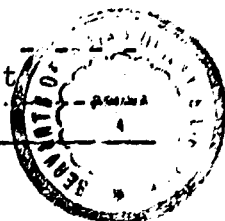

C H A P T E R - I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 BACKGROUND :

Ahmednagar which is popularly known as 'Nagar' in Western Maharashtra is the seat of District Administration of Ahmednagar District and is on the bank of Sina River, which remains dry for nearly 9 month in a year. This city was founded in the year 1494 and till 1630 was the main centre from where the administration of Southern India was carried out. Ahmednagar district came into being in 1818.

Ahmednagar district is located between 18.0° and 19.9° North latitudes and 73.9° and 75.5° east longitudes. It is surrounded by Ehir and Osmanabad districts, on the east, Poona, & Thana districts on west, Aurangabad & Nasik on North & Sholapur district on South. The district with an area of 16,776 Km. is biggest in Poona Division and second biggest in the whole of Maharashtra State next to Chanda District of Nagpur Division.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY

1. Soil : The soil of the district can be classified into 1) Black 2) Red 3) Laterite 4) barad & 4) White/as Pandhari. and known

In Rahuri Taluka the soil is mostly Black, deep & very fertile coupled with fine perennial water system. This is the primary reason that is why this area is selected for the seat of Agricultural University in the State. In the hilly area of the west of Akola taluka red laterite soil is deeper on the slopes. The soil along the banks of Pravara is rich & fertile. In Kopergeon and Shrirampur talukas we get very deep & fertile soil. The Southern portion including Ahmednagar, Parner, Shrigonda and Karjat is mostly composed of pathars, and the plain land in this area is also poor and shallow. The soil in Jamkhed...

taluka from low levels of reddish land is mostly light.

2. Rivers : Godavari and Bhima constitute the major rivers of this district. Godavari flows along the North eastern boundary of the district that is along the border of Shrirampur, Newasa and Shevgaon Talukas. Pravara a tributary of Godavari drains Akola and Sangamner, Shrirampur, Kopergaon and Newasa Talukas. Pravara originates in Akola and then joins Godavari at Pravara-Sangam in Newasa Taluka. A dam known as Bhandardara has been built in 1926 in Akola Taluka from where the Pravara originates with irrigable area of 62976 Hectares. Pravara Canals proved bounteous to the habitual famine stricken people of this area. Mula Adhala and Mahalungi are important tributaries of Pravara.

The Southern half constituting Parner, Ahmednagar Pathardi, Shrigonda, and Karjat lies in the Bhima basin & is drain^{ed} by Sina, Kukadi and Ghod the tributaries of Bhima. The river Bhima flows nearly 35 miles along the boundry of Poona and this district.

3. Hill Ranges : The Main Sahyadry range touches only one Taluka i.e. Akola in the west. From this main range there are three spurs viz. Kalsubai, Baleshwar and Harishchandragad stretch towards the east. The spurs of Kalsubai stretches out east-wards along the northern border of the district & goes on up to Dudheshwar hill in Sangamner Taluka. The highest peak of Sahyadry viz. the Kalsubai (5427-feet) is in this range and serves, as a water-shed between the Dharana and Pravara rivers. The length of Harishchandragad spur is about 60 miles in the district and its branches run from Ratangad and it also functions as a water-shed between the Pravara and Mula rivers. The Baleshwar range is the largest forming the boundry line between Poona and Ahmednagar district and on entering Parner taluka this spur forms

a plateau from which 2 spurs branch off one going through North of Ahmednagar town, & range forms a water-shed between Godavari and Dhima. Another one turns southwards across the north east corner of Shrigonda Taluka and then enters in Karjat Taluka.

4. Minerals : Except lime stone in Parner taluka there are no minerals in the district.

1.3 CLIMATE :

1. Rain-fall : Ahmednagar district gets rain mainly from south-west monsoon but during the latter half of its period, i.e. during September. The distribution of rain-fall is also most uneven. The major part of precipitation is experienced in western part of Akola Taluka, whereas rains in Southern part of the district are most erratic.

The normal rainfalls at taluka Head Quarter in Ahmednagar district vary between 430 m.m. to 650 m.m. approximately. The district can be divided into 3 zones according to rainfall at taluka Head Quarter. The normal rainfall in 1st Zone comprising of Northern part viz. Kopergaon Sangamner and Shirampur is round about 500 m.m. or less.

Zone II comprises of south eastern part including talukas of Shevgaon, Nagar, Pathardi, & Jamkhed with normal rainfall between 600 m.m. to in 3rd Zone covering remaining talukas with rainfall between 500 m.m. to 600 m.m. From each of these Zones one centre is selected and the deviation of actual rainfall during 65-66 from normal rainfall is given below to show the spread of rainfall during the year & between the zones.

As compared to normal rain fall the actual rainfall during 65-66 appears to be satisfactory in Ahmednagar & Karjat centres representing Zones II & III, Zone I consisting of northern part of the district has received poor

poor rainfall and is of the order of half of the normal rainfall. In all these three Centres Winter and pre-monsoon rains are quite satisfactory, but post monsoon is unsatisfactory. Since these rains are quite important for Nagar district it affected the crop conditions very much. In Zone I Sangamner Centre the monsoon rain have been only half of the normal rainfall and thus Kopergaon, Sangamner and Shrirampur were hard hit during the year.

2. Temperature : The climate of district is mostly dry. Monthly temperature records are available for Ahmednagar city only. Table No. 2 of the Abstract envisages that during April-66 maximum temperature was recorded as 39.2 C. and minimum was 22.2 C. Whereas in January 66 Maximum Temperature was recorded as 29.9 C. and Minimum was 13.3 C.

1.4 NATURAL ZONES :

District can be divided into four natural zones according to topography and climatic conditions of this district.

ZONE - 1 : Akola taluka is entirely different from all other talukas of the district, and its western part is hilly and full of forest which receives heavy rainfall. Kharip crops are sown in this areas.

ZONE - 2 : This zone consisting of Ahmednagar, Sangamner, Parner, Shrigonda, & Karjat talukas, constitutes the 47.92 percent area of the district which receives very low and scanty rainfall and is almost a scarcity zone.

ZONE - 3 : The third zone is consisting of Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri talukas which also receives low rainfall but due to rich soil and development of Canal irrigation system Sugarcane factories are located in this zone.

ZONE - 4 : Jamkhed, Shevgaon, Pathardi, & Newasa constitutes the fourth zone of this district. It receives a regular rain and the soil of Newasa and Shevgaon is very very fertile.

1.5 FAMINE & SCARCITY

Due to exceptionally good & timely rains no village was affected by famine and scarcity condition in the year 1966-67.

1.6 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION :

In 1891 the Ahmednagar district was consisted of eleven sub-Divisions namely,

Pathardi which was the part of Jamkhed Taluka was formed into a Pathardi Peta in 1913 and then subsequently upgraded to as Pathardi Taluka during 1941. The remaining portion of the Jamkhed Taluka was then renamed as Jamkhed Mahal. Karjat taluka was down-graded into a Karjat Peta during decade 1931-41 and subsequently again upgraded as a taluka during 1950-51.

For administrative purpose the district is at present divided into four sub-divisions, which together contains twelve talukas and one Mahal. The following table envisage the administrative set up of the Ahmednagar District.

District administration include State Govt. administration, Revenue, Judicial, Forest, Police, Employment, Exchange, Cooperative Department, Irrigation Department; B & C. Department & Divisional Soil Conservation Office. Central

Government Administration include Income Tax Department, Postal Department and Local Bodies viz. Zilla Parishad, Panchayat Samities, Municipalities and Public bodies like Maharashtra State Electricity Board & State Transport.

Collector is incharge of the the General Administration, Law and order, and Land Revenue. He is assisted by the Resident Deputy Collector and four Deputy Collectors who hold charge of the four sub-divisions, and have their head-quarters at Ahmednagar, Parner, Rahuri and Sangamner respectively. Mamlatdar/Tahsildar is incharge of taluka and one Mahalkari looks after the work of Mahal.

With the acceptance of democratic de-centralisation of power with the view to promote development of democra-

tic institutions and to gear up the participation by the people in the developmental plans. Zilla Parishad and 13 Panchayat Samities have been constituted under the Maharashtra Government, Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act of 1962.

All the Urban and Cantonment areas except the Wadi village which was treated as town according to 1961 census have been excluded from the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad. Thus the Zilla Parishad nearly covered 99.36 percent of the total area and 89.84 percent of the total population of the district.

Zilla Parishad has an elected President assisted by 3 vice-Presidents. The administration of the Zilla Parishad is carried out through standing committee and 6 subject committees, viz. Finance, Works, Agriculture, Cooperation, Education, & Health. At the Block level Panchayat Samiti consists of all elected and coopted councilors from the area of the Block and is headed by Chairman. An I.A.S. Officer works as a Chief Executive Officer, and is assisted by various departmental heads. At Block Level Block Development Officer, works as a Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti.

