 'layout map' (See L.D. appendix No.3):
  - (a) Mark field channels in black thick lines from irrigation outlet and verify whether any area cannot be irrigated from the channel and demarcate it by dotted line. The channels should follow ridge lines as far as possible and maximum use of field boundaries should be made while aligning them. There should be only ore point from which each individual owner will draw water.
  - (b) Mark the locations of turnouts or division boxes on the field channels for every holding. From this division boxe the farmer shall take water and prepare the water distribution system for his fields.

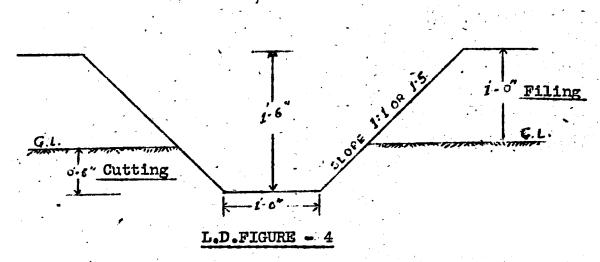


- (c) Hark locations of drop structures, chutes, crossings etc. required.
- (d) Hark individual field drains, collecting drains and main drains in dash and dot lines.
- (e) Mark locations of drop structures, chutes, crossings etc. on the drains.
- (f) Mark by arrows in black lines, directions of land grading required and show bund alignments in black lines.
- (g) Mark diversion drain for diverting outside runoff from un-command area in double line.
- (h) Mark areas by appropriate alphabet to indicate the land development measure as described under a, b, c and odd of para 4.8

The layout map should be got approved from Divisional Soil Conservation Officer and necessary copies made for the use of field staff.

- 4.6 The layout map shows the block as it would look after the development work is carried out. In order to have a clear idea of how the locations of field channels, equalisers, bunds serving as permanent guide lines, different structures for efficient irrigation by graded furrow method eliminating the damage due to soil erosion in the field should be laid down, three magnified sketches are shown in L.D. figure 1, 2 and 3. The graded furrows in which the crop will be sown and water let in for irrigation are indicated in dotted lines. These will be governed by the bund lines and will be drawn by the cultivator himself while preparing the seed bed and cultivating and irrigating the crop during its growth period.
- 4.7 It will be necessary to construct field charmels, drains and bunds of different sizes as well as use different types of structures such as outlets, turnouts, drops, diversists, chutes, crossings etc. in land development work. The designs of these are given below:
- (a) Field Channels: All channels including antillary structures for capacities above half cused are designed and constructed by Irrigation and Power Department. Field channels to take water to individual fields have to be constructed by

cultivators and are included in the land development programme. Channels should have 1' bottom width, 1: 1 or 1.5 side slopes according to Soil type and 1.5' depth. It is not necessary to design these channels for different discharging capacities as these will not be required to carry discharge above 1 cusec and for all practical purposes it is not advisable to reduce the section of the channel for smaller discharges to comform to the worked out size. The channel should be 6" in cutting and 1' in filling. (See L.D. Figure 41.



They should have bed slope of not more than 1 %. Drop structures ... should be provided at suitable intervals to regulate the bed slope.

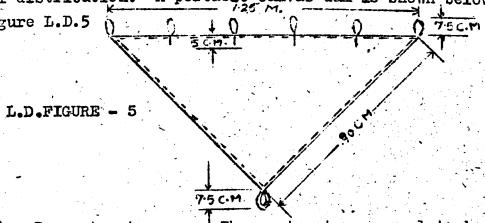
(b) As indicated above there should be only one outlet for each individual holding on main field channel. It will, therefore, be necessary to provide suitable internal distribution channels (equalizers) so that water can be taken to each and every compartment within the holding. These should be 1' deep (6" in cutting and 6" in filling) and 1' wide at the bottom and 1: 1 or 1.5 side slope according to soil type.

If any cultivator desires to have lined or pipe channels, the cost will be very high and will have to be borne by the oultivator himself and the expenditure will not be shared in common with others.

