CHAPTER I.

INTRODUCTION.

Chanda district was taken over by the British from Marathas in 1853 and it was constituted on the 18th December 1854. The district lies in the Godavari basin. Three important tributaries of Godavari, viz. Wardha, Wainganga and Indravati drain the Western, Central and Eastern regions of the district respectively. The Wainganga which runs from North to South, cuts the district into two unequal parts and forms a large fertile zone in the part of the district. The western parts of Warora and Chanda talukas lie in the valley of Wardha river, which flows along the western and southern boundaries. The Indrawati and its tributaries drain the eastern region of the district.

Location.

Chanda district lies between 18°41' and 20°50' North Latitude and 78°48' and 80°55' East longitude. The district is roughly triangular in shape, the north boundary forming the base of the triangle which gradually tapers towards its apex in the south.

Boundaries.

The district is surrounded by four districts of Maharashtra, having Bhandara at the north, Wardha and Nagpur on the northwest and Yeotmal at the west. Similarly, the district is surrounded by two states, Madhya Pradesh at the east and Andhra Pradesh at the south west and south.

Topography.

The district is a most picturesque part of the state with varied scenery, wooded hills, interesting archaeological regions, old temples and forts notably at Chanda itself, Bhandak, Markhanda, Wairagarh and Ballarpur. It possesses vast forests and the area of its Government forests alone surpasses that of many entire districts. The major part of forest, produces valuable teak, other timbers and bamboos.

Except in the north and west and on the borders of the Wardha and Nagpur districts, where cotton & wheat are grown, there are large areas under rice, jwar and small millets. Its irriga-

-tion system, already very extensive, is now being paid considerable attention on the part of the Government.

Chanda district with a population composed of three main elements, marathas, telgu and gonds, each speaking more or less an impure variety of their natural languages is of peculiar interest from a linguistic and ethnological point of view. The people are unprogressive and several dialects are spoken. The marathi of north-west gives way to Telgu in the south, and to Hindi (Chattisgarh) in the north-east. In all the wilder tracts aboriginal races predominate and Gondi and other tribal dialects are common as in the Bastar district of the neighbouring Madhya Pradesh State.

The District has many other distinguishing features. In mineral wealth it is remarkably rich. Coal is found in the extreme west at Ballarshah and Ghugus, while iron ore of high grade is found at Surjagad hill.

Soil.

The soil of the district falls into clearly defined tracts. Each of these tracts displays cropping pattern of a wholly different kind. The most fertile tracts are found in the Wardha and Wainganga Valleys. The varieties of soil in the district are numerous, and are known by many local names but they can be grouped under the following representative classes namely:- Kalikanhar, Barzi Kanhar, Marand, Khurdi, Wardi, Ratari or Baroli Pandhari and Kachhar (which is found in Sironcha taluka along the banks of Godavari).

On the extreme west, on the left bank of Wardha and subsequently the Godawari there is a black strip of black soil, known as Kali, retentive of moisture and suitable for open field crops such as cotton, wheat, gram, jwar and linseed. Further inland both immediately adjoining this open tract there is a range of small hills with poorer soil at their feet and in the intervening strips. This soil is of little use without irrigation. With irrigation it is an ideal soil for rice and sugar-cane. Further eastward again on either bank of Wainganga, the black loam reappears and is accompanied by few rice growing villages.

Eastward of the Wainganga valley, the soil becomes poor and hills are abundant. Rice is the staple crop of this tract.

Rivers.

The main rivers of the district are the Wardha, the Wainganga, the Pranhita, the Indravati and the Godavari rivers. The whole of the western border is bounded by the Wardha, Pranhita and Godavari rivers. During its course in the south-easterly direction, Wardha receives Wainganga on the right bank and Erai on the left. After its confluence, the Pranhita joins the Godavari near Sironcha. Further south at the southern corner of Sironcha taluka, the Indravati flows in the Godavari along the south east boundary of the district. The only important tributary of the Godavari running through the district is the Telpir which rising in Baster falls into the Godavari.

Besides numerous rivers, the district has a lake 'Tadoba' in the range of Chimur hills in the basin at an elevation of 300 to 400 feet above the plains. The lake has its name from Gondi God who is worshipped here and now it is a National Park for tourists to visit the wild life. Within the municipal limits of Chanda city, there are 6 fairly large size tanks known as Ramala, Lendhala, Ghutkala, Geori, Lal and Kner. Besides these the District has been enriched with Asolamendha, Ghadesari and many other important tanks.

Hills.

