CHAPTER - I
I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1 General

Kolhapur district is located between 15° to 17° north latitude and 73° to 74° east longitude. To its north there is Sangli district, to the south and east Belgaum district of the Karnataka state and to the west Ratnagiri district.

1.2 The area of the district is 8059 square kilometres. Its population is 20,48,049. The district comprises of 12 tahsils. The boundary of the district has not undergone any change since 1961.

1.3 Physical setting

The main part of the district is traversed by the Sahyadree mountains in the west. It has thrown several spurs in the east of the district, and in this range some of the points are as high as 900 metres above mean sea level. The major portion of the district is 390 to 600 metres above the mean sea level.

1.4 Rivers.

The principal rivers of Kolhapur district are the Krishna, the Varana, the Panchganga, the Doodhganga, the Vedganga and the Hiranyakeshi. The Varna river which has a fairly south-eastern trend serves as a boundary between Kolhapur and Sangli districts. Its approximate length is 130 k.m. The Panchganga is formed by 4 tributaries viz, the Kasari, the Kumbhi, the Tulsi and the Bhogavati. The Panchganga falls into the river Krishna at Narsobawadi in Shirol tahsil of Kolhapur district after covering approximately 136 Kilometre length in the district. The south western region of the district,

is mainly drained by the Dudhaganga river flowing a length of 83 k.m. in this district, and her important tributary the Vedganga flowing a length of about 64 Km. The Dudhaganga ultimately falls to Krishna at yeddur in Belgaum district. The Hiranyakeshi has a length of about 80 km. in this district and falls into the river Ghataprabha in the Belgaum district.

1.5 Forests

The forests in Kolhapur are confined to the western half of the district. In the high rainfall regions in the extreme west, Jamhul, hirda, angani, suriangi, Karvi and panasi plant species are located, Amba, Nana, Sissum asana, Kumbhi, bhavada, kinjal, ain, biba etc. ^{are} in the moist ~~deciduous~~ and semi evergreen regions. The famous scented wood species Chandan occurs in Ajara tahsil in forest of such type. The dry deciduous type of forest are strewn for and wide in small patches with greater incidence of sissum. Besides Timber, sandle wood, fruit, fire wood, grass, timber bamboo, hirda, kangur, mango, bibi fruits, and other minar forest such as shikekal, couumbs, honey and war, karangi seeds etc are marketable products from these forests. The total forest area in Kolhapur district is of the order of 1 lakh and 65 thousand hectares.

1.6 Soils

Kolhapur district has three broad soil zones. The western part covered with laterite soil, the fertile central part covered with brownish well-drained soil and the dry eastern zone covered with medium to deep black soil.

1.7 Minerals

Bauxite is known to occur at several places like

Radhanagari, Gargoti, Waki, Dhanagarwada, Rangewadi and Wajiri. Its quality is fairly good and suited to produce Aluminium, Gypsum is found in small quantities in Bhudargad tahsil.

1.8 Rainfall

Due to relief/land the distribution of rainfall varies considerably from place to place. Gaganbawada in the west receives 6000 mm. rainfall annually where as Hatkanangale in the east receives only a little over 500 mm. rainfall. The district gets rain from the south-west as also from the north east monsoons. The main rainy season is from June to October. Ajara, Chandgad, Gaganbawada, Radhanagari and Shahuwadi tahsils come in the heavy rainfall tract. Tahsil Bhudargad Gadhinglaj, Karvir have sufficient rainfall, Kagal tahsil falls in rather insufficient rainfall tract while Hatkanangale, and the remaining annual Shirol tahsils come under poor rainfall track receiving rainfall below 650 mm

1.9 Scarcity Conditions

No Scarcity conditions prevailed in Kolhapur district during 1973-74. However Scarcity works started in 72-73 were in force up to Sept. 73 and an amount of Rs. 364 lakh was spent during April to Sept 73. Rs. 7 lakh were disbursed as tagai loans during this period.

1.10 Demography

The population of Kolhapur district is 2048049 as per 1971 census. The per square km. population density is 254, for the district as a whole. In rural area density is 204 where as in Urban area it is 2295. Barring greater Bombay district, Kolhapur district has the highest density of population in 1971. Among the tahsil of the

district, Karvir tahsil has the highest population density viz. 704 and Bavda tahsil the lowest viz. 92.

1.11 Compared to the 1961 census data, the 1971 census population of Kolhapur district shows an increase of 23.23 per cent in total count, in urban area the decadal increase is very much higher viz 43.04 % as against 24.76 % in rural area in the district. The tahsilwise figures of decadal increase which are above the district average figure of decadal variation are given as below.

- 1) Hatkanangle- 39.77 %
- 2) Karvir - 35.85 %
- 3) Shirol - 31.40 %
- 4) Panhala - 29.99 %

In the rest of the tahsils the percentage of decadal increase in population is below the district average. The descending ranking is as below.

- 1) Radhanagari 24.52 %
- 2) Ajara 23.51 %
- 3) Kagal 23.11 %
- 4) Gadhinglaj 20.69 %
- 5) Bhudargad 19.82 %
- 6) Chandgad 19.67 %
- 7) Shahuwadi 19.14 %
- 8) Bavda 8.51 %

1.12 Considering only the urban area it is observed that the percentage decadal increase is highest in Hatkanagale tahsil, viz. 65.48. In shirol tahsil it is 45.05. The percentage increase is lowest in Panhala tahsil viz. 13.91

1.13 Administrative set up

The district is under the control of the district Collector who is also the District Magistrate. He is in

charge of general administration law and order, land revenue, and civil supply. He is assisted by a Resident Dy. Collector in his office. The three revenue Sub. divisions in the district are in charge of Prant officers. The tahsils are under the charge of tahsildars.

1.14 The Zilla Parishad at district level and the 12 panchayat samities at the tahsil level were formed in 1962 to give impetus to the developmental plans and promoting active participation of the people. The area of operation extends to the rural area of the district.

1.15 The following towns in this district have municipal councils. 1) Ichalkaranji, 2) Gadchiroli, 3) Jaysingpur 4) Kurundwad, 5) Panhala, 6) Malkapur, 7) Murgud, 8) Vadgaon and 9) Kagal. Kolhapur city has a Municipal Corporation.

1.16 Special Features of the district

The Kolhapur district is very well known for its Gur production. The district produces and exports quality Gur. Besides this there are a number of cooperative sugar mills spread over the district contributing a large share to the states sugar production. The recovery percentage of sugar is markedly high in this district.

1.17 Another important industry of export value is the Kolhapur chappi. There are a number of small scale manufacturing unit in this district. Preparing Kapshi and Kolhapuri chappis which have been taken fancy to, by the people in India and abroad. A number of small scale units manufacturing Oil engines and spare parts of engines have been thrived in kolhapur city. Power loom weaving industry has prospered very well in Ichalkaranji town.

1.18 The Gymnastic sports, which received a great impetus during the regime of His Highness Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaja, still continue to be of importance in this district . The development of arts,sports, educational institutions are the reminiscent of the efforts and patronage of the ex. princely State of Kolhapur.

CHAPTER - II

EXPLANATORY NOTES

2.1 As the caption indicates, this chapter is meant to give scope and limitations of the statistical data presented in this issue.

2.2 The statistical tables given in the second part of this issue present tahasilwise data and they cover following 12 major subjects.

1. Area and Population.
2. Climate.
3. Agriculture.
4. Animal Husbandry and forest.
5. Industry, Employment, Mining and Electricity.
6. Co. Operation.
7. Medical and Public Health.
8. Education.
9. Transport and Communication
10. Local bodies. (8)

12. Prices.

2.3 Statistics on miscellaneous subjects like

- i) Police force and crime.
- ii) Court Cases.
- iii) Cinema.
- iv) Banks, Joint Stock Companies.
- v) Insurance.
- vi) Small Savings etc.

are given in the last section named 'Miscellaneous.' In addition, Kolhapur District at a glance which gives comparative data of Kolhapur district and the State of Maharashtra and 'Trends in Selected Indicators' are also given in the Abstract

2.4 Area and Population.

The tables on this subject are based on 1971 Census of population. While referring to data on urban areas it should be noted that a town/urban area is "a place which has a municipal council, a Contonement, or a Civil line or a place having population of 5000 or over and having a density of not less than 400 per sq.km. and at least 75 percent of male population dependant on non-agricultural pursuits. Or the place should have according to the Director of Census Operations a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

2.5 Regarding data on Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes it may be noted that the data include only these castes and Tribes declared as Scheduled Castes and Tribes in Kolhapur District.

