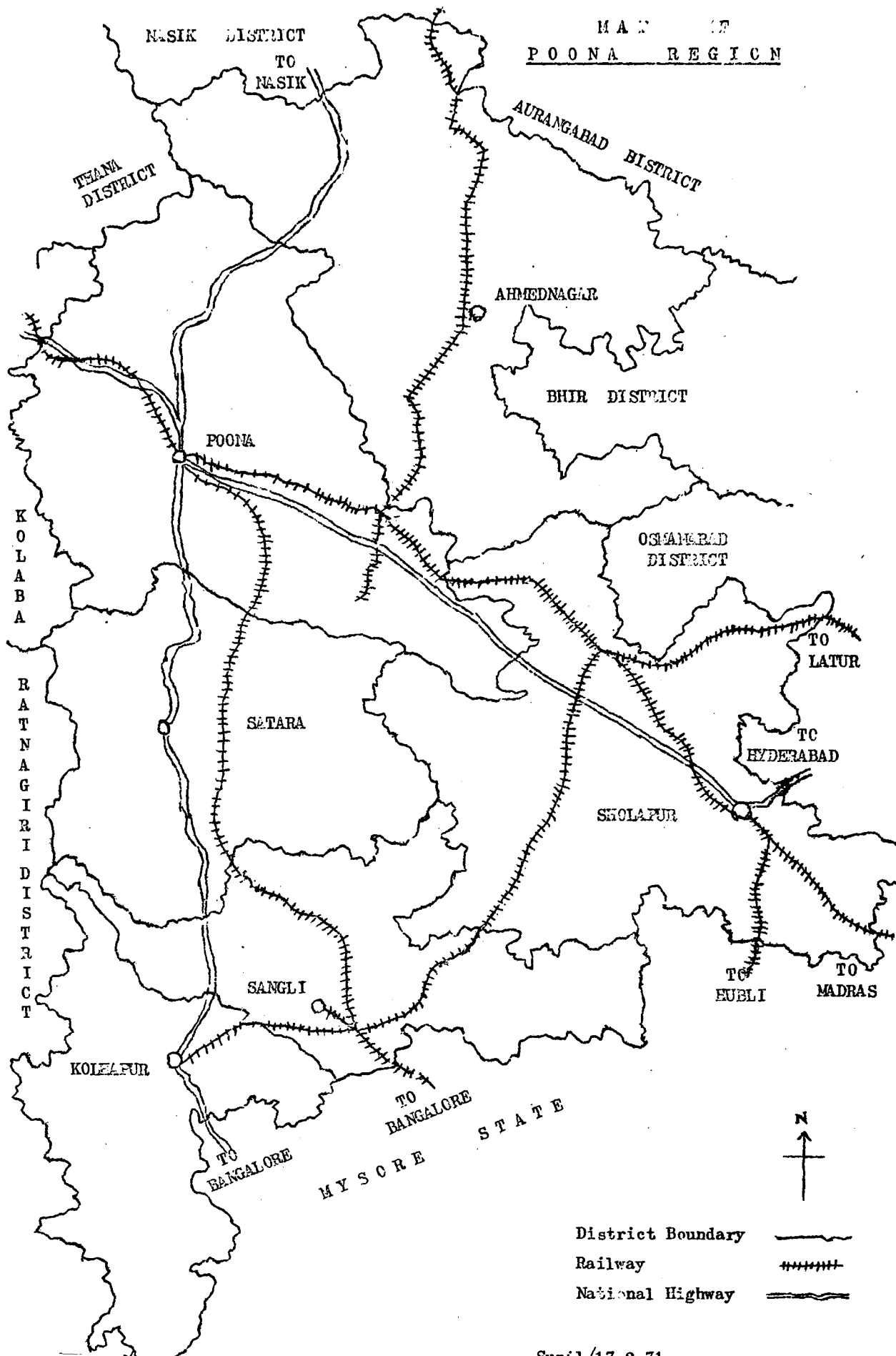

CHAPTER I.
INTRODUCTION.

