C H A P T E R N O . I  
I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1 Introduction and Location:

Nanded district sprawls between  $18^{\circ} - 15'$  and  $19^{\circ} - 55'$  north latitude and  $77^{\circ} - 7'$  and  $78^{\circ} - 15'$  east longitude. The contour of the district is very irregular in shape. It is situated on south-east fringes of Maharashtra State demarcating the boundaries of Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra. It is one of the five districts of Marathwada Division and lies in the Godawari basin. It is about 10,492.0 Sq. Km. in area and its population is 13,97,762 as per 1971 census. It constitutes for 3.37% and 2.73% of area and population of the state respectively. Nanded town, the district head quarters, is situated on the left bank of the Godawari river. It is the biggest Railway station in the district and a business centre, with its rapid strides towards industrialization. It is famous for having Guru Govindsingh Guradwara which is next to Amritsar in India.

1.2 Boundaries:

The district is bounded on the north by Yeotmal district, while Adilabad and Nizamabad districts of Andhra Pradesh lie on the east and south; Osmanabad district on south-west and Parbhani on the north-west of the district.

1.3 Administrative Set-up:

For administrative purposes, the district is divided into eight talukas. The area, number of inhabited villages, number of towns, population as per 1971 census and the percentage of area and population of each taluka are shown in the following table, which gives a birds eye-view of the set-up with area and population.

1.4 General Administration and Revenue:

The Collector is incharge of General Administration , law and order, treasury, land revenue and Civil supplies. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector, and two Deputy Collectors, one for each revenue division, Nanded and Deglur. They, inturn, are incharge of these divisions and assist the Collector. Tahsildars are incharge of taluka in the district, who are assisted by Naib tahsildars.

### 1.5 Area:

The area of the district is 10,492.0 Sq.Km.(10,236.3 Sq.Km. rural and 255.7 Sq.Km. Urban). It is the seventeenth district in rank in terms of area in Maharashtra state vis-a-vis at the last ladder in Marathwada region. Kinwat taluka is the biggest of all the talukas in the district while Deglur the smallest.

### 1.6 Topography:

Nanded district lies in the plateau of south India, on account of which it is one of the most homogeneous districts in Maharashtra. It does not have any well defined topographical natural zones. The southern portion of the district is however, little different because of its poor hilly soil. The north-eastern part of taluka Kinwat is again different because of its extensive mountain ranges and barren and unculturable area. The rest of the central part of the district is flat with fertile land of black cotton soil.

### 1.7(A) Hill Ranges and Forests:

There is only one main system of hills known as Bhag or Thanvari range. It traverses the district from north-west to south-east. There are a few minor ranges of hills like Mudkhed hill in Bhokar and Hadgaon talukas and Balaghpat mountain in Kandhar and Mukhed talukas. This district has various types of forest from sparse and stunted to dense and ever green.

The area under forests is over 777 Sq. Km. forming 7.27% of the total geographical area of the district.

Major portion of the forests area in the district is, in K  
Kinwat taluka forming 25% of its area under forests, inter-  
alia Hadgaon and Bhokar talukas are also gifted with dense  
forests area in the district.

#### 1.7(3) Rivers:

The important rivers that flow in the district are the Godawari, the Manjra, Manyad, Saraswati, Penganga, Ashana, Sita and Lendi. The Godawari enters the district from the west, passing through the central part of the district, passes out into Nizamabad district of Andhra Pradesh. The Manjra which is the largest tributary of the Godawari flows from south to north demarcating the boundary of the district and Andhra Pradesh. The Manyad, flows through Kandhar taluka from west to east and forms the natural boundary between Mukhed and Deglur talukas on one hand and Biloli on the other. The Saraswati rises in Wakhd hills and flows from north to south through the eastern portion of the district and finally embrace the Godawari near the village Malkautha. The river Ashna flowing the eastern direction, joins the Godawari on left bank about three kilometres from Nanded town. The Lendi flows from west to east in Deglur taluka. It runs partly alongwith southern boundary and after taking slightly north-wards course passes through Deglur taluka and meets the Manjara. The Penganga river forms the northern boundary of the district flowing in eastern direction and falls into the Wardha river in Yeotmal district of Vidarbha division. The less important river Seeta rises from north and meets the Godawari.

The perennial rivers of this district are the Godavari, Manjara, Manyad and Penganga. The irrigation potentials of these perennial rivers are not fully utilized, except Manyad. The command area under its project is only 35772 Hectares.

#### 1.7(1) Soil:

Black cotton soil is universal in all the talukas of the district. It is very rich in calcium magnicium and carbonates, but poor in nitrogen, potash, phosphates and humus. Its high retentivity of moisture has rendered it very useful in rainfall starved region of the district. The best black cotton soil is found in narrow strips of land on the banks of the Godavari and its tributaries.

Good black cotton soil is found along the banks of the Manjara and the Manyad rivers in Biloli taluka while elsewhere it is undulating and much inferior in quality and covered with loose stones. The soil of Nanded taluka consists principally of rich black alluvial deposits. Near the foot of the hills black soil is scarce and it is of a very poor description. Deglur taluka though the smallest in the district is endowed with the best soil in the district. With exception of a small portion of the taluka towards the western direction, the entire soil is of superior quality and suitable for raising Rabi crops. Kandhar taluka generally has black and rich soil and grows rabi crops. Unfortunately half of the taluka is covered with hills, small bushes and light soil. It is undulating and covered with loose stones where Kharif crops

are chiefly grown. About three fourth taluka of Hadgaon is highly fertile, particularly along with the banks of Penganga . . is most fertile. Towards the south near the hills, the soil is rather mixed up with certain saline matter. In the remaining two talukas i.e. Bhokar and Kinwat, except for the hilly tracts, the entire land is of black cotton soil.