Ahmednagar, Kopergaon, Sangamner and Shrirampur are the towns and are administered by Municipalities.

1.7 DEMOGRAPHY

According to 1961 census total population of the district was 17,75,569 which indicates the rate of increase of population of indicates the rate of increase/population by 25.83 percent during the decade. The district witnessed the decrease in population during 1911-21 by 22.33 percent due to the severe attack of Influenza epidemic of 1918 and due to exodus of the population due to severe famine condition.

The following table indicates the percentage variation in population since 1901.

The percentage increase during the last decade is observed to be more as compared to that in Poona Division & also in Maharashtra.

According to 1961 census the density of the district was 105 per Sq. Km. which shows increase of 23 as compared to density of population during 1951. Due to rapped expansion of Sugar Industries and assured water supply the densities of population in Shrirampur and Kopergaon talukas are high and according to 1961 census it has densities of 220 and 188 persons per Sq. Km. respectively. Average population per village in 1961 is 1,205 in the district as against 752 in the Maharashtra State, i.e. an average village in this district is almost 50 percent larger than the village in the Maharashtra State.

The district has made much progress in literacy & Education.

The following table indicates the percentage of literacy in the district since 1901.

During last three decades the improvement in literacy has been substantial, mainly due to the introduction of compulsory primary education by the State Government. In Urban areas the literacy in the district was 51.12 percent while in rural areas it was only 23.54 percent as against 49.27 percent and 23.58 percent in Poona division and 51.07 percent and 21.46 percent for the whole of Maharashtra State.

According to 1961 census 50 percent of the population was classified as workers and out of this nearly 59 percent were engaged in cultivation and followed by 22 percent as agricultural labourers. Corresponding proportion in the State was 46 percent and 24 percent respectively. Eight percent of the population form industrial workers as against 11 percent in the state.

Schedule caste and Schedule tribes constitute 8.87 and 6.18 percent of the total population of the district respectively. The total population of the Schedule caste was 1,57,500 out of which 91.48 percent was living in rural areas and 8.52 percent in Urban areas. The total population of the Schedule tribes was 1,09,827 out of which 98.93 percent were living in rural areas and 1.07 percent in Urban areas. The proportion of the Schedule tribes in this district is very high as compared to that of Poona division.

CHAPTER-II

Explanatory Notes on the Tables included in the District Statistical Abstract - 1965 - 66 .

In this chapter brief notes on the data presented in the tables in Part-II of this publication i.e. District Statistical Abstract are given below, with a view to present the scope and limitations of the information put forth in the tables. In all tables except population tables, the data for the year 1966 have been given alongwith the data for the preceding year i.e. 1965, for the purpose to know the comparative trend, as well as wherever possible, Table-wise break up of the data has also been given.

1. CLIMATE

Table No. 1 : In this table monthwise rainfall in M.M. and rainydays during the year 1965 and 1966 for all taluka centres has been given. The table also gives the centre-wise normal rainfall data. In comparision it will be observed that rainfall during 1966 was less then during 1965 for 7 centres.

Table No. 2 : This table gives Monthly temperature data recorded at Ahmednagar Centre during 1966 and 1967. Data has been given in centigrade, and monthwise minimum maximum and average temperatures are represented in the table. Average temperatures rased between 21.6^o to 30.7^o during 1967.

2. AREA & POPULATION :

Table No. 3 : This table gives taluka-wise Rural and Urban population and areas of the district as per 1951 and 1961 census. Figures of 1951 are adjusted according to definitions of Urban and Rural areas as per 1961 census. Total area of district is 16,647 Sq. Km. Biggest taluka in

in the district is Parner having an area of 1,738 Sq. Km. followed by Sangamner (1681 Sq. Km.) and Shrigonda (1601 Sq. Km.) Shrirampur is the smallest with an area of just 807 Sq. Km. Ahmednagar taluka is the most popular taluka with population of 2,45,581 in 1961. Average density of whole district in 1961 was 106 per Sq. Km. Shrirampur taluka has the maximum density of 231 persons per Sq. Km. During the decade 1951-1961 the population of the district increased by about 26 percent. The percentage increase was above district average in case of Kopergaon(38%) Shrirampur (33%) Rahuri(35%) and Karjat (33%) Talukas.

Table No. 4 : In this table data regarding taluka-wise number of villages and their total population is given for 1961 census according to various population groups. Total number of villages is 1,323 including 5 deserted villages. The deserted villages are Ghanegaon and Pimpri Ghummat in Nagar Taluka, Mhalapur in Newasa Taluka, Gangapur in Shevgaon taluka and Bhangar Dhumala in Shrigonda. Maximum No. of villages viz. 448 belonged to the population group 509-999. These villages formed 34 percent of the total and had 52 percent of total rural population. Average population per inhabited village is however 1205. It is interesting to note that there are 8 villages having a population exceeding 10,000. Villages Rahuri, Vambori, Jamkhed, Kharda, Karjat, Pathardi, Shevgaon and Shrigonda were treated as towns during 1951 census but in the 1961 census as per new definition of town, they were declassified.

Table No. 5 : Table 5 gives taluka-wise classification of towns in different population groups. There are only 5 towns viz. Ahmednagar (Ahmednagar Taluka), Kopergaon & Wari (Kopergaon Taluka), Sangamner (Sangamner Taluka) and Shrirampur (Shrirampur Taluka) in this district. Excepting

Ahmednagar City, other towns are small and as per 1961 census population of each was less than 25,000.

TABLE No. 6 : This table gives Number of workers in each taluka according to Livelihood classes. For purpose ^{of} easy comparison rural and urban figures have been given separately. Out of total population of 1775969 - 892801 are workers which works out to 50 percent and in total workers, persons engaged in Agriculture are 81 percent in this district as against 70 percent in the whole state.

Table No. 7 : This table gives the distribution of population according to 1) Age groups 2) Mother tongue and 3) Religion.

1) Distribution according to age groups have been shown in 0-4 to 60 and above.

2) Distribution according to mother tongue have been shown 9 into categories and

3) Distribution ^{of} /relisiorwise population have been shown in 6 gategories.

Table No. 8 : This table gives Scheduled caste and Scheduled Tribes population. As per 1961 census there are 1,57,500 persons belonging to scheduled castes & 1,09,827 belonging to scheduled tribes. These work out to 8.87 percent and 6.18 percent respectively. Talukawise proportions of backward class population (i.e. Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes together) is 47.94 percent in Akola, 17.36 percent in Rahuri and 17.12 percent in Shrirampur.

3. AGRICULTURE

Table No. 9 : In this table details of land utilisation

utilisation in the district are presented for the years 1964-65 and 1965-66. Total geographical area is 17.02 lakhs hectares. Land put to various uses is more or less the same during the two reference years. Increase of 120 hectares has been registered in the forest area. Net area sown has gone down by about 7386 hectares during the period 64-65 to 65-66, while area sown more than once has also declined from 70,617 hectares in 1964-65 to 60,376 in 1965-66.

TABLE NO. 10 : Gives talukawise details about the areas under different groups during 1964-65 and 1965-66. Following table shows the change during the period.

It is observed that area under cereals has decreased/about 23,000 hectares while that under pulses has increased/about 4,000 hectares during the reference period. As for the cash crops, area under sugarcane registered increase of about 4,000 hectares while area under Cotton decline by about 15,000 hectares. Amongst the cereals Bajara and registered an increase of about 10,000 hectares while areas under Wheat and Jowar (Rabi) had declined.

TABLE NO. 11 : This table gives the out-turn & average yield per hectare of principal crops in the District. The out-turn figures are in Metric tonnes and yield per Hectares of cereals, Gram and Tur have gone down as compared to previous year's yield rates. The total out-turn of foodgrains...

food-grains during 65-66 was 2.89 lakh tonnes in the District, and that of Sugarcane was 0.28 lakh tonnes. These figures are less as compared to previous year.

TABLE NO. 12 : This table gives information in respect of Irrigational facilities provided by various sources in different talukas. Nearly $\frac{1}{3}$ of the area is irrigated by Govt. canals and an area double than this is irrigated by wells. Proportion of land irrigated by Govt. canals increased from 31 to 38 percent while proportion of well irrigated area had gone down during 1965-66. Total area irrigated during 1964-65 was 1.71 lakh hectares while during 1965-66 it has increased to 1.81 lakhs hectares.

TABLE NO. 13 : In this table figures of area irrigated under different crops for the year 1964-65 and 1965-66 are presented for each taluka. It shows that total gross area irrigated for the district had increased from 1,71,412 hectares in 1964-65 to 1,81,001 hectares in 1965-66. Irrigated area under Rice, Wheat, Jowar, Bajara, Gram, Sugarcane had increased during the period, while area under Cotton, Tobacco had gone down.

TABLE NO. 14 : This table presents data in respect of irrigation wells in each of the talukas during 1964-65 and 1965-66. During the period 1964-65 to 1965-66 number of wells had increased from 77,334 to 78,627 i.e. by 1293. Out of these, 3,737 and 3,759 wells were out of use, respectively in 1964-65 and in 1965-66. Sangamner taluka had highest number of wells in use during 1965-66 the number being (8,441) followed by Kopergaon (7,781), Shrirampur (7,679) and Parner (7,426).

