CHAPTER : I
PHYSICAL FEATURES

1.1 LOCATION :

Kolhapur District lies in the Krishna, Panchaganga basin. The District lies between 15° and 17° North latitude and 73° and 74° East longitude. It is surrounded on the North by Satara district, on the South and East by Belgaum district of Mysore state. It has a fairly compact area and its major portion forms an irregular part of the South Deccan Plateau.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY :

1) Soil - The district can be divided into three broad soil zones (a) the western part covered with laterite soils (tembadi mati); (b) the fertile central part, with brownish well-drained soils; and (c) the dry eastern zone covered with medium to deep black soil of varying depth.

Laterite soils occur mainly in the western parts of Karveer and Bhudargad talukas and Ajara mahal and the whole of Shahuwadi and Radhanagari talukas and Panhala and Bawada mahals. They are red to brownish red in colour. They are not retentive of moisture and are fit for raising hill millets alone. Paddy is however grown on them in the valleys.

Brown soils (halvi kali mati) are found in the talukas of Hat-Kanangle, Karvir and Radhanagari and in parts of Bhudargad taluka and Ajara mahal in the transition tract. They are rich and fertile soils. Rice, Jowar and groundnuts are grown on them in the kharif season. Sugarcane and vegetables are grown where irrigation facilities are available.

1.2 SOIL(contd.)

Medium to deep black soils(Madhyam or bhari kali mati) are found in the talukas of Shivol, Hatkanangle, Karveer, Kagal and Gadhinglaj. The soils are deep in the river valleys. These lands are quite fertile and yield good crops of kharif jowar and groundnuts. They are fairly rich in phosphorus contents and the crops respond well to the application of Nitrogen. The soils are amenable to irrigation and paddy, sugarcane and vegetables are grown on them successfully.

(2) RIVERS

The main rivers of this district are Krishna, Varna, Panchaganga, Dudhaganga and Hiranyakeshi. The Varna has a south eastern trend in upper reaches. Its length is 130 Kms. It acts as a boundary between this district and Sangli district for its entire length. It merges with Krishna in Shivol Taluka. The Panchaganga is formed by four streams, the Kasari, the Kumbhi, the Tulsi and the Bhogawati. The south western region of the district is principally drained by Dudhaganga and her important tributary the Vedganga. The rivers Varna, Panchaganga, Dudhaganga and Vedganga merge into Krishna before it leaves the district. Hiranyakeshi which has a length of about 80 Kms in this district meets Krishna in Mysore State. All these rivers are important in that sugarcane is extensively grown on the banks of these rivers by lift irrigation.

(3) HILL RANGES :

Main part of the district is traversed by the Sahyadree in the West. The Sahyadree has thrown several spurs in the east of the district and in this range some points are as high as 900 meters above the mean sea level. The major portion of the district is 390 to 550 metres above the mean sea level. The average height is about 560 metres above the mean sea level.

4) MINERALS:-

Major portion of the district is covered with Deccan trap. In these tracts there are very large areas containing deposits of high grade bauxite in sufficient quantities. Bauxite forms the chief raw material in Aluminium industry. The mineral bauxite is known to occur at several places like Radhanagari, Gargoti, Waki, Dhanagarwad, Rangewadi and Udegiri. The quality of bauxite is fairly good and is suitable for producing aluminium. Recent survey undertaken by the Department of Geology and Mining near Udegiri has proved the presence of about 5.9 million tone of good quality of bauxite ore. The total reserve of bauxite in the district including Amboli Ghat is estimated at 40 million tone. A scheme of establishing an Aluminium Plant near Radhanagari Hydro-Electric works and at Koyana Hydro electric works was under consideration of the Ministry of Industries Govt. of India and the State Govt. A Joint Stock company in the Private sector has however obtained the rights of exploiting bauxite mines near Radhanagari area. The ore mined in the area would be transferred to the plant to be established near Belgaum of Mysore State. Power for this plant would be supplied by the Sharawati Hydro Electricity works.

Apart from Bauxite, Gypsum is found in very small quantity in Bhudargad Taluka of the district. Besides minerals of lesser economic importance like building stone (trap variety) are found in sufficient quantity all over the district.

1.3 CLIMATE AND TEMPERATURE

The district can roughly be divided into two zones marked by broad climate difference (a) western mountainous tract caused by the Sahyadree with its spurs with small valleys running in between these spurs and (b) the main eastern plain with little broken range hills. The height above mean sea level in the western Region ranges from 564 meters in the valley to 914 meters on the crest of Sahyadree. The elevation in the eastern plains varies from 500 Mts. to 580 mtrs. The rainy season starts from June and lasts upto the end of October. It is followed by cold weather from November to February and by hot weather from March to May. On the whole the climate is temperate and is not subject to abrupt changes or to extremes of heat or cold. The maximum temperature in the Summer season seldom rises above 38° C, while the minimum temperature in the winter rarely falls below 15° C. During the rainy season, temperature normally ranges between 19° C to 32° C.

Within the district, the season show local variations. In the western part near Sahyadris, it is always cooler than in the eastern part which is liable to hot winds during April and May. The nights over the whole district are generally cool due to the influence of the sea breezes which set in during the afternoons and continue till late in the evening.

It may be seen from the above table that the maximum temperature in the Summer Season seldom rises above 38.3 C., while the minimum temperature in the winter rarely falls below 15 C. The rainy season lasts from June to October and though the climate is wet during rains the temperature does not fall below 17 C and normally ranges between 19 C to 32 C due to which the climate is warm during these months. The winter season which starts from November and ends in February is dry. January is the coldest month of the year with the mean minimum temperature varying between 14 C to 18 C. It sometimes fall as low as 10 C. The hot season starts in March and ends in June. Though the days from 10 A.M. to 5 P.M. during the summer season are hot, the nights are fairly cool. The nights are very rarely sultry except in the far eastern part of the district. April and May are the hottest months of the year. The mean maximum temperature during these months varies from 35 C to 38 C the mean maximum even rises as high as 41.5 C. in the month of May. During 1965 the climate was fairly normal. Maximum temperature of 38.3 C was recorded in April while the minimum temperature, which was observed in January was 14.4 C.

1.4 RAINFALL AND NATURAL ZONE:

The district gets rain from the south-west as well as from north east monsoons. Throughout the district the rain falls from May to Nov. However, the main rainy season is from June to October.