#### 1.7(D) Minerals:

This district is devoid of important minerals worth mentioning. The only mineral available in the district is lime stone. The deposits of intertrappean lime stone have been found to occur in Kinwat taluka. The lime stone quarried is not uniform in grade and is highly siliceous. Building materials like Deccan trap or basalt, sand, sandstones and brick clay are also found in this district.

#### 1.8 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall:

##### 1.8-(A) Climate:

The climate of the district is dry and subject to extremes of heat and cold. It is very hot in summer and cold in winter. The hottest month of the year is May and the Coldest are December and January. Within the district even the weather ~~can~~ conditions show local variations. Kinwat taluka in the extreme north-east is comparatively more hot than other talukas of the district. There are wide seasonal variations in temperature even at Nanded town. Like other parts of the division the rainy season starts from June and lasts upto the end of September. However, there are scattered and untimely rains in other

seasons also. The climate of the district though subject to extremes of heat and cold is healthy.

### 1.3(B) Temperature:-

Monthly temperature records are available only for Nanded station. In the year 1972, the mercury touched the highest point i.e.  $44.0^{\circ}$  centigrade in the month of June and the lowest temperature recorded in the month of January was  $7.2^{\circ}$  centigrade.

### 1.3(C) Rainfall :-

The rainy season starts from June and lasts upto the end of September. Nanded district falls in assured rainfall zone of the state, though the rainfall is not evenly distributed in all parts of the district. Usually, 75% of the total rainfall is received from the south-west monsoon (June to September) and 13% from post monsoon period (October to December). Pre-monsoon showers contribute about 7% of the total rainfall and the remaining 2% is received from winter monsoon during January and February.

The rainfall data is available for eight rain gauge centres located at each taluka head quarters of the district. The maximum rainfall, recorded in the year 1972 was 670.0 M.M. in Kinwat taluka and the minimum rainfall recorded in Nanded taluka i.e. 360.0 M.M. only.

In the year 1972 the south-west monsoon contributed less than than the post-monsoon. This resulted in insufficient rainfall required for Agriculture. This was a scarcity year, because of failure of monsoon.

C H A P T E R N O . II

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON SCOPE AND LIMITATION OF STATISTICS  
PRESENTED IN THIS STATISTICAL ABSTRACT.

1972-73.

Purpose and scope:

This is the 13th issue of the District Statistical Abstract published since 1958-59. As stated in the previous issue the purpose of this publication is to present the background of statistical material on as many Socio Economic characteristics of the district as possible, so as to make it a useful reference book. The statistical data presented in this issue for the year 1972-73 will be useful for research, planning or further Socio Economic studies about the district. It presents taluka-wise data on various socio Economics aspects for inter-taluka comparison within the district. In case of a few tables for which data for the year 1972-73 was not available, the data for the latest year has been given. The data on similar items for the earlier year has also found its place in the respective tables which, will facilitate comparison and drawing safe inferences there-on.

District at a glance:

This table gives the picture of the district in nutshell. It is divided in two parts. The first part deals with general particulars on various topics like population, agriculture and education etc. the second part presents the data on these items for the district as a whole. The reference period to which the data relates to the district or division is shown against each item though it may not relate to the identical period due to non-availability of the data for the same year.

The scope and limitation of the statistical data presented in this issue is briefly enlarged in the following paragraphs:-

(1) Area and population :-

Tables 1 to 7 present population data as per 1971 population census. Table-1 gives taluka-wise data on Rural and Urban areas and populations of the district alongwith numbers of inhabited, uninhabited villages, towns, occupied residential houses and households. It also gives the break-up of male and female population. Table-2 depicts decadal variation in population since 1951. It deals with Rural and Urban, male and female population and density of population per Sq. Km. with decadal percentage variations in population. Table-3 gives taluka-wise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1971 census. The ranges are (1) less than 200; (2) 200 to 499; (3) 500 to 999; (4) 1000 to 1999 and so on, along with number of un-inhabited villages. Table-4 shows taluka-wise classification of towns according to population ranges with population ranging from, below 5,000 to 1,00,000 and above as per 1971 population census. Table-5 indicates Taluka-wise workers and non-workers according to 1971 census. It deals with rural and urban livelihood classes as cultivators, agriculture labourers and other persons engaged in forestry, fishing, plantation, mining, manufacturing, processing and household industry etc. It also gives the number of non-workers in the district. Table-6 indicates distribution of rural and urban population according to age groups, mother tongue and religion. Table-7 gives taluka-wise rural and urban schedule caste and schedule tribe

population according to 1971 census with its break-up in males and female.

(2) Climate:

Table No. 8 presents centre-wise monthly rainfall, number of rainy days alongwith normal and total rainfall in M.M. during the year 1972. Table-9 shows the monthly, maximum and minimum temperature in centigrade at Nanded proper for the calendar year 1972.

(3) Agriculture:

The tables- 10 to 21 deal with the data on land utilization, area under different crops, yield per hectare, area irrigated by difference sources of irrigation , area irrigated under different crops, number of irrigation wells, minor irrigation works, major and medium projects, agriculture wage rates, agriculture implements, famine and akin to scarcity conditions and history of scarcity in the district during the year 1970-71 and 1971-72.