The main hill ranges in the district are the Chimur and Mul hills. They serve as watershed between the valley of the Wardha and Wainganga rivers. The general elevation of these valleys is same 600 to 800 feet above sea level.

East and parallel to Chimur hills runs a range known as the Parasgarh hills, which forms a boundary between Warora and Bramhapuri talukas which extends for 13 miles with an average height of 600 feet above the plain and terminates in a scarped cliff named 'Sat Bahini' 1500 feet above the sea level, which has a land escape for 40 miles southwards.

The other important hill ranges lie in the south. They are mainly Tipagarh range, the Sirkonda range near Sironcha, the Gadulgatta hills key end Indravati River, lies the famous Bhamragad hill which overlooks the confluence of three mountain rivers and is known as an unrivalled beauty spot in the district.

ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP.

Present set up.

For administrative purposes, the district is at present divided in six talukas. The area, number of inhabited villages number of towns, 1961 population and the position in the district by percentages of area and population for each talukas are shown below.

* The name of Chanda town is changed to Chandrapur vide Government Notification General Administration Department No. NMS- 1063- B dated the 11th January 1964.

The district forms part of the Nagpur division and is administered by the Collector. The collector is in charge of general administration, law and order, land-revenue, food and Civil supplies. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector and other Deputy Collector in his office and six Deputy Collectors who hold charge of the six revenue sub divisions and have their headquarters at each of the six taluka headquarters.

Zilla Parishad Set up.

With a view to promote development of democratic institutions and to secure greater measure of participation by the people in Development plans and in local and governmental affairs by decentralisation of powers and functions the Zilla Parishad and 18 panchayat samitis have been established in the district in the year 1962 under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act of 1962. The area under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad corresponds to the district boundaries except the Municipal towns which are not covered by them. Sasti which does not have a municipal committee but which is treated as a town in the 1961 Census is however included under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samiti concerned. Each taluka is divided into three or more blocks. There is a Panchayat samiti for each block.

The Zilla Parishad covers 99.79 percent of the area and 92.70 percent of the total population of the district. The population covered consists of the entire rural population and 5.57 percent of the urban population of the district in 1961.

An Officer in the Senior scale of I.A.S works as Chief Executive Officer in the Zilla Parishad. The Parishad is also assisted by various departments and the heads of those departments at the district level are officers of Class I and Class II services under the State Government. At the Block level the Panchayat Samitis have elected chairmen and Deputy Chairmen. The Block Development Officers work as secretaries to the Panchayat Samities. The executive authority for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act vests in the Chief Executive Officer and the Block Development Officers. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as Secretary to Zilla Parishad.

Besides, the Revenue Department and Zilla Parishad the other major offices are Police, Cooperation, B & C, Courts and Forests. As Chanda district has vast area under forests for the purposes of administration the forests are divided into 6 divisions viz, (1) East Division (2) West Division (3) South Division (4) Allapalli Division (5) Central Division (6) Bhamragad Division. All the Divisions work under the Conservator of Chanda Circle whose Head Quarter is at Nagpur.

Temperature :-

The District is one of the hottest district in Maharashtra. At District Head Quarter it is usually about 1 degree hotter than Nagpur in the month of May and nights become rather uncomfortable on account of high temperature combined with fairly high percentage of humidity. The climate of the district is very cold in winter season. Thus the district has extreme climate.

The temperature is recorded for Chanda, Bramhapuri and Sironcha centres. The district average for the highest temperature in the month of May 1964 is 43.9 centigrade. The temperature of Sironcha is 44.1 in the above month.

Rainfall.

Due to dense forest, the surrounding of the major part of the district, the atmosphere is chilly, damp, and sultry through out rainy season. The Chanda district receives rainfall from the south monsoons. The monsoons generally set in, in the IInd or IIIrd week of June and increase in intensity in July and August. The average normal rainfall for the district is 1456.8 m.m. The rainfall is heavy in the hilly and jungly tracts of Bramhapuri and also in the thickly wooded tract of Aheri and in the Cotton tract of Warora tahsil. The eastern region of the district comprising of the talukas of Sironcha, Gadchiroli and Bramhapuri has an assured and heavy rainfall. The central region, comprising of Chanda and Rajura talukas gets sufficient rainfall while the western region comprising Warora taluka gets a moderate rainfall.

CHAPTER II.

POPULATION.

