NOTES:—

(1) Figures given in the table relate to cereals *i.e.* Rice, Jowar, Bajra, Maize, Ragi, Small Millets, Wheat and Barley. Gram and other pulses are not included in the figures of this table. Prior to 1950, however, gram and other pulses were issued for internal consumption in the case of Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Kutch, Delhi, Saurashtra, Hyderabad and Bihar as part of ration. In the beginning of 1950, Vindhya Pradesh had some stocks of gram which have also been excluded from the figures of this table.

(2) Local procurement was suspended in some States during 1952; in Madras for all cereals from 7th June in U.P. for all cereals other than rice from 1st July, in Mysore for millets, in Madhya Bharat for rice and millets, and in Saurashtra for all Kharif cereals from November 1952. During 1953, monopoly procurement of rice was replaced by levy system in West Bengal from 1st January; the levy system was given up from 14th October and purchases were made on a voluntary basis thereafter. In Andhra the levy system of procurement was given up in mid-December and purchases were made on a voluntary basis at village site at prices fixed by the Government. In U. P., procurement of rice was given up in December 1953 though collection of the quantity procured earlier continued thereafter. Procurement of wheat and coarse grains was given up after the decontrol of these cereals in November. Small quantities of coarse grains were, however, procured during 1954 from the eastern districts of U.P. Some quantity of coarse grains was also procured by Madhya Bharat in 1954. Procurement of rice was resumed in surplus districts of Madras in 1953. In Assam, Bombay, Punjab and Travancore-Cochin procurement of rice was stopped from 14th March, 1954, 21st March, 1954, 20th February, 1954, and 7th April, 1954 respectively, and in other States procurement of rice was stopped completely from 10th July, 1954 consequent upon complete decontrol of rice from that date.

In December, 1954, the Government of India announced their policy of limited purchase of foodgrains as a measure of price support. In this connection, Table No. 6 and the Note below it may be seen.

Owing to the difficulties of procuring rice from abroad in 1957, limited purchases of rice were made internally in Andhra Pradesh, Punjab and Orissa by the Government of India. In Andhra Pradesh, rice was procured in the three delta districts of Krishna, West Godavari and East Godavari. To begin with procurement was made at the average of the prices for three months preceding the 6th June, 1957 under the provisions of the amended Essential Commodities Act, 1957. Later, on 14th September, 1957, maximum controlled prices were notified for these districts and procurement was made at these controlled prices. These controlled prices were revised with effect from 30th December, 1957 when procurement operations were extended to Guntur district also. Procurement was made partly by requisitioning and partly on the basis of voluntary offers.

In Punjab and Orissa, purchases were made on the basis of voluntary offers by trade. On 19th March, 1957, the Orissa Government first banned the export of rice. When they started making purchases, the Government of India prohibited the export of rice from Orissa with effect from the 6th June, 1957 and from the Punjab with effect from 30th December, 1957. Maximum controlled prices for rice in the Punjab were fixed with effect from the 28th December, 1957.

The Central Government purchase of rice was extended to Madhya Pradesh in 1958. Besides purchases by the Centre, a number of State Governments, particularly those of Assam, Mysore, Orissa and West Bengal undertook purchase of rice and paddy from 1957.

NOTE.—In December, 1954 the Government of India announced that in view of the fall in price of some foodgrains to unduly low levels in some isolated areas, they would be prepared to purchase from cultivators as a measure of relief, jowar at Rs. 5.50 per maund, bajra at Rs. 6 per maund and maize at Rs. 5.50 per maund at certain specified *mandies* where the prices fell below these levels. The policy of limited price support was extended to wheat in March, 1955 when the Government announced that they would make purchases of FAQ wheat at rail-head *mandies* at Rs. 10 per maund where its price fell below that level. In June, 1955, a minimum purchase price of Rs. 6 per maund was announced for gram, the machinery for the purchase of gram being the same as that for wheat. In August, 1955 the Government announced its decision to make purchase of coarse rice, as a measure of price support, at selected *mandies*, if the price of that quality fell below Rs. 11 per maund.

The limited price support policy for jowar, bajra and maize was extended in September, 1955 to the 1955-56 kharif crop when the Government of India announced the same minimum prices for these grains as were in force in 1954-55.

No purchases of bajra and coarse rice were made during 1955 as the market prices of these cereals did not fall below the minimum prices announced by the Government.

No purchase of cereals were made during 1956 on Government of India's account. A quantity of 20,518 tons of rice and 1,563 tons of paddy was, however, purchased through trade on Jammu and Kashmir Government's account and despatched direct to Pathankot.

NOTE.—Exports of husked rice within a ceiling of 2 lakh tons were allowed from the ports of Bombay and Calcutta on July, 1954. At the same time the export duty on husked rice was raised from 2 annas 3 pies per maund to 20% *ad valorem*. In February, 1955 exports of rice were allowed from all ports and the export duty reduced to the original level of 2 annas 3 pies per maund.

Exports of jowar within a ceiling of 50 thousand tons and of maize within a ceiling of 30 thousand tons were allowed in June, 1955 and August, 1955 respectively.

Exports of wheat products were allowed from February, 1954.

Exports of rice, jowar, maize and wheat products were banned with effect from 20th January, 23rd January, 2nd January and 31st January, 1956 respectively. However, preban commitments in respect of export of rice were honoured in subsequent months.

NOTES.—1. The subsidy scheme was introduced from 1st April 1946. A revised scheme was enforced from 1-1-1951, according to which the Central Government subsidised specified quantities of imported cereals in selected industrial towns and deficit areas. With effect from 1-3-1952 the subsidy scheme was abolished but imported rice (coarse and broken) and milo continued to be supplied by the Centre to the recipient States at reduced pool prices (i.e., at prices lower than their actual landed costs), resulting losses being borne (exclusively) by the Government of India.

2. These figures represent the amount of subsidy which accrued to the State Governments on the cereals supplied to them during the specified period and do not represent the amount as adjusted in the accounts.

NOTE.—The Bonus Scheme was introduced with effect from the 1st January, 1948, bonus being allowed at the rate of eight annas per maund for all cereals procured in a State and another eight annas per maund on exports made to other States under the Basic Plan. A Revised Bonus Scheme was introduced from the 1st January, 1951, the main points of which were :—

- (a) No bonus was payable on cereals procured by a State for its internal consumption, and
(b) Net export and import quotas were fixed for each State for the year and bonus was paid to the importing and exporting States on a graded scale for exports and imports beyond a prescribed minimum.

The Bonus Scheme was abolished with effect from 1st January, 1952.