Table-10 gives taluka-wise land utilization figures in hectares for the years 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively. This table exhibits geographical area, forest area and other land use area. Table-11 stands for taluka-wise area under different crops during the above period, while Table-12 gives data of yield per hectare and out-turn of certain selected crops of the district supplied by department of Agriculture, Poona. Table-13 shows irrigated area by different sources i.e. Govt. canals, tanks and wells etc. in each taluka, in hectares, during the above period. It also gives total net and gross area irrigated. Table-14 deals with the area irrigated under different crops in each

taluka of the district during the year 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively. Table-15 shows the taluka-wise number of irrigation wells in use, not in use and other wells during the year 1970-71 and 1971-72. Table-16 presents information regarding number of minor irrigation works excluding wells. This table also shows number of irrigation works not in use and in use with net area irrigated during the above period. Table-17 presented in this publication is meant for giving information on major and medium irrigation projects in the district as on 30-6-1972. It gives the location of the project, area under its command and area irrigated by it. It also shows the cost of construction of the project. Table-18 deals with agricultural wage rates for skilled and unskilled labourers both, prevalent in the three selected rural centres namely Ardhapur, Loha and Bhokar for the calendar year 1971-and 1972 respectively. Table-19 gives the taluka-wise number of agricultural implements as per 1971 live-stock census. Table-20 shows taluka-wise famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity conditions in the district experienced during the year 1972-73. Table-21 gives circle-wise and taluka-wise information of number of villages affected for determining the precarious scarcity condition and history of scarcity since the year 1968-69 to 1972-73 in this district.

(4) Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries:

The tables 22 to 25 enunciate the statistical data on Animal Husbandry and tables 26(a), 26(b) & 26(c) deal with forest and fisheries, in the district. Table-22 shows taluka-wise live-stock populations under differnt categories i.e. Cattle, Buffaloes, Sheep Goats and poultry as per 1972 live-stock

Census. Table-23 enlightens veterinary facilities available in each taluka of the district during the year 1972-73. Table-24 shows disease-wise live-stock mortality during the year 1972-73. Table-25 shows the statistics relating to number of recognized slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in them during the year 1972-73. Table 26(a) shows the classification of forest area in the district during the year 1972-73; whereas Table-26(b) gives the quantity and value of major and minor forest products.

#### (5) Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity:

Under this heading Tables 27 to 37 present data on employment, industry, mining and electricity. Table-27 gives details for each industry, the total number of working factories, total workers classified as males and females and total number of mandays for which they worked during the year 1974. The data presented in columns 6 to 8 relates only to the factories submitting returns, while column 9 for factories not submitting returns. Table-28 gives industry-wise distribution of working factories according to working strength ranging from less than 10 workers to 5000 and above in this district during the year 1972. Table-29 presents the distribution of factories for each industry by number of days worked during the year 1971. Table-30 shows statistics relating to Annual survey of industries in the district, furnishing the figures on number of factories registered their production capital, employment, gross output in terms of Rupees and value added by manufacture. Table-31 deals with month-wise employment exchange statistics of the district for the year 1972-73; while Table-32 indicates occupational distribution of total registration and placement in

employment exchange in the district during this year. Table-33 gives volume of employment in different industries like agriculture, mining and quarrying, manufacturing, constructing, trade & commerce and transport etc. as on 31st March, 1973. Table-34 shows number of Govt. employees according to pay and emoluments ranges, as on 1st July, 1966 for Class-I, Class-II, Class-III and Class-IV employees in the district. Table-35 depicts the total number of Government employees in each department as on 1st July, 1966. Table-36 deals with generation and consumption of electricity during the year 1972-73 consumed for different purposes i.e. domestic, commercial, industrial, public lighting and agriculture, in Nanded district. Table-37 shows number of towns and villages electrified as on 31st March, 1973 and population covered as per 1961 census.

#### (6) Co-operation:

The data relating to various activities of co-operative movement in the district is displayed in 8 tables i.e. from Table Nos. 38 to 45. Table-38 gives number of different types of co-operative societies in operation in the district in 1972-73. Table-39 presents statistics relating to co-operative Banks in Nanded district during the year 1972-73. This table deals with the total members, share capital, working capital and loans advanced by these banks. Table-40 deals with taluka-wise data on primary agricultural credit societies for the above period, with their number of members, share capital, working capital, loans etc. while Table-41 presents data on other co-operative societies of different types in the district during the year 1972-73. Table-42 deals with the taluka-wise data on

operations of primary co-operative marketing societies during the year 1972-73 whereas Table-43 shows operations of other co-operative societies of different types during the above period with achievements on selected items. Table-44 shows the operation of Regulated Markets in each taluka of the district during the year 1972-73 with quantity and value of important agricultural commodities marketed. Table-45 gives the taluka-wise number of registered money lenders and loan advanced by them during the year 1972-73.

(7) Medical and Public Health :

Tables 46 to 50 present data on Medical facilities available during the year 1972. Table-46 gives taluka-wise medical facilities extended by the hospitals and dispensaries by in-door and out-door patient treatment. It shows the number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, health centres and primary health centres. It also shows the number of doctors, vaidyas, nurses and beds in these hospitals during the year 1972. Table-47 presents the taluka-wise data on number of births, deaths and infant deaths registered in the district during the year 1972. Table 48 shows number of deaths occurred due to different important causes like Malaria, Cholera, Small pox, T.B., etc. in the district during the years 1969 to 1972. Table-49 gives taluka-wise information on primary vaccination and re-vaccination with Cholera inoculations in the district during the year 1972. Table-50 introduced in this issue gives statistics on taluka-wise number of family planning centres inter-alia furnishing the data on sterilization operations and I.U.C.D. insertions in the district during the year 1972-73.

(2) Education:

The data on education is presented in 7 tables from table No. 51 to 57. Table-51 indicates taluka-wise number of literates separately for males and females in rural and urban areas with percentage of literacy according to 1971 census. Table-52 gives data on education in rural areas of Nanded district as per 1961 census while similar data for urban areas is presented in Table-53. Table-54 deals with number of different types of institutions, pupils and teachers in the district during the year 1970-71 & 1971-72 and Table-55 indicates number of beneficiaries hailing from scheduled castes, scheduled tribes & other backward classes in Nanded district during 1970-71 and 1971-72. Table-56 gives data on concessions of free education extended to economically backward classes during the year 1970-71 and 1971-72. Table-57 shows recurring and non-recurring expenditure on Primary education incurred by local bodies during the years 1971-72, 1972-73.