TABLE NO. 15 : In this table data regarding Minor Irrigation works in the district for the year 1965-66 is given. In all there were 18 works in use irrigating about 3,972 hectares of lands. Out of these, 6 works irrigating an area of 544 hectares were in Zilla Parishad Sector and ...

sector and remaining 8 were in State Sector, irrigating 1,563 hectares and 4 private/Cooperative irrigating 1,865 hectares.

TABLE NO. 16 : Data regarding Major and Medium Irrigation projects in the district is presented in this table. There are two Major Projects in the district viz. Bhandardara Dam which was already completed and Mula dam which is in progress. Estimated cost of Mula Project is about Rs. 15 crores. After completion of this project this will irrigate area of 65,530 hectares. Visapur tank is a medium project. During 1966-67 it irrigated 299 hectares perennially and 401 seasonally.

TABLE NO. 17 : In this table statistics of wage rates of the three centres in the district viz. Akola, Belapur and Karjat are presented for the years 1965 & 1966. At Akola the wage rates for field labour were on average Rs. 2.50 per day for male and Rs. 2.00 for female. At Belapur they were between 2.00 and 2.50 for Male and between 1.00 and 2.00 for female. At Karjat centre the rates were 1.50 for male and 1.00 for female. Karjat is a dry area and labour is available readily there. Generally Labour charges in the irrigated area are more than the charges in the dry areas.

TABLE NO. 18 : Gives data regarding Agricultural implements as per the census held in 1966. It is found from the table that out of the 21,997 oil engines in the district, 5,296 were in Kopergaon taluka, 4,697 in Shrirampur and 3,031 in Rahuri taluka. Thus these three talukas together accounted for 13,024 engines which comes to 59 percent of total. Similarly in case of tractors these three irrigated talukas had 81 percent of the tractors in district. Total Iron ploughs, however were found to be distributed comparatively evenly in all talukas.

TABLE NO. 19 : In this table Famine and Scarcity data is ...

is presented. The information regarding scarcity conditions has been collected from Collector of the District. During the year 1966-67 no village from the District has been declared as affected by famine and chronic scarcity.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FOREST AND FISHERIES :

TABLE NO. 20 : In this table the statistics of Live-stock in each taluka, as per the Live-stock census held in 1966 is presented. Total cattle population in the district was 8,75,919 of which 4,02,403 were males and remaining were females. Buffaloes numbered 79,630 majority of these, 47,532 being females. Sheep and Goats together numbered 7,88,513. Total live-stock were 17,66,392 and total poultry was 6,90,172.

TABLE NO. 21 : Veterinary statistics in the district is given in this table. At the end of 1966-67 there was one Hospital and 13 Dispensaries for animals. Number of veterinary Aid centres had gone up from 37 during 1965-66 to 42 during 1966-67, and 1,52,685 animals were given treatment in all these institutions together. The number of artificial insemination centres, had been stagnant but animals inseminated, had however gone down in 1966-67.

TABLE NO. 22 : This data is limited to the cases treated in the hospitals and aid centres only. Live-stock mortality according to various diseases is presented in this table, for 1965-66 and 1966-67. It is found that in case of most of the diseases attacks during 1966-67 were less than during 1965-66. Total number of attacks during 1965-66 was 1,857 as against 886 during 1966-67. The number of deaths also had fallen from 602 during 1965-66 to 554 in 1966-67.

TABLE NO. 23 : In this table, information in respect of recognised slaughter houses is reported. There were in all 6 such slaughter houses in the district in 1966-67 of these 4 were situated in Ahmednagar City and 2 in Shrirampur. ...

Total number of animals slaughtered during 1966-67 was 27,571 as against 25,234 in 1965-66.

TABLE NO. 24(a) : This table gives data in respect of forest. It is observed that the total area under forest which stood at 2,00,758 hectares in 1965-66, decreased to 1,84,196 in 1966-67. Out of this 90,439 hectares was under Revenue department and 93,757 under forest Department.

TABLE NO. 24(b) : In this table data in respect of major and Minor forest produce is given. During 1966-67 total value of Major and Minor forest produce was Rs. 95,499 as against Rs. 62,464 in 1965-66.

TABLE NO. 25 : Information in this table is Nil, as there is no Govt. fish cutting yard in the District as well as there is no scope under fishery activity in the District.

5. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY :

TABLE NO. 26 : This table gives details about Factory statistics of the district for 1966. During the year there were 285 working Factories out of which 200 had submitted returns, All these working factories together had employed 28,532 workers during the year.

TABLE NO. 27 : In this table distribution of working factories is given according to their product and working strength. There were 10 factories which employed less than 10 workers, 22 factories which employed workers between 10 and 19, 62 which employed 20 to 49 workers, 79 which employed 50 to 99 workers, 45 which employed 100 to 499 workers, & 4 factories which employed 500 to 999 workers.

TABLE NO. 28 : This table gives distribution of factories according to number of days worked during 1966. It is found that there was not a single factory which worked for more than 300 days during 1963 or 1964, whereas during 1966, 133 factories had worked for more than 300 days.

TABLE NO. 29 : Employment Exchange statistics in the district for 1965-66 and 1966-67 is included in this table. During

During 1965-66 registration was 9,705 while during 1966-67 it was 9,245. The number of vacancies notified was 2,036 during 1965-66 and 1,761 during 1966-67. During 1965-66 1,417 candidates had been placed in employment, 351 in private sector and 1,066 in public sector. During 1966-67, 536 persons had been placed in employment in private sector and 897 in public sector.

TABLE NO. 30 : This table presents distribution of registration and placement during 1965-66 and 1966-67 according to various occupations. It is seen from the table that maximum number of registration are from unskilled workers. At the same time proportion of these having got employment is quite small to registrations. Proportion of placement to registration is fairly large in case of other groups also.

TABLE NO. 31 : Shows changes in volume of employment in different industries as on 31-3-66 and 31-3-67. During 1965-66 398 establishments had sent reports while during 1966-67, 401 had done so. Most of the employment is observed to be manufacturing & services.

TABLE NO. 32(A) : In this table data regarding Census of Government employees as on 1st April-1966, has been given. All Government employees class I to Class IV and basic Pay paid to them ranging from Rs. 1-50 to Rs. 2500-3000 have been shown.

TABLE NO. 32 (B) : This table gives the Department-wise break up of number of Government employees. It will be seen that maximum number of employees are under Revenue & Forest department, followed by home Department, whereas under General Administration Department there are only 9 employees in the district.

TABLE NO. 33 : In this table details about Registered factories during 1961 are presented. It is found that

out of the total 315 factories, 126 i.e. 40 percent were engaged in production of Sugar, Gur etc. While 108 (34%) were engaged in tobacco manufacturing. Productive capital of all factories together stood at Rs. 18.94 crores. These factories had employed 19,534 persons on average and net value added was of the order of Rs. 618.68 lakhs.

TABLE NO. 34 : This table gives details about the generation and consumption of electricity in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The consumption of electricity has increased from 66.63 lakh K.W. to 93.73 lakh K.W. during the year 66-67. Major part of the consumption during 1966-67 is for other purposes followed by Domestic use and Industrial use.

TABLE NO. 35 : No. of towns and villages electrified as on March ending 61, 66, & 67, are given in this table. At the end of 31-3-61, only 1 village and 4 towns had been electrified all by private companies. But at the end of 31-3-66, 30 villages and 4 towns had been electrified. At the end of 31-3-67, this increased to 84 villages and 4 towns. In addition to this, factory sites of Sugar Factories and Government distillery were also electrified. In respect of electrification, this district was very much behind others in this Division.

6. COOPERATION

TABLE NO. 36 : In this table type-wise number of cooperative societies is given for the year 1966-67 i.e. as on 30-6-67. There were 1,585 societies in all, made up of 1,079, Agricultural credit, 97 Non-Agricultural credit, 176 Agricultural Non-credit and 233 Non-Agricultural Non-credit Societies.

TABLE NO. 37 : This table presents statistics regarding Cooperative Banks during 1965-66 and 1966-67. During 1965-66 the district Central Cooperative Bank had 41 branches. In 1966-67, 5 new branches were opened. During above period advances granted had increased from Rs. 796.55 lakh to Rs. 868.15 lakh.

The Land Development Bank which advances long term & Medium term finance to cultivators, had 13 branches at the end of 1966-67. It has granted finance to the tune of Rs. 144.60 lakh during 1966-67 as against Rs. 77.54 lakhs during 1965-66.

TABLE NO. 38 : In this table figures on working of primary Agricultural credit societies are given. Progress is reflected by the ^{increase of} 8,676 members and working capital of Rs. 147.16 lakh. During 1966-67, loans to the extent of Rs. 745.68 lakh were granted by these societies. Percentage of overdues to outstanding loans which stood at 27.7 in 1965-66 had however, remained same i.e. 27.5 at the end of 1966-67.