2.6 Unlike 1961 Census, at the time of 1971 Census it was stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in family economic activity, but not on a full time scale should be treated as "Non-Worker" in respect of their main activity

2.7 Climate

Rainfall and temperature data of the selected centres are given in the tables under this section. The temperature data is given for only one centre and as such it cannot be said to be representative temperature of the district. The figures of normal rainfall are the averages, based on actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eighty years. As regards rainy day, a day is treated as a rainy day, if during the twenty-four hours, the rain gauge records a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall.

2.8 Agriculture

Tables under this section cover data on many important subjects like-

- i) Land Utilisation
- ii) Yield per hectare and Out-turn of Crops
- iii) Sourcewise Irrigation of Area.
- iv) Agricultural Wage rates.
- v) Famine and Scarcity Conditions etc.

Concepts of some important terms used in these tables are as follows-

Forest :- They include all forest areas state owned or private, classed and administered as forests under legal enactment.

Barren & Unculturable lands :- They include mountains river beds etc. i.e. lands which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a very high cost.

Culturable Waste :- This includes land which can be brought under cultivation but have not been cultivated or having been cultivated for some time have not been cultivated during current year and the last five years or more in succession.

Current fallows :- Lands which are left fallow during the current year only.

Other fallows :- All lands which have been cultivated, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years.

Gross Cropped area :- This is the sum of areas under all crops and represent the sum of net area sown and area sown more than once in a year.

Yield rates/crops:- They are expressed in terms of kg per hectare for almost all crops except sugarcane and cotton. Yield rate of sugarcane is given in terms of Gur and is in kg per hectare, and that of cotton in terms of hundred bales of 180 Kg. each. Yield rates are based on the estimates obtained from the crop estimation surveys conducted on sample basis.

Minor Irrigation Workes:- Work involving an expenditure of less than Rs. 20 lakh is treated as 'Minor Irrigation Work'. Works with potential irrigable area upto 250 acra is entrusted to the Zilla Parishads while those above 250 acres to the Irrigation Department.

Agricultural Wage Rates:- Monthly average rates based on data collected fortnightly from three selected centres in the district are presented.

2.9 Animal husbandry, Forests and Fisheries

Data on livestock number, Veterinary, recognised slaughter houses, major and minor forest produce etc. are given in dissection. Livestock Census is carried out every five years. The last Census was done in 1972 data of which is reproduced in this issue. The entire area under the control of Forest Department is classed as forest area by that department though some area in forest might have been brought under cultivation and classed as such by the Agricultural department in their agricultural statistics. This explains the variation in the area under forests as given in forest Statistics that reported by the Agril Deptt. and shown in

2.10 Employment, Industry, Electricity and Mining:-

Under this section statistics on the various subjects mentioned above is presented. The data on factory statistics is of factories registered under Factories Act-1948. Viz. those employing 10 or more workers with aid of power and those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power.

2.11 Co-operation

Comprehensive statistics on various types of Co-operative Societies, Co-operative Banks, Regulated Markets and Money lenders is displayed in the tables under this section. The Co-operative year starts in July and ends in June.

2.12 Public Health

Data regarding medical and public health facilities, birth and death statistics, family planning is incorporated in this section.

2.13 Education

Statistical data on subjects like literacy, number of students, teachers, backward class beneficiaries and concessions to the economically/Backward classes, expenditure on education etc. presented in the tables under this section. Some of the data is based on the 1971 Census while in respect of other the data for the latest year is incorporated under this section.

2.14 Transport & Communication.

Important Statistics on traffic census, road length, rail length, motor vehicles in operation, operational statistics of the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation, Posts, telegraphs and telephones, rural broadcasting statistics are given in this section.

2.15 Local Bodies.

Classified Income and Expenditure statistics of the Zilla Parishad, the Village Panchayats and the Municipal Councils is presented in this section.

2.16 Plan and Community Development

Plan expenditure under different development sub heads, physical achievements under plan, data on Community Development Programme and expenditure incurred in different stages of the block are included in this section. The data are collected by the District Statistical Office,

2.17 Prices.

Wholesale Prices of certain regulated agricultural commodities in the district and retail prices prevailing at the district head quarter, the Consumer price Indices of Sholapur and Poona Centres are included in this section. It may be noted that the retail price statistics reported for a given commodity is restricted to only one quotation collected from a specified shop in the district head quarter. The average price shown for a commodity, therefore, cannot be said to be fully representative. The data may prove to be useful only as a broad indicator of the trend in price changes over a period of time. The data are for calendar year.

2.18 Miscellaneous.

This section covers statistical data on subjects such as Police Force and Crimes, Insurance, Small Savings, News Papers, Periodicals and Land Revenue etc. In case of Land Revenue, the amount of remission is taken as reduction in the demand of the land revenue, suspension taken as addition to arrears as the amount is to be collected in subsequent year. The figures of Land Revenue are exclusive of cess.

2.19 Trends in Selected Indicators.

Trends in important items such as population, agriculture, livestock, electricity, industry, education, health etc. are given for the years 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67 & 1970-71 to 1973-74. Cultivable area for which an indicator is worked out, includes net area sown, current fallows, other fallows, land under miscellaneous trees and groves not included in net area sown and cultivable waste land. Length of surface roads is another indicator. The surface roads/all roads excluding Municipal roads, include

CHAPTER - III
AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS 1932-74

3.1 In part II of this Statistical Abstract, comprehensive data on the various aspects of Socio economic development are given. Utilising these data some derived tables are prepared in the following paragraphs which would give us broad indications regarding the progress or otherwise in the various socio-economic fields of this district.

3.2 AGRICULTURE.

Agriculture is even to-day the most vulnerable sector of the State's economy because it is still at the mercy of rains. Though two third of the population is dependent on agriculture, it continues to show low productivity despite planned efforts to increase agricultural production. The land available for cultivation is fixed, so the only recourse open to increasing production is by more intensive utilisation of the available land with better inputs and extension of irrigation facilities.

3.3 Considering the percentage of gross cropped area to net areasown the tahsilwise picture is seen as below.

3.4 The data shows that the gross cropped area declined by one percent in 1965-66 by 2 in 1971-72 & 1972-73 as compared to total position. This is not a comfortable trend. Turning to the tahsilwise position it is seen that except in Chandgad tahsil the percentage of gross cropped area to net sown area is found to have decreased. It has remained constant when compared to 1960-61 data. The picture continued to be dismal in the subsequent years also.

3.5 In terms of absolute hectares, the year 1972-73 shows a slight improvement in terms of both gross cropped area and net sown area. The gross cropped area increased from 409,514 ha. in 1971-72 to 409,706 ha. in 1972-73 while net sown area increased from 4,05,326 ha to 4,06,967 ha. during the same period.

3.6 IRRIGATION

The net irrigated area in Kolhapur district in 1971-72 and 1972-73 was 47,344 hectares and 32,894 hectares respectively (figures are reported as provisional). In 1960-61 this area was 33,203 hectares. The net increase in irrigated area was only 25 percent during the period 1960-61 to 1971-72. However there appears to be a sudden rise of 74 percent in the year 1972-73 as compared 1971-72. As stated earlier the figures are provisional.

3.7 Tahsilwise data on irrigation indices are given below. They are to be judged taking into account the provisional nature of the data for the years 1971-72 and 1972-73.

2.8 Excepting Hatkanagale tahsil there appears to be sudden increase in the indices of net irrigated area in all the tahsils.

2.9 The above indices are worked out on the basis of actual increase in irrigated area over years. This aspect can be studied from another angle. It is interesting to study whether the percentage of irrigated area to net area sown has undergone any change.

3.10 The above table shows significant increase in the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area in 1972-73 in a number of tahsils especially in Kavir, Shirol, Bhudargad and Kadhanagari.

3.12 The following observations are made from the above data.

1) The percentage of area under food crops in 1971-72 and 1972-73 dwindled as compared to the year 1960-61. The percentage has slightly improved in 1972-73 over 1971-72.

2) Conversely the percentage of nonfood crops has increase in 1971-72 & the following year in comparison with 1960-61.

3) Rice is the predominant cereal crop of this district. More than one fifth of the total cropped area is under rice. The decline in its percentage area during 1971-72 to 72-73 is not very significant.