According to the rain fall the district can be divided into five tracts as given below :-

1. Heavy rainfall tract :- Consists of Gagan Bawada, Ajara, Chandgad, Radhanagari and Shahuwadi talukas forming western part of the District and traversed by Sahyadri ranges and small valleys. The rainfall in this tract exceeds 2000 m.m. and at Gagan Bawada it exceeds 7000 m.m.
2. Large rain fall tract :- Consists of Bhudargad and Panhala and the rain-fall is between 1200 to 2000 m.m.
3. Sufficient rain fall tract :- Consists of Gadhinglaj and Karvir talukas where the rainfall is generally between 900 to 1200 m.m.
4. Rather insufficient rain fall tract :- Kagal taluka is having rainfall between 650 to 950 m.m.
5. Poor Rainfall tract :- The talukas of Shirol and Hat-kanangle may be included under this category as the rainfall is below 650 Km.

The heavy rainfall in western part may be due to the fact that the moisture laden clouds in eastward journey strike the crest of Sahyadri and release much of rain.

It will be interesting to give the deviation of actual rainfall for agricultural year 1965-66 (June 65 to May-66) from the normal rainfall for selected centres. Three centres, one each from heavy rainfall tract (Radhanagari), sufficient rainfall tract (Karvir) and poor rainfall tract (Shirol) are selected to study percentage deviation of rainfall in 65-66 to normal rainfall during different periods.

During the year 65-66 scarcity conditions were witnessed in the district. About 236 villages were affected by scarcity. Accent Ajara, Chandgad and Hatkanangle scarcity was felt in all other talukas in varying degrees. As regards monsoon rainfall in Radhanagari taluka, the percentage deviation of rainfall from normal rainfall was -15. In Karvir and Shirol talukas the corresponding percentages were +2 and -19. In Karveer taluka 31 villages were affected as monsoon rainfall was not timely and evenly spread. The scarcity conditions prevailed generally in heavy rainfall tract and sufficient rainfall tract as the monsoon rainfall was inadequate. This affected Kharif crops, especially and ~~the~~ paddy, jowar and Tur. Wheat and gram were also affected. The yield of groundnut also slightly decreased. The yield of tobacco increased in 1965-66 as compared to previous year as tobacco required lesser rainfall. In general kharif as also Rabi crops were adversely affected due to inadequate rainfall in major part of the District.

1.5 FAMINE AND SCARCITY :- There was no scarcity in Kolhapur District during 1966-67.

1.6 TERRITORIAL CHANGES DURING THE LAST 15 YEARS SINCE 1951:-

The Kolhapur District was formed in 1948 after the merger of former Kolhapur princely state with 8 Talukas and 3 Mahals. In 1956 the Chandgad Taluka of Belgaum district was transferred to Kolhapur district according to the recommendations of the States Reorganisation Commission. The Kolhapur district became a part of Maharashtra after the bifurcation of bilingual state of Bombay in May 1960. There has been no change in the area of Kolhapur District since 1961. Village Watangi from Gadhinglaj taluka was transferred to Ajara Mahal subsequent to 1961 Census.

1.7 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP :

State Government Administration - (1) Revenue :-

The Collector is in charge of general administration law and order, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies. For administrative purposes, the district is divided into three sub-divisions known as "Prants". Each sub-division is under a Prant Officer of the Revenue Department. The three sub-divisions are at 1) Gadhinglaj 2) Karveer and 3) Shahuwadi. The Headquarter of Gadhinglaj prant is at Gadhinglaj itself, the Headquarters of Karveer and Shahuwadi are Kolhapur.

The sub-divisionwise classification of talukas and mahala alongwith their areas, population, number of villages, towns etc. are given in the following table-

It may be seen from the above table that eight out of the 11 towns in the District are in Karvir sub-division and that Karveer division covers more than half of the population of the District.

(ii) JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT : Since 1953, the judiciary is completely separated from the Executive. The Judicial Department at the District level is headed by the District and Sessions Judge. He is assisted by Asstt. Judge and Additional Sessions Judge. They have jurisdiction over the entire District and they attend the civil and criminal work - both original and appellate.

There are also ten civil judges and first class judicial Magistrate with Headquarter at different taluka places in the district. They deal with regular civil suits of value of subject matter below Rs.10,000. They also try ordinary criminal cases. Some of the deal with municipal appeals.

There are three judicial magistrates first class with headquarters at Kolhapur. They have jurisdiction in municipal appeals. One of them has jurisdiction of Juvenile court and another has appellate jurisdiction in municipal appeals.

(iii) POLICE :- The Police force in the district works under the district Superintendent of Police who is assisted by two Deputy Superintendents and two Circle Police Inspectors. There are 19 Police Stations in the district.

Average number of villages and population per police stations in the district is 58 and 84,026 as against 69 and 62,547 in the State - respectively.

(iv) The Executive Engineer, Buildings and Communications Division looks after the maintenance and development of roads under his charge as also maintenance and construction of Govt. buildings.

(v) The Divisional Soil Conservation Officer undertakes soil conservation measures such as counter bunding as also terracing of land etc. He also looks after some of the schemes pertaining to Agricultural Department.

(vi) Malaria Officer looks after the eradication of Malaria in the District.

(vii) Employment Exchange:- The District Employment Officer maintains list of job-seekers and provides suitable candidates to the various officer on being notified the vacancies.

(viii) Agricultural Research Stations

There are four Agricultural Research Centres functioning in Kolhapur district. The Station at Shirolī taluka Hat'anangle has facility regarding research of sugarcane, while stations at Radha-nagari, Ajara and Gadhinglaj conduct research in respect of rice, horticulture and cereals and pulses respectively.

(ix) Cooperation :- The District Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies is in charge of cooperative movement in the district. He is assisted by two Asstt. Registrars who have territorial jurisdictions and deal with all the aspects of the cooperative movements in the district. In addition an Asstt. Registrar who has since been designated as Cooperation and Industries Officer works under the Zilla Parishad.

(x) Forest :- The Divisional Forest Officer with his Headquarters at Kolhapur is in charge of the Department and works under the Poona Circle. The forests are divided into eight ranges and each range is incharge of a range forest officer.

The Forests under the Revenue Department are looked after by collector of the District.

(xi) Others :-

The Civil Surgeon is in charge of the Civil Hospital. The Executive Engineer, Irrigation Division, looks after the irrigation projects.

Central Government Administration :-

There is Income-tax department located at Kolhanur. Six income tax officers are assigned different areas, the commissioner of income tax being located at Poona. There is Assistant Collector Central Excise at Kolhanur and there are three circle offices two at Kolhanur and one at Jaysingpur.