1.1. General.

Poona Division is located between 15°6' to 20°0' north latitude and 73°2' and 76°2' east longitude. To its north and west, there is Bombay Division, to the east Aurangabad Division and to the south Mysore State.

The area of the division is 74,705 sq.km.s which is about one-fourth of the area of Maharashtra State. Its population is a little more than 1 crore as compared to about 4 crore population of the State.

The Division comprises of six districts, viz.,

- a. Ahmednagar,
- b. P o o n a,
- c. Satara,
- d. Sangli,
- e. Sholapur, a n d
- f. Kolhapur.

Since 1961 Census, the boundaries of these districts have not undergone any changes.

1.2. Administrative set-up:

Each of the above mentioned districts is under the control of a Collector who is in charge of general administration, law and order, land revenue and civil supplies. The six collectors work under the overall control of the Divisional Commissioner, Poona. The Collector of each district is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office. The revenue sub-divisions of the districts are in the charge of Prant Officers/Deputy Collectors. The Tahsils which are the sub-divisions of a district are under the control of Tahasildars.

1.3. Historical Background.

Stone Age remains are found on the banks of Mutha river in Poona city area. However, nothing specific is known of the period upto the 13th century A.D. in the beginning of which there was the kingdom of Dakshinapath, with its capital at Junnar.

Muslims ruled over the major part of this

division till Shivaji came on the scene. Aurangzeb unsuccessfully tried to vanquish the Maratha power. The Peshwas who later came into power expanded the frontiers of the Maratha Kingdom and had practically the whole of India under their sway at one time. However, due to internal strife the regime came to an end in the year 1818, when the British wiped it out. After 1818, the socio-economic life of the peoples of this region underwent important changes like introduction of mass education, new methods and technique of production etc. The peace that prevailed for some time proved to be illusory. There was the war of independence of 1857 and the final ouster of the British Raj in 1947. Great historical personalities from this region like Lokmanya Tilak, Banade, Gokhale were on the forefront of the movement for independence.

1.4. Physical setting.

Geographically, Poona division forms part of Western India. The Sahyadri Ghats and beyond them an undulating plateau make this region.

Geologically, the basal complex of western India consists of igneous rocks upon which rests a metamorphic series. This igneous complex has given rise to terraced hill and broad valleys. There are varying local features also and all these add variety to the division's landscape.

The Sahyadri mountain which is the principal relief of this division starts from the western shoulder of the division and traverses in the south-west direction upto Bhor Ghat and then goes almost straight in the southern direction. The creastline is highest at Mahabaleshwar. There is a contrast between the western and eastern flanks. The western flank of the Ghats is a fractured edge of the plateau marked by a series of terraces, so typical of the Deccan Lava landscape. The eastern flank, on the other hand, consists of plateaus, which have fairly broad basins drained by major plateau rivers and their tributaries.

Poona Division forms almost the beginnings of the Godavari and Krishna systems which cover about one-third portion of Peninsular Table land. The Bhima

river cuts right across the division. The rivers Bhima and Krishna have almost an equal drainage, whereas, comparatively, the Godavari has a very small drainage in the division. The Mahadev ranges separate the upper Krishna drainage from the Bhima basin. The Balaghat range distinguishes the Bhima basin from that of Godavari. All the rivers in this region are graded streams and develop shallow and meandering courses outside the Sahyadrian zone. During rainy season the flood waters entail much soil erosion, while during dry part of the year they resume a slender course in a large bed. All other water courses in the east are markedly seasonal in their flow.

Poona division has no important minerals, excepting building stones, clay and limestone, which are common to all the districts. Laterite is widely formed in the western part of Satara district. Twenty villages in Jaoli and thirty villages in Patan taluka of Satara district contain iron ore in the murum below the laterite. The ore is of a low grade and unsuitable as yet for commercial exploitation. In Kolhapur district there are very large areas containing deposits of exceptionally high grade bauxite in sufficient quantities. The quality of the material is very good and is suitable for the manufacture of aluminium.