(c) <u>Turnout or Division box</u>: These would be necessary to divert water in a controlled way from field channel to internal distribution channels. These should be built in stone masonry in mottar or in plane cement concrete. Type plan estimate for

this structure is attached (vide L.D. appendix (a,b,c) III).

(d) <u>Triangular Canvas dams</u>: Portable devices may be constructed to serve the purpose of checks and turnouts for internal distribution. A portable canvas dam is shown below vide figure L.D.5 () 10 (7.50.m)



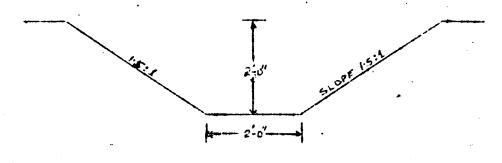
- (e) <u>Drop-structures</u>: These structures regulate bed slopes of field channels. Special provision should be made to prevent action of underminining structure on the down stream side. These structures should be in stone masonry in mortar or in concrete. Type plan and estimate attached (vide L.D. appendix IV)a,b,c.)
- (f) Chutes: These structures are suitable where the drop is more than 3 feet and should be in stone masonry in mortar or in concrete. Type plan and estimate attached (vide L.D. appendix V).
- (g) <u>Crossings</u>: At places a channel will have to pass over a drain, or a cart-track may pass over a channel. At such places suitable crossing will have to be provided. These may consist of pipe crossings. Type plans and estimates of different types of crossings are attached (vide L.D. appendix VI (a,b,&c).

  4.8 <u>Drains</u>: Drains are necessary to carry out excess after from the fields. Such drains should generally be aligned along

from the fields. Such drains should generally be aligned along valley lines and field boundaries. These are classified as upland drains (over 2 % slope) and flat land drains. Shallow saucer shaped sodded drains with loose rock drops would be suitable to prevent gully formation on uplands. Flat land drains should be deep drains to serve as subsurface drains (open ditch or tile) to prevent waterlogging. Where more than 10' wide strip of land would be occupied by saucer shaped drain, it would be advisable to provide deep drains to save land. In case of medium

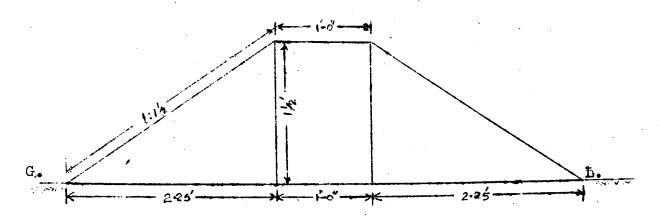
and deep soils the drains should have a bed width of 2', side slope 1.00 to 0.50 and depth 2'. Bed slopes of these drains should not exceed 1 %. These drains should be surplussed in natural water course with adequate outfall (i.e. more than 1'). A type cross section of a drain is shown below:

## 4.9 Land Development:

(a) Fields having less than 2 % slope: Align bunds on 0.2 % grade in case of shallow and medium soils and on 0.3 % grade in medium deep and deep soils. Deviations to the extent of 6" on ridge and 1' in gully may be given to avoid excessive seniosity in bund alignments. Bunds should be aligned at a vertical interval of 3' to 4' or horizontal distance of 150' to 225'. Bund should have l' top-width, 1 : 1.5 side slope and height 12 feet (see L.D. Figure 7) in all types of soils. The area in between two bunds should be dressed to have uniform one sided slope between two bunds and a planned grade (i.e. 0.2 % or 0.3 %) to the strip along the bund. If there are any big mounds, they should be levelled and if there are any big gullies, they should be filled in . The land between the two bunds can be irrigated by grade or contour furrow irrigation method.