LOCAL BODIES ADMINISTRATION :

1) ZILLA PARISHAD : In accordance with the provisions contained in the Maharashtra Zilla Parishads and Panchayats Samities Act 1961, the Zilla Parishads and Panchayat Samities started functioning all over the State in May 1962. In Kolhapur District there are twelve panchayat samities within the zilla parishad. The jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad corresponds to the revenue district boundary. Similarly the boundaries of the twelve panchayat samities conterminate with the boundaries of the Talukas and Mahals. The Municipal limits, however, are excluded from the area of Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad covers 97.28 percent of the area of the District and 81.03 percent of the total population.

The Kolhapur Zilla Parishad has 53 directly elected members. In addition to this a woman member has been coopted by the elected members. Besides, there are also five associate councillors who are Chairmen of the five federal cooperative societies conducting business in the District.

The Panchayat Samiti consists of all the elected and coopted councillors from the Block area and Chairman of a cooperative conducting business of purchase and sale of agricultural produce in the Block as associate member. Sarpanchas of village panchayats are also elected members of the panchayat samiti, their number is at the rate of two for each electoral division in the Block area.

The Zilla Parishad has an elected president and vice-president from amongst its elected members. At panchayat samiti level, the samiti has an elected chairman, while the Block Development Officer appointed by the State Government acts as the secretary of the Panchayat Samiti.

An I.A.S. Officer works as the Chief Executive Officer of the Zilla Parishad at District level. He is assisted by Officers of the cadre of Class I or Class II who are heads of various departments of Zilla Parishad. All executive authority for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act vests with the Chief Executive Officer at District level and with the Block Development Officer at Panchayat Samiti level.

ii) MUNICIPALITIES :- There are ten municipalities in Kolhapur District. The municipalities are located at Kolhapur, Ichalkaranji, Jaysingpur, Kurundwad, Gadhinglaj, Kagal, Vadgaon, Murgud, Malkapur and Panhala. All the municipalities except Kolhapur and Ichalkaranji have population below 11,000 as per 1961 Census.

Public Bodies Administration :- As regards statutory bodies, there is a State Transport Division located at Kolhapur, whose jurisdiction does not correspond to District boundaries. There are two Divisions Urban and Rural of Maharashtra State Electricity Board, each Division being under the charge of Executive Engineer.

1.8 DEMOGRAPHY :-

(i) General :-

The total population of Kolhapur district as recorded in 1961 is 15,96,493. The population of the district is 15.4 percent of Poona Division and 2.9 percent of population of Maharashtra State. The rural population of Kolhapur District formed 80.72 percent of the total population. The corresponding percentages for Poona Division and Maharashtra State are 16.0 and 4.5. The urban population of Kolhapur district formed 13.4 percent and 2.8 percent of urban population of Poona Division and Maharashtra State respectively.

(ii) Growth of Population :-

The population of Kolhapur District had risen by 22.05 percent during the decade 1951-61. The corresponding growth rates for Poona - Division and Maharashtra State are 24.1 percent and 23.6 percent respectively. It will be seen that the growth rate has been lesser in the District than in Poona Division and State.

There are significant differences in the rates of growth of population in various talukas. Most densely populated talukas in the east have shown higher rates of growth. The western talukas of Chandgad, Radhanagari, Bawada and Ajara do not have urban areas and had comparatively smaller growth of population. The rates of variation in Hatkanangle (+ 33.50) are above district average while Bawada (* 11.62) has the lowest rate of growth. This is mainly due to urban centres in Hatkanangle and Karvir talukas and industrialization at these places. The growth rate for urban areas was 48.0 per thousand as against 18.9 per thousand for rural area in the decade 1951-61.

(iii) Density :- The density of population per square kilometer in the District, Poona Division and Maharashtra State are 193,139 and 129 persons per Sq. Km. Thus it will be apparent that density per Sq. Km. is highest in Kolhapur District as compared to Poona Division and the State. Hatkanangle, Karvir and Shirol talukas are situated in the very fertile Krishna Rm and Panchaganga basin are the most densely populated areas in the district. High density is also due to large urban centres like Kolhapur and Ichalkaranji. The western talukas are mostly hilly areas without any large urban centre and in spite of paddy cultivation, their density is lower. Chandgad and Shahwadi talukas make one fourth of the district's area but only one-eighth of its population, while Gadbinglaj, Hatkanangle, Kagal, Karvir and Shirol talukas together make 34.7 percent of districts area but 61.3 percent of its population. The density of population decreases as we go from east to west.

(iv) Literacy :- Comparative picture of literacy in the district Poona Division and Maharashtra State is given below :-

The level of literacy among males as well as females is lower in Kolhapur district as compared to Poona Division and the State. The reasons for this is higher rate of rural population in the district and relative backwardness of the western part of the district.

(v) Livelihood classification :- The population in 1961 Census was divided in two parts viz. workers and non-workers. About 45.6 percent of population was returned as workers as against 45.5 percent in Poona division and 47.9 percent in the State. 54.3 percent males and 36.7 percent females were returned as workers in the district. Of the workers 64.2 percent were engaged in cultivation, while 14.5 percent were returned as agricultural labourers. This is about 79 percent of total workers were engaged in agriculture. Household industry and manufacturing other than household industry claimed little over 10 percent of workers.

2.1. PURPOSE :-

This is the sixth issue of District Statistical Abstract brought out by District Statistical Office. One of the purposes of the issue is to present statistical material on as many topics as is possible so that the abstract may be useful not only as a reference book but also research, planning or further socio-economic studies. The data is generally given taluawise. For some items when taluawise data is not available figures for the District are incorporated in the statements.

2.2. DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :-

In this table certain eloquent figures of the District pertaining to demography, agriculture, industry, cooperation, health education, transport, planning etc. are presented.

The District Statistical Abstract for the year 1966-67 consists of two parts. Part-I of the Abstract consists of chapters of Introduction, scope and limitations of statistics given in part-II, selected indicators and review of District level schemes implemented in Kolhapur District during the Annual Plan 1966-67.

Part-II of the Abstract consists of statistical tables giving statistics of various subjects viz. Agriculture, Cooperation, Industry, Transport & Communications, Education and other matters. In most of the tables statistical information for the financial year 66-67 is given, while in certain cases information for the calendar year 1966 or 1967 is given. Comparative statistics of the year 1961-62 or the previous year are also given whenever possible. Salient features of the various tables are given below .