TABLE NO. 39 : In this table figures in respect of working of different types of Cooperative Societies excepting Agricultural credit are given. Number of Agricultural Marketing Societies in the district had gone down from 22 to 19 in 1966-67. But their working capital has increased from Rs. 111.70 lakh in the year 1965-66 to Rs. 113.17 lakh during 1966-67. Number of Agricultural Processing Societies has increased from 20 to 21 at the end of 1966-67 showing remarkable increase in working capital i.e. from 1610.37 lakh Rs. to 1752.96 lakh in 1966-67. During 1966-67, 29 such stores functioned in the district with a working capital of Rs. 18.95 lakhs. But however it can be seen that although the number of stores has increased by 3 from 1965-66 the working capital in 1966-67 has gone down during the year by Rs. 0.93 lakh.

TABLE NO. 40 : This table includes data regarding the operations of Cooperative Marketing Societies in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The table represents the value of purchase and sale of Agricultural produce and requisites.

During the year 1966-67 these societies purchased material worth of Rs. 497.83 lakhs, which included Agricultural produce, Agricultural requisites and consumer goods. Sales of Agricultural produce and agricultural requisites by these societies amounted to Rs. 681.45 lakh. Amongst the agricultural requisites fertilisers accounted for about 94 percent of the total sales.

TABLE NO. 41 : In this table operation of different types of cooperative societies in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67 are detailed. It shows that during 1966-67 arrivals of agricultural produce amounted to Rs. 145.55 lakhs. In case of Milk societies purchase have gone down from Rs. 6.60 lakh in 1965-66 to Rs. 5.17 lakh in 1966-67 while sales also decreased from Rs. 7.62 lakh to Rs. 5.94 lakh during the same period. In 1965-66 Sugar factories had produced 15.27 lakh tonnes/while in 66-67 the production went down to 12.07 lakh tonnes.

TABLE NO. 42 : This table shows the item-wise quantities sold and its value for regular Markets. The principle items of agriculture produce that are marketed have been taken in the table and it shows that the highest value during the 66-67 is of Gur followed by Cotton(unginned) and Bajara.

TABLE NO. 43: In this table information in respect of registered money lenders and their operations is given. During 1965-66 there were 139 registered money lenders in the district while at the end of 1966-67. The number had increased to 154. But the total advances made by these money lenders decreased from Rs. 93.59 lakh in 1965-66 to Rs.69.85 lakh, during 1966-67, loans to traders and non-traders were 30 percent and 70 percent respectively. While during 1965-66 the percentages were 25 and 75. Non-traders category mainly consists of cultivators and have smaller percentage of loans to non-traders. This must be due to the expanding activities of co-operative movements. It is significant to note

note that during 1966-67, out of total loans of Rs. 69.85 lakh granted by all money lenders in the district, large amount to the extent of Rs. 25.63 lakh had been granted by money lenders in Kopergaon taluka.

77. MEDICAL & PUBLIC HEALTH :

TABLE NO. 44 : In this table statistics regarding availability of medical facilities during 1965 and 1966 is presented. At the end of 1966 there were 3 Hospitals in the district, 13 dispensaries and 17 primary health centres. The number of doctors was 68 and vaidyas 2. The number of beds which was 415 at the end of 1965 had increased to 420 at the end of 1966. During 1966, 20,290 indoor patients and 2,13,108 outdoor patients were treated in these institutions.

TABLE NO. 45 : Gives registration of births and deaths in various talukas during 1965 and 1966. The necessary data is collected from Director of Public Health. The birth & death rate per 1000 population during 1966 comes to 25 and 10 respectively. Both these rates are more as compared to previous year.

TABLE NO. 46 : In this table classification of deaths is given according to important diseases, for the years 1965 and 1966. The data is collected from Director of Public health, Poona.

TABLE NO. 47 : In this table vaccination & inoculation statistics during 1965 and 1966 are presented. It shows that during 1965, 2,17,887 persons had been revaccinated & 1,28,964 had been inoculated against Cholera. These figures for 1966 stands as 1,52,112 and 1,56,816 respectively.

TABLE NO. 48 : Statistics regarding Hygienic Drinking water supply available in Rural areas as on 15th June-1964 is given in this table. It is found that in case of 55 percent villages sufficient Hygienic water was available, in case of 27 percent villages water supply was inadequate while in...

while in remaining 18 percent villages there was no hygienic water supply available.

8. EDUCATION

TABLE NO. 49 : In this table information about literacy in the district as per 1961 census is given, over all percentage of literacy in the district was 26.45. For Rural areas it was 23.54, while for Urban areas it was 51.12. Comparative position of literacy in district and in whole State is given below :-

Thus we see that literacy in Ahmednagar district was lagging behind the State average. Comparing to talukewise proportions, it is found that Ahmednagar taluka with percentage of 38.97 topped the list followed by Shrirampur (28.74) and Kopergaon (27.43). Percentage of all other talukas were less than district average.

TABLE NO. 50 : This table gives number of persons educated upto various levels, in Rural areas, this information is given taluka-wise.

TABLE NO. 51 : This table gives details of educated persons in the Urban areas of the district as per 1961 census. As already seen percentage of literacy in Urban areas was 51.12 and number of literate persons was 95,759. Only about 10 percent persons were matriculates while only 1 percent held degrees or postgraduate degrees. Thus it is observed that 98 percent of the literates have been educated upto Matriculation only.

TABLE NO. 52 : This table gives taluka-wise details of Educational facilities in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. During the period the number of preprimary institutions had increased by 1 where as number of pupils decreased by 52. Number of primary schools & pupils had gone up by 32 and 29,071 respectively, 17 new secondary schools had been started and the number of pupils in them had gone up by 3,595 pupils. Two colleges had been also opened making their total 11 as on March-1966, & 1967, with total strength of 5,038 pupils.

TABLE NO. 53 : In this table details about enrollment of Backward classes during 1965-66 and 1966-67 are given, alongwith its break-up into Boys and Girls as well as break-up of enrollment under pre-primary, primary and secondary.

TABLE NO. 54 : In this table details statistics about the concessions of free education given to economically backward classes are given. During 1965-66 the number of beneficiaries was 22,449 and the amount of concession was Rs. 22.21 lakh. During 1966-67, 35,522 pupils got the benefit of this scheme and the amount of concession rose to Rs. 27.96 lakh.

TABLE NO. 55 : Expenditure on Primary Education by way of grant in aid to local bodies is presented here. During 1965-66 total amount of grants distributed was Rs. 89.07 lakh while during 1966-67 grants worth Rs. 98.10 lakh were distributed. Zilla Parishad, which had received grants to the extent of Rs. 83.20 lakh during 1965-66 was granted an amount of Rs. 93.84 lakh during 1966-67. Municipalities & Cantonment also received more grants during 1966-67 as compared to 1965-66.

TABLE NO. 56 : In this table classification of town & villages is given as per the facilities of primary schooling. In 1966 out of the total No. of 1328 villages & towns, 1310 had schooling facilities, whereas only 18 villages having population under 199 did not have schooling facilities in the villages. At the end of 1966, it is seen that all the villages had been schooling facilities.

9. TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION :

TABLE NO. 57-A : This table gives the length of Railway route in the Ahmednagar district. There is only one line viz. Dhond-mannad of the Central Railway, passing through this district. Its length is 197 Km. It is broad guage single line, with 19 stations in the district.

TABLE NO. 58 : In this table length of Roads excluding Municipal roads, is given according to category and surface classification. Total length of roads which stood at 3,024 Km. at the end of 1960-61 had increased to 4,116 Km. as on 31-3-67. Out of this, 61 Km. belongs to the category of National Highway viz. Poona-Nasik road, which passes through Sangamner taluka. Total length of cement concrete, black topped and water bound macadam roads was 1,997 Km. i.e. 49 percent of the total length. Length of Rural roads had increased from 449 km. in 1960-61 to 1405 during 1966-67. Length of municipal surface roads increased from 72.76 in 1960-61 to 85.10 km. in 1966-67.

TABLE NO. 59 : Gives details about Motor vehicles in operation in Poona Region, as on 31st March-1966 and 1967, is given according to the various type of vehicles. District-wise figures are not maintained by the Regional transport officer. The total number vehicles is increased from 36,035 to 43,796 during the period. The significant increase is in private carriges -Deisel engine,

TABLE NO. 68 : In this table details about the working of the State Transport is given. As on 31-3-66 and 31-3-67. During year's period, 93 vehicles were added to the fleet of the Division. Average daily earnings increased from Rs. 41,980 to Rs. 64,895. Average earning per vehicle also increased from Rs. 292 during 1965-66 to Rs. 316 during 66-67. Road transport is more popular in this district.(CONTD)...