1.5. Climate.

a. Rainfall - Due to relief of land and the direction of rain-bearing winds, the distribution of rainfall varies considerably from place to place. Mahabaleswar which is in the region of Sahyadri gets the highest rainfall - on an average 6,000 mm in a year. Broadly rainfall declines from the south-west to the east and the north, but relief locally modifies this tendency.

Most of the rainfall in the division is received from the south-west monsoons but later monsoons also contribute a share.

Failure of rainfall is practically unknown

to the western part of the division, while it is a frequent experience in the eastern-most parts, such as Sholapur district and eastern Tahsils in Poona, Sangli and Satara districts.

The years 1966-67 and 1967-68 were bad for agriculture in Poona district and the year 1966-67 was also not fair in Satara dist. and the year 1967-68 was unfair in Sangli district.

- b. Temperature - Cold season normally starts from the second fortnight of October. November marks the onset of winter season and ends in the month of February, when the temperature begins to rise, reaching its peak in the month of May.

Temperature starts cooling down from June to the first week of October. The average summer and winter temperature, however, naturally depends upon altitude. Eastwards over the plateau higher temperature ^{and higher} seasonal ranges are recorded. In the western and central portion of the division, nights are cool and early mornings cooler.

- c. Humidity and annual cloudiness. As compared to the coastal region of Bombay, there is less humidity in this division. During the rainy season, humidity is generally high. It declines in winter season and the summer season witnesses dry weather. The seasonal variation in cloudiness is mainly dependent on the prevailing winds. In April, the proportion of cloud is as low as 2/10. July and August are the months of maximum cloudiness when the proportion reaches nearly 8/10 except in the eastern-most part of the division, where the sky is more clear. From October cloudiness in the sky begins to decline appreciably and by November the skies become clear.

The western tips of Poona, Satara and Kolhapur districts witness very heavy rainfall over 3750 mm. high humidity and lower

temperatures on higher slopes. Immediately after this region there is a belt of about 50 to 100 krs. in width, running straight from north to south. In this belt rainfall varies from 1,000 to 1,750 mm and rapidly declines eastwards. In the third part of the division rainfall is received from southwest and north-east monsoons.

1.6.3 soil.

Most of the soil in this division is 'Medium black soil on trap'. However, there are superior tracts also and they are found in those areas through which big rivers like Krishna, Bhima, Godavari flow. The soil in these tracts is of the type known as "deep black soil from trap."

1.7. Geographical region.

The geographical region is to be distinguished from administrative region, the boundaries of the latter being drawn by keeping in view administrative convenience. Thus, the apparently compact unit of a division or a district often shows regions of great natural contrast. The whole of Poona division falls into what can be termed as the 'Maharashtra Plateau', which is that portion of the Deccan Table Land that is bounded on the north by the Satpuras, on the west by the edge of the Sahyadris and on the east and south by the administrative boundaries.

On geographical basis, this division can be subdivided into six groups -

i. The Sahyadrian Main Range.

This range as it enters Poona division takes a southwest turn for about 50 miles and then run almost parallel to the coast-line. Mahabaleshwar and Panchgani Plateaus are situated in this tract which is thinly populated. Only a small portion of this region is under cultivation.

ii. Naval Transitional Tract :- The eastern

flank of the Sahyadris, drained by the waters of Godavari and Bhima rivers is a transitional region situated between the Sahyadrian Main Range and the dry plateau. This region, with hills and valleys, is intensely cultivated and well-populated in the valley part.

iii. Balaghat and Mahadev Upland Tracts.

The eastern plateau is marked by three major and minor hill ranges. The Balaghat range demarcates the basin of Godavari from that of Bhima and the Mahadev hills separate the Bhima basin from that of the Krishna. A major portion of this tract is forests and grass lands. Cultivation is inferior.

iv. A part of Godavari basin lies in Poona division. It has rich black soil yielding good harvests. In the Tahsils of Kopergonj, Shrirampur and Nerasa in Ahmednagar district, the advantages of the soil are further enhanced by canal irrigation. The sugar industry in Ahmednagar district depends on this well-developed irrigation facilities.

v. Bhima Basin.