I. CLIMATE :-

Table No.1 gives statistics about rainfall for the years 1965 and 1966 for fourteen selected centres of which twelve are talu'ra headquarters. Table No.2 gives data pertaining to mean, mean maximum and mean minimum temperature at Kolhapur centre, The mean maximum and mean minimum are the averages of maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily. The mean temperature is the average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperatures thus arrived at.

II. AREA AND POPULATION

The figures given in the tables of this section are based on the 1961 population census. Table No.3 gives talukawise rural and urban population, its variation over 1951 census and area and population per Sq. kilometer. Table No.4 depicts talu'rawise classification of villages according to population ranges. Table No.5 gives talukawise classification of towns according to population ranges. Number of workers according to different livelihood classes for rural and urban areas separately is given in table No.6. Moreover in this table non-working population is also shown. Table No.7 gives population according to age group, mother tongue and religion separately for rural and urban areas. In table No.8 scheduled caste and scheduled tribes population is given. The figures adopted in the various tables are as published by Government of India in "Census of India 1961", Vol-X, Part-II-A". The various concepts adopted at the time of census such as village, Town, worker, non-worker are as defined in the above census.

III. AGRICULTURE

Important statistics presented in this section pertain to land utilization, area under different crops, irrigation, yield and outturn agricultural wages, agricultural implements and famine and scarcity data. The data is generally for 1964-65 and 1965-66. The statistics, regarding area, its mode of utilization and irrigation are first collected at village level by the talathi and it is subsequently consolidated at taluka and district levels.

Though talathis are collecting data according to uniform system of concepts, some variation from year to year may be due to errors in compilation at various stages. These limitations are to borne in mind while studying agricultural statistics.

Table No.9 gives talukawise land utilization statistics for 1964-65 and 1965-66. Table No.10 contains data on area under different crops in each taluka. Field per hectare and outturn of principal crops are given in table No.11. It may be stated that yield rates are estimated on the basis of crop-estimation surveys conducted on sample basis by agricultural departments. These rates are used alongwith area figures to arrive at outturn of various crops. Table No.12 gives data pertaining to area irrigated by different sources, while table No.13 depicts area irrigated under each crop. Number of irrigation wells in use and not in use are given in table No.14. In table No.15 information on minor irrigation works excluding wells is given. It may stated that a work involving an expenditure of less than 20 lakhs is treated as minor irrigation work. Work covering irrigable area upto 250 acres entrusted to Zilla Parishad and work above 250 acres to the irrigation department. Table No.16 gives data on Major and medium irrigation projects. There is only one medium project viz. Radhanagari Hydro-electric work in the District and the work of another medium project namely Tulsi River project is under way at present. The data on this table is as on 30-6-67 and is collected from Executive Engineer, Irrigation Division, Kolhapur. Table No.17 gives agricultural wage rates for three selected centres viz. Kapshi in Kagal Taluka, Madilge BK in Bhudargad taluka and Shirol from Shirol Taluka. Information on agricultural wage rates is collected fortnightly from selected cultivators employing agricultural labourers. The data presented is monthly average of rates for male and females separately. Table No.18 gives agricultural implements, electric pumps, oil engines etc. The data is based on 1966 livestock census. Data on famine and scarcity for the year 1966-67 is presented in this table. Data is nil for the above year for Kolhapur District.

2. IV. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FORESTS -

Data on livestock presented is for the year 1966 and is based on livestock census 1966. For other tables on Forests and Fisheries data pertains to the year 65-66 and 66-67. Table No.20 gives a summary of livestock census which was conducted in 1966. No. of livestock per 100 hectare in Kolhapur district is 150 as against 116 in Poona Division. Number of poultry per 1000 population increased from 265 in 1961 to 337 in 1966.

Table No.21 gives veterinary statistics, table 22 disease-wise mortality, table 23 recognised slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in them.

There are two tables on Forests Statistics. Table No.24(a) gives details of area under different types of forests. Information regarding forests under the control of the States Revenue Department and States Forest Department is shown separately in this table. It will be seen from this table that area under Forest Department is 165421 hectare in 1965-66, while there is no area under Revenue Department. Thus the total forest area remains 165421 hectare. Whereas according to statistics released by Director of Agriculture, under land utilization and presented in table No.9 in this Abstract, the area under forests in 1965-66 is 151414 hectare, i.e. by 14007 hectare less than that given by Forest Department. The entire area under control of forest Department is reported to have been classed as forests, whereas actually some of the area under control of Forest Department may have been put to cultivation of crops. That is why the area under forests in land utilization statistics are lower than figure shown in forest statistics. Table No.24(b) gives estimates of production of major and mineral forest produce.

V. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY AND ELECTRICITY

In tables 26 to 28, factory statistics are presented. The data pertains to the year 1964 and 1965 and is obtained from Inspector of Factories. The data covers factories registered under Factory Act 1948 viz (1) Those employing ten or more workers and working with aid of power and those employing twenty or more workers and working without aid of power. Table 26 gives number of working factories, days worked and average daily employment. Table 27 gives distribution of working factories according to products and their working strength. It may be noted that the number of workers shown in the above two statements are the average number of workers working daily throughout the year and not the total number on the register of factories. Table No. 28 shows distribution of factories according to number of days worked.

Statements 29, 30 and 31 give employment exchange statistics for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. Table No. 29 gives details such as registration, vacancies notified, number on live register, placements etc. In table No. 30 registration and placements according to occupational groups are given. Table 31 gives volume of employment in different industries, in public sector as also private sector submitting returns to the employment exchange. Table No. 32 (A) gives number of employees according to different classes and according to pay and emolument ranges as on 1-7-66. The data pertains to Government Employees only. Table 32(b) gives total employees in the various departments of the State Government. The data on these two tables is based on the census of Government Employees conducted by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics. In table No. 33 statistics relating to Annual Survey of Industries in the year 1961 are given according to different types of industries. Details such as registered factories, productive capital, employment gross output and value added are given. The limitation of data is given in the form of foot note to the table.

In tables 34 and 35 data on electricity is given for the years 65-66 and 66-67. The data has been obtained from Maharashtra State Electricity Board and private companies in the District. Table No.34 gives data on generation and consumption of electricity according to different uses, while table 35 gives number of towns and villages electrified and population covered at the beginning and at the end of Third Five Year Plan as also at the end of the year 66-67. The per capita consumption of electricity in Kolhapur District during 1966-67 works out to 48.5 - KWH, while working out per capita 1961 census population has been taken into account.