4) The percentage of area under sugarcane which was only 7.50 in 1960-61 rose to 10.37 in 1972.73. This is a significant rise.

3.13 YIELD RATES

3.13 Maharashtra State is not still self sufficient so far as food production is concerned. As the land available for cultivation is limited, increase in yield rates becomes the crux of the agricultural strategy. Use of hybrid and high yielding varieties, supply

of fertilisers, insecticides etc. have been projected on a large scale and campaigns undertaken every year.

3.14 In view of the above, following table is prepared to find out if it can throw light on the achievements in the field of crop yield rates.

3.15 The year 1972-73 was one of the abnormal years, and scarcity conditions prevailed due to drought through out the district. As many as 623 villages out of 1093 in the district were affected by chronic drought conditions while 234 villages had conditions akin to scarcity.

3.15 The yield rates during 1972-73 suffered a heavy set back for almost all crops excepting the crops Ragi and Sugarcane. Ragi is a crop which is usually taken in the western parts of the district where rainfall usually is quite assured and the crop is of short duration. The drought conditions in 1972-73 did not affect this crop much. So also sugarcane which is entirely grown on irrigation showed no effect of drought conditions. However, turning to the indices of food crops like rice, jowar, gram & tur in the earlier years viz 1971-72 it is observed that they have not reached the level of yield rates prevailed in the base year 1960-61. Cash crops, however, maintained their yield rates within close limits of the yield rates in 1960-61.

3.17 The year 1972-73 has proved that the agricultural production in the district is still predominantly dependent on the rainwater.

3.13 AGRICULTURAL CREDIT

The co-operative societies considerably meet the needs of credit facilities of the cultivators. The primary co-operative societies have covered almost all the villages in the district. They advance short and medium term loans. The number of primary agricultural credit societies increased from 791 in 1960-61 to 379 in 1973-74. Their membership also rose from 1.41 lakh in 1960-61 to 2.45 lakh. During 1960-61 amounting to Rs. 365 lakh were advanced to cultivators while in 1973-74 advances amounted to Rs. 1447 lakh. The average loan per member was Rs. 259 in 1960-61. In 1973-74 the average loan is of the order of Rs. 539. While the credit facilities are on an increasing scale, the overdues are increasing at an alarming rate. They reflect very badly on the financial soundness of the co-operative institutions.

3.19 AGRICULTURAL WAGE RATES

The wage rates data collected from the three rural centres-Shirol, Madilge Bl and Kapshi show that the wage rates at centre Shirol are always on a higher side owing to proximity of urban areas, such as Jaysingpur and Kurundwad. The average wage a male and a female worker used to get was below Rs. 1.50 and Rs. 1.00 respectively in Kapshi and Madilge centres in 1965. In Shirol it was Rs. 2.04 for males and Rs. 1.25 for females then. In 1970 the wage rates were Rs. 1.33 for males in Kapshi and Rs. 2.03 at Madilge as against Rs. 3.13 in Shirol.

3.20 In 1972 the average wage rates for males in Shirol were Rs. 3.64 as against Rs. 2.33 in Madilge and Rs. 2.00 in Kapshi. For females the wages were 2.72 (Shirol), 1.32 (Madilge) and Rs. 1.32 (Kapshi)

3.21 The maximum wage rate offered to a male worker at Shirol & Madilge was Rs. 4.00 in 1972 as against Rs. 2.50 at Napashi. The maximum wage rates for female worker was Rs. 3.00 at Shirol, 2.00 at Madilge and Rs. 2.50 at Napashi.

3.22 ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

Animal husbandry plays an important supporting role of supplementing food programme and also provides greater avenues of employment in rural areas. It still provides drought power to cultivation

3.23 The Eleventh quinquennial Livestock census was carried out in 1972. The comparative picture of livestock and poultry emerging from the last two censuses is as below

3.24 The total livestock population has increased by 6 percent during the five year period 1956 to 1972. The cattle population has however declined by 3 per-cent while buffaloes show a big rise of 13 percent. Poultry has increased by a very insignificant margin during this period.

3.25 The number of milch animals per 1000 human population and the number of working bullocks per 100 hectares of gross cropped area in 1956 & in 1972 are shown below.

3.26 The No. of milch animals per unit has reduced in 1972 in all the tahsils of Polhapur district. The No. of working bullocks per unit has shown slight improvement in 1972 for the district as a whole. It has decreased in case of Farvir, Hatkanangile, Shirol, Nagal & Gaganbavda tahsils.

3.27 CONSUMPTION OF ELECTRICITY

Electricity occupies a very important place in the economy of any State. Not only industrial but agricultural development also depends on the extent of electrification. With rapid use of electric pump sets for irrigation the demand for electricity is increasing at a very fast rate.

3.28 The per capita consumption of electricity serves as an indicator in this respect. The per capita consumption was 12.37 KWH in 1960-61. It was 92.34 KWH in 1970-71 and 39.62 KWH in 1972-73. This rose to 127.21 KWH in 1973-74. The indications for the years

1972-73 & 1973-74 are based on the 1971 census Population. Allowance will have therefore to be made for increase in population. Even then the progress made in the short span of 1950-51 to 1973-74 is spectacular.

3.29 In Kolhapur district there are 1032 inhabited villages and 11 towns. The number of villages electrified is 327 as at the end of March 1974. All the 11 towns have already been electrified in the past. About 24 percent villages in the district still have no electricity.

3.30 EMPLOYMENT

The unemployed labour force contributes nothing to the national wealth but consumes it. This is a drag on the national economy. The Statistics available with the employment exchange is a useful indicator to show the gravity of unemployment situation. The data is of limited use because it reflects the position of unemployed population that is registered with the Employment Exchange. Comprehensive Statistics on the unemployed persons remaining outside the purview of the Employment Exchange and underemployed is lacking.

3.31 It will be seen that the position of employment is worsening as the years pass by. The percentage of unemployed finding jobs has fallen in the year 1973-74 as compared to the other two years. The registration has increased by more than one and half times in 1973-74 over 1950-51. The number remaining on live register of the Employment Exchange as unemployed at the end of the year

1973-74 is very large & calls for serious consideration.

3.32 PUBLIC HEALTH.

Medical and public health facilities are increasing every year both in the public sector as also in the private sector. Statistics of facilities in the private sector are unfortunately not collected on a full scale. Any attempt to build up indicators of development in this field to that extent suffer in accuracy.

3.33 The increase in medical facilities in public sector and their ratios to population is shown in the following table.

Further, The Doctor Patient ratio, which was 1 : 23963 in 1961, has come down to 1 : 15399 in 1973. This cannot be said to be satisfactory ratio. According to Mudliar Committee the ratio recommended is 1 : 3000. The number of beds has increased from 493 in 1961 to 923 in 1973. The progress is slow.

3.35 Another important indicator in the field of public health is the trend in birth rate and death rate.

3.36 The following table gives the relevant Statistics.

Education is the most effective means for rapid economic & social progress. It provides opportunities for self elevation & economic betterment. Educational statistics at various levels serve as an indicator in this regard.

There has been an over all increase in respect of Primary Secondary and Higher education. The increase in the case of girls under Primary and Secondary education is remarkable. The rise in the number of boys at the Primary and Secondary level is same (Viz: 4). However, the increase at higher level is double that of the rise at the Primary & Secondary levels.

Another indicator in the field of education is the ratio of pupils to teachers. The following table will reveal the comparative data in this respect.

3.41 The ratio of pupils per teacher has increased in case of both Primary and Secondary education in 1972-73 over 1971-72. The increase is conspicuous in case of Primary education indicating the fact that the number of primary teachers has not increased at the rate commensurate with the increase in the number of pupils at primary level. In case of higher education ratio has come down by 2 in the year 1972-73. There was one teacher per 23 students at higher level in 1971-72. The number decreased to 21 students per teacher in 1972-73. The ratios of pupils per teacher can be said to be satisfactory.

3.42 BANKING

With the growing awareness of the need to cater to the rural credit requirements the number of branches of the commercial and Co-operative banks opening the rural areas is on the increase. During the decade 1961-71 the number of banking offices in Kolhapur district increased from 51 to 130. In 1973 the number rose to 164 of which 97 were branches of co-operative banks alone. These banking offices are spread over 52 towns and villages in the district. Considering the entire population of the district the ratio of No. of banks to a lakh population works out to 3.01 for 1973. This ratio was 2.3 in 1961 and 6.3 in 1971. Thus it is seen that the number of banking offices per lakh population has increased by two and half times in 1973 over 1961 position. This is remarkable progress over a short period.