TABLE NO. 61 : This table gives information regarding traffic Census held in May-1965 on different roads in the district. On the National Highway viz. Poona, Nasik Road the census was held at Bota, Dolsane, Chandnapur, and Sanganner in this district. Traffic intensity was found to be maximum at Mile Number 87/1 near Sanganner where total average of 872 vehicles were counted per day and total traffic intensity per 24 hours in tons was 1,991. Other roads on which census was held included Gholi-Manjlegaon Road-State Highway Number 10, Malegaon, Ahmednagar, Palas Road-State Highway Number-14, Poona, Ahmednagar, Jalgaon Road, State Highway No. 27 and Madhe, Wadgaon, Bhir, Gangakhed Road State Highway No. 31. Amongst all these roads maximum intensity was found at Kopergaon on State Highway No. 14 which was 17,742 tons per 24 hours.

TABLE NO. 62 : Gives statistics regarding post, telegraphs & Telephones in the district for the period from 1961-62 to 1966-67. Number of post offices had increased from 365 in 1961-62 to 477 in 1966-67. But during 1965-66 some branches of post offices were closed, since they were running beyond permissible loss. Increase in the number of telephones was very significant. It had jumped from 429 in 1961-62, to 1197 at the end of March-1967.

TABLE NO. 63 : In this table data regarding Rural Broadcasting is incorporated. During the year 1966-67, 62 new villages had been provided with radio sets by the Rural Broadcasting development department, and thus the total number of such villages was increased to 77% out of total of 1318. The number of Radio farm forums, however, was only 130 at the end of 31-3-1967. Villages are expected to form such forums in every village, having a radio and hold discussion on the useful programmes broadcasted.

19. LOCAL BODIES.

TABLE NO. 64 : This table is an abstract showing important statistics of various types of Local bodies viz. Village Panchayat, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for 1965-66 & 1966-67. Detailed information in respect of each of these are given separately in following table.

TABLE NO. 65 : This table gives taluka-wise details about Income and Expenditure of Village Panchayats, for 1965-66 & 1966-67. Total income during 1966-67 of all Panchayats was Rs. 68.23 lakhs while the expenditure amounted Rs. 75.24 lakh lakh, as against the income of Rs. 86.12 lakh and expenditure of Rs. 91.81 lakh during 1965-66. Taxes and fees, together accounted for Rs. 28.41 lakhs which comes to per 42 percent of the total income during 1966-67, in the same year. Amount of receipt as grant was Rs. 35.48 lakhs or 52 percent of the total income. On the expenditure side loans share of expenditure was on account of Public works the amount being Rs. 35.12 lakh i.e, 47 percent of total expenditure. Expenditure on administration was Rs. 10.92 lakhs which works out to 14 percent.

TABLE NO. 66 (A) : In this table Head-wise receipts of Zilla Parishad are given for the years 1964-65, 1965-66 & 1966-67. Total income of the Zilla Parishad was Rs. 791.89 lakh in 1966-67 as compared to the figure of Rs. 1016.92 lakh during 1965-66. This is mainly due to reduction in Govt. grants, revenue receipts & loans and advance. Out of this, self raised resources accounted for 12 percent while remaining amount of Rs. 292.10 lakh was received from Government as grant.

TABLE NO. 66(B) : Head-wise figures of expenditure incurred by Zilla Parishad are given in this table for the years 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67 total expenditure incurred had increased from Rs. 739.70 lakhs during 1964-65 to 1016.92...

1016.92 lakh during 1965-66, but the same is again declined to Rs. 791.89 lakh during 1966-67. The total revenue expenditure during 1966-67 was Rs. 364.96 lakhs. Major expenditure in this is on education i.e. Rs. 162.86 which amounts to 45 percent of revenue expenditure.

TABLE NO. 67 :- There are four municipalities and one cantonment board in this District. In this table, total expenditure incurred by these institutions during 1965-66 and 1966-67 are given. The expenditure figures for 1966-67 for Cantonment board are not given in the table as the same are not received. Total income of all the municipalities was Rs. 87.31 lakhs as against total expenditure Rs. 88.17 lakh. Out of this expenditure an amount of Rs. 3.45 lakh (4%) was spent on Administration. Rs. 6.09 lakh (7%) on collection of taxes, Rs. 35.32 lakh (40%) on public health, Rs. 7.13 lakh (8%) on public works and Rs. 9.13 lakh (10%) on public institution.

11. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

TABLE NO. 68 : Head-wise expenditure incurred on District level Plan schemes during the Annual Plan 1966-67 are given in this table. Total expenditure during the year was Rs. 332.75 lakhs out of this Rs. 217.23 lakhs i.e. 65 percent, was on the schemes implemented under State sector and Rs. 115.52 i.e. 35 percent was on the schemes implemented under local sector schemes.

TABLE NO. 69 : In this table important physical achievements during the year 1966-67 are given. Detail note on Plan achievements have been included in this abstract under Chapter No. 4.

TABLE NO. 70 : This table gives information regarding the C.D. programme in the district as on 31-3-1966. Out of the total number of blocks of 23.00 C.P.A. size, 12 were in stage I,

Stage I, 6 in stage II and 3 in stage III, Remaining 2 were T.D.Blocks viz. Rajur and Waki blocks, carried out of Akola C.D.Block. All the 1323 villages and 1 small town viz. Waki with population of 6,895 were covered by the C.D. programme. Total population covered by the programme was 15,95,549 as per 1961 census.

TABLE NO. 71 : In this table figures of expenditure incurred during various stages by different blocks are given. Funds are granted to a block at the rate of Rs. 12.00 lakh per C.P.A. size in stage I and Rs. 5.00 lakh per C.P.A. size in Stage II.

TABLE NO. 72 : In this table block-wise figures of important physical achievements on selected items during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67 are given.

12. PRICES

TABLE NO. 73 : In this table average retail prices of selected commodities prevailing at Ahmednagar during 1965 and 1966 are given. As stated in the note below the table, the prices have been collected from only one selected shop in the city and hence the prices quoted cannot be taken as representative. This data is given only as an indicator of price trend.

Average price of Wheat(Medium during 1965 and 1966 had remained more^{or}/less stable. Jowar was not available in market during 1965 and 1966. Price of Bajari averaged at Rs. 0.98 per Kilo during 1965 and 1.04 during 1966. Among pulses slight variations were observed in prices for 1965 & 1966. Average prices of Gram dal were Rs. 1.61 and Rs. 1.62 Tur dal Rs. 1.30 and Rs. 1.18, Mung dal Rs. 1.31 and Rs.1.39 and Urid dal Rs. 1.15 and Rs. 1.39 per kilo during 1965 & 1966 respectively. Prices of Gur had increased from Rs. 0.76 per Kilo in 1965 to Rs. 0.83 in 1966. Price of Ground-nut oil had considerably increased from Rs. 2.96 in 1965 to Rs. 4.52 in 1966.

TABLE NO. 74 : In this table consumer price Index numbers in Poona and Sholapur Cities are given since such an index is not being computed for Ahmednagar. It is expected that these will show general trend in prices in Ahmednagar also. In case of Poona centre the index with 1961 prices as based had steadily increased from 135 in April 1966 to 145 in March 1967. Price Index of clothing had also shown steady increase from 121 in January 1966 to 131 in March-1967. In case of Sholapur centre (^{Base} period 1960) The general index increased from 134 in Jan-66 to 155 in March-1967 which shows great increase in prices of all commodities during a years' period. Food articles registered an increase during the period from 140 to 168. Clothing articles went up from 128 to 133.

TABLE NO. 75 : This table gives information in respect of police force. It is significant to ~~note~~ that during the period 1965 and 1966 the strength of police force was stationery at 1023 of which 1034 were permanent and 59 were temporary. Number of police stations out posts and lock ups were also stationery during the period. The total cost of police force was increased from Rs. 26 lakh during 1965 to Rs. 36 lakh during 1966.

TABLE NO. 76 : Crime statistics of the district during the year 1965 and 1966 is given in the table. Figures have been obtained from District Superintendent of Police and break-up of the Crimes under cognizable and Non-cognizable is given seperately for both the years.

TABLE NO. 77 : This table gives data regarding work disposed by Civil and Criminal courts in the district during 1965 and 1966.

TABLE NO. 78 : Deals with Cinema Statistics in the district....

district, during 1965-66 and 1966-67. During these two years the number of permanent theatres stood at 17 while number of touring theatres increased by 1. Seating capacity at the end of 1966-67 was 8,150 in permanent theatres and 4,000 in temporary ones.

TABLE NO. 79 : In this table information about banking Offices is given. It is seen that at the beginning 1967 only 38 towns and villages in the district were served by 55 cooperative and 18 scheduled Banks. The population of these towns and villages comes to 3,70,893 which is 21 percent to total population of the district.

TABLE NO. 80 : This table gives data about joint stock companies at the end of 1965-66 and 1966-67. It is found that during this period there was decrease of 2 Public limited by shares whereas there has been increased by 1 private limited by shares.