VI. CO-OPERATION :-

In this category cooperative statistics generally for the cooperative years 65-66 and 66-67 are given. The cooperative year is from July to June. The data has been collected from District Dy. Registrar Cooperative Societies. Table No.36 gives, in a summary form important information pertaining to different types of co-operative institutions according to four fold classification of societies into 1) agricultural credit 2) non-agricultural credit 3) agricultural non-credit and 4) non-agricultural non-credit. In tables 37 to 42 societies are grouped into a) Co-operative Banks b) primary agricultural societies c) primary cooperative marketing societies and d) other societies. The main function of cooperative societies is to supply credit and give similar financial and other assistance to the people. Hence important particulars concerning this function such as fresh advances, outstanding, overdues etc are given. Table 43 gives registered money lenders and loans advanced by them.

VII. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :

In this section data on Medical & Public Health generally for the years 1965 and 1966 is given. The data ^{pertains} to public and public aided bodies and has been collected from Civil Surgeon, Municipalities and Zilla Parishad. Table 44 gives medical facilities available through public aided bodies in each taluka. Information of hospitals and dispensaries, number of beds, medical personnel and cases treated is given. In table No. 45, statistics on birth and deaths and infant deaths registered are given. In this table talu-wise break up of males and females is not given as the same was not available with Director of Public Health. While table 46 give deaths due to important causes, table 47 contains vaccination statistics and data on Cholera inoculations. In table 48 data on sources of hygienic drinking water supply in rural areas in each taluka is given. The data which was collected from Block Development Officers in 1964 also gives number of villages without drinking water supply and inadequate water supply.

VIII. EDUCATION :-

Tables 49 to 51 relate to literacy and illiteracy and the data is based on 1961 population census. Table 52 gives number of institutions pupils and teachers in the District for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. The information is given separately for pre-primary, primary, secondary, higher and special schools. Tables 53 and 54 give information regarding concessions to backward classes and free education to economically backward class respectively. Grant in aid given to different types of institutions is shown in table No. 55. Table 56 gives talukawise data on number of villages without schools according to different population ranges. This data has been collected from Block Development Officers and is as on 31-3-1966 and 31-3-1967.

IX. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS :-

In this section road kilometrage, railway kilometrage in the district, statistics on motor vehicals in operation in Kolhapur sub-region consisting of Kolhapur and Sangli districts operational statistics of nationalised road transport and postal statistics etc. are given. Table No.57(a) gives railway, kilometrage as on 31-3-66 and 31-3-67. The length within the district is calculated between the railway stations in the district as exact kilometrage in the district are not available. There is only meterguage in Kolhapur District at present. Table No.58 gives road lenth according to types of road such as National Highways, State Highways etc. and according to types of surface. Data indicates position as on 31st March 1961, 66 and 67 and covers roads under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad, Bulldings and Communications Department and Municipalities. Tables 59 and 60 give Motor Vehicles in operation in Kolhapur -Sub-Region and nationalised road transport in Kolhanur Division as on 31st March 1966 and 67. The area of the Divisions is not co-terminus with that of District boundary. Results of traffic census on important roads conducted in Nov'65 in Kolhapur district by B & C Department are presented in table No.61. Tables 62 and 63 deal with postal - statistics and rural broadcasting respectively.

X. LOCAL BODIES :-

Information mainly on items like income and expenditure of local bodies such as village panchayats, Municipalities and Zilla Parishad is presented for 65-66 and 66-67. Information both on income and expenditure is classified under broads, heads depending on the aunctions. It is likely that data is misclassified by Village Panchayats or Municipabilities inspite of generally known princinals. This limitation may have to be borne in mind in analysing the data. Table No.64 gives in a summary form income and expenditure of all the three types of local bodies. Table No. 65 deals with coverage of village panchayats and their income and expenditure Panchayat Samitiwise. Table No.66(a) (b) gives headwise receipts and expenditure respectively. Table 67 shows income and expenditure of Municipalities.

XI. PLAN & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME :-

Table 68 gives expenditure on district level schemes under different sub-heads of development during the period of Third Five Year Plan and in 1966-67 in state and local sectors. It may be noted that the schemes which benefit mainly district are classified as District level. The classification of schemes into district level was adopted as per Govt. instructions from time to time. Table 69 gives physical achievements in respect of important ^{items} under different sectors of development. Tables 70, 71 & 72 gives coverage of C.D. Blocks as on 31-3-67 as also expenditure under different stages of Blocks upto 31-3-67 and physical achievements on selected items of importance. The data is compiled from the Quarterly and Annual Progress Reports submitted by C.D. Blocks.

XII. PRICES

Table 73 gives average prices of essential commodities collected in the district Headquarter for the calendar years 1965 and 1966. However it may be borne in mind that prices quoted in the table are collected for one shop in the district headquarter and the monthly average is the average of weekly prices collected on each Friday during that month. The prices may therefore be treated as broad indicator of trend in changes in retail prices for each month in calendar years 1965 and 1966 presented in this publication. Table 74 gives average consumer index number of working class for the Sholarur centre for each month in the year 1966 and upto March 1967. The index numbers are based on revised series with 1960 prices equal to 100. Groups of items considered are Food, Fan, Supari, Tobacco, intoxicants fuel and light, housing, clothing and miscellaneous. The data is obtained from Commissioner of Labour.

XIII. MISCELLANEOUS :-

This section covers statistics of various miscellaneous subjects like Police-force, Crime, Cinema statistics, insurance, general election Small savings, Joint stock companies, newspapers and periodicals etc. The data presented is generally for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67 or for calendar years 1965 and 66 or indicating position as on 31-3-67, As regards table No.83 land revenue, demand, collection and arrears are given. The demand minus collection tally with arrears. The amount of remission is taken as reduction in Demand and suspension is taken as addition to arrears as the amount is to be collected in subsequent years. Table No.86 gives Trends on selected items of importance. Data pertains to the years 1950-51, 1955-56 and 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1966-67. The idea is to present broadly the achievements under different items at the beginning and end of each of the Five Year Plans.

SELECTED INDICATORS

Some tables giving selected indicators of development for each taluka of district are appended at the end. The items covered are from topics like population, agriculture electricity and factory workers, road kilometerage, education, and medical facilities etc. An effort is made to show the position of each taluka in relation to development under each item by ranking to each of the taluka as per latest reference year 1965-67.