3.43 TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION.

rail length underwent no change. However, road length has considerably increased since 1961. In 1961 the road length was 1764 km. It was 2782 km. in 1971 by March 1974, the length reached the level of 3834 km.

3.44 The indicator of road length per 100 sq. km. area works out to 47.7 for 1974. This compares very favourably with previous years indicators viz. 21.86 km. for 1961 & 34.52 for 1971.

3.45 PRICES

The General index for Solapur Centre (base 1950=100) and pune centre (base year 1961) rose to 277 and 239 respectively in the year 1973-74.

3.46 Food prices shot up very high than Prices of other groups. Next to food, prices of clothing groups have shown steep rise in 1973-74. Housing is the only group where the price rise is the least.

CHAPTER - IV

ANNUAL PLAN 1973-74.

4.1 The year 1973-74 was the Last year of the Fourth Five Year Plan.

4.2 The total expenditure on all the district level plan schemes in 1973-74 amounted to Rs. 391.51 lakh. Out of this the expenditure on the district level plan schemes of the Maharashtra State was Rs. 346.09 Lakh and the rest of Rs. 45.42 lakh expenditure on the Centrally Sponcered Schemes.

4.3 The total budget provision for all the district level scheme (States as also Centrally sponcered) for 1973-74 was Rs. 400.89 lakh. Rs. 350.65 lakh for states plan schemes & Rs. 49.74 lakh for centrally sponcered schemes. The Plan Schemes are implemented through two sectors - State Government Offices and Local sector i.e. the Zilla Parishad Offices. The budget provision of Plan schemes implemented through these sectors sepa ately were :

Rs. 239.77 Lakh -State Sector.
Rs. 110.62 Lakh -Local sector.

Thus it will be seen that 72 percent of the total budget provision was in the state sector & 28 percent in the local sector.

4.4 The comparison of the expenditure to budget provision in 1973.74 reveals the following.-

- a) Percentage of total expenditure to total budget provision 98
- b) Percentage of expenditure on district level Plan Schemes under State Plan to the budget provision of these schemes is 99
- c) Percentage of expenditure under centrally sponcered Plan schemes to their budget provision is 91.
- d) Among district level plan schemes under state Plan & centrally sponcered schemes the figures of percentage of expenditure to budget provision under State Sector and Local sector are 97 and 99 respectively. It will thus be seen that the performance in both

the State Sector and local sector is very satisfactory so far as financial aspect is concerned.

4.5 The per capita expenditure on the district level plan Schemes in 1973-74 and in the earlier years is given below.

A State Plan Schemes

Of the provision of Rs. 350.65 lakh, Rs. 346.09 lakh have been spent in 19 73.74, on the district level Plan schemes under the state Plan. The percentage of expenditure to budget provision is 99 which is very satisfactory. The expenditure under the major heads C.D & Co-operation and Irrigation & Power has excelled the budget provision under them. The expenditure under the head Industry and Mining shows only 77 per cent expenditure during 1973.74. While that under the head Miscellaneous a very poor figure of 25 per cent. The progress of expenditure under the remaining heads is 88 percent and above which can be said to be fairly satisfactory.

4.9

Looking to column No. 3 of the above Table it will be observed that the major share of expenditure is on two heads of development viz. Social services 53 per cent and agricultural programme 25 per cent. The head Irrigation and Power accounts for 11 per cent while the head Transport and Communication accounts for 7 per cent. The expenditure on the rest of the heads of development is comparatively insignificant.

4.10

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME

Agricultural development occupies a very high position among the core sector items of plan programme. The aim behind undertaking various schemes of expanding irrigation facilities, soil

conservation, supply of hybrid and highyielding varieties of seeds, chemical fertilisers etc is to maximise agricultural production. Besides, there are a number of other schemes to enhance production in the fields allied to agriculture viz. forest, fisheries, dairy etc.

4.11 The table given below will show the subhead-wise expenditure under the major head Agricultural Programme.

4.12 AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION

The provision for schemes under the Sub-Head Agricultural Production was Rs. 7.39 lakh in 1973.74. The expenditure incurred was Rs. 7.52 lakh. This is 95 percent of the budget provision. In the year 1972.73 the percentage was 97 and the budget provision was Rs. 3.53 lakh then. Both the actual expenditure and the percentage expenditure in 1973.74 fell short of the achievement in the previous year.

4.13 The important schemes under the sub-head Agricultural Production were Development of local manurial resources, integrated area development, horticultural development, Community wells, plant protection etc. The important targets fixed under various schemes and targets achieved are shown in the following table.

4.14 It is seen that none of the targets fixed for 1973-74 has been fully attained excepting that of town Compost.

4.15 MINOR IRRIGATION

The expenditure on the schemes under Minor Irrigation sub-head exceeded the budget provision by 25 per cent in 1973.74. In the previous year the expenditure fell short of the Provisions by 7 per cent. However compared to the year 1972.72, the budget provision & expenditure during 1973.74 have been found to be very much less.

4.16 Even with the extra 25 per cent expenditure the targets fixed for 1973.74 do not seem to have been attained satisfactorily. Only 99 wells have been constructed^(S3) as against the target of 340 wells; 196 pump sets installed against the target of 580 sets and 3 bandhas as 4 Tanks and 3 weirs completed against the targets of 11,14 and 7 respectively. The irrigation potential created by these together is 633 hectares.

4.17 SOIL CONSERVATION

The expenditure on the schemes under this sub head in 1973-74 was 85 per cent of the budget provision (97 per cent in the previous year). The actual budget provision & expenditure in 1973.74 is however much more than that of the previous year .

4.18 The achievements of the schemes under the sub head-soil conservation are as shown below-

4.19 The targets fixed for 1973-74 have been achieved fully. In facts, the achievement has exceeded the targets of bunding and terracing of area.

4.20 ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

 There was only one scheme of providing veterinary aid centre under this sub head and the budget provision was only Rs. 25000. The amount has been practically fully utilised.

4.21 DAIRY DEVELOPMENT

 The financial achievement under the scheme of Town milk supply has been very poor viz. 6 %. The entire provision was for purchase of equipment & machiner which could not be procured during 1973-74. The expenditure on the other scheme namely Assistance to milk Union Federation has been in excess of the budget provision during 1973-74.

4.22 The target of milk handling per day was fixed at 40,000 litres for 1973.74. The milk handled per day during 73.74 was 36,000 litres only. 22 societies were to be assisted under the other scheme. The target has been fully achieved.

4.23 FORESTS

 The expenditure on the schemes under this sub head has been 100 per cent during 1973.74. It was 96 per cent in 1972.73 .

4.24 The targets fixed for 1973.74 for all the schemes were fully achieved.

4.25 FISHERIES

 The expenditure was 76 per cent of the budget provision for the schemes under this sub-head during 1973.74. In 1972.73 this

was 65 per cent of the budget provision.

4.26 The target of construction of nursery was not achieved, target of fish production was 50 lakh number, however only 29.20 lakh could be produced. The number of fingerlings stocked was 4.70 lakh against the target of 10.00 lakh and 47739 kg. of fish was netted as against the target of 20,000 kg. during 1973-74. Under the scheme of fishery requisites, 441 kg. of nylon was supplied against the target of 260 kg.

4.27..... WAREHOUSING AND MARKETING

There was only one scheme of giving subsidy to agricultural marketing Societies during 1973-74 & the budget provision was very small viz. Rs. 1000. Two societies were to be given the subsidy. The target is fully achieved.

4.28 CO-OPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The budget provision for the schemes under this sub-head was Rs. 12.30 Lakh and this forms a very small fraction of the total budget provision for 1973-74. The actual expenditure was Rs. 12.75 lakh exceeding the target by nearly 4 per cent. As compared to the previous year the budget provision and expenditure during 1973-74 are found to be less. In 1972-73 the expenditure was Rs. 320.37 lakh against the provision of Rs. 20.90 lakh.