The drainage area of Bhima basin which is as big as that of the Krishna, trap soils of varying fertility and dry climate have given a distinctive feature to this basin. The central and south-eastern portions of this basin greatly differ from the western belt mainly because of its dry climate and greater proportion of poor soil. The immediate flanks of Bhima river are well-cultivated but yields are highly susceptible to scarcity. The upland portion of the basin formed by Balaghat and Mahadev ranges grows hardier crops like Bajra. The Nira and Sina rivers have formed tributary basins in this region.

vi. Krishna - Panhaganga Basin.

This region is drained by the Krishna river and its major tributaries, Koyna and Panhaganga.

This region also has a rich black soil cover developed on the Deccan lavas under a more humid climate. The valleys though considerably restricted by hill ranges form belts of intensive cultivation. Crops like

i. Jowar, .

ii. Wheat,

are grown here; but sugarcane and tobacco are its main cash crops. In the southern part of this region, sugarcane has gained importance due to rapid development of sugar industry in the Miraj-Sangli-Kolhapur area. This area is free from scarcity.

CHAPTER II

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

2.1. As the caption indicates, this chapter is meant to give the scope and limitations of the Statistical Data given in the present issue.

2.2. This Divisional Statistical Abstract covers data of all the six districts in the Division and is divided into 12 major subjects which are -

1. Climate,
2. Area and Population,
3. Agriculture,
4. Animal Husbandry and Forest,
5. Industry, Employment, Mining and Electricity,
6. Co-operation,
7. Medical and Public Health,
8. Education,
9. Transport and Communication, 10. Local Bodies,
11. Plan and Community Development, and
12. Prices,

2.3. Statistics on Miscellaneous subjects like

- i. Joint stock companies,
- ii. Collection of Small Savings,
- iii. General Election etc.,

are given in the last section named ' Miscellaneous ' In addition, Poona division at a glance ' and ' Trends in Selected Indicators ' are also given in the Abstract.

2.4. Climate -

The first two tables give data on rainfall and temperature for the selected centres. The concepts mean maximum and mean minimum are the averages of maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily during the reference years. The mean temperature is the average of the mean ^{maximum} and mean minimum temperatures thus arrived at. The temperature data is for the selected centres and as such, this cannot be taken as the representative temperature of the district.

In Rainfall table, rainfall data is incorporated for the selected centres. Normal rainfall is the average for more than 50 years in some cases.

2.5. Area and Population.

The tables on this subject are based on 1961 Census Handbooks. While referring to data on urban areas it should be noted that a town or urban area is "a place which has a municipality a cantonment or a civil line or a population of 5,000 or over and at least 4/5ths of male population dependent on non-agricultural pursuits". A population enumerated in urban areas is urban population and the population enumerated in all other places is rural population.

2.6. Regarding data on Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes it may be stated that at the time of 1961 Census, all backward castes or tribes living in the districts were not included in these two groups. They include only those castes or tribes declared as scheduled caste or scheduled tribe in a district.

2.7. Agriculture.

This section comprising of tables from 9 to 19 covers data on many important subjects like,

- i. land utilisation,
- ii. yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops,
- iii. area irrigated by different sources
- iv. famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity data etc.

Regarding irrigation works, it may be mentioned that a work involving an expenditure of less than 20 lakhs is treated as 'minor irrigation work', that covering irrigable area upto 250 acres is entrusted to the Zilla Parishads and work above 250 acres to the Irrigation Department.

2.8. Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries.

Data on livestock, veterinary, recognised slaughter houses, major and minor forest products etc., is given under this head. Fisheries section is not applicable to this division.

2.9. Employment, Industry, Mining & Electricity.

This gives factory statistics, data pertaining to Employment Exchanges, Census of Govt. employees, Statistics relating to Annual Survey of Industries, Generation and Consumption of electricity, number of towns and villages electrified.