(3) Transport and Communications:

Tables 58-A to 64 give information on transport and communication facilities available in the district. Table- 58-A shows the length of Railway route in Kms. in Nanded district as on 31st March 1973 covered by meter-gauge. Table-58-B relates to ports which is not applicable to this district. Table-59 gives length of roads in Kms. according to category and surface classifications in Nanded district as on 31st March, 1973 under Building and Communication Department, Zilla Parishad and Municipal councils. The data on type of roads category is not applicable to Municipal councils. However, surface classifications will apply in their cases. Table-60 shows the date on different

— types of motor vehicles in operation in Aurangabad region as on 31st March, 1973 while Table-61 presents data regarding operational statistics of Nationalized road transport according to Nanded S.T. Division for the above period with number of routes, route distance in Kms., vehicles on road per day, average daily earning, number of passengers travelled every day etc. The information regarding traffic census on important roads in Nanded district is furnished in Table-62. Table-63 deals with number of post offices, telegraph offices, letter boxes, post-men, telephones and number of radio licences issued and renewed together, during the period 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1970-71 to 1972-73. Table-64 shows taluka-wise rural broadcasting statistics as on 31st March 1973 furnishing information on number of villages where receiving sets are installed, rural population covered and total number of radio farm forums.

(10) Local bodies : जिला नगरपालिका

Table-65 to 68 indicate statistics relating to local bodies in Nanded district for the year 1965-66, 1968-69 to 1972-73. Table-65 gives income and expenditure of village panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils in this district for the above period, whereas Table-66 shows panchayat Samiti-wise income and expenditure of village panchayats in the district during 1972-73. This table indicates the sources of income by way of grant-in-aid, contribution, donations, taxes, fees etc. and expenditure on sanitation, health, public works, social welfare, administration etc. Table-67(A) gives the head-wise receipts of Zilla Parishad, Nanded during the year 1970-71 to 1972-73 by way of receipt from various heads under

Revenue sections and Govt. grants etc. Table-67(B) shows the head-wise details of government grants to Zilla Parishad by various sources during the year 1970-71 to 1972-73 whereas Table-67(D) deals with head-wise expenditure of Zilla Parishad during the above period. Table-68 presents Municipal Council-wise data on income by way of Govt. Grants, Octroi, taxes on houses and lands other taxes etc. and expenditure on general administration cost of collection of taxes etc. for the year 1972-73.

(II) Plan and Community Development:

Table 63 to 73 present statistics relating to plan and community development programme. Table-69 gives sub-head-wise plan expenditure on district level schemes implemented in Nanded district during the year 1972-73 both for state and local sector, while table-70 gives the sub-head-wise data on physical achievements for selected items during the above plan period. Table-71 shows stage-wise number of blocks of C.P.A. pattern, number of inhabited and deserted villages with rural population covered as per 1961 population census. Table-72 gives stage-wise expenditure of all the blocks in this district upto the end of 1972-73 while Table-73 indicates the block-wise physical achievements on selected items under community development programme during the above period.

Miscellaneous important statistics are presented in <sup>the</sup> Tables from 77 to 88, as discussed below:-

Table-77 gives data on strength of police force showing number of superintendents, Assistant superintendents, Deputy superintendents, Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors etc. both permanent and temporary as well, alongwith total strength of police force and total cost on it in the district during the year 1972-73. Table-78 deals with the trend of cognizable and non-cognizable crimes and offences, tried, convicted and acquitted in the district during the year 1972-73. Table-79 deals with the data on disposal of regular and miscellaneous cases under original and appellate jurisdiction for civil and criminal matters in the district during 1972-73. Table-80 shows the taluka-wise number of permanent, semi-movement and touring Talkies with their seating capacity for the year 1972-73 in this district. Table-81 gives the category-wise number of banks in operation in the district during the year 1972 with the details of number of towns and villages having these offices and population covered by them. Table-82 shows the

number of joint stock companies limited by shares and guarantees separately with public and private break-up as on 31st March 1972. Table-83 indicates the number of insurance policies issued and amount insured in the district for the years 1972-73. NOTES ON SELECTED INDICATORS

Indicator No.1:- Percentage of gross sown area

to net sown area for the year

1960-61, 1970-71 & 1971-72.

1.1 A continuous increase in the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in the district was observed during the period commencing from 1960-61 to 1966-67. During the year under reference i.e. 1970-71 and 1971-72 the percentage of gross area to net area sown stood at 104.60 and 104.08 respectively. The taluka-wise percentage of gross area to net area sown ~~stood~~ at 104 indicated considerable variation. In the year 1960-61 Nanded taluka had the highest percentage of gross area sown to net sown area. In 1970-71 Kandhar taluka with its 114.61 percentage of gross sown area to net area sown stands at the top of the ladder and the Kinwat taluka indicates the lowest percentage 100.21 of gross sown area to net sown area.

In the year 1971-72, Biloli Taluka had the highest percentage (112.17) whereas Kinwat taluka had the lowest percentage (100.23).

2.2 It will be seen from the above table that during the year 1970-71 only Sugarcane and groundnut registered sizeable increase in the production over the year 1960-61, whereas considerable increase was observed in 1971-72 in agricultural production under wheat, Gram, Sugarcane, groundnut and tobacco when compared to 1960-61. During the year 1971-72, on one hand the agricultural production in case of wheat, jowar, tur, gram, chillies, groundnut, tobacco & cotton has increased but on the other hand, it is decreased in case of rice and sugarcane when compared to 1970-71.