According to 1961 Census the District has a population of 12.38 lakhs as against 10.53 lakhs during 1951. During a decade 1901 to 1911 the population has increased by nearly 27%. In the following decades, the incidence of epidemic took a heavy toll of life which is revealed by the decrease of nearly 2% in the district population. In the successive decades the population of the district increased at moderate rates among which the rate of growth (17.58%) in the decade 1951-61 ranks the highest.

The district has an area of 10,088.3 Sq. miles i.e. 8.53 percent of the total area of the Maharashtra State. In the area that now forms Chanda District, there are 47 persons per Sq.K.M. as per 1961 Census as compared to 129 for Maharashtra. In fact Chanda District has the lowest density of population in Maharashtra State. The rural and urban density, of the district is 114 and 3615 per Sq. K.M.

The ratio, females per 1000 males for the Chanda district according to 1961 Census is 985 as against 936 for Maharashtra State. At each Census since 1901 the sex ratio was consistently higher than that of Maharashtra. Similarly the sex ratio of rural population in the district has always been higher than that of urban population.

As per 1961 Census there are 3368 villages and 5 towns in the district of which 2755 are inhabited village and the rest are deserted villages. The urban population in the District is 7.73% of the total population of the District.

The concept of dependence has been abandoned for the economic classification at the 1961 Census. Instead, the population is classified into workers and non workers, the workers are classified into nine categories of economic activities. The workers population of the whole District works out to 57.77% of the District population. This population was further divided in 9 categories of workers. The population of urban workers is 4.81% of total population of workers in the district. Bramhapuri and Gadchiroli talukas are more rice producing area and have larger proportion of labourers. Warora taluka with its cotton soil seems to

have comparatively a larger proportion of Agril. labourers. Chanda taluka has largest proportion of workers of mining, currying, live stock etc. and of manufacturing other than household industry.

The population of non workers is 42.23% of the District population. The population of non workers in urban areas is 11.72% of the population of non workers of the District.

Mahar, Madgi, Chambhar and Basor are the four numerically largest scheduled castes. The remaining fourteen scheduled castes have together, 0.29 percent of the total population of the district. Dohar, Ellamlwar, Kilpulvandu, Mala, Mahajangam and Mala sale castes have less than 50 person each. The reduction of the proportion from 17.89 to 3.44 is the result of a large number of persons from Mahar caste returning their religion in 1961 Census as Buddhist or Nav Buddha. The combined proportion of the Buddhist and scheduled caste is 15.38% of the District population in 1961. It is slightly lower than 1951 because of the large increase in the tribal population in 1961.

The population of Scheduled tribes in the district is 183431 or 14.82% of the total population. Only 13 Scheduled tribes i.e. Bhil, Binjwar, Gond, Halba, Kavar, Khairwar, Kolam, Korku, Koya Pardhan, Nagesia Pardhi, Thoti were enumerated in the notified areas of 1961 Census and for the remaining 21 Scheduled tribes no one was returned as Scheduled Tribes. The Scheduled Tribes are concentrated more in Sironcha taluka where they form 54.26% of the total population. The corresponding proportions for Gadchiroli and Rajura talukas are 35.94% and 27.43% respectively. Gond with 1566,266 persons is the most predominant scheduled tribe in the district.

Agriculture.

Agriculture is the predominant economic activity in the district, as about 82 percent of the total working population is engaged in agriculture, as cultivators or agricultural labourers. As in other areas of the state, there are two main agricultural seasons viz. Kharif and Rabi. The areas under crops in two seasons are nearly equal under normal conditions. However, within the district, the three talukas viz. Sironcha, Gadchiroli and

Bramhapuri have more proportion of cropped area under Kharif crops, while Rabi crops dominate in the remaining three talukas. The principal Kharif crops are paddy, kharif-jowar, tur and cotton, while wheat, gram and rabi jowar are the main rabi crops.

According to land utilisation statistics, about 55.97 percent of the total geographical area of the district is under forests. Because of the high proportion of area under forests, the proportion of net area sown to the total geographical area is very low as compared to other districts in the state, and is about 25.65 percent. About 1.70 percent of the geographical area is barren and unculturable 4.26 percent as land put to non-agricultural uses, 3.24% cultivable waste, 7.62 percent as permanent pastures and misc. tree crops and groves and remaining 7.56 percent as fallow land. Sironcha taluka has the highest proportion of area under forests followed by Gadchiroli taluka, while Rajura taluka has very low proportion of area under forest. The proportion of area cropped more than once is 5.91 percent of the net areas sown for the Chanda district.