Regarding factory statistics, it may be pointed out that the data covers factories registered under Factories' Act, 1948, viz., those employing ten or more workers and working with

aid of power and those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power. In electricity table, generation is included in the district where only generating plant is located in the district.

2.10. Co-operation.

Comprehensive data on this subject is displayed in tables from 36 to 43, which includes number of different types of societies, statistics relating to Co-operative Banks, Primary agricultural credit societies etc. In table nos 38 and 39, due to non-availability of break-up of figures of members into societies and individuals, consolidated figures are given. The co-operative year starts in July and ends in June.

2.11. Medical and Public Health.

Data regarding Medical facilities available, births and deaths registered etc., are incorporated in this section.

2.12. E d u c a t i o n .

This covers a wide range of data on literacy, beneficiaries and concessions to the backward classes, expenditure on primary education, etc.

2.13. T r a n s p o r t a n d C o m m u n i c a t i o n .

Important statistics like traffic census on important roads (National Highways and State Highways), information on postal and telegraph and telephones, Rural Broadcasting statistics, etc., are given in this part.

2.14. L o c a l B o d i e s .

In this section, one table giving Income and Expenditure of Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishads, Municipalities and Cantonments is included.

2.15. P l a n a n d C o m m u n i t y D e v e l o p m e n t .

Plan expenditure under different development sub-heads, physical achievements under Plan, Data on Community Development programme and expenditure incurred in different stages of Blocks are included in this section.

2.16. P r i c e s .

There two tables in this section. The first is on Average retail prices of important commodities during the years 1966 and 1967. The prices given in the table are the averages of those given in the Statistical Abstracts of the six districts in this division. It may be noted here that

the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop in the district head-quarter. Hence the averages shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative. Moreover, it is obvious that in a Divisional Abstract description of quality/variety/brand/count (local trade name) of various commodities cannot be given. However, the data may be useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The data are for calendar year.

2.17. In the other table Consumer Price Index for working class are given.

2.18. Miscellaneous.

As the title indicates, data on various subjects not included in the above 12 sections are given in this section.

2.19. Poona Division at a glance.

Comparative statistics of Poona Division and Maharashtra are given in ^{it}.

2.20. Trends in Selected Indicators.

The period of time covers four years viz., 1950-51, 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1967-68. It covers a wide range of indicators on

- i. population,
- ii. agriculture,
- iii. livestock,
- iv. electricity and
- v. co-operation, e. t c.

CHAPTER III.
SECTORIAL TRENDS.

3.1. In this chapter an attempt is made to analyse the data pertaining to important indicators like

- i. agriculture,
- ii. livestock,
- iii. electricity consumption,
employment position,
- iv. public health,
- v. education,
- vi. transport,
- vii. banking, and
- viii. prices

with a view to assess the development of this division.

3.2. Agricultural Development

In the State Income of Maharashtra Agriculture occupies a very important place, contributing about one-third of the total income. The population engaged in this sector is, however, very large, the percentage being about 70. The small contribution by a large section of the population is due to inferior quality of soil, low consumption of fertilisers, inadequate irrigation facilities, vagaries of monsoon and financial backwardness of the agricultural community.

3.3. Indicators like percentage gross cropped area to net sown area, percentage of irrigated area, cropping pattern etc. are used here to assess the development in the districts.

3.4 From the above table, a clear picture regarding increase or decrease in the ^{double} cropped area can be

had. Increase in it indicates fuller utilisation of the available agricultural land, while decrease in it shows under utilisation. The use of land depends on the rains. If there are timely rains, all cultivated land is utilised for sowing to the maximum limit. The low utilisation of land is due to insufficient rains. This division is well-known for scarcity tract in the eastern area. This leads to variations in the land use.

3.5. For the division as a whole, as compared to 1960-61, there was no increase at all in the double cropped area as at the end of 1966-67. This is not a satisfactory position. The figures, however, compare favourably with those for Maharashtra State (1960-61 : 105.28, 1966-67 : 105.20). Looking at the districts, it is seen that only A'nagar district there was some progress in this direction. The decline in the double cropped area in other districts may be due to change in cropping pattern; from seasonal crops to perennial crops like sugarcane.