4.29 Most of the targets fixed under this sub head for the year 1973-74 were fully achieved.

4.30 IRRIGATION AND POWER

There were no district level schemes under the sub head Irrigation during the Fourth Five year plan. The irrigation projects such as Tulshi, Warna were considered as divisional level schemes. They do not form part of the schemes to be reviewed at the district level. Under power Projects there were two schemes viz. Rural electrification and normal Development (urban). The budget provision communicated was Rs. 12.00 lakh. However the actual expenditure is more than three times the provision in 1973-74.

4.31 This district has been very much ahead of others in the field of rural electrification. Of the 1092 villages in this district 324 villages were electrified up to the end of the year 1972-73. During 1973-74 additional 8 villages have been electrified. Under the Normal Development programme 2722 single phase, 229 three phase and 6 H.T. connections were provided. The No. of pump sets energised was 1790.

4.32 INDUSTRY AND MINING

The budget provisions for the schemes under this head form a very negligible fraction of the total budget provision for district level plan Schemes in 1973-74. Rs. 65000 have been spent out of the provision of Rs. 24000 for 3 schemes under this head.

4.32 Under the schemes under this head, 6 handloom Societies, 20 small scale handicrafts societies and 55 artisans were given financial assistance for their Industries development. The target has been fully achieved.

4.33 TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

Out of the total budget provision of Rs. 850.35 lakh on the State Plan Schemes, 7 per cent provision was on the schemes under this major head. Out of Rs. 25.73 lakh provision, the amount spent was Rs. 25.71 lakh i.e. nearly 100 percent expenditure. During 1972-73 the expenditure was Rs. 25.33 lakh against the provision of Rs. 31.85 lakh.

4.33 The expenditure was on construction of new roads, roads in hilly and inaccessible areas, and village roads, and black topping programme. Construction of 3 km. District Roads was envisaged during 1973-74. This has been fully achieved, 6 bridges and 14 km. of roads in hilly areas were envisaged of which 3 bridges were completed and 14 km. of roads were constructed in hilly areas. Under the scheme of Village Roads 23 km of road length was constructed against the target of 30 km. length and 11 cross drains were fully achieved as planned. Black topping of 8 km. length of road was envisaged to be completed during 1973-74. This was fully achieved.

4.36 SOCIAL SERVICES

The sub-head-wise plan provision and expenditure under the major head Social Services is shown in the following table.

The budget provision during 1973.74 under the head Social Services claims major chunk of the total budget provision of the State Plan Schemes, viz: 56 per cent. Among the sub heads under Social Services, General Education and water supply and drainage are the two important sub heads claiming bulk of the provision under the head Social Services. Expenditure on sub-head water supply and drainage was 100 percent while that on General Education 94 per cent. Expenditure on sub-head Health, welfare of Backward classes and Labour welfare was 88, 99 and 82 per cent respectively. The budget provision for Technical Education was Rs. 1.93 lakh. Only Rs. 1.02 lakh were spent i.e. 53 percent while expenditure on housing was only 22 per cent i.e. Rs. 1.33 Lakh out of Rs. 5.13 Lakh provision. No amount has been spent on the scheme under Urban Development though the provision was quite sizeable viz. Rs. 2.34 Lakh. No Municipal Councils came forward with the proposals to claim financial assistance for implementing their developmental plans under the scheme under Urban Development during

The achievements under the various plan schemes under General Education are of the nature of appointments, imparting training and grant of scholarships or freeships concessions. To cite a few achievements 136 primary teachers have been appointed under the scheme of Expansion of primary Education Grants to Municipal School Boards. Additional 6 A.D. E.Tr. & have been appointed, 10 Head Masters post filled in on Municipal School Boards. 20 Schools have been benefitted under the scheme of Development of Non-Government Secondary Schools, 40 Teachers received training benefits under the schemes of preprimary teachers Training while 33 trainees received C.P.Ed. training under Elementary teachers training (C.P.Ed). In Service training was imparted to 571 teachers. E.B.C. concessions were granted to 4537 students. The number of children benefitted under the scheme Concessions to children of Primary Teacher was 700.

The Government polytechnic Kolhapur received funds under the scheme of consolidation of Government Polytechnics. The funds could not be fully utilised by the polytechnic for a number of reasons. Equipment required for reorientation of Diploma course in engineering Technology is yet to be procured.

The number of Student Nurses imparted practical training during 1973-74 was 149. Under the Primary Health Centres Scheme the work of 5 staff quarters is in progress.

Under Government water supply scheme 2 works out of 9 are completed during 1973-74. Pipeline work in Shivaji Udyam-nagar, water supply to Mahatma Phule Housing Society, Kolhapur and installation of turbine pumping set at Murundwad works are completed. Fixing of 600 water meters to Kolhapur water works is also completed, remaining work is in progress. Under the Municipal water Supply Schemes 4 works

were completed out of 11. Improvement to Furundwad Piped water Scheme work, sink of jack well at Malkapur, Vadgaon piped water Scheme and sewer work, pumphouse, raising main, staff quarters and disposal site work under the Polhapur Drainage scheme are completed, Under village piped water Scheme 8 works are completed out of 52 in hand. The rest are in progress, Under the simple measures schemes 131 wells have been constructed against the target of 523.

HOUSING

Construction of tenements under Low Income Group

Housing, was already completed in the previous year i.e. No new construction were undertaken during 1973-74. Extension of Goshan Scheme was implemented in 3 villages against the target of 10 slated for 1973-74. Tiles were provided to 60 huts under the Scheme of roofing of roofs of huts. The target was fully achieved.

URBAN DEVELOPMENT

As stated earlier the scheme of Financial Assistance to Municipal Councils could not be implemented during 1973-74, as no Municipal Council submitted any proposals for assistance. There was no other Scheme sanctioned under the sub-head Urban Development during 1973-74.

4.44

WELFARE OF B.C. AND CLASSES

Most of the Schemes under this sub head are of the nature of granting assistance, Scholarships and bursaries etc. to B.Cs. B.C. hostels received grants worth Rs. 15000 during 1973-74. The number of B.C. Students to whom Scholarships were granted was 1555. The target was however 1750. The No. of irrigation wells dug for B.C. was 1 at a cost of Rs. 30,000. Under the scheme of Housing aid to B.Cs. 20 tenements received assistance worth Rs. 15,000.

4.45

LABOUR AND LABOUR WELFARE

Under this sub head only one scheme of craftsman training (I.T.I.) was implemented. Extension to main building and workshop has not yet started. The work is still in preliminary stage. Staff sanctioned has been filled up & deputed for training.

4.46

OTHER PROGRAMMES

Under the scheme of Rural Broadcasting 24 radio sets were installed against the target of 35 sets during 1973-74. Under the employment Guarantee Scheme, 17074 man days work has been utilised on various E.G.S. works in the district.

4.47

B- CENTRALLY SPONCERED SCHEMES.

Under the centrally sponsored schemes implemented in this district the plan provision was Rs. 49.74 lakh while expenditure was Rs. 45.42 lakh. Thus 91 per-cent of the plan provision has been spent in 1973-74. In the previous year budget provision was Rs. 52.32 lakh and 92 per-cent of this was actually spent in that year.