Taking into consideration the cropping pattern of the district in the year 1964-65, it is observed that Chanda district is mainly food grain producing area and 83.48 percent of the gross cropped area is under food crops. Rice and Jowar are the major food crops each occupying nearly 30 percent of the gross cropped area. Oilseeds and cotton are the chief constituents of the non food crops and together account for 98.09 percent of the area under non food crops. Among oilseeds cocum and linseed are the important as they occupy most of the area under oilseeds. Within the district the cropping pattern varies considerably depending upon rainfall and soil conditions. Bramhapuri, Gadchiroli and Sironcha tahsils are predominantly rice growing areas as they account for 75.33 percent of the total area under rice in the district, where as Warora, Chanda and Rajura talukas are wheat, jowar, cotton and oilseed growing areas.

The district has a quite high proportion of area under irrigation as compared to the state average. The proportion of gross irrigated area to gross cropped area during 1963-64 was 14.76 percent as against nearly 7 percent for the state. The proportion of irrigated area is lowest in Rajura taluka and highest in Bramhapuri taluka. Major source of irrigation in the district,

tanks as about 78.55 percent of the net area irrigated is accounted for by tanks. Area irrigated by Govt. canals is also significant as 17.48 percent of the net irrigated areas is by Govt. Canals. The canal irrigation is mainly in Chanda and Bramhapuri talukas, whereas tank irrigation is undertaken in Gadchiroli and Bramhapuri talukas followed by Chanda taluka. As regards utilisation of irrigated area under different crops, it is observed that in 1963-64, about 99 percent of the gross irrigated area was accounted for by food crops. Among food crops rice alone occupied 96.75 percent of the gross irrigated area and chillies and other food crops covered 1.22 percent and 1.72 percent of the irrigated area respectively.

Livestock :-

Total number of Livestock animals in Chanda district according to 1961 Livestock Census was 13.08 lakhs, which showed the increase of about 6.3 percent over the livestock population enumerated in 1956. About 98.58 percent of Livestock population in 1961 was found in rural areas, while remaining 1.42 percent in urban areas. The growth rate was 14 percent in case of Buffaloes and 8% in case of Cattle, Sheep, Horses and ponies however declined in 1961 as compared to 1956.

Cattle formed highest percentage i.e. 70.1, of the total livestock population. Then came in order the goats, which formed 16.5 percent of the total population. The class of buffaloes followed suit with 9.4 percent. The number of male bovines (cattle and buffaloes) over 3 years numbered 4044 lakhs and as such area cultivated per pair of male bovines over three years worked out to 7.18 acre as against the average of 5.48 acres for Maharashtra for the same period.

As regards livestock mortality it was observed that among the animals attacked by diseases, cattle and bovines accounted for the major percentage i.e. 86.06 and their deaths also formed the major proportion i.e. 65.61 percent.

Forests.

Nature has been benevolent to Chanda district so far as forest wealth is concerned. Chanda district share more than half of the forest wealth of Vidarbha Teak of Chanda. Out of the total area under forests managed by 6 forest divisions taken

together, present area was classified as reserved forests 35.00 percent as protected forests and 41.28 percent as unclassed forests.

Fisheries.

The Chanda district is endowed with more than 12000 tanks with a total water spread area of approximately 40,000 acres which boasts of the second biggest place in whole of Maharashtra State, the first being Bhandara District.

Out of these tanks 8000 are seasonal and perennial tanks out of which 4000 are found to be suitable for fish culture.

There are five deep reservoirs in the district out of which four reservoirs viz. Ghorajheri tank, Aselamendha Tank, Nalleshwar Tank, Navatalao are suitable for fish culture. The fifth tank Tadoba belonging to the forest department is useful for fish culture as there are number of crocodiles in tank.

In addition to this, there are 19 seasonal and perennial Rivers which help in production of fish crop in the district. The names of the important perennial rivers are the Wardha, Wainganga, Pranhita, Indrawati and Godavari river.

Industries.

Chanda being mainly a rice growing area have enough scope for paddy processing industries. There are 12 factories and 92 persons are engaged, in these factories. The factories manufacture of edible oils are 3 in district, having employment of 54 therein. Basir oil Mill, Warora is one of the modern oil mills and can be categorised as large scale factory. Since Tendu leaves found in abundance there are bidi factories and 252 workers are working therein. The factory of manufacture of glass, pottery and earthen ware (except optical lenses) were 3 and having employment of 350 workers. The Swastik glass works at Chanda manufactures glass works at Chanda, manufacture glass and glasswares, and the Dādabhai Potteries is located at Ballarpur with the easy availability of Bombo and other allied materials the and paper products industries has a bright prospects. The Ballarpur Paper and Straw Mills Ltd located at Ballarpur has an employment of 947 workers out of the total employment in factories, of 3141 employment in the district.