3.6. Let us now turn to the ^{next} indicator viz., irrigation facilities. In table no.2 percentages of irrigated areas to net areas sown are given -

3.7. The above table shows that for the division as a whole, the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown in the year 1966-67 had remained at the same level as compared to the year 1960-61. The percentage of gross irrigated to net irrigated area had, however, increased by 7 points during this

period. From table no.1, we find that during the above period there was no increase at all in the double cropped area. It means that irrigation facilities were not utilised for growing crops in those areas where double cropping was not possible due to paucity of water.

3.8. As regards the picture obtaining in the districts Kolhapur stands at one end and Poona at the other. In the former district double cropped area has declined a little bit. There is some increase in net irrigated area, the gross irrigated area has, however, increased perceptibly. This indicates that the areas where a second dry crop was grown, were brought under cultivation of irrigated seasonal crops. This same change to a more pronounced degree is found in Poona district. The only district which seems to have benefitted from irrigation is Anagar district, where there is increase in all the three fields, viz. increase in double cropped, net irrigated and gross irrigated areas.

3.9. In order to have a clearer picture, we have to turn to the cropping pattern as found in the years 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1966-67.

3.10. From table no.3, it is observed that in the year 1960-61 area under foodgrains as a percentage of gross cropped area was 75.35 which moved to 75.47 in 1966-67..

That is, there was increase by 0.14 points. During this same period, percentage of irrigated foodgrains increased more than proportionately, i.e., by 0.91 points. Percentage decline in area was highest in ^{the} case of cotton, while Groundnut showed an increase of 0.22 points. In the case of total food crops, there was positive change in area and irrigation, while negative change was observed in respect of non-food crops.

3.11. Another important indicator is the yield per hectare of principal crops. Table no.4 below gives the necessary data.

3.12. It is seen that except Jowar, Bajri and Cotton, all the other important crops showed a decline in the yield rate. This is a very disturbing trend, because agricultural land being limited, it is the increase in yield rate which ^{alone} will lead to agricultural prosperity.

3.13. Agriculture can cease to be a way of life and become a commercial proposition only when there is a substantial surplus in produce, available for investment. But near subsistence level of living of a farmer, makes it difficult for him to earmark some amount of his income for investment in his farm. Supply of agricultural credit, therefore, assumes paramount importance in this sector. The co-operative sector occupies a very important position in this respect.

3.14. Examination of data regarding primary agricultural credit societies would be useful for this purpose. Table no.5 on the next page gives the relevant statistics.

3.15. During the period from 1961-62 to 1967-68, the number of Primary Agricultural Credit societies declined by 0.52%. However, the loans advanced increased by 39.10% in the last year (taking 1961-62 as the base year). This position is very encouraging indeed. However, there is an other side of this coin. Loans outstanding and overdues indicate the financial health of these societies. Loans outstanding trebled during the reference period. As regards overdues, the position was somewhat better in the year 1967-68 as compared to the year 1966-67.

3.16. Mechanised agriculture on a vast scale is yet a distant dream. Possession of livestock helps the rural community in tillage of land as well as by giving it a source of subsidiary income.

3.17. Compared to the total livestock in the year 1966 with that in the year 1961, we find that the total number in the division has gone down from 74,86,697 to 73,38,708. Taking availability of livestock per hundred hectares of cultivable land, it is observed that it was 123 in the year 1961, while in 1966 it was marginally higher, viz, 124. The comparative figures for Maharashtra State for the years 1961 & 1966 were 122 and 118 respectively. The position in Poona Division thus favourably compares with that of Maharashtra. Changes in per capita consumption of electricity give us yet another indicator of development. The figures for 1966-67 and 1967-68 were 66.5 and 75.2 Kwh. respectively. While working out the figures for both the years population of 1961 Census has been taken into account. Since the population in these two years had, of

course increased. This per capita consumption involves some overestimation.