Indicator No. 3:- Gross value of agricultural production.

3.1 Agriculture constitutes a major portion in National Income of our country and hence any change in agricultural production affects the level of National Income. Gross value of agricultural production is always studied in the context of the prices which is a relative phenomena.

3.2 The gross value of the agricultural production in the year 1960-61 at the prices prevailing in the same year was around Rs. 16.05 Crores and in the years 1970-71 and 1971-72 at the prices prevailing in the corresponding year was Rs. 19.73 Crores and Rs. 24.75 Crores respectively. The gross value of agricultural production in the district had increased by 22.90% in 1970-71 and by 64.19% in 1971-72 over 1960-61. The increase in gross value can be attributed to the rise in prices rather than increased production. The per capita of gross value of agricultural production in the district is calculated to be Rs. 149.00, Rs. 141.17 and Rs. 177.10 respectively in the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72 at prices prevailing in the respective years.

Indicator No. 4:- Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area.

4.1 The talukewise percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72 is given below:

The above table shows that the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area has decreased from 103.93 during 1970-71 to 102.36 during 1971-72 in Nanded district. The highest percentage (109.60) is observed in Mukhed taluka during the year 1970-71 whereas taluka Kinwet registered the highest percentage 110.22 in the year 1971-72. The lowest percentage of gross irrigated to net irrigated area for both the years 1970-71 & 1971-72 was noticed in Bhokar Taluka.

Indicator No.5 :- Change in cropping pattern.

5.1 The table below shows the percentage of area under food crops, non-food crops to gross cropped area and percentage of irrigated area under food and non-food crops to gross irrigated area in the district separately for the year 1960-61, 1970-71 & 1971-72.

5.2 The above table indicates that the food crops

dominate the cropping pattern of the district covering 67.66%, 65.54% and 66.56% of the total cropped area during the years 1960-61, 1970-71 & 1971-72 respectively. It can be observed that there was some decrease in the area under food crops from 67.66% during 1960-61 to 65.54% and subsequent increase to 66.56% during the years 1970-71 & 1971-72 respectively. In case of area under irrigated crops, there was variation in the cropping pattern ranging from 99.88% during 1960-61 to 88.99% during 1971-72 of food crops and 0.12% to 11.01% of non-food crops during the year 1960-61 & 1971-72 respectively.

Indicator No. 6:- Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural produce.

6.1 Agricultural credits increased by 321.21 in 1970-71 and by 103.40% in 1971-72 over the year 1960-61. However, it decreased by 51.71% in the year 1971-72 when compared to 1970-71. Similarly, outstanding dues also increased and decreased during the said period in the same fashion. The gross value of agricultural production increased by 22.90% and 54.19% during the year 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively over the year 1960-61. It increased by 26.45% during the year 1971-72 over the year 1970-71. The details of agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production in the district during the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72 are shown in the following table.

6.2 It can be observed from the above table that agricultural credit increased four times during the period from 1960-61 to 1970-71, but it increased only two times in 1971-72 over the year 1960-61. Outstanding dues increased by 11 times in the year 1970-71 and by about 10 times in the year 1971-72 over 1960-61. The gross value of agricultural produce indicated continuous increase during 1970-71 and 1971-72 over the year 1960-61. The percentage of outstanding dues to agricultural credit was 93.37%, 241.34% and 461.06% respectively in the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72.

Indicator No.7:- Agricultural Wage Rates.

7.1 The agricultural wage rates for the skilled labourers as well as un-skilled labourers employed for different agricultural operations were collected in the district at three centres namely (1) Ardhapur, (2) Loha and (3) Bhokar since 1963.

The following table gives the details of average wage rates for the years 1963 and 1972.

7.2 The above table indicates that the average wage rates of skilled as well as un-skilled labourers showed increasing trend in the year 1972 over the year 1963. The highest increase was observed in the wages of un-skilled male workers. It was partly due to the fact that these type of labourers were diverted towards the works other than agricultural operations in the nearby urban centres and partly due to the imbalance between the demand and supply of male labourers for agricultural operations.

Indicator No.8:- Livestock per hectare of Cultivable area.

8.1 The following table gives the taluka-wise position of live-stock per hectare of cultivable area in Nanded district during the year 1960-61 and 1971-72.

8.2 Considerable variations are observed in the Live-stock per hectare of cultivable area in different talukas of this district, both in 1960-61 and 1971-72. It varies from 0.83 in Hadgaon taluka to 1.54 in Kandhar taluka

during the year 1960-61. In the year 1971-72, Hadgaon taluka had the lowest (1.00) and Biloli taluka had the highest (1.25) live stock per hectare of cultivable area. The position of the district remained constant (1.17) for both the years 1960-61 & 1971-72.

Indicator No. 9:- Poultry compared to population.

9.1 The ratio of poultry per lakh of population had decreased from 14,807 in 1961 to 8,037 in 1966 whereas in 1972 it increased to 10,532 when compared to 1966 in the district. The highest ratio of poultry per lakh of population was 18,311 in Bhokar taluka for the year 1961 whereas it was 9,590 in Mukhed taluka for the year 1966 and the same was 18,646 in Kinwat taluka for the year 1972. The talukas of Hadgaon, Kinwat and Deglur had more number of poultry in relation to population than the District average and the remaining talukas had less poultry ratio per lakh of population than the district average for the year 1972. The lowest ratio was reported in Nanded taluka for the year 1972.

Indicator No. 10:- Per capita consumption of electricity.