CHAPTER NO. III
SECTORIAL TRENDS

One of the main objectives of the Planning is to promote development of different sectors of the economy and to remove imbalances in different parts. In this chapter an attempt is made to review sectorial trends in respects of agriculture, livestock and poultry, employment, electric consumption, civic amenities, education, communication etc. This study is based on the basis of data as at the beginning of the Third Five Year Plan and as at the the end of the Third Plan or Annual Plan 1966-67. The intention is to show broadly the development accrued during the period of Third Five Year Plan.

Agricultural Development :-

Agriculture contributes little over one third (38. percent) of the State income of Maharashtra as against 45. percent for the country. This is mainly due to agricultural backwardness of its hinterland. The productivity per acre is low due inferior quality of soil, meagre irrigational facilities, uncertain rainfall, low rate of consumption of fertilizers and financial backwardness. The indicators below will show the position of the district and the comparative position of different talukas in respect of some of the important aspects.

1. Gross Sown Area :-

The percentage of net sown area to the geographical area in Kolhapur district for the year 1965-66 was 50.4. This indicates that about half of the geographical area is not available for cultivation due to hilly tracts and forest land etc.

The table below gives percentage of gross cropped area to net sown area to indicate extent of double cropping.

The percentage of area sown more than once to net area sown for district as a whole has decreased by one percent over the period of five years during Third Plan. Though the grossed and net area sown have both increased, the percentage of extent of double cropping in relation to net area sown has decreased. The reason is due to shift to production of cash crop like sugarcane having longer duration. The area under sugarcane increased from 32125 hectare in 1961-62 to 38915 hectare in 1965-66. Panhala, Shahuwadi, Karveer and Radhanagari, Hatkanangle are the talukas where double cropping is resorted to in greater degree due to sugarcane cultivation.

2. Productivity of important crops:-

The productivity of important crops of Kolhapur District is given below with comparative figures for Poona Division.

The yield rates of almost all crops is good in 1960-61 as it was regarded as a year of bumper crop in the country. Rice is an important crop of Kolhapur District and the yield rate is also favourable as compared to Poona Division. The yield has, however, decreased in 1964-65 and 1965-66 in the district as also in the Division. Yield of Kharif Jowar is favourable as compared to that in Poona Division but infavourable in respect of Rabi Jowar. The yield of wheat is also greater than that in Poona Division. Though Kolhapur District has been hailed as producer of sugarcane, the yields in both the years 1960-61 and 1964-65 were lower than those in Poona Division. However the yield has very much improved and was greater in 65-66 than in Poona Division. This is due to better irrigation and use of fertilizers. Yield of groundnut (Pods) in the district decreased from 1050 kg in 1960-61 to 932 kg in 1964-65. However decrease in yield rate in Poona Division was proportionately greater during same period.

3. Gross value of Agricultural Production:-

The prosperity in rural areas depend on the extent or agricultural production and the income accrued to the cultivators. The per capita (Rural population) value of agricultural output in Kolhapur district in 1960-61 was Rs.226/- which decreased to 219 in 1961-62. The table below gives per capita income in different districts of Poona Division.

In 1961-61 per capita value increased in only one district i.e. Sangli. It was constant in Ahmednagar and Sholapur and decreased in rest of the District. Kolhapur district stands second in the Poona Division as regards per capita value of production, the first being Ahmednagar district..

4. Irrigation :- The net irrigated area to the cultivable area in Kolhapur district was 7.2 percent in 1960-61 as against 8.8 percent in Poona Division, After taking into consideration the irrigation potential created during the five year period the percentage of net irrigated area to total cultivable area has gone up to 10.4 percent as against 10.7 percent in Poona division as at the end of 65-66.

The percentage of area irrigated more than once to net irrigated area was 2.25 percent in 1960-61 which has gone up to 3.16 percent in 1965-66. The talukas where greater area is brought under irrigation are all the talukas except Bawada, Ajara and Chandgad.

There has been increase in the percentage of area irrigated in 65-66 as compared to 1960-61. In 1964-65 the percentages of area irrigated in the district and division are almost same. There has been increase in the area irrigated in 65-66 as compared to 1960-61 in all talukas except Shahuwadi. The percentage of area irrigated in Shahuwadi decreased has been due to the fact that the area sown has increased considerably in 65-66 as compared to 1960-61, while there has been decrease in the net area irrigated.

5. Changes in the cropping Pattern :- The table below gives percentage area under important crops to gross cropped area in 1960-61 and 1965-66.

The area under Rice, Groundnut and sugarcane increased over the period of five years during Third Plan while as the area under Jowar and tobacco decreased. The area under cereals and pulses also decreased. The total area under food crops decreased from 65.2 percent to 64.6 percent as compared to gross cropped area during the respective years. Consequently the area under non-food crops increased. Under this category the increase was notable in respect of groundnut.

As regards irrigation, the area irrigated increased from 39069 hectare to 49474 hectare, the increase being 26.6 percent. The area irrigated under sugarcane increased from 21874 hectare to 38915, the increase being 22.1 percent.

6. Agricultural credit and outstanding dues :-

The following table gives the progress of agricultural credit in Kolhapur district during the Third Five Year Plan and in 1966-67

It will be seen from the above table that there has been a increase in the agricultural cooperative credit. The loans advanced by agricultural cooperatives societies increased by 66 percent as at the end of Third Five Year Plan, while the amount outstanding increased by 62 percent as compared to the position at the beginning of the Plan. Loan advanced per member was Rs.258 in 1960-61 which increased to Rs.312 in 65-66 but decreased to Rs.288 in 66-67. The decrease has been due to increase in membership and relatively less advance in 66-67. The loans advanced by land development bank shotup from a bare Rs.84000 to Rs.71.29 lakhs in 65-66 and Rs.74.54 lakhs in 66-67 while the loan outstanding stood at Rs.611.32 in 65-66 as compared to Rs.48000. The reason for such a huge out-standing amount is that the long term loans were advanced during Third Plan for agricultural development, while the recoveries are spread up over longer period.

7. Agricultural wages rates :- Data on agricultural wage rates from 3 selected centres in each district of Maharashtra are being collected since 1963-64. The 3 centres selected from Kolhanur district are Shirol, Madilge BK and Kapshi.

The wage rates have been found to vary with Urban and Rural characteristics of the selected centres. The wage rate at Shirol are found to be higher than Kapshi and Madilge centres both in respect of field labour and other agricultural labour due to proximity of Shirol & Jaysingpur town.