3.18. Employment Exchange Statistics.

The problem of unemployment poses a very grave threat to ^{our} economic development. The improvement or otherwise in the employment position will, therefore, be very useful in assessing our march towards economic prosperity. However, there is a difficulty in taking recourse to the Employment Exchange Statistics. All unemployed persons do not register their names in an Employment Exchange and hence the number of persons registered does not reflect the true position of the unemployment problem. Moreover, mainly persons from urban areas register their names in the Employment Exchange. The data given here has, therefore, to be viewed with these limitations in view.

3.19. In this division, during the year 1966-67, the number of registration was 89,908, while the corresponding figure for 67-68 was 96,319. Thus there was 7 per cent increase in the year 67-68 as compared to the previous year. The number of vacancies notified, however, declined by 25.08 per cent in 67-68 as compared to 1966-67. The same deteriorating position is reflected if the percentage of placement to live register is taken. The percentage declined from 13 in 1966-67 to 10 in the year 1967-68. It is thus evident that the employment position is worsening year by year.

3.20. Education has been rightly called "Investment in Man.". It has also its impact on urbanisation. Progress in this respect will give us yet another indicator of development.

3.21. The table shows tremendous progress both in the increase in boys and girls. It is highest in respect of Higher Education, which is a very healthy trend.

3.21. Transport constitutes one of the most important

c
constituents of the infra-structure of an economy. Road facilities available in the division could be better judged by working out road length per 100 sq.km. The Extra-Municipal road length was 21,057 km.s as on 31/3/1967 and 21,728 as on 31/3/1968. It works out to 28.18 km. per 100 sq.km. and 29.08 respectively. The progress does not seem to be significant.

3.23. As regards Railway length, there was no increase in it, with the total length remaining constant at 1,282 km.s

3.24. If roads are the ^{arteries} ~~articles~~ of the nation, banking can be compared to the heart because without a fast growing and sound financial system, economic development is not at all possible. In India a large portion of the population still remains uncovered by institutional finance. To assess the development in this direction, increase in banking facilities per lakh population would be a correct indicator. In 1967, there were 511 banking offices in the division, while in 1968, the figure was 544. If we work out number of banking offices per lakh population, the figure remains the same at 5.

3.25. The last indicator considered here is 'Prices', the impact of which is felt all over the economy. For Poona Division, Price index numbers of Poona and Sholapur are considered. In respect of Poona, the average for 1966-67 for food was 151 and the General Index was 141. In 1967-68 these figures shot up to 171 and 154 respectively. As regards Sholapur Index, the average for the year 1966-67 for Food was 162, which increased to 181 in 1967-68, and the general index from 150 to 165. (The base year for these indices was 1960 = 100).

3.26. It is thus seen that there was considerable price increase in the division, thus eroding the purchasing power of the consumer and affecting the standard of living adversely.

CHAPTER IV.

ANNUAL PLAN REVIEW : 1966-67 & 1967-68.

4.1. The Fourth Plan of India was to have started from 1966-67. However, this was not possible due to many difficulties especially the uncertainty of foreign exchange. But in order that the tempo of economic development gathered during the IIIrd Plan Period should continue without break. Annual Plans were prepared for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68:

4.2. In the following table, Plan expenditure in Poona Division incurred on various Development Heads is given.

4.3. Comparison of expenditure for the two years shows that the expenditure on Co-operation and Community Development and that on Irrigation & Power remained at almost the same level. While there was a decline in expenditure on Agriculture and Allied Programme, expenditure on Social Services increased considerably.

4.4. In order to judge the impact of Planning, not only the figures of expenditure but actual physical achievement has also to be considered.

4.5. (1) Agriculture and Allied Programme.

The expenditure on this head was 878 lakhs in 1966-67.

It, however, declined to 737 lakhs in the subsequent year. This head includes expenditure on such sub-heads like Agricultural Production, Minor Irrigation, Animal Husbandry, Forest etc..