10.1 Per capita consumption of electricity is one of the best indicators to judge economic development of the district as it correlates with the industrial, agricultural and other production activities. The per capita consumption of electricity increased from 1.49 KWH in 1960-61 to 17.70 KWH in 1971-72 and 23.17 KWH in 1972-73. This shows that there has been about 12 times increase in per capita consumption of electricity in the district over the period from 1960-61 to 1971-72 whereas the increase is about 16 times in 1972-73 over the period from 1960-61. This increase was due to the implementation of urban and rural electrification programme in the district. More electric motors were installed on

in 1960-61 was 4,284. In 1961-62, 1,000 more irrigation wells for lifting water and more power connections were given to industrial purposes. The result was more consumption of electricity both for agricultural as well as industrial purposes.

Indicator No. 11:- Candidates enrolled in Employment exchanges:

The statistics relating to candidates enrolled and the number of vacancies notified depicts the nature and intensity of unemployment problem. The candidates enrolled in employment exchange of this district has decreased from 7,094 in 1960-61 to 6,773 in 1971-72, whereas it increased to 8,713 in the year 1972-73. The number of vacancies notified also decreased from 1,113 in 1960-61 to 998 in 1971-72, whereas it increased to 1,313 in 1972-73. The number of vacancies notified per lakh of population decreased from 105 in 1960-61 to 84.74 in 1971-72 and 93.94 in 1972-73.

Indicator No. 12:- Increase in in-door and out-door patients treated in hospitals, dispensaries and primary health centres in the years

1960, 1971 & 1972.

12.1. Indoor and out-door patients treated for the years 1971 and 1972 have increased considerably as compared to the same for the year 1960. The highest number of in-door and out-door patients treated was recorded for Nanded taluka. This is due to the fact that two hospitals are located in Nanded town. The lowest number of indoor patients treated was reported in Kinwat taluka during the year 1971, but in the year 1972, it is reported in Bhokar taluka. The lowest number of outdoor patients treated in 1971 and 1972 was observed in Bhokar taluka.

Indicator No. 13 - Increase in the number of students in different categories (Boys & Girls separately)

13.1 The following table indicates the position of enrollment in Nanded district during the years 1960-61, 1970-71 & 1971-72.

It is evident from the above table that the strength of students, boys as well as girls increased considerably in Primary and Secondary institutions. Abnormal increase in the strength of boys and girls is observed in higher institutions during 1970-71 & 1971-72 but there is decrease in the strength of girls in the year 1971-72 when compared to 1970-71. The higher percentage increase of 706.68 & 754.45 was observed in the number of boys enrolled for the years 1970-71 & 1971-72 in the higher institutions. The percentage increase of girls which was observed as 628.30 in the year 1970-71 has decreased to 420.75 in the year 1971-72 in the higher institutions.

Indicator No.14:- Increase in Road Mileage per 100 Sq. Km.  
in 1960-61, 1971-72 & 1972-73.

14.1 Road communication facilities increased faster than the other facilities of socio-Economic development of the district. Increase in road mileage per 100 Sq. Km. is the indicator of road development in this respect. It has increased from 20.30 Km. in 1960-61 to 30.91 Km. in 1971-72 and 31.62 Km. in 1972-73. This increase in road mileage can be attributed to the implementation of road development programme taken up in the district under plan schemes and also the scarcity works made considerable contribution to this increase, in road mileage.

14.2 No national high way passes through this district. The length of State high-way was 290.07 Km. in 1971-72 and there is no addition to this road length during the year 1972-73. The length of major district roads was 666.08 Km. during the year 1971-72. Whereas, the same was 680.40 Km. in the year 1972-73. The length of water bound macadam surface roads was 826.54 Km. and 875.72 Km. for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively. The Black topped surface road length was 450.42 Km in the year 1971-72 and 430.1 Km. in the year 1972-73. Rest of the surface roads was covered by granular material and lower type of surface.

Indicator No.15:- Increase in banking facilities in proportion to population.

15.1 The total number of bank offices in the district increased from 16 in the year 1960-61 to 65 in the year 1971-72 and 72 in the year 1972-73.

15.2 In the year 1960-61, the number of bank offices per lakh of population in the district was one; whereas it increased to 4.7 in the year 1971-72 and 5.2 in the year 1972-73. The increase

in banking facilities was mostly due to opening of 6 new branches of scheduled banks and one branch of District Central Cooperative Bank. Mandod Taluka has the largest number of bank offices in the district. This is due to the fact that most of the banks are located at Mandod proper.

Indicator No. 16 :- Prices

16.1 The trend of rising prices is observed since past few years throughout the country. The retail prices of almost all the commodities indicated increasing trend in the district in the year 1972 as compared to the prices in 1963. The following table indicates the increase or decrease in prices for 1972 over 1963.

CHAPTER - IV

PLANNING.

4.1 Planning for economic growth, is the prerequisite for the developing country. Objectives of planning are, all round socio economic development of the people and also attainment of economic self sufficiency. It covers and takes into its sweep, the raising of levels of living, creation of employment opportunities, optimum utilisation of manpower and natural resources available. Since inception of plan we have achieved much in all the fields and yet more efforts are to be made for removing inter-district imbalances.

4.2 Since 1966-67 Annual plans were formulated to meet the urgent needs. The Annual plans for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 were the parts of IVth five year plan. In these plans most of the district level schemes from earlier Annual plans were continued and some of the new schemes were introduced. The total expenditure on these schemes of Annual plans 1971-72 and 1972-73 in Nanded district was to the tune of Rs.361.66 lakhs and Rs.441.23 lakhs respectively.

4.3 Total expenditure on different heads of development both in state and local sectors for district level schemes in Nanded district during the years 1971-72 & 1972-73 was as under:

4.4 Out of the total expenditure of Rs.361.66 lakhs during the year 1971-72, 75.36% expenditure was incurred on the schemes in the State Sector and 24.64% on the schemes in Local sector. Corresponding expenditure for the year 1972-73 was Rs.441.23 lakhs; 75.21% on the state sector schemes and 24.79% on Local sector schemes. In respect of percentage of expenditure within the heads of development, the agricultural programme stands at the top (38.40%) for the year 1971-72 and (44.38%) for the year 1972-73, whereas the expenditure under miscellaneous programme is the lowest, 0.13% and 0.10% for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively. This indicates that the agricultural programme received highest priority in the Annual

plans for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73.