A male field labourer is found to ~~xxxx~~ get ^{wage} an average of Rs.1.66 during 1965 and female labourer Rs.1.66. Other agricultural labour gets a wage of Rs.1.37 (Male) and Rs.1.00 (female). Hardsman is getting wage of Rs.1.04 skilled workers such as carpenters, Blacksmiths, cobblers whose services are required occasionally for agricultural pursuits are still found to be paid on Baluta system, a system in which wages are paid mostly in kind only annually usually after harvests. The rate reported for carpenter in 1965 was Rs.3.00.

In the year 1965-66 the trend of the agricultural wages was found to be higher which is consistent with the general rise in the price line year after year.

Livestock :- The 10th quinquennial livestock census was carried out in year 1966 all over the state. Animal husbandry makes a substantial contribution to the economy by providing income and draught power to farmers, subsidiary food to human population and resources.

Number of livestock, particularly Bovine and Ovine population in relation to per hectare cultivable land is one of the indicators of development.

The No. of livestock per 100 hectare in Poona Division as a whole is 116 and as such the ratio of 150 for Kolhapur district compares favourably with that of the Division. Between the talukas Karvir is having largest number of livestock per hectare of cultivable land. The talukas of Hatkanangle, Parhala, Gadhinglaj, Shirol Shahiwadi and Kagal follow in the order given. They are having livestock per hectare of cultivable land more than or equal to that of the district ratio. The talukas of Bhudargad, Ajara, Chandgad, Radhanagari and Bawada are having livestock lesser than the district ratio. Notably these talukas fall in the heavy rain fall tract.

The number of livestock per 100 hectare has decreased in 1966 as compared to that in 1961.

9. Poultry :- The total poultry increased from 423372 in 1961 to 538814 in 1966 in Kolhapur district. The number of poultry per 1000 population has therefore increased from 265 in 1961 to 337 in 1966. The comparative ratios for Poona Division as a whole are 344 and 394 in the corresponding years. The rate of increase in poultry per 1000 human population in Kolhapur district is 72 percent as against 14 percent for Poona Division as a whole. This comparison however is based on constant human population factor of 1961 for both the years 1961 and 1966.

10. Consumption of electricity:- The per capita electricity consumption in Kolhapur district is 37.36 KWH as against 43.04 KWH for Poona Division in 1965-66. The consumption increased to 48.6 in the district as against 53.6 in Poona Division. While calculating the per capita consumption population of 1931 census is taken.

11. Enrolment employment Exchange and vacancies notified -

One of the objectives of the plan is to offer employment opportunities and reduce unemployment. Additional employment opportunities must be substantially in excess of additional labour force.

The following table gives the total registration and vacancies notified to the exchange.

The vacancies notified are only about 8.7 percent of the total registration in 1961-62. However in 1965-66 this percentage had gone up to 21.7 percent but decrease to 16.5 percent in 66-67. This is due to more enrollment and comparatively lesser number of vacancies notified. Of course it would be incorrect to conclude anything on the basis of statistics of employment exchange alone. Employment provided in the private sector without recourse to employment exchange is substantial and even in public sector, some recruitment is done through public service commission and also by advertising the post. The employment exchange statistics provides only a rough yard stick to indicate the trend of the extent of unemployment and employment opportunities.

The outdoor patients treated has increased over five years in Third Plan. However, the total number of indoor patients decreased. The percentage increase in patients treated over five years comes to 25.6.

13. Increase in No. of students of different categories :-

It will be clear from the following table that there has been phenomenal increase in education of all types.

There has been an increase in the No. of school going children boys and girls especially as regards primary education. The increase is marked in respect of girls in primary secondary higher categories and is more than that of boys. However, there is decrease in percentage of boys in secondary schools in 66-67 as compared to 65-66.

Increase in road length per 100 Sq. KM. - The road facilities available in the district could better be judged by working out road length per 100 Sq. km. The road length in Kolhapur district including municipal roads was 25.18 km. per 100 Sq. Km. as at the beginning of Third Plan which increased to 30.62 at the end of Third Plan and stood at 30.95 as on 31-3-1967. The corresponding figures for Poona Division are 21.01, 29.0 & 30.8 respectively.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population -

The No. of offices of all types of banks in Kolhapur district was 51 in 1961. This No. rose to 76 in 1966 and 88 in 1967. There were 4.8 banking offices per lakh of population in 1966 and 5.5 in 1967 as against 3.2 in 1961. This shows that banking facilities are on the increase.

Prices :- The work of collection of prices at district Headquarters was entrusted to the District Statistical Office since Nov. 1962. An attempt is made below to give changes in the prices during Third Five Year Plan period for major groups. However it may be mentioned the prices of commodities are restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop in the district headquarter. As such the brief note below only indicates very broadly the trend in the change of retail prices.

Food :- There has been a great rise in the food prices during the Third Plan period. This is attributed to the shortage of food brought out partly due to inadequate and or untimely rainfall and growing demand due to population increase and increase in the consumption level of certain categories of people. The rise has been double or more than double in respect of some commodities. The changes in respect of some important commodities of daily consumption are given below per Kg. In case of wheat the price rose from 58 paise per kg. to Rs.1.06. The price of Rice rose from 53 paise to about Rs.1.18. The price of Jowar rose from 40 paise to 75 P. In respect of Gram Dal the rise in price has been nearly three time viz. it rose from 57 P. to Rs.1.75, Tur dal also indicated rise from 75 P. to Rs.1.15 P. The price of Gur fluctuated between 62 P. to Rs.1.00. Groundnut oil rose from Rs.1.85 to 3.87 per Kg. The Consumer price index of Sholapur had registered a rise of about 40 percent in the food group in March'66 as compared to 1960 average index.

Fuel etc.:- The price rise of this category has not been as sharp as that of the food group. The price of Charcoal rose from Rs.8.50 to 9.00 per 10 kg, while the price of firewood rose from Rs.2.50 to 3.50. The price of Kerosene has however registered an increase of 46 percent i.e. from 35 P to 51 P. per litre. The consumer price index of Sholapur for this category registered percentage increase of 26 percent in March'66 as compared to 1960 index.

Clothing :- It is difficult to locate changes in prices of this category due to change in varieties. However an effort was made to find out substitute which closely compares with the previous variety going out of production or market.

Prices of some varieties as at the end of 1962 and as at the end of March'66 are given below for broad comparison.