Mining.

Chanda is very rich in mineral products in Maharashtra. It has large reserves of high grade iron ore and coal. The important coal fields are situated at Bandar, Warora, Majri, Ghugus and Ballarpur. The product of these mines has been increased by 3.40 percent and iron ore reduced by about 66 percent during the year 1964. Similarly the product of white clay, brick earth, ordinary clay increased by 33, 370 and 66 percent respectively.

Handloom and powerloom :-

There are 1600 hand operated looms and 15 power operated in the district. The production of handloom is reduced by 23.50 percent but the production of powerloom increased by 20.13 percent during the year under review.

Employment exchange statistics.

The employment exchange statistics for the period ending 1964-65 shows that total Registration reduced by 5.38 percent whereas vacancies notified increased by 55.02 percent. The placements were decreased 5.70 percent and the number in the live register at the end of the year was increased by 20.28 percent. The employment under public and private sector indicates an increase of 4.12% employment during the year under review. The annual survey of industries for the year 1961 indicates decrease in total employment in these factories by 14.26 percent and the value added by manufacture of these factories also decreased by 6.79 percent.

Electricity :-

The figures for generation and consumption of electricity for the year 1964-65 are not made available. Out of 3368 villages in the district only 1.81 percent villages and 5 towns were electrified on 31-3-1965 and the population covered by these villages and towns is 20.16 percent of the total population of the district.

Cooperation.

The cooperative movement has made considerable progress during last three plan periods. By the end of 1964-65 almost all the villages in Chanda district have been covered by agricultural credit societies. The cooperative movement which was in the

beginning mainly the agricultural credit movement has entered other fields of economic activity such as marketing, processing, farm, industrial, housing etc. However the movement still continues to be a predominantly agricultural credit movement as agricultural credit societies account for 77.51 percent of the total number of societies (1641), claim 73.43 percent of the membership of all societies and possess 43.56 percent of the share capital of all types of societies.

The numbers of cooperative societies of all types have reduced by 1.3 percent during the year under report, while their membership, share capital and working capital have increased by 7.95 percent 15.74 percent and 40.31 percent respectively. The decrease in the amount of loans advanced during the year has been about 4.90 percent.

Important types of cooperative societies other than agricultural credit societies in Chanda district are processing, producers, consumers societies.

There were 17 agricultural marketing societies in the district at the end of 1964-65. Total value of purchases made by these marketing societies in the year 1964-65, comprised of 7.15 percent of purchases of agricultural produce, 7.76 percent of agricultural requisites and remaining 85.09 percent of consumer goods. Total value of sales effected by the marketing societies consisted of 77.34 percent of sales as owners, while 22.66 percent of sales as agents. The major agricultural produce handled by the marketing societies was paddy as the sales of paddy formed 91.34 percent of the total sales of agricultural produce. 67.83 constituted the major proportion (percent) of agricultural requisites distributed by the marketing societies.

Medical and Public Health:

The medical and public health facilities in the district consist of (1) Curative services in hospitals and dispensaries (ii) Preventive services to control the spread of communicable diseases and to prevent epidemics (iii) basic services for maternity and health in rural area and (iv) supply of drinking water and housing. Out of the 408 persons enumerated at the time of 1961 Census, as physicians, surgeons and dentists 31.62 percent were located in urban areas and the rest in rural areas.

Out of the 860 nurses, pharmacists and other medical and health technicians 23.84 percent were working in urban areas and the rest in rural areas.

The district is served through 5 hospitals 32 Ayurvedic 18 Allopathic and 2 Ugani dispensaries 6 Maternity homes and 14 P.H.Cs. The number of beds per lakh of population in Chanda district was 31.42 at the end of 1964.

Among the outdoor patients treated in 1964, major proportion i.e. 27.27 percent was of diseases Diarrhoea, phrexia, nutrition or metabolism and Dysentery. Among the indoor patients treated majority of cases (Percent) were of 10.34.

It will be seen that the majority of the patients treated were of the disease diarrhoea, phrexia, disease due to deficiency of due to disorders of nutrition or metabolism, injuries disease of the respiratory system other dysentery disease of digestive system etc. There were 990 deaths out of these patients in the year 1964.

There are two leprosy centres one at Mul and the other at Gadchiroli. Besides there is a private hospital working with missionary zeal Named " Anandwan" at Varora dedicated to the cause of leprosy.