4.6. Looking at the achievement side, we find that during 1966-67, 41,717 quintals of improved seed was distributed, while the quantity increased to 64,585 quintals in 1967-68. During 1966-67, 64,724 tonnes of chemical fertilisers were distributed, the corresponding figure for 1967-68 was higher at 79,875 tonnes. The figures of compost production during the two years were 1,77,445 and 2,23,464 tonnes respectively.

4.7. As regards minor irrigation, additional irrigation potential created by new wells, installation of pumping sets, by Bandharas etc., was 8,696 hectare in 1966-67 which rose to 10,271 hectares in the year 1967-68.

4.8. In respect of Animal Husbandry during 1966-67, 8 veterinary dispensaries and aid centres were started. However, in 1967-68, only 2 dispensaries and aid centres were started. Similarly, in 1966-67, two cattle breeding centres were started. In 1967-68 no new centres were opened.

4.9. Progress is observed in Forestry also. During 1966-67, 851 hectare area was afforested, while in 1967-68 the area afforested was 2,083 hectares.

4.10. Thus, the Agricultural Programme was tackled successfully on many fronts.

2. Co-operation & Community Development,

4.11. The agricultural production programme depends to a large extent on the credit provided by co-operative institutions, Government have taken energetic measures to support and strengthen the cooperative structure for efficiently discharging its vital function of providing supplies and services to the cultivators. These measures include, inter alia, share capital contribution to the apex institutions, grant of management subsidies, and grants to service co-operatives.

4.12. On this major head during 1966-67, about Rs.166 lakhs and during 1967-68 about Rs.162 lakhs were spent which comes to 7 per cent of the total expenditure during these years.

4.13. During these two years, i.e., 1966-67 and 1967-68, 19 and 21 agricultural credit societies, 11 and 7 farming

societies, 5 and 6 processing societies, 46 and 15 lift irrigation, 21 and 10 industrial co-operative societies and 4 and 1 weavers' co-operative societies respectively were formed.

4.14. The aim of the Community Development programme is to carry out rural development based on local initiative and community action. The Community Development Blocks now cover the entire rural areas in this division.

3. Irrigation & Power.

4.15. About one-third of the total expenditure was incurred on this head in both the years.

4.16. A high priority has been given to the programme of rural electrification and installation of pumps. In 1966-67 324 and in 1967-68, 190 villages were electrified in the division. The number of pumps connected was also very impressive, the number being 5,714 and 8,866 respectively. The total number of villages electrified as at the end of MARCH, 1968 comes to 23 per cent of the total villages in this division. The total ^{electric} pumps installed increased from 17,933 in 1966-67 to 26,799 in the year 1967-68.

4. Industry & Mining.

4.17. The programme consists of development of handloom industry and financial assistance to industrial co-operatives.

4.18. On this, Rs.59 lakhs were spent in 1966-67 and in 1967-68 Rs.118 lakhs were expended.

5. Transport & Communication.

4.19. In this division 7 per cent of the total expenditure in 1966-67 and 5 per cent in 1967-68 were incurred on this head.

4.20. During 1966-67, 49 km.s of new district roads were constructed. In 1967-68, the corresponding Km.s were 193. In 1967-68, 64 roads were provided with cross-drainage facilities, the figure for the previous year was 11.

4.21. As regards rural roads in the two years 422 Kms and 163 Km.s respectively of village roads were constructed. The number of bridges constructed were 3 and 4 respectively.

6. Social Services.

4.22. Education, Medical and Health, Housing etc.,

are included in this head. In 1966-67, 351 lakh Rupees and in 1967-68, 525 lakh Rupees were spent on this head.

4.23. Some of the points on which significant progress was made were school buildings constructed, 82 and 161 numbers respectively, family planning units started, 6 and 30 respectively, drinking water wells constructed 295 and 621 respectively, villages benefitted under Rural water supply scheme 125 and 399 respectively, number of tenements constructed for low income groups, 40 and 26 respectively.