The consumer price index for Sholapur for this group rose by 28 percent in March'66 as compared to 1960 base.

The price index of Sholapur for this group rose by about 21 percent in March'66 as compared to 1960 base, the price index for Pan, Supari, Tobacco and intoxicants registered a rise of 30 percent in March 66 as compared to 1960 base. During same period housing index increased by 15 percent.

It may be concluded that the rise in prices by end of Third Five Year Plan was of the order of about 34 percent over the price prevailing before the beginning of the Third Five Year Plan.

CHAPTER - IV
ANNUAL PLAN 1966-67.

From 1966-67 Annual Plans are being executed pending finalization of Fourth Five Year Plan.

During 1966-67 an amount of Rs.2.77 crores was spent on District level schemes. In this Annual Plan more than 50 percent amount was spent on Agricultural Programme and more than 17 percent was spent under the schemes of social services.

Expenditure under different heads of development during 1966-67 is given below :-

The outlay in the Annual Plan was Rs.277.41 lakhs as compared to the average annual expenditure of Rs.128.72 lakhs in the Third Five Year Plan. Thus it may be said the rate of expenditure even in Annual Plan 66-67 was little more than double that of that of the average yearly expenditure of Third Five Year Plan.

During 1966-67 emphasis was on Agricultural Programme in as much as 50 percent outlay was incurred for agricultural development. Power projects that is rural electrification claimed 13.4 percent of the outlay and social services 18.2 percent. Achievements under different heads of development are given below :-

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME

An amount of Rs.268.77 lakhs was spent on various schemes under agricultural programme in the Third Five Year Plan. This formed 41.7 percent of total expenditure. During the year 1966-67, an expenditure of Rs.139.55 lakh was incurred under agricultural programme. This formed about 50.3 percent of total expenditure. Expenditure during 1966-67 under each of the sub-heads is given below :-

It will be seen that greater emphasis in annual plan 66-67 was on Minor Irrigation and Soil Conservation. This was also true in Third Five Year Plan. The expenditure in one year in 66-67 was nearly 50 percent of the total expenditure in Third Five Year Plan under agricultural programme. This is mainly due to accelerated rate of growth under minor irrigation and soil conservation. Under agricultural production greater emphasis was laid on the activities undertaken under croon campaign (Rs.4.84 lakh) while under minor irrigation greater outlay was on lift irrigation (Rs.50.58 lakhs), under soil conservation terracing was given greater priority in as much as Rs.23.37 lakhs were utilized on this scheme.

ACHIEVEMENTS :-

Since agriculture is a private enterprise, the activities of Govt. consist mainly of distribution of improved seeds, chemical fertilizers and compost and green manures, plant protection services, agricultural training and horticultural development. Under the programme of agricultural production 1058 quintals of improved food grains, 36 quintals of cashewnuts were distributed for maximising the agricultural production. Chemical fertilizers of the order of 27790 tons were distributed during the year. Kharif and Rabi campaigns were continued during the year 1966-67. Under Soil Conservation, emphasis was on the scheme of terracing of land due to hilly tracts in this district. About 1546 hectare were terraced while counterbundling was carried out in 3440 hectare. Under minor irrigation, additional irrigation potential created was of the order of 3242 hectare. Under the fisheries, 1.85 lakhs fingerlings were stocked.

COOPERATION & C.D. :- Expenditure

Under sub-head cooperation Rs.2.79 lakhs were utilized, while under C.B. Programme Rs.23.76 lakhs were spent. This was 8.5 percent of total outlay incurred. Under cooperation greater outlay was on development of cooperative marketing and strengthening of cooperative credit, while under C.D. Programme most of the amount was on C.D. projects.

ACHIEVEMENT :- Loans advanced to agricultural credit societies were to the extent of Rs.5.87 crores, while long term loans to these societies were to the tune of Rs.75 lakhs. Membership of agricultural credit societies increased by about 10,000. About 34 Lift Irrigation societies were formed during the year.

POWER PROJECTS:-Expenditure - An outlay of Rs.37.02 lakhs i.e. 13.3 percent of total outlay was incurred under this head in 1966-67. The amount was earmarked for rural electrification. During third five year plan this scheme was classified as divisional.

Achievements :-

285 villages were electrified as at the end of third five year plan. During 1966-67, 63 villages were electrified in the district under the scheme of rural electrification. The percentage of villages electrified to total villages in the district is 26.

INDUSTRIES AND MINING -

Under this sub-head total expenditure of Rs.2.05 lakhs i.e. 0.7 percent of the total outlay in 1966-67 was incurred. The expenditure was mainly on development of handloom industry and industrial cooperative of handicraft workers.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

The total outlay under this head was Rs.24.44 i.e. 8.8 percent of total outlay. The expenditure was earmarked for development of district roads and rural roads and construction of new roads. Greater emphasis was on District Roads (Rs.13.60 lakhs) and roads in hilly areas (Rs.5 lakhs).

Rural roads having about 50 kilometers were constructed and 8 Kms. of district roads modernised.

SOCIAL SERVICES :- Expenditure-

Under this head about Rs.50.59 lakhs i.e. 18.2 percent of the total outlay was incurred during the year. The sub-headwise expenditure is given below :-

Under the scheme of general education greater outlay was on expansion of primary education (Rs. 3.03 lakh) and development of non-govt secondary schools (Rs. 2.64 lakhs). Under technical education greater emphasis was on development of existing polytechnics (Rs. 4.72 lakh). Under public health greater priority was given to Family Planning (Rs. 5.91 lakh) and Malaria eradication (Rs. 3.07 lakh). Under water supply scheme Kolhapur and Ichalkaranji water supply schemes were envisaged. Kolhapur drainage scheme has also been taken up. Under housing, village housing scheme was given priority and total outlay incurred was Rs. 2.01 lakhs. Under backward class welfare financial assistance to cooperative housing societies of B.Cs was given to the extent of Rs. 1.31 lakh. Under labour and labour welfare, the expansion of industrial training institute was envisaged.

Under Education 24 primary schools and 10 secondary schools were started. Under Public Health two family planning centres were started. 29 villages were benefitted under the scheme of rural water supply. The scheme of improvement of water supply of Kolhapur and Ichalkaranji was undertaken.

To conclude, the rate of spending in 1966-67 was greater than in the Third Five Year Plan in as much as little more than double outlay was incurred in the year as compared to the yearly average outlay in Third Five Year Plan.