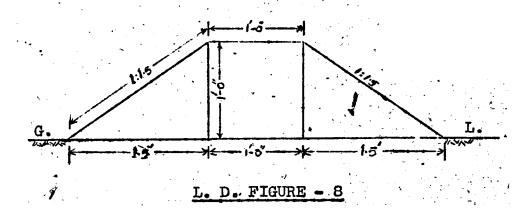

# (b) Border strip method in fields having less than 2% slope:

Align borders on grades of 0.3 % and at a vertical interval of 6" to 9" or horizontal distance of 50' to 66'. Deviation on either side to the extent of 2" may be allowed to avoid excessive seniosity. Border should have a top-width of 1', side slope 1:1.5 and height 1' (see L.D. figure 8). The area in between two borders will level itself in due course of time and will have a planned grade of 0.3 %. The land between the two borders may be irrigated by border strip irrigation method.

In soils having depth of more than 36" and slope less than 2%, border strip method of irrigation can also be followed with advantage.



## (c) Fields having more than 2 % slope:

Align bunds on 0.2% grade in case of shallow and medium soils and on 0.3% grade in medium deep nand deep soil. Deviation to the extent of 6" on ridge and 1' in gully may be given to avoid excessive seniosity in bund alignment. Bunds should be aligned at a vertical interval of 3' to 4' or horizontal distance of 100' to 130'. Burds should have 1' top width, 1: 1.5 side slope and height  $1\frac{1}{2}$  in all types of soils. The area in between two bunds should be dressed to have less than 2% slope which would mean removal of 6" of top soil from higher side and depositing it on the lower side. While doing this knolls, mounds or ridges should be removed and gullies and ditches filled in. The area between two bunds will thus be developed as under 4.9 a with a planned grade of 0.2% to 0.3% along the bund for following irrigation by grade or

contour furrow irrigation method. Since the top six inch soil will be removed from half the area, the surface soil will lose its fertility and should be green manured with Sann green manuring to restore the same and give uniform good crop.

- (d) Cut up lands and low-lying fields subject to waterlogging: There are always some fields along the Nalas which are cutup and have deep gullies. There are also low-lying areas which are subject to waterlogging. Such fields should be bunded and The size of a paddy field may converted into paddy fields. vary according to situation and lay of the field but on an average it should be about 8 to 10 gunthas or 66' x 132' or 165'. The bund should have l' top width 1: 1.5' side slope and height 2' These fields will have to be almost dead in all types of soils. level so that good crop of paddy followed by gram, peas, maize or wheat could be grown. Since considerable surface soil will be removed, the fields should be green manured with Sann green manuring, at least in the first two seasons to restore their fertility.
- 4.10 <u>Diversion drains</u>: Run-off water from uncommanded areas situated on top of command areas should be diveted to adjoining water courses by constructing diversion drains as this run off would damage developed land surface, field channel etc.. Sections of diversion drains should be worked out as prescribed under Department Circular Fo. SCS-4564/E dated 19-7-1965

#### C'APTER V

## Preparation of plans and estimates for field charmels etc:

- Having prepared the lay-out map and decided about the locations and numbers of various structures as well as the alignments of channels and drains and fields in which levelling has to be done, the next stage is to prepare plans and estimates of each block separately and get them sanctioned from the competent authority. The plans and estimates should be prepared in a book-let form by the Agricultural Supervisor with the help of Agricultural Assistant and submitted to the Sub Divisional Soil Conservation Officer who should scrutinise them and submit to the Divisional Soil Conservation Officer.
- 5.2 The guide lines for preparing the cover page leaf which is shown in Appendix Plan and Estimate 1 are given below:-
- (a) Index sheet: This should show contents of the estimates file with page numbers as Appendix Plan and Estimate 2.
- (b) Site Plan: This should be a copy of the map traced from the map of command area obtained from Irrigation and Power Department. Site plan should be 2" x 2" extract of the above map with the block located in the centre as in Appendix Plan and Estimate 3.
- (c) Short note: This should give the location of the block, information on climatic conditions, soil types and details of type of work to be carried out. Extent to which views of cultivators are considered for planning should be indicated in the short note under the heading "General Information" is in Appendix Plan and Estimate 4.
- (d) List of Khatedars: This should contain information about land owners, assessment, total area, area to be improved, soil type, estimated cost of work etc. as in Appendix Flan and Estimate 5.
- (e) All works such as field channels, drop structures, division boxes, crossings, etc. benefitting more than one cultivator i.e. of common interest should be classified as community works. All other works such as land grading, border stripping paddy bunding etc. in particular survey Nos. which benefit only individual cultivator should be classified as individual works.