I-Agricultural programme:

1.5 The agricultural programme comprises the following sub-heads of development. The expenditure under these sub-heads during 1971-72 and 1972-73 is shown with the percentage(bracketed) to the total expenditure under agricultural programme.

4.5 The above table indicates that 83.00% expenditure was incurred on schemes in state sector and 17.00% on schemes in local sector for the year 1971-72. Major portion of the expenditure was incurred on the schemes of minor irrigation (47.52%), Ayacut development programme(23.04%) and Soil conservation (18.43%) during the same year. During the year 1972-73, 81.30% expenditure was incurred on the schemes in state sector and 18.70% expenditure was booked on the schemes in local sector. More expenditure was incurred on the schemes of minor irrigation (60.37%), Ayacut development programme(18.03%) and soil conservation (14.70%).

4.7 During the year 1971-72 the schemes of small holders block was continued and 8 community wells were taken-up and 8 godowns were constructed. An area of 1,53,015 acres was brought under intensive cultivation of food crops & 32,719 acres were covered under plant protection services campaign. Apart from this scheme, taluka seed multiplication farm, loans under horticultural development, sugarcane nursery, Agricultural school etc. were continued.

In the year 1972-73 the scheme of small holders block was also continued and 8 community wells were completed and 7 godowns were constructed. Under the scheme of intensive

cultivation programme, an area of 1,03,502 acres was brought under intensive cultivation of food crops and 48,630 acres of area was brought under the high yielding varieties programme. Under the scheme of plant protection programme 43508 hector of area was covered and 14,160 quintals of seed was treated. Apart from this the schemes of talukdi seed multiplication farm, loans under horticultural development, sugarcane nursery, Agricultural school etc. were continued.

4.8 Under the scheme of development of local manurial resources, 18,940 tonnes of compost was prepared and under the same scheme 153 quintals of sunseed was distributed, during the year 1971-72. In the year 1972-73, 21,203 tonnes of town compost was prepared and distributed.

4.9 Under the sub-head, minor irrigation 535 and 80 new wells were constructed 351 and 146 pumping sets were installed during the year 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. In state Sector and local sector together 1,763 acres and 5,404 acres of additional irrigation potential was created during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73. Under the scheme of soil conservation 21450 hectares or 27654 hect. of land was binded during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively.

4.10 In the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 under the sub-head animal husbandry the budget provision was made for the continuation of the scheme of one veterinary dispensary and three veterinary aid centres. Farm forestry and extension of forestry, plantation of fuel wood and general utility timber and bamboos were the schemes implemented under sub-head forest. Under the scheme forest communication, 15.75Km of forest road was

constructed during the year 1971-72 to facilitate the communication in forest area. During the year 1972-73, 20Km. road was also constructed.

4.11 Fisheries was another sub-head under the head agricultural programme. The scheme, fish-farming in impounded water was undertaken and 960000 and 1203500 finger-lings were stocked and 1189 and 1190 quintals of fish was netted during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73. Under the sub-head warehousing and marketing subsidy for propaganda of marketing was granted for 12 societies during the each years 1971-72 and 1972-73.

4.12 Under this head following two sub-heads are included. The expenditure for these sub-heads is shown with the percentage (bracketed) to total expenditure under the head.

4.13 The above table indicates that the expenditure under co-operation was 36.07% and 39.43% during the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 whereas the same under community development was 63.93%

and 60.52% during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively to the total expenditure under head co-operation and community development.

4.14 The programme under co-operation, emphasises the purpose of inculcating the spirit of self-help among the individuals and providing credit facilities and other requirements. The scheme under community development programme seeks at socio-economic development of rural population in the district. All schemes

under sub-head co-operation were implemented in state sector, whereas all the schemes under sub-head community development, in local sector.

4.15 The co-operative societies was a source of providing short-term, medium term and long-term credit needs of the rural area had advanced Rs. 49.47 lakhs medium and short term credit and Rs.167.93 lakhs longterm credit during the year 1971-72. In

the year 1972-73 short-term and medium term loan of Rs.387.36 lakhs was advanced by the cooperative societies to the cultivators. Managerial subsidy was also given to 6 labours contract societies during the year 1971-72. During the same year managerial subsidy was also given to two consumers co-operative

societies. A rebate was given to 7 handloom weavers societies and the subsidy for sale depots was granted to 50 individuals.

During the year 1972-73 share capital was give to one marketing society and two cooperative farming societies were selected for improvement. Management subsidy was also given to one consumer, cooperative society and six labour contract societies were organised and assistance was give for management, for share capital and for tools and equipments.

4.16 Twelve C.P.A. size community development block were continued during the year 1971-72 and 1972-73. Out of these 12 blocks, only 2 blocks are in stage-II and other 10 blocks are in post-stage-II phase. The expenditure was incurred only for incomplete works and no other fresh works were allowed under these programme. Apart from community development blocks, four applied nutrition blocks were in operation during this period.

### III-Irrigation and power:

4.17 Under the sub-head irrigation, no district level scheme was implemented in Nanded district. From the sub-head power project, only one scheme namely, rural electrification was implemented in this district. During the year 1971-72 total expenditure of Rs. 59.82 lakhs was incurred and in the year 1972-73 the same was to the tune of Rs. 65.29 lakhs.

4.18 Under the physical achievements side of this scheme, 66 villages were electrified and 510 electric pumps were installed on irrigation wells during the year 1971-72. In the year 1972-73, 87 villages were electrified and 935 electric pumps were installed on the irrigation wells.