Number of births registered decreased during 1964 by 6.58 percent while deaths have increased by 6.77 percent. Among the deaths due to different causes fever accounted for the major proportion i.e. 47.09 percent of deaths followed by diarrhoea which caused 7.84 percent deaths.

Out of the total number of villages in the district 26.44 percent of the villages are still without any drinking water supply source, while 36.12 percent of the villages are with inadequate water supply. Well is the main source of drinking water supply while there were only 5 towns having piped water supply.

Education.

Education is an essential prerequisite for economic, social and cultural advancement of the community; General awakening after independence and conscious efforts of the Government, have raised the literacy levels to 17.27 percent in the district in

1961 as against 10.90 in 1951. The literacy percentage of male in 1961 is 28.58 percent but the female literacy i.e. 5.79 percent for the district is very poor as compared to state average of 16.76. The 1961 Census indicated that about 43.24 percent of urban population is literate where as the percentage of literacy of rural population is 15.10 percent only. The percentage of literacy for males and females in urban areas is 59.39 and 25.31 respectively where as in rural areas it is 52.87 and 4.24 percent for males and females respectively.

Out of the total literate persons in the rural area of the district in 1961, 51.68 percent males and 9.47 percent females were literate without educational level, 32.56 percent males and 4.38 percent females were with educational primary or junior basic and 11.77 percent males and 0.13 percent females with educational level matriculation and above. While in urban areas 23.14 percent males and 12.73 percent females were literate without educational level, 40.93 percent males and 13.63 percent females in primary or Junior basic, 6.71 percent males and 1.22 percent females in Matriculation, 0.24 percent males and 0.04 percent females having diplomas, either technical or non technical equivalent to degree. Proportion of degree holders and post graduates in technical as well as non technical courses was very poor in this district.

In primary education, Number enrollment and strength of teachers has increased during the year under report by 11.88 %, 10.65% and 10.85% respectively. Proportion of trained teachers was 63 percent during 1964-65. At the end of the year under report 38 percent of the villages were without primary schools. The proportion of villages without primary school was highest in the population range 0-199 as 94.91 percent of the villages in that range were without schools.

The secondary education is an important link between primary and collegiate education. The number of secondary schools in the district was 86 having a total strength of 28605 students including 5912 girls students. There are 7 secondary schools per lakh of population in the district and the population per school is 321 students. The number of secondary school teachers was 1174 as such the teacher pupil ratio works out to 25 students per teacher. Taking into account the numbers of primary students and

the secondary students, it will be seen that the proportion of secondary students is 230 students per 1000 primary students in the district in the year 1964-65.

The district has only 7 higher institutions with a total strength of 2424 students including 319 girl students. The number of teachers in these institutions are 104. The teachers pupils ratio in these institutions works out 23 students per teachers during the year 1964-65.

There were only 11 special schools in the district with a total strength of 600 students and 93 teachers in the year 1964-65.

Concessions such as free ships and scholarships were granted to students belonging to backward classes. Roughly Rs. 21.04 per cent were spent per student during the year 1964-65 by way of concessions. Concessions of free education were also granted to economically backward classes. Concessions granted worked out to Rs. 12.06 per beneficiary during the year under report.

Transport and Communication.

Rail and road are the only means of transport available in the district. The length of the total railway route in the district is 300 K.Ms. The Broad gauge line of the central Railway passes through the talukas Warora, Chanda and Rajura is 141 K.Ms in length where as narrow gauge line of south east Railway, Chanda to Gondia passes through Chanda, Bramhapuri and Gadchiroli taluka is 159 K.Ms. There are 28 railway stations in the district. The existing railway mileage in the district is 0.11 KM. per 1000 hectares.

No national high way passes through the district. The total road length of the district consists of 36.48 percent under state high ways, while major district roads account for 10.31 percent of the road length. The other district roads, village roads and other roads form 13.72 percent, 8.17 percent and 31.33 percent length respectively.

According to surface classification, 10.15 percent of total road length was black topped, 28.25 percent was water bound macadam roads and the remaining of lower type.

There were 252 post offices and 16 telegraph offices in the district at the end of 1964-65. Thus there is one post office per nearly 10 villages and 4913 population.

Local Self Government.

The Zilla Parishad, Panchayat Samities, Village Panchayats and Municipalities are the units of local self Govt. in the district.