- (f) Abstract of estimates: This should indicate separately estimated expenditure on community works and individual works as in Appendix Plan and Estimates 6. Actual expenditure on survey for preparing plan and estimate, estimated expenditure on survey during construction and plane table survey should be shown under community works. Establishment charges at 33 1/3 % on the total estimated cost of both community works and individual works should be added to the total estimated cost and cost per acre worked out at the end.
- (g) Detailed estimates: These should be in two parts.

  Part I should be for community works and Part II for individual works. Each of these parts should include details of estimates for both earth work and masonry work benefitting community and individuals.
  - (h) Bench mark statement. vide Appendix P & E 9.
  - (i) Check level certificate. -do- P & E 10.
  - (i) Base map of the project. as in L.D. Map 1.
  - (k) Contour map of the project. as in L.D.Map 2.
    - (1) Layout map of the project as in L.D. Map 3.
    - (m) Longitudinal sections of field channels:

Part I - Community works :- Field channels, drains and masonry works should be numbered serially from head of channel towards its tail and their estimates should be shown in Part I as in Appendix Plan and Estimate 7.

Part II-work in individual Khatedar's holding should show estimated amount of work separately for each holding according to type of work viz landgrading, border stripping, land levelling for paddy bunds and levelling of cut up lands. These estimates should be prepared holding-wise as in Appendix Plan & Estimate 8. 5.3 Land development for graded furrow method of irrigation on land having 3 % slope, would not normally invelve any levelling work as the lands would be having uniform slope on one side. At the most, mounds and pockets at few spots may have to be levelled by cutting and filling. This work sould not involve nuch expenditure and need not, therefore, be estimated in detail. Estimates for graded bunds should be prepared on the basis of specified bund section and a provision for removal of nounds and filling of pockets may be made on percentage basis i.e. if the estimate for construction of bunds is Rs. 30/- per acre, a provision of Rs. 4.50 at the rate of 15 % of the estimated expendi--ture on bunds should only be made.

5.4 Quantity of cutting for levelling of (a) border strips,

(b) lands with more than 2 % slope and (c) cut up lands and deep gullies should be calculated by adopting following formula for purpose of estimation:

$$V = A \times VI$$

where V = Volume of cutting in cft.

A = Area of border strip in sq. feet.

VI = Vertical interval in feet.

This will be clear from the figures L.D. 9, 10 and 11 shown below:

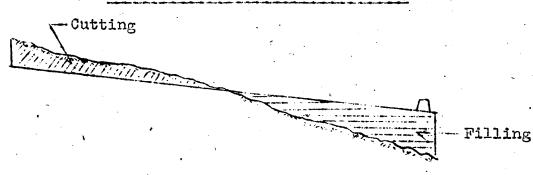
CUTTING AND FILLING OF FIELD WITH LESS THAN 2 PER CENT SLOPE.

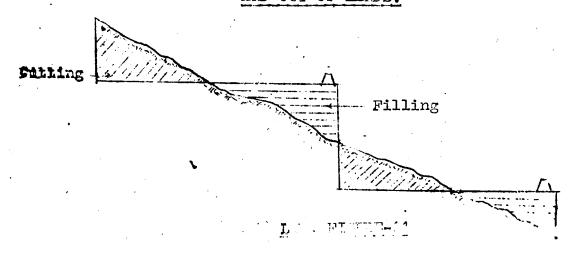
CUTTING AND FILLING OF A FIELD WITH MORE THAN 2 PER CENT SLOPE.