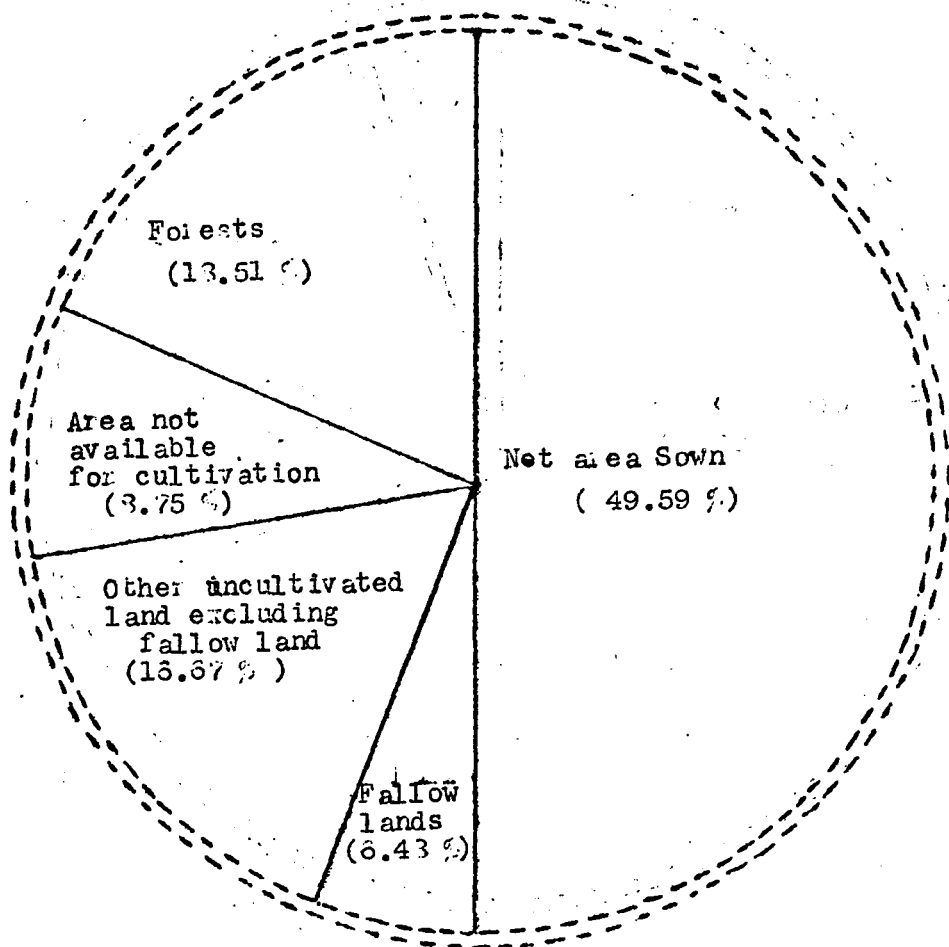
The salient physical achievements under the centrally sponsored schemes during 1973-74. are as below:-

The area brought under package practice (under maximising production of groundnuts for export) was 27245 hectares against the target of 22000 hectares only. Under the scheme of Mass training of Farmers 100 camps were targetted. and were held in 1973-74. Under applied Nutrition Programme one more C.D. block was covered as planned in 1973-74. The number of class rooms constructed was 15 for primary Schools. The target was fully achieved. 23 Graduate Head Masters were appointed in the central Primary Schools and 213 Primary teachers were appointed in Zilla Parishad Primary Schools. Under the Health Programme 22,733 family Planning operations were carried out against the target of 22,173. Under rural drinking water supply accelerated programme 3 works have been planned and undertaken. Under the schemes of welfare of mukta Jatis, 171 students got benefits of exemption of tuition fees, 2 wells were constructed for irrigation purpose 2 balwadies were started.

With the year ending March 1974, the Fourth Five Year Plan came to an end.

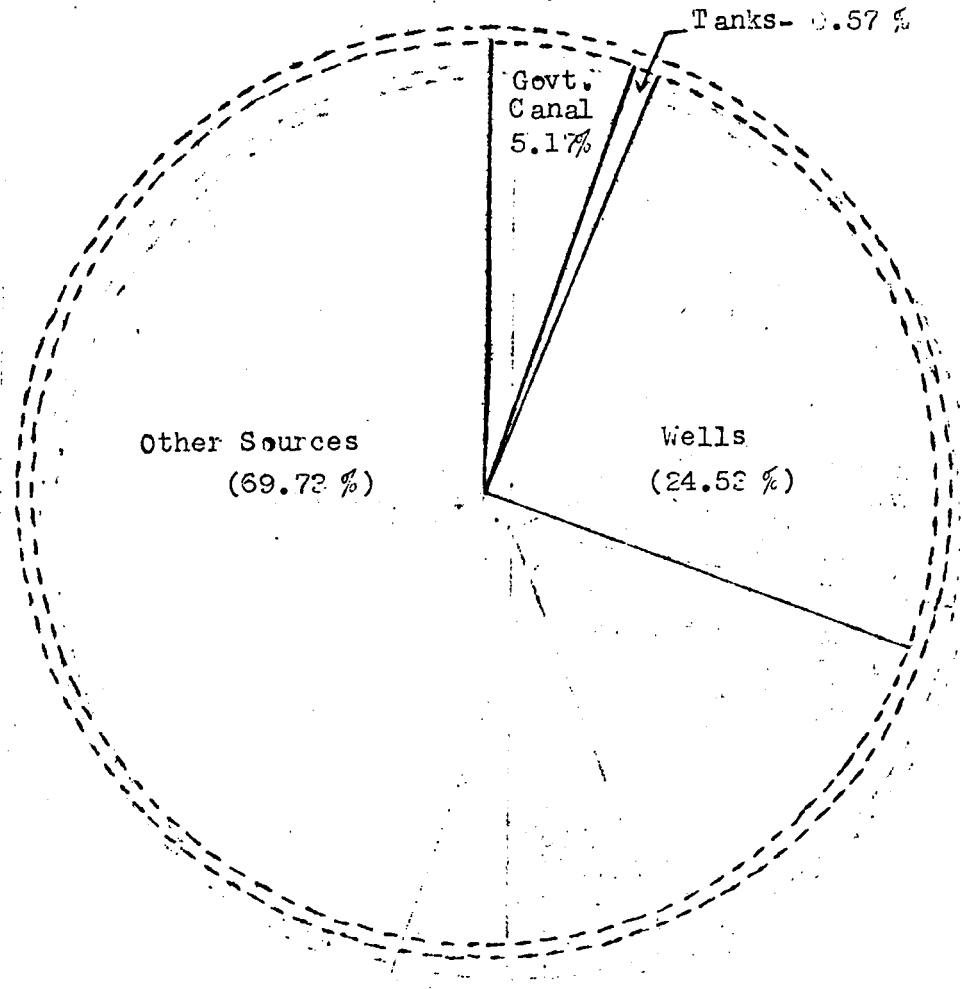
CHART NO. 1

Outturn Of Total Cereals And Pulses In Kolhapur District .

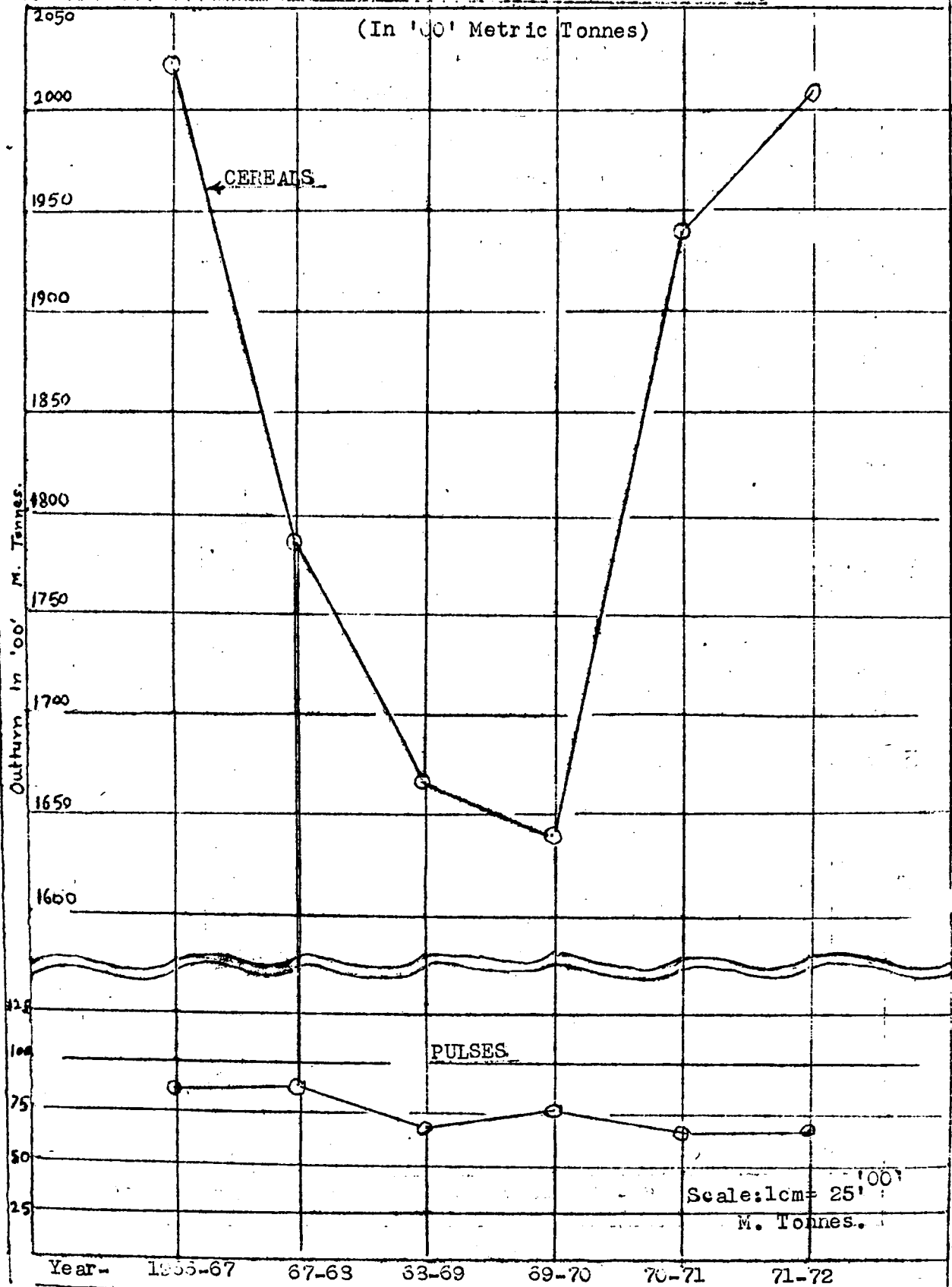


CHART NO. 4

(1967-68 To 1973-74)