TABLE NO. 81 : This table deals with Life Insurance statistics, given to 1966 and 1966-67. During 1966-67 short-fall in the business is appeared, which is reported due to the strike of Development officers. during 1966-67 4,027 policies for Rs. 179.66 lakh were issued as against 5,214 policies worth Rs. 226.40 lakh during 1965-66.

TABLE NO. 82 : Gives data regarding Small Savings collected in the district. During 1965-66 and 1966-67 district was given target of Rs. 25.00 lakh. Gross collection for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67 was recorded to be Rs. 210.66 lakh and 219.21 lakh respectively and the net collection of the District during this period is found to be Rs. + 14.96 lakh and +19.83 lakh respectively.

TABLE NO. 83 : This table gives taluka-wise details of land revenue collections during 1965-66 and 1966-67. During this period the total demand including arrears had increased from

increased from Rs. 38.13 lakh to Rs. 74.16 lakh and amount collected in both the years was Rs. 38.13 lakh and 47.50 lakh respectively. Arrears of Rs. 26.66 lakh were remained during 1966-67.

TABLE NO. 84 : In this table information regarding number of presses, News papers, and periodicals printed as on 31-3-67 is given. In the district there were 88 printing presses and 23 News papers were printed and published during the year. Out of this 23 news papers and periodicals, 4 were daily 17 were weekly and 2 were monthly and all these were published in Marathi.

TABLE NO. 85 : This table represents statistics relating to General Elections held in 1967. There were 12 Assembly constituencies and 2 Parliamentary Constituencies in the district. For this election, there were 877 polling stations. Out of the total voters 6,02,950 i.e. 64.04 percent voted in the Assembly elections and Parliamentary elections.

TABLE NO. 86 : This table gives trends in selected Indicators under, Agriculture, Factories, Electricity, Cooperation and C. D. for the year 1950-51, 1955-56, 1960-61, 1965-66 & 1966-67. Besides the basic data on above items, some important ratios and percentages have also been worked out and presented in the table.

Analytical Review of Sectorial Trends

In this chapter certain indicators have been considered under Agriculture, Irrigation, Live-stock, Road-Mileage and Miscellaneous in order to give their position prior to and after the close of the third Plan in different talukas of Ahmednagar district. An attempt has also been made to show the position of Ahmednagar district in Poona Division wherever possible. In some cases data for the year 1966-67 has also been used for comparison.

1. AGRICULTURE :

Double cropping is one of the methods of increasing agricultural output. Taluka-wise position in this respect can be seen from the following table.

In the district as a whole there has been no appreciable change in the percentage during the period under consideration, & the percentage has remained stationary at 105. From the table it is seen that Pathardi, Shrigonda and Karjat are only talukas having the percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area more than 105 for both the years. In....

In rest of the talukas double cropping is not adopted on a extensive scale as is observed from the table. Irrigation is one of the factors to increase the double cropping activity provided irrigation is not utilised for pernian crops. In Nagar district Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri have large percentage of irrigated areas. However majority of this area is under Sugarcane and hence double cropping is in-significant.

In almost all crops listed above except Sugarcane it is observed that yield rates for Ahmednagar district are lower as compared to those in Poona Division. During 1961-62

1961-62 the yield rate of Sugarcane was 130 times more as compared to division average. The average yield rates of food grains are nearly 75 percent of those for the division as a whole. Year-wise comparison shown that the yield rate for food-grains has increased by nearly 11 percent during 4 years period. This is solely due to significant increase in the yield rate of Jowar. The yield rate of Cotton has increased by nearly 2 times during the above period but that of Groundnut has gone down to 25 percent. The yield rate in respect of Ground-nut is already less (nearly half) as compared to the yield rate of Division.

3) Out-turn of important Crops : The total production of food-grains in the district has increased by 0.20 lakh tonne, the production during 1965-66 being 3.08 lakh tonnes. The production of food-grains in the district is nearly 1/6 of that in the division. Production of Bajara is nearly one fourth of that in the division. The Sugarcane yield in Nagar district during 1961-62 was nearly half of that in the division and that of Cotton is also considerable. The production of rice in this district is however very poor.

4) Irrigation : The position of Ahmednagar district in the division in respect of Irrigation is better since the percentage of area irrigated to net sown area during 61-62 was 11.6 in the district as against 10 in the division. This has remained more or less stationery in the division.

The table on next page shows that Rahuri, Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Shrigonda have better irrigation facilities. The position in respect of Newasa, Shevgaon & Rahuri has improved during 4 years period.

The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area during 1961-62 in the district was 114....

This changed to 113 during 1965-66. In the division this increase is from 117 percent to 122 percent. In respect of Akola, Newasa, Shevgaon, Parner & Pathardi the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area is more than 125. If comparison of this percentage during 1961-62 is made w.f.t. that in 1965-66, it is seen that this percentage has increased in respect of Akola, Ahmednagar, Karjat, Pathardi. Sangamner, Rahuri, Parner & Shrigonda show some decrease whereas other talukas do not show much change.

cane/ is the important crop of this district and nearly 30
percent of total area of the Division under this crop be-
longs to Nagar District. Area under food-grains and Cotton
has been decreased considerably during the above period
but the same is substantiated by other non food-crops.

6. Agricultural Credit and Outstanding dues:... The main
function of primary agricultural credit societies is to
advance loans to cultivators which serves as working capi-
tal to Agricultural Industry. The number of such Agricul-
tural credit societies during the year 1966-67 was 1176
and Ahmednagar District ranks first in the Division as far
as number of such societies is concerned. The loans are a
advanced by these societies to cultivators to meet their
needs of Agricultural operations such as purchase of seeds
Manures, Insecticides, Agricultural implements, construction
of wells etc. and hence in a way the functioning of Agri-
cultural credit societies will be reflected in loan opera-
tions. Following table gives the taluka-wise loans advanced
during 1961-62 and 1966-67.

During 1966-67 all the Agricultural credit socie-
ties together had given loans to the tune of Rs. 745 lakhs
which shows an increase of 45 percent in comparison with
the loans advanced during 1960-61. When comparison for Talu-
kas is considered, it has been increased by more than 100
percent for Akola, Shevgaon, Ahmednagar, Pathardi, Karjat &
Jamkhed talukas. Whereas during the year 1966-67 highest
advances have been granted in Kopergaon Taluka i.e. Rs.
213.18 lakhs, which comes to nearly 29 percent of total ad-
vances in the District and it is followed by Shrirampur and
Rahuri with total advances of Rs. 172.65 lakhs & 92.18 lakhs

growing cash crops, mainly Sugarcane and hence the advances are very high in view of the repaying capacity of the Societies. Total advances per member comes to Rs. 403. & is the highest in the Division. The amount of outstanding dues has also gone up from 648.10 lakhs in 60-61 to 967.86 lakhs in 66-67, i.e. 49 percent more as compared to 60-61. Hence it seems that even-though the advances has increased during above period by 45 percent. The outstandings has also gone up during the same period.

7) Agricultural Wage Rates : As prices of essential commodities increases it has counter affect to increase the labour charges. Following tables-will show how labour charges have gone up during the four years period. The average wage rates given below have been worked out from the data collected for three centres Belapur, Karjat and Akola. ...

Above table shows the significant increase of wage rates for skilled labour, where as wages of un-skilled labour have shown very negligible increase during three years period. Wages of Black-smith have increased by 1½ times and that of carpenter by 27 percent.

8. Live-stock per 100 hectares :

Possession of Live-stock is a good assets to the rural people, as it is most assential for agricultural operations, Table No. 20 gives taluka-wise detailes of Live-stock-as per 1966 census. Comparison of 1961 and 1966 live-stock data shows that the Live-stock population has gone up by 65,704 during five years period, and the total during 1966 was 17.66 lakhs.

The ratio of Live-stock population (ovine & Bovine) per 100 hectares in the District has slightly increased from 100 to 104 where-as this ratio in the Division has gone down from 123 to 116 of the total Live-stock population. nearly 49 percent are cattle and about 5 percent buffaloes, and 45 percent sheep and goats.

9. Poultry :

Poultry is another industry which provides additional income to a farmer. The total poultry in the District as per 1966 census is 6.90 lakhs. In Parner taluka maximum number of poultry birds were located, followed by Sangamner, Ahmednagar, Shrigonda and Karjat Talukas.

Poultry per 1000 human population is 388 for District and it varies in talukas from 191 in Jamkhed to 732 in Parner.

10. Per capita consumption of Electricity.

Ahmednagar district is back-ward as far as consumption of electricity is concerned. Because per capita consumption of electricity in 1966-67 is about 5.3 KWH, whereas it is 53.6 in Poona Division. During 1965-66 consumption of total electricity was 66.63 lakh K.W.H. whereas it increased to 93.73 lakh K.W.H. in 1966-67. Per capita consumption of electricity during 1961-62 and 1966-67 shows three times increase. The break up according to purpose is given below :

It is apparent from above that during 5 years period total consumption has increased three times due to high consumptions for domestic and commercial, and other purposes.