### IV-Industries and Mining:

4.19 Development of large and medium industries was considered under the head "Industries & Mining". Under sub-head large and medium industries no district level scheme was implemented. However, some district level schemes under sub-head small scale Industries were implemented. Out of total expenditure of Rs. 0.50 lakhs, an amount of Rs. 0.36 lakhs was spent in state sector and Rs. 0.14 lakhs in local sector during the year 1971-72. Similar was the position in the year 1972-73. Total expenditure under

This head was Rs. 0.54 lakhs. Out of which the expenditure under State Sector was Rs. 0.42 lakhs and under local sector it was Rs. 0.12 lakhs.

4.20 The aim of the scheme is to develop the small scale and cottage industries in the district. During the year 1971-72 most of the schemes were continued and rebate was given to 7 handloom weavers societies. Management subsidy to 5 societies was granted and subsidy for purchase of tools and equipment was given to 2 societies. For construction of godown, subsidy was granted to one society and loan was also advanced to one society, loan was also advanced for purchase of tools and equipment to the industrial co-operative societies. In the year 1972-73, under the development of handloom industry a rebate was given to 7 societies and loan for purchase of shares was advanced to 25 societies. Under the scheme of handicrafts, assistance was given to 3 societies for share capital contribution. Subsidy was granted to 3 societies and for management, and to 1 society for tools and equipment and loan was advanced to 6 societies for tools and equipment.

#### V. Transport and Communication:-

4.21 Under this head transport and communication, the schemes for road development were implemented in the district. The purpose of the scheme is to provide maximum road communication facilities. Total expenditure of Rs. 20.94 lakhs was incurred during the year 1971-72. Out of this Rs. 0.79 lakhs were booked in state sector and Rs. 20.15 lakhs in local sector. Corresponding expenditure in the year 1972-73 was Rs. 28.48 lakhs. Expenditure under state sector was Rs. 12.07 lakhs while under local

sector at Rs. 16.41 lakhs. Most of the schemes for construction of the roads were implemented under local sector.

4.22 The schemes under road development programme were taken-up with a view to increase the road length, improvement in the existing roads and construction of bridges and culverts. During the year 1971-72, 39.00 Km. of district roads were constructed, and 11.00 Km. were modernized and 82.40 Km. of rural roads were constructed. Twenty nine C.D. works were provided on roads and 17 culverts were constructed during the above period. In the year 1972-73, 19.90 Km. district roads were constructed and 19.20 Km. were modernized. Apart from this 18.00 Km. rural roads were constructed and 16 C.D. works were provided on roads and 4 small bridges and 7 culverts were completed.

#### VI-Social Services:

4.23 Multifarious programmes were envisaged to educate the masses, and to provide them with better medical, housing and other facilities so as to bring the socio-economic conditions upto the desired level under the head social services. The following sub-heads were included during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73. The figures of expenditure with percentage(bracketed) to total expenditure of the corresponding years under the head are shown below:

4.24 Out of Rs. 134.23 Lakhs 69.55% expenditure was incurred in the state sector and 30.45% in local sector during the year 1971-72. In the year 1972-73 total expenditure was Rs. 146.08 lakhs and expenditure under state sector was 63.42% and under local sector it was 36.53%. Under social services, there are 9 sub-heads and the major portion of expenditure was incurred under the sub-head water supply and drainage i.e. 74.93% and general education 20.11% during the year 1971-72. In the year

1972-73 maximum percentage of expenditure was seen under the sub-head water supply scheme (69.84%) and general education (25.31%).

4.25 The schemes under sub-head general education, aim at expansion of educational facilities. Under the scheme expansion of primary education, 265 teachers were trained during the year 1971-72 and 100 during the year 1972-73. Special facilities were made available to 650 girls during the year 1971-72. In the same year 4 non-Government schools were expanded. During the year 1972-73 special facilities were extended to 600 girls in primary schools in selected areas and also 4 non-government schools were expanded. Under the sub-head technical education, provision was made for the improvement of libraries and establishment of students aid funds at the polytechnic college Nanded during the year 1971-72. In the year 1972-73 a provision was made for the continuation of Govt. polytechnic Nanded and the expenditure was incurred on staff and contingencies. In the year 1971-72, an expenditure of Rs. 10.30 lakhs was incurred on construction of 6 staff quarters for primary health centres under the sub-head health. During the year 1972-73 the construction work of 4 staff quarters was in progress and the facilities of water supply and electrification were provided to 2 and 3 quarters, respectively.

4.26 Eradication of malarial and small pox were taken up under the schemes of public health during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73. Family planning was another major scheme under this sub-head. During the year 1971-72 and 1972, 73, 9683 and 17,385 operations were performed, respectively.

4.27 Municipal water supply schemes were continued during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73. 8 schemes were completed during the year 1971-72 and 3 schemes during the year 1972-73. So also the rural water supply schemes were continued and 18 schemes were completed during the year 1971-72 and 9 schemes during the year 1972-73. Under the simple measures 121 drinking water wells were constructed during the year 1971-72 and 129 wells during 1972-73. The housing programme taken-up in the district aimed at providing housing facilities for the persons belonging to low income group and assistance for developing village housing and provision of house sites under extension of gaonthans scheme. 21 villages were covered under the scheme of extension of village gaonthans during the year 1971-72 and 13 villages during 1972-73.

4.28 The socio-economic of backward classes was furthered by implementation of the schemes of the welfare of the backward classes, grant of scholarship, grants to backward class hostels, propagation of improved agricultural implements, grant of loans and subsidy for cottage industries and housing aid to backward classes are some of the schemes that were implemented during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73. Only one scheme of the welfare extension project was continued in the district under the sub-head social welfare. 