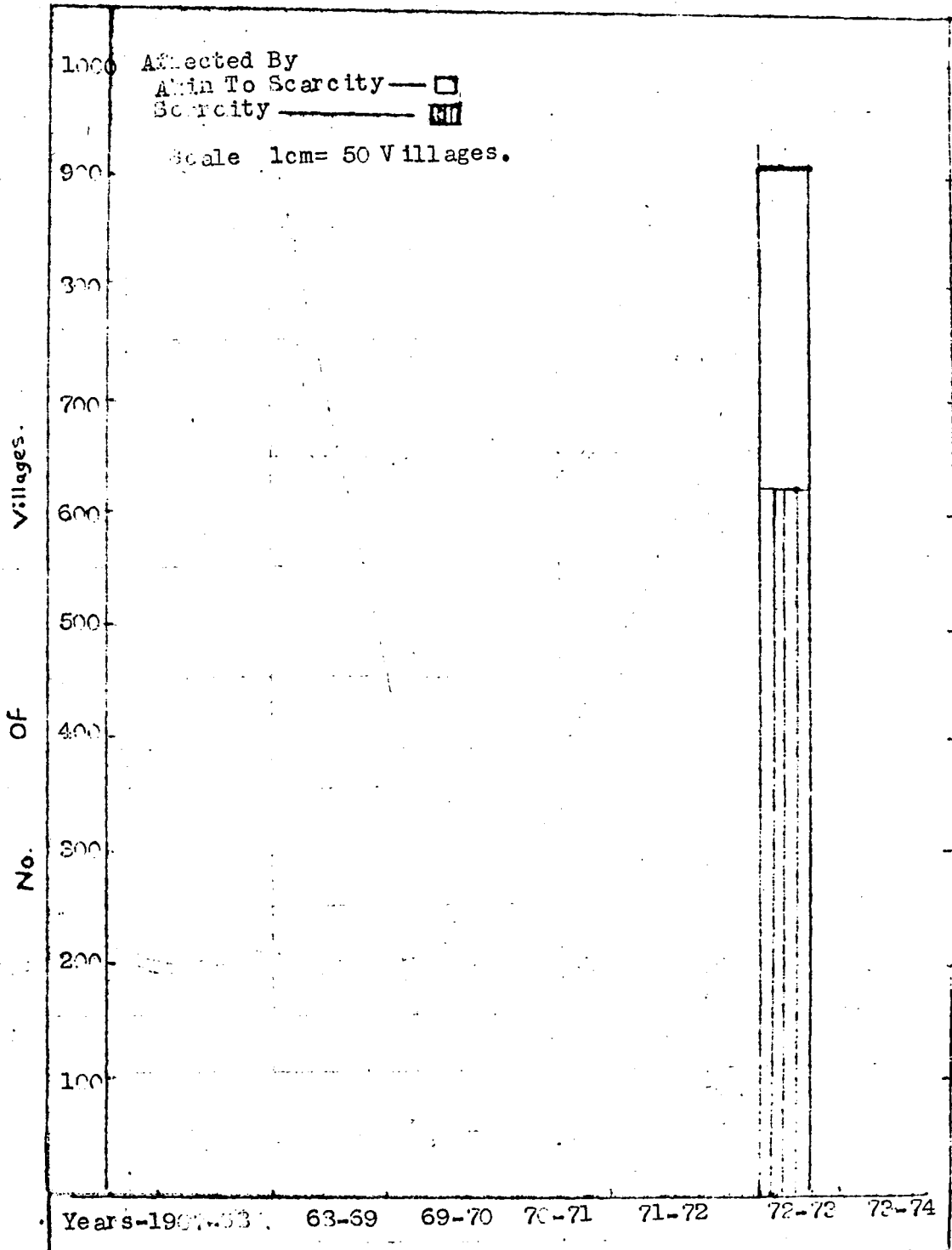
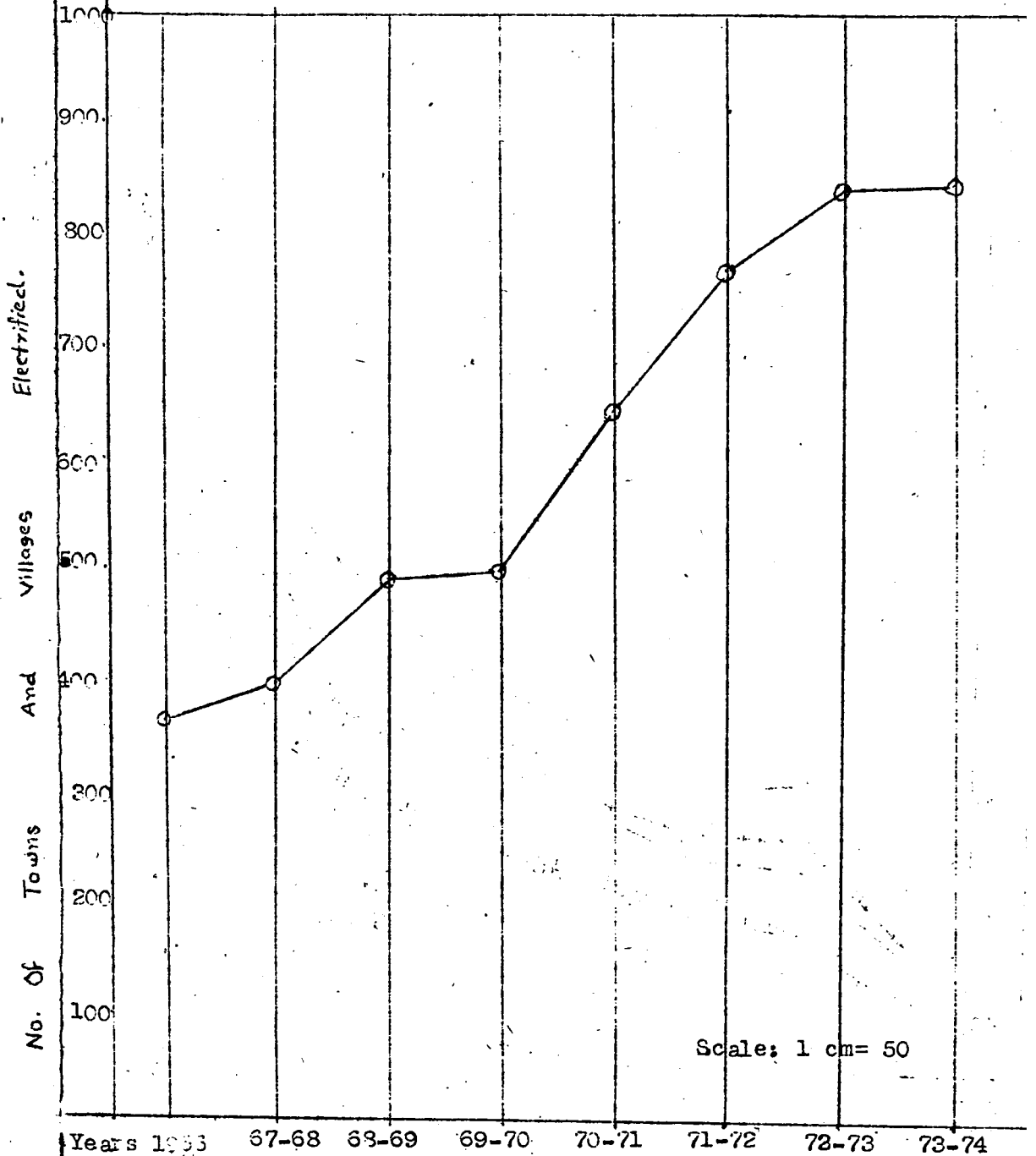

General And Food Indices Of Sholapur And Pune Centres.