- 5.5 The estimates of field channels and internal distribution channels, drains and levelling work should be prepared at rates mentioned in Schedule of rates given in Plans and Estimates Appendix P & E 13. As these will be only 6" in cutting normally no murum cutting would be involved.
- 5.6 After alignments of field channels are fixed, their longitudinal section should be drawn. This would be useful for locating division boxes, drop structures, chutes etc. For this purpose fly levels should be taken alone the alignments of channels at every 100' distance and at points where there is sudden change in gradient. This section should be drawn to a scale of l" = 200' horizontal and l" = 2' vertical. It is not necessary to draw sections for every field channel but in case of highly sloping land, longitudinal section may be taken as shown in Appendix P & E ll. This may be decided by the Sub-Divisional Soil Conservation Officers by visiting the site.

## 5.7 Longitudinal section of drains:

It is necessary to draw Longitudinal Sections of drains to design bed-slope and section, and to locate out-fall point and drap structures. Instructions and procedure prescribed for drawing longitudinal section of field channels should be followed for drawing longitudinal sections of drains as shown in Appendix P & E 12.

5.8 Plans and estimates so prepared by the Sub Divisional Soil Conservation Officer should then be submitted to the Divisional Soil Conservation Officer for technical sanction and administrative approval. If the estimated cost is more than Rs. 20,000/- the same should be forwarded to the Department by the Divisional Soil Conservation Officer.

## 5.9 Rate <u>list</u>:-

A schedule of rates for all items of work involved in land development should be prepared every year in the form vide P & E appendix 13 and got approved from the Department.

## 5.10 L.I.S. Act Procedure:

Directive under Section 4(1) should be obtained from the District Land Improvement Board for preparing draft schemes as per Appendix P & E 14. Draft schemes of land development for irrigation should be prepared under items (ii) and (v) of Section 4(1) of the Land Improvement Schemes Act (1942) amended. These items provide for improvement of water supply and improvement of methods of cultivation. Draft schemes so prepared in the booklet form should be got approved from the District Land Improvement Board under Section 5(1) of the Act and action to observe all further formalities under the Act should be taken. Forms of notifications under Section 5(2) and 9(2) are attached (vide Appendices Plans and Estimates Nos. 15 & 16).

## Execution of Land Development Work:

- Construction work should be undertaken after the scheme 6.1 has gone through all the provisions of the Land Improvement Schemes Act (1942) amended and after obtaining technical sanction and administrative approval of the competent authority. Field channels, internal distribution charmels and drains should be aligned from plan. The lines can be given directly in the field by the Agricultural Supervisor and checked and passed by Sub Divisional Soil Conservation Officer. The Agricultural Assistant can then earry out the work. Construction of channel should start from top to bottom and that of drains from bottom to top. It should be seen that slopes are properly dressed and designed bed slopes are maintained. The slopes should be checked by dumpy level during construction. Special attention should be paid to give designed Spoil from excavation of drains and channels outfall to drains. should be properly deposited on either banks to form bunds which should be dressed. Foundations should be taken upto hard strata and passed by the Agricultural Supervisor (SC) and certified. Specification given in P.V.D. Hand-book for all stone mortar masonry and concrete work should be observed.
- 6.2 Since the sizes of drop structures, division boxes, and pipe crossings will be the same in different blocks, it will be very convenient to get them pre-fabricated and stock them at suitable places according to requirements. These standard sizes of structures will not only bring uniformity in construction but also save considerable time and enable replacement if and when necessary. If a structure of a special size is required to be built, then only it may be constructed on site. It should be borne in mind that use of pre-fabricated structures should be the common practice as it will speed up the work and achieve the targets in time.
- 6.3 Agricultural Assistant (SC) should give alignments of all grade bunds in a survey number starting from top. The bund itself should, however, be aligned from the outfall and towards the ridge. He should check these alignments and correct wherever necessary to obtain designed grade. All corrections should be shown on the layout map and the same should be kept up-to-date. Area between