The Village Panchayat forms the lowest administrative unit in the three-tier system of the Panchayati Raj. There were 1165 independent and group gram panchayats in the district at the end of 1964-65 covering almost all the villages in the district. The income and expenditure of these village panchayats for the year 1964-65 was Rs. 5812761 and 4799671 respectively. As such the income and expenditure per village Panchayat was Rs. 4939 and 4120 during the year 1964-65. The major source of income of the village Panchayats is Government grants.

Zilla Parishad with 18 panchayat samiti have been established in the district in the year 1962 under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti Act of 1962. In the year 1963-64 one more block named Dewada was established and two blocks i.e. Etapalli and Dewada have been declared as T.D. Blocks. The total revenue receipts of Zilla Parishad for the year 1964-65 were 13.97 crore lakhs where as the total revenue expenditure was Rs. 22.67 crore lakhs. The major items of ^{income of} Zilla Parishad are local fund cess, cess on water rates, and profession tax. The expenditure is incurred on the major items, general and administration, education community development projects, building and communications, miscellaneous and other items. No new taxation measures were introduced by the Zilla Parishad during the year 1963-64 and 1964-65. The major portion of the receipt of Zilla Parishad was from Government grants only. There are 5 Municipal Committees in the district. Chanda and Warora municipalities were established in the year 1867. A new municipality has been established at Desaignanj in 1961 after Census. Sasti, the remaining town in the district does not have municipality. The five Municipal Committees together cover 94.99 percent of the urban population or 9.01 percent of the total 1961 population of the district. The income & expenditure of these municipalities was Rs. 2131697 and 2111769 respectively during the year 1964-65. The major portion of Income is derived from Octroi, local taxes such as conservancy tax, cattle registration fee and rent of shops. Nazul income, water rate licence fees, market cess, house tax, sanitation tax etc. also fetch a sizeable income. Government grants are also disbursed to the municipalities whose expenditure exceeds their income.

Similarly a major portion of Income was spent upon, meeting the exorbitant expenses under education, health, sanitation, lighting, establishment, water supply, roads, buildings, gardens, slaughter houses, veterinary charges, drainage grants to various institutions etc. The per capita expenditure of municipal committee, Chanda and Warora for the year 1964-65 is high i.e. Rs. 24.81 and 32.55 respectively as compared to other 3 municipalities, which indicates the higher rate of incidence of taxation.

Plan and Community Development.

Out of the total plan provision of the district level plan schemes of Chanda district under the third five year plan, 59.49 percent of expenditure was incurred at the end of the 4th year of the plan. The expenditure incurred under agricultural programme was 34.63 percent. The agricultural programme includes various sub heads and 14.20, 49.55, 4.32, 39.09, 1.48, and 0.37 percent of total expenditure of agricultural programme was incurred under agricultural production, minor irrigation, animal husbandry, forest, fisheries and ware house/marketing respectively.

Under co-operation and community development 32.21 percent of expenditure was incurred. Out of which expenditure of 12.97 and 87.03 percent was incurred under the Sub head co-operation and community development respectively.

The percentage of expenditure, on industries and mining and transport and communication was 0.42 and 4.64 percent respectively. Where as 28.10 percent of expenditure was incurred on Social services. Out of total expenditure under social services, 35.81, 13.44, 39.47, 2.56, 2.22, 0.87 and 5.63 percent expenditure was incurred on general education, medical and nursing, public health, water supply and drainage, housing social welfare and labour welfare at the end of the fourth year of plan.

Out of the total rural population of the district 48.06 percent is covered under stage I blocks, 29.38 percent under stage II blocks, 13.96 percent under stage III blocks, 3.58 percent multipurpose development blocks and 5.02 percent under T.D. blocks.

Out of the 19 blocks, 9 blocks were categorised under A Class, 2 under B, and 1 under C, and rest of the blocks have not submitted the figures of expenditure.

Prices.

The prices of most of cereals fluctuated during the year under review. The prices of rice fine and medium decreased by 9.10 percent and 10.72 percent respectively while the prices of rice coarse increased by 6.06 percent at the end of the year. Similarly the prices of wheat medium and coarse increased by 71.42 percent and 84.48 percent during the year due to less arrival of rice in the market. The prices of jwar (local and Bajra also increased by 39.53 percent and 14.58 percent respectively.

Except Urid (Dal) the prices of all the pulses were increased at the end of the year. The prices of gram (whole) and gram (dal) increased more than double i.e. by 112.69 percent and 130.98 percent respectively and the prices of Arhar, Mung and Masur (dal) increased by 46.22 percent, 44.52 percent and 74.07 percent respectively.