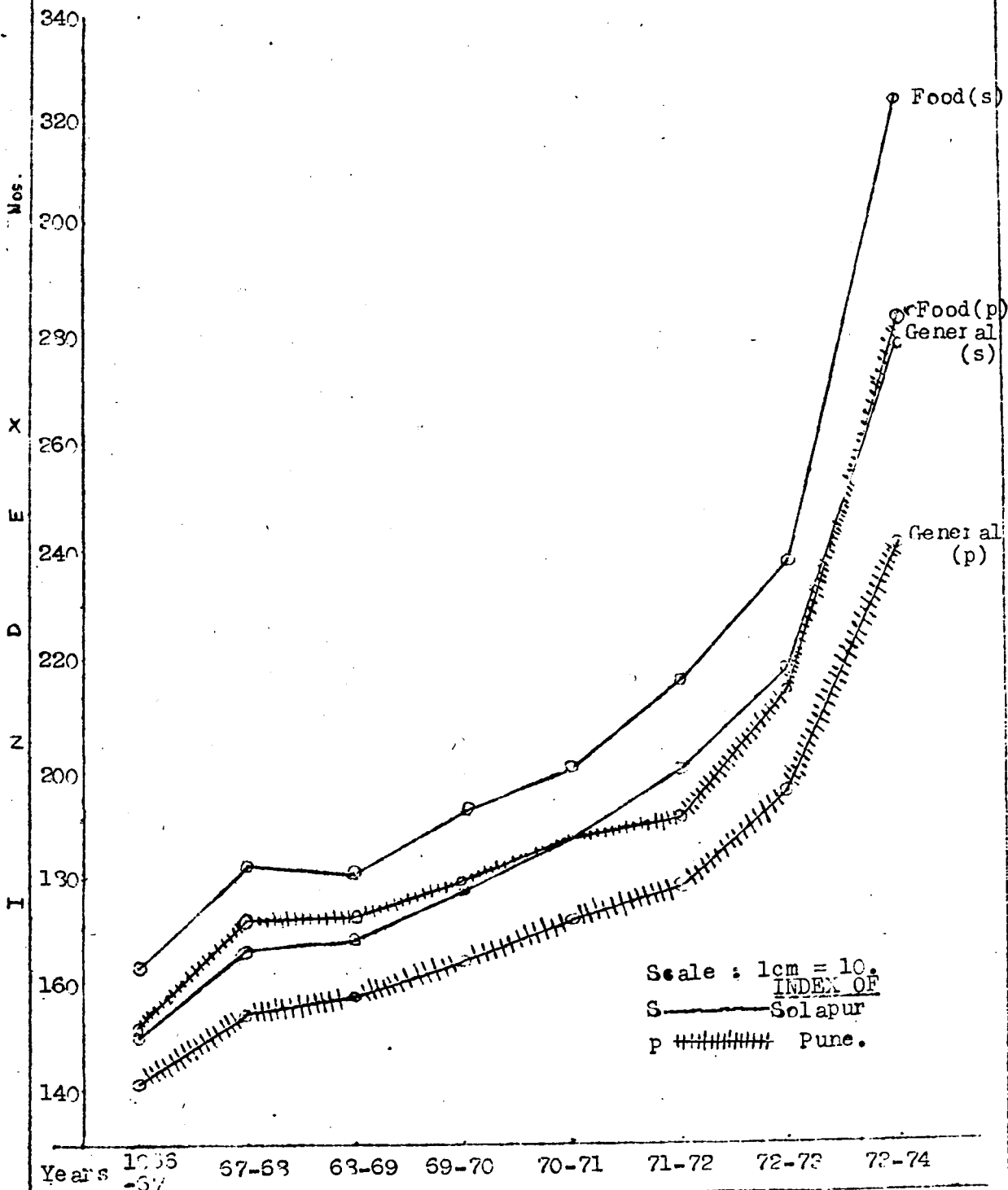
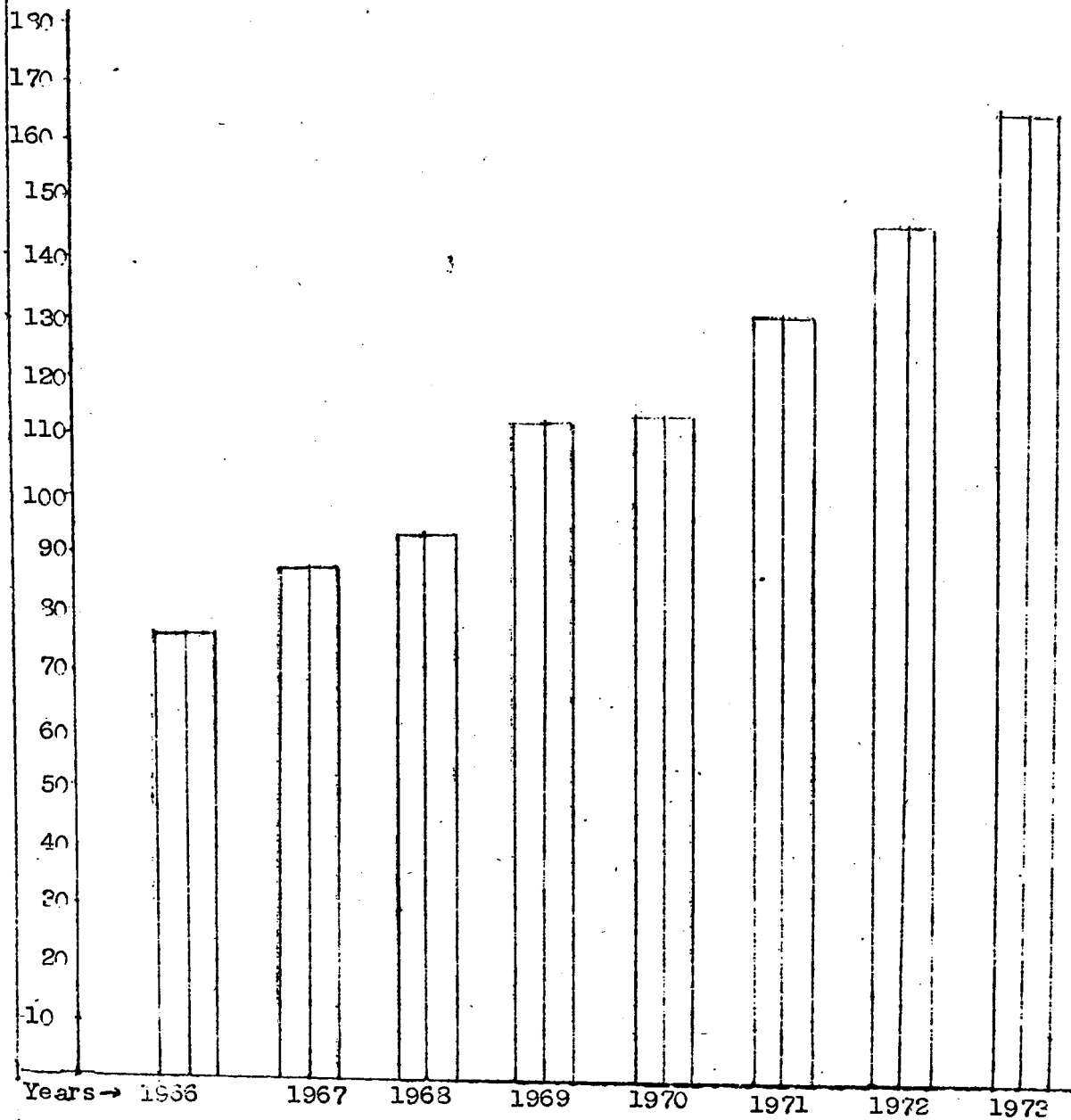