two bunds will form a compartment. Land development should be taken up compartment by compartment. As the land is to be used immediately after land development, no borrowpits should be taken for construction of bunds, levelling of pockets etc. Bunds should be formed by scraping the mounds and ridge portions by Kenis. The spoil from field channels and drains should also be used for construction of bunds, the cross sections which will be 2.5 and 5.25 Sft. Measurement of bunds should be recorded as in case of Keni work. In respect of bunds constructed from spoils of channels and drains, payment should be made only for lead and not for excavation for which payment will be made under excavation for channels and drains.

## 6.4 Levelling:

Bull-dozers can be used with advantage for speeding up levelling work. Procedure for aligning, execution of work and recording measurements should be the same as prescribed under terracing.

#### 6.5 Work Registers:

Work register for expenditure incurred as per Fart I estimates should be separately maintained block-wise. Work register for expenditure incurred as per Part II estimates should be maintained individual holding-wise.

## 3.6 Completion reports and work slips:

Procedure as already laid down in case of other soil conservation works should be followed. Monthly progress report of work done should be sent in the forms shown in Appendix/L.D. I & I.,

## CHAPTER - VII

## Recovery statements:

- 7.1 Separate recovery statements should be prepared for community works and for works in individual holding as shown in Appendix Recovery Statement 1 & 2. In case of recovery statements of community works, show number of channels under Column 5, show number of drains under Column 6, and show all structures under Column 7. A remark should be made to the effect that all cultivators in the block would be jointly and severally responsible for the maintenance of works. In case of recovery statements of works in individual holdings show number of bunds under Column 5, drains and channels under Column 7, and other structures under Column 7.
- 7.2 If the land development work preposed to be carried out from the loan from the Agricultural Refinance Corporation, the recovery statements should be sent to the concerned District Land Development Bank for sanctioning the loan to each individual cultivator and reimbursing the amount spent by the Department of Agriculture. The District Land Development Bank will subsequently be responsible for recovery of the loan. In case the work is carried out from funds of the Agriculture Department, the recovery statements will have to be sent to the Mamlatdar as in case of other soil conservatiom works.
- 7.3 An amount equal to 33½ % of the works cost of each work representing the cost on establishment should be added to the works cost, to be termed as establishment charges to arrive at the total cost of each block.
- 7.5 The cost of work recoverable from cultivator in each block should be arrived at after deducting the subsidy as above from the total cost. Thus the recoverable cost will be equivalent to 75 percent of the total cost.
- 7.6 The rate of interest to be charged and the number of instalments in which the cultivators' share of cost should be recovered, will be as per orders of Government issued from time to time.
- 7.4 A subsidy equal to 25% of this total cost referred to above should be treated as subsidy to the cultivators occasional.