11. Registration in Employment Exchange :

Employment exchange is a link between employes & un-employed but all the un-employed do not register themselves at exchange, particularly in rural areas. However the magnitude of un-employment as given by the exchange is not exact representative of the problem. Table No. 30 gives

No. 30 gives categori-wise registration and placement during 1965-66 and 1966-67. Total number on the Live-register at the end of March-66 was 4737 and that at the end of March-67 was 4972 showing an increase of 235. The magnitude of un-employment is thus increasing.

12. Indoor and Outdoor patients treated in the Hospitals

Total number of indoor and out-door patients treated during 1965 were 297 lakhs whereas it has gone down to 2.33 lakhs during 1966. The number of indoor patients treated has actually increased during the year by 147 patients and correspondingly number of beds also has increased from 415 in 1965 to 420 in 1966. The number of out-door patients treated has gone down during the year by 63,980. Total number of patients treated shows that out of 6 persons in the District one person has received medical aid from Govt. or semi Govt. dispensaries and hospitals. The total number of deaths during the year 1966 is 17,244 showing an increase of nearly 2500. Major damage to human life during the year was due to periperatory diseases, Dycentry, Diarrhoea and other diseases. The propoation of deaths due to Malaria during 1966 appears to quite less as compered to that during 1965. The number of deaths due to Small Pox and Typhoid has however been doubled. The cases of accidents also appear to be more during 1966 as compared to previous year.

13. Increase in the number of Students :

The total number of primary institutions in the district during 1965-67 were nearly 2,000 with pupils totalling nearly 3 lakhs. The number of institutions in the district, forms one fifth of the total in the Division whereas the number of pupils forms one sixth of the respective figures in the Division. This shows that the number of primary students.

primary students appears to be less as compared to the number of institutions when compared with the position in the Division. The number of institutions in the District has increased by 32 during the period of one year. There has been also has been also an increase of 400 teachers during the year. As regards secondary education this district is lagging behind in the division. Since the number of schools is only 164 which forms only 17 percent of the total in the Division. As against this the number of students forms 13 percent of the total in the Division. As regards Higher education the position is still unsatisfactory. The number of institutions in the district is only 11 out of nearly 100 in the Division and the number of students is only 5,000 out of total of 52,000 in the Division. The percentage of girls in the total for higher education in the Division is 21 where-as this works out to 14. This shows that the proportion of girls going for higher education in the district is less as compared to that in the Division.

14. Road Mileage :

The following Table gives road length (Extra Municipal) according to surface classification.

The total road length at the end of 31-3-61 was 3024.11 Km. which was 18 K.M. per 100 Sq. Km. The same for the Division was 19 K.M. This ratio at the end of 31-3-67 came to 24 K.M. per 100 Sq. K.M. for the district. This shows the increase in road length during above period, but this increase is due to increase in Kaccha roads. Increase in the road-length of lowertypes has been doubled during the period of 6 years. Of the total length of 4116 K.M. nearly 20 percent has covered by National and State High-ways and 47 percent is covered by District roads and the remaining 33 percent by rural roads. Talukawise position is available for only 1964. Which shows that the road-length per 100 Sq. K.M. in respect of all the talukas of the District except Kopegaon, Sangamner, Shrirampur, Parner, Nagar Pathardi is less than 10 K.M.

15. Banking Facilities :

In Ahmednagar District at the end of 1962-63 there were 46 banking Offices only, and the same have gradually increased to 73 upto beginning of 1967, total population covered by the bank offices is 3.71 lakhs i.e. 21 percent of the total population of District and the ratio of population per bank office comes to 24,328. The number of banks in the district are less as compared with other District in the Division.

16. Prices :

The work of price collection of weekly retail prices at district Head-quarters was started from November-1962. Prices are collected on weekly basis and hence a wide range of fluctuations are ought to be due to day to day market conditions, and hence consolidated effect of this price fluctuations can be seen from consumer price index. For present this index is computed for two places i.e. Sholapur & Poona in the Division with a 1960 and 1961 as base years respectively. The general Index during 1966-67 has gone up...

gone up to 150 and 141 at Sholapur and Poona and hence it shows that as compared with 1960 and 61. The general prices has gone up by one and half times during 6 years period.

Due to Government restriction Rice and Jowar was not available in Local Market and hence prices available for 1964 are taken for reference. In almost all commodities given above the prices have increased, except the price of Gur. Prices of Gram dal, Groundnut^{oil} have been increased more than double. Prices of all other commodities have also shown a considerable increase.

CHAPTER IV.

ANNUAL PLAN - 1966 - 67

Introduction : The draft outline of the Fourth Five Year Plan was presented to Parliament on August 29th, 66, " to consolidate and carry forward the achievements of the earlier three Plans, make-up for their short-falls as far as practicable and to prepared the ground for a self , reliant economy to be attained by the end of 5th Plan. " The year 1965 marked with hostilities with our unfriendly neighbour Pakistan and unprecedented draught condition in our country which completely smashed our agriculture production. Thus the major task before the country was to generate self confidence and the ability of the people to carry forward the task of realising the good of socialistic pattern of society. The major objective of the fourth Plan were :

- 1) to achieve self reliance as early as possible,
- 2) Top priority to agriculture and Agricultural industries to achieve maximum agricultural production in order to enlarge the income of the rural people, as well as to increase the supplies of food articles & industrial raw material.

Self reliance indicates not only freedom from dependence on foreign aid but also the establishment of an acceptable minimum standard of living for the masses & a continuing rise in their standard.

Taking all the factors into consideration Fourth Plan of the Maharashtra State was prepared in con-

consultation with the Planning Commission, but not yet finalised as the National Plan has not been finalised. 1966-67 is a first year of the fourth Plan and during this period highest priority was accorded to agricultural production and mostly schemes which were quick and high yielding in nature to enhance the agricultural production in minimum possible time.

Technique of Planning.

The district Plan for the year 1966-67 was formulated. On the lines and the policies laid down by the State Govt. State Government plays a very important roll as far as the district Plan is concerned, because it is a agency which finances major portion of the expenditure.

Unfortunately, during the year 1965-66, 653 villages were affected by the famine and the chronic saarcity condition. Thus it was the major task before the district Adminstration to axcelerate its efforts to enhance the food production in minimum possible time.

Annual Plan 1966-67

The Plan schemes under-taken during the period under review were classified in-to three categories, i.e. 1) State Level, 2) Divisional Level & 3) District Level. Since the formulation of the Zilla Parishad some Plan Schemes were transferred to it for implcmentation in Local Sector, while other schemes are implemented by various departments in State Sector. The following table illustrates the various Plan schemes and its expenditure in this district. (Please see table on next page.)

The District Plan expenditure during 1966-67 was to the tune of Rs. 332.75 lakhs. Out of which Rs. 217.23 ..

Lakhs were spent under State Sector, and under Local Sector only Rs. 115.52 lakhs were spent. It will be observed from the above table that the total expenditure on Agriculture Programme, Irrigation and Power is very high. This high expenditure was mainly due to the policy & programme for fulfilling the food production targets and to create basic conditions of industrial growth so as to encourage resource-base-industries in Rural areas. Community Development and Transport and Communication are the two major heads of expenditure under Local Sector.

Agricultural Programme.

Programme of Agricultural production aims to reconstruct the rural economy of this district. Agriculture in this district has to face certain natural difficulties. Southern part of the district which is mostly dry and lack of irrigation facilities, whereas in Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri the soil is rich fertile and have good assured water supply. Thus the cultivators of the southern part have to strive had to meet the both ends, whereas the other part endowed with prosperity due to mainly Sugar-

...ane. Thus Agricultural Programme includes the develop-
 ment of Irrigation, Soil Conservation, Supplies of fer-

A) Agriculture Production :

Under Agricultural production various schemes were undertaken for execution. During the year 1966-67 under the Horticultural Development Programme new plantations were carried out in 404 acres, Rejuvenation in 216 acres, and Renovation in 211 acres, on 657 acres the free-fertiliser-demonstrations were held on cultivators fields. Besides this subsidy for distribution of saan seed and for Plant protection appliances were granted to purchase 562 quintals of saan-seed and 185 appliances. Under Kharip & and Rabi crop campaign programme 1,200 acres were brought under paddy, 400 acres under H-V Kowar, 100 acres under Bajara, 1,200 acres under maize cultivation. Under State ---

Sector subsidy for pesticides and Plant protection services were offered to the cultivators.

B) Land Development : Land Development Programme was carried out mainly under State Sector, and the principal schemes were 1) Consolidation of holdings 2) Schemes for bull dozing & 3) Scheme for tractor ploughing. Consolidation of holding was done in one village and 669 acres were consolidated whereas 3868 acres were leveled by bulldozing & 1500 acres were ploughed by tractors.

Soil Conservation : Low productivity in Agriculture is generally due to progressive deterioration of soil due to erosion. In irrigation areas soil deterioration is occurred due to water logging and consequent salinity and alkalinity. It would have not been judicious to ignore this problem and to allow soil to be deteriorated. Thus it was necessary to take effective steps to stop further deterioration of soil. A scheme for contour bunding was carried out under State Sector with a total expenditure of Rs. 79.17 lakhs and 1,09,094 acres area have been banded.