Since sugar was sold in fair price shops the prices of sugar increased by 5.66 percent. The prices of ground nut oil, and vanaspati (dalda) increased by 27.00 percent and 30.71 percent respectively.

The prices of salt and turmeric remained unchanged during the year. The price of dry chillies (Jambhulghati) decreased by 12.30 percent since new crop came out, while the prices of potatoes and onions increased by 72.40 percent and 34.77 percent respectively. The prices of tea leaf and match box slightly reduced by 1.73 percent and 4.71 percent respectively while the prices of Coffee increased by 54.36 percent. But the prices of kerosene oil, clothings, utensils and miscellaneous items of consumption, except soap by 30.18 percent ruled without any changes.

Out of 11 agricultural market committees in the district three market committees named Marora, Armor and Mul stated their work and the arrival in the grainmarket was 22,237 tons, value of which was Rs. 167 lakhs, during the year under report.

Police and Crimes.

The police force in the district works under the District Superintendent of Police who is assisted by two Deputy Superintendent of Police and three Inspectors. There are 48 Sub Inspectors who look after 25 Police stations with the help of 43 Jamadars, 185 Head Constables and 803 Constables. The Headquarters and Jurisdiction of these police stations are fixed by the District Superintendent of Police. There is a marginal increase of staff i.e. by 2 percent in sub inspectors and 3 percent in constables during the year 1964. But the total cost of the police force has been increased by 8 percent during the year 1964. The average number of villages and population per police station in the district is 110 and 49523 against 69 and 62547 in the state respectively.

The number of cognisable and more cognisable crimes reports during the year more or less same i.e. 3394 and 3395 respectively.

Civil and Criminal cases.

During the year 1964, the percentage of number of cases including civil and criminal cases, decided in the courts, has been increased by 64 percent over the year 1963.

Cinemas.

Cultural activities play an important role in social education and in bringing out talents of people. The number of permanent and touring talkies during the year 1964-65 were 14 and 6 respectively out of the sitting capacity of touring talkies was more by one percent than the permanent talkies.

Census of Government employees.

The census of Government employees was taken in the district in the year 1961. Accordingly Government employees in the district were 5860 in number. The percentage of persons employed, in Class I, II, III and IV were 0.19, 2.01, 83.62 and 14.18 respectively. Out of the total employees in the district, the percentage of 52.37 is among the pay range of Rs. 75 to 100 but the percentage of the total emoluments paid to the employees under this category, works out to 37.63 percent which is higher than all the pay ranges.

Banks.

The number of scheduled banks were 7 in the district and co-operative banks reported 21 in the year 1964-65. The number of towns and villages having the banking facilities were 20 and the facilities available to 13.6 percent of the total population of the district. There are 2 Public and 2 private joint stock companies in the district.

Insurances.

During the year 1964-65 the percentage of Insurance policies and amount insured was 8.3 percent and 7.5 percent respectively, against the division.

Small Savings :-

During the year 1964-65 the target of Rs. 20 lakhs of small saving for the district and out of the gross collection of Rs. 6451163 the withdrawals during the year were 82.91 percent as such the net collection during the year 1964-65 comes to 18.09 percent.

Land Revenue

The percentage of collection of land revenue was 87.65 percent against the demand during the year 1964-65 in the district, where as the percentage of arrears of revenue was increased by 33.54 percent during the year 1964-65.

Excise Revenue sales tax and entertainment tax.

The collection from excise, revenue sales tax and entertainment tax was increased by 13.26, 33.26, and 12.14 percent during the year 1964-65 over the preceding year.

Document registration.

Out of the total Income Rs. 125051, the expenditure incurred on this account was 19.59 percent, as such the net income from registration during the year 1964-65 was 84.41 percent of total income from registration.

Election.

The General Election were held in the district in the year 1962. There is one parliamentary constituency named Chan'a parliamentary constituency. The percent of voting for this constituency was 63.20 and 13.86 percent of votes were rejected for that constituency. Similarly the percentage of votes polled for 9 state constituencies in the district was 66.70 percent out of which 13.22 percent of votes were rejected. During the year 1962 the number of boxes used were 4081 and 1568 for parliamentary and state constituencies respectively in the district. The number of tender votes was negligible.

Housing.

According to 1961 Census the average No. of rooms occupied by each household was 1.69 percent of the 57326 total households in the district. 3.03 percent of households have no regular rooms at all. The household with one room and two rooms, are 48.51 and 33.73 percent respectively. About 14.73 percent of households are living in more than 2 rooms according to 1961 Census.