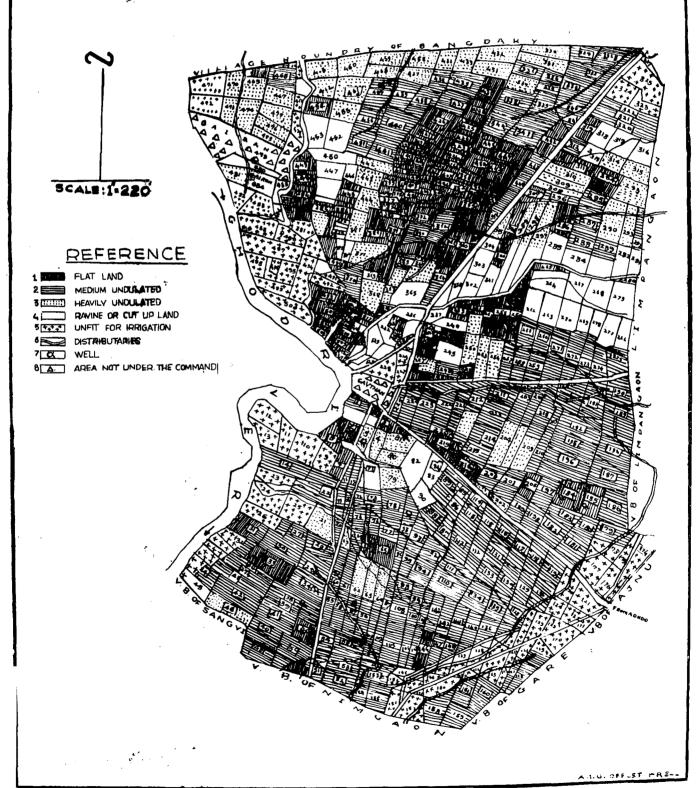

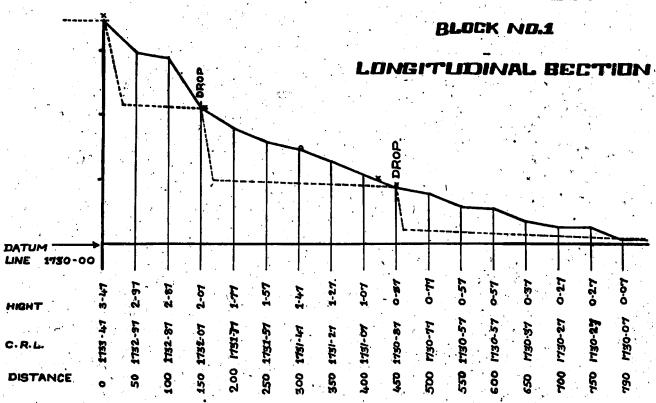

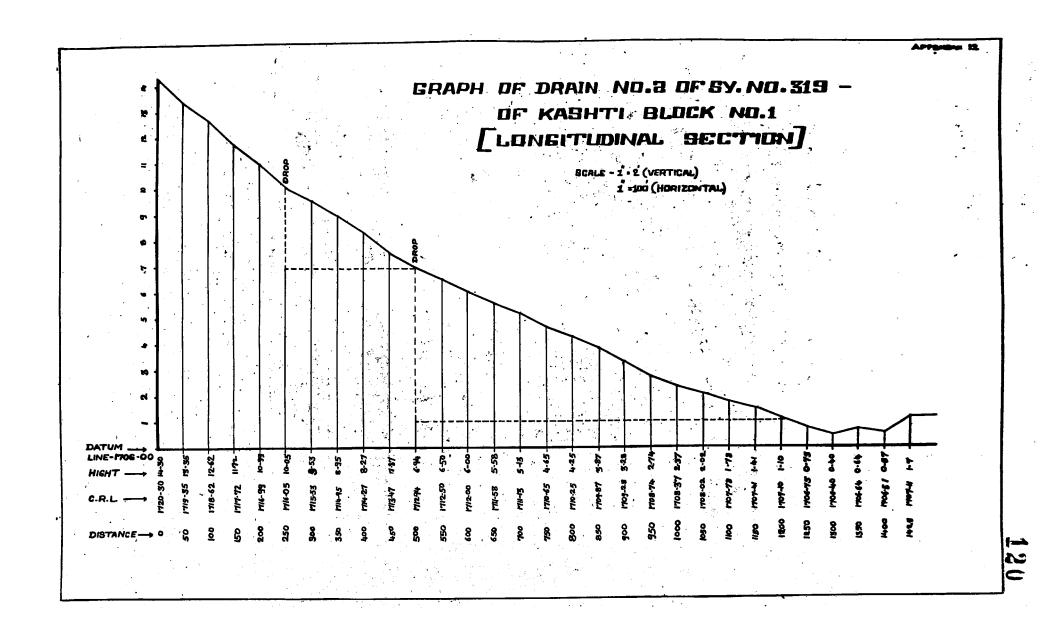