Minor Irrigation : Minor Irrigation programme have been under taken in this district with a view to augment the agricultural production and to provide assured water supply to cultivators' fields. Under this head construction of new wells, installation of pumping sets, lift irrigation scheme, schemes to bore and to take holes in wells, percolation, irrigation tanks were included. Out of total expenditure Rs. 1.25 lakhs was incurred on subsidy for installation of pumping sets and on percolation and irrigation tanks.

Animal Husbandry : Animal Husbandry Programme includes district premium bull scheme, opening of Veterinary aid centres, supplementary cattle breeding centres and the

construction of buildings for poultry centres. Major portion of the expenditure incurred on district premium bull scheme, which maintained 158 bulls followed by supplementary cattle breeding centres.

Dairy Development : The need for expanding the production of supplementary and subsidiary food have been increasingly felt in recent years. Dairy Development not only increases the income of the farmers but also help in enhancing the supply of milk and milk products. Under this scheme Rs. 0.02 lakhs were spent for assistance to milk producers' societies and loans for purchase of cattle from rural areas.

Fisheries : No programme was under-taken of worth name in this district during the year 1966-67. The programme of inland fisheries can be under-taken in Bhandardara and Visapur tank where sufficient water level remains through out the year. This will not only make fish available in the Urban and Rural areas but will also provide beneficiary employment to fishermen mostly of whom live are on the verge of poverty. During the whole of third Plan period fishing equipment worth Rs. 100 were given to fishermen, and the scheme for grant of financial assistance could not be materialised because these poor fishermen failed to produce required security for loans.

Ware-housing & Marketing : Under this Sub-head, there were only two schemes in operation i.e. 1)Development of Agricultural Marketing and 2)Loans to cooperative Agricultural processing societies. Subsidy worth Rs. 0.58 lakhs were accorded under this schemes to various cooperative Societies in this district.

Forest : The scheme for forest includes Plantation of valuable trees. Afforestation of soil conservation, fuel plan-

~~WATER, DEVELOPMENT OF BOARDS AND JUNGLES AND FOREST PROTECTION.~~ During the year 1966-67, 460 hectares were under plantation of valuable trees, 78 hectares under afforestation of soil conservation, 320 hectares under fuel plantation, 160 hectares under bamboo plantation and 202 hectares under Development of pastures and fodder. The total expenditure of Rs. 3.01 lakhs incurred under State Sector on these schemes.

II. COOPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT : Under this head Rs. 34.47 lakh were spent through state and Local Sector. The contribution of the state sector is very low, whereas under Local Sector Rs. 31.59 lakh were spent, mainly on community development.

Cooperation : Economic Development and Social Change are the vital elements in the process of development of a under-developed country. And cooperation is the important mean by which it is possible to transform the present situation, by raising productivity & extending improvement in technology. The cooperation became the principal basis of organisation in many branches of economic life, notably Agricultural Marketing, distribution, supplies, housing, and construction and sugar industries in this district. During the year 1966-67 Rs. 6,000 were granted as a subsidy to cooperative societies under the scheme of extension of agricultural credit, Rs. 2,31,719 were granted as a subsidy for godown to cooperative Marketing societies under development of cooperative farming for pilot areas, and under the cooperative consumer stores scheme Rs. 4,500 were granted ^{as} a subsidy during the year 1966-67.

Community Development : Community Development is a

method by which the transformation of the social and economic life of the rural areas can be achieved. It was the idea mooted during the first five year plan, to gear up the people's participation in the process of Planning. The community Development programme in this district was in all the 15 blocks, out of which 2 are Tribal Development blocks namely 1) Waki and 2) Rajur. During the 1966-67 total expenditure on various community Development schemes was to the tune of Rs. 31.59 lakh entirely in Local sector.

III. IRRIGATION AND POWER.: Irrigation and power are most important aspect of economic development. Expansion of Irrigation is an essential condition for diversifying agricultural activities and increasing crop yields, whereas the development of power help to rebuilt the agricultural economy and thus it paves way for rapid expansion. Under this head the rural electrification scheme was mainly carried out at the cost of Rs. 61.61 lakh. Rural electrification primarily aims to enhance employment opportunities thereby increasing the income and ultimately the standard of living of the people. The rural electrification is used for irrigation pumping sets and development of small scale industries in rural areas. During the third-Plan 140 villages were electrified, whereas during 66-67, 84 villages have been electrified. This indicates the magnitude of the work which was carried during the period under reference.

IV. INDUSTRY & MINING. : Under this head Rs. 7.07 lakhs were spent out of which Rs. 5.82 lakh in state sector and Rs. 1.25 lakh in Local Sector. Financial assistance to the tune of Rs. 90,629 in form of loan and subsidy were granted to 28 cooperative societies under the Scheme of ...

development of Handloom industry whereas 20 societies were benefitted by the subsidy for consumption of electric power by small scale industries. Under share capital contribution scheme to societies and loans to its members Rs. 4,69,280 were distributed, and financial assistance to the tune of Rs. 1,24,983 was accorded under the scheme for financial assistance to small scale and cottage industries.

V. TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION: Poona, Dhond, Ahmednagar, Manmad is the only rail link in this district. Thus the road transport plays the crucial role in the economic development of this district. Due to expansion of Sugarcane industries and due to developmental activities in the district which ultimately contributed for the increase in agriculture production and income of our rural gentry. Thus the need for development of road transport is still in prominence, linking market places and other important villages and towns in this district. Taking all this factors into consideration during the Annual Plan, Rs. 335.05 lakh were spent for the development of Roads in this district. Mainly building of roads in Sugarcane areas, district roads and approach roads, in the rural areas.

VI. SOCIAL SERVICES : This developmental head includes education, Medical and Nursing, Public Health, water supply and drainage, housing, Back-ward class welfare, Social welfare and Labour welfare. The total expenditure on this scheme during the year 1966-67 comes to Rs. 38.78 lakhs out which Rs. 15.31 lakh were spent under State Sector- whereas 23.47 were spent under Local sector.

1. General Education : Development of Education is the important ingredient of the economic development. Education

kindless the flame of awareness which creates a social order based on values of freedom, social justice and equal opportunities. According to 1961 census percentage of literacy in this district was only 26 percent. General educational programme includes normal expansion of primary-education, loans scholarships to primary teachers, construction of primary school buildings, improvement of science education at primary stage, development of non-Govt. secondary schools, scholarships in secondary schools, Removal of illiteracy and E.B.C. concession. Under general education programme Rs. 8.57 lakh were spent during 1966-67 As a result of removal of illiteracy 95,436 adults were made literate and 6,173 students were recipients of concession under E.B.C. Scheme.

2. Medical & Nursing : Construction at Ripon General Hospital at Ahmednagar was in progress. The expenditure is on construction and training of nurses.

3. Public Health: Public Health includes small pox and Malaria eradication programme and Family Planning programme under the family planning programme 1,422 vasectomy operations, were performed 502 women under-gone tubectomy operations, and 4,051 loops were inserted during said period. Corresponding figures the year 1964-65 are 675 vasectomy, 404 tubectomy and 7,470 I.U.C.D. insertion. From this, it is evident that the tubectomy & vasectomy operations were increased in comparison to 1965-66, but I.U.C.D insertion were less than those of the year 1965-66. The major reason attributed for the less response was the complications like bleeding, while discharge, backpain, head-ack and other general complications faced by the large number of women. The total expenditure incurred for family planning programme during 1966-67 was to the tune of Rs. 48,500. Under the small pox eradication programme

eradication scheme nearly 87 percent of the ~~area~~ ^{area} have been covered and the total expenditure was Rs. 1.33 lakhs. The National Malaria eradication scheme is a many phased programme and 3,79,769 blood smears were collected and examined during 1966-67.

4. Water Supply & Drainage. : Under this sub-head an expenditure of Rs. 2.87 lakhs was incurred, providing additional rural drinking water wells in rural areas.

5. Housing : Under this sub-head total expenditure was to the tune of Rs. 0.74 lakh and major portion of this was spent on local sector for village housing project scheme and extension of village gaothans and provision of housing sites.

6. Backward Class Welfare : Backward class welfare includes payment of tuition fees and examination fees and scholarships to the Backward Class students, grants to the backward class students' hostels, scheme for Vimukta Jatis, Distribution of improved agriculture implements, applied nutrition programme and two tribal Development blocks i.e. Waki and Rajur. The major portion was spent for these two tribal development blocks i.e. Rs. 5.3 lakh and the rest of the amount was spent on all the remaining scheme.

7. Social Welfare : Under social welfare, Rs. 29,000 were spent for 33 Balwadis, 18 Literacy classes, 10 Maternity centres and 3 arts and crafts classes.

8. Labour and Labour welfare : Craftsman training scheme was in operation and under this sub-head Rs. 5.90 lakh were spent and 144 students were benefitted by this scheme.
