The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to republish for general information the following Notification issued by the Government of India under date the 25th ultimo.

FORT WILLIAM.

FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT, 25TH JAN. 1837.

Notice is hereby given, that under the Conditions of the Advertisement of this Department, dated 5th October 1836, and in conformity with further Orders recently received from the Hon'ble Court of Directors, adjustments of Interest will be made upon all Stock Certificates of the Book Debt Loan, bearing date 31st December 1834, by allowing Interest at the rate of 6 per Cent. on the amount of the cancelled Promissory Note of the Remittable Loan represented by such Stock to the date of its advertised discharge, and from that date at 5 per cent. on the augmented principal of the transferred Stock.

The difference of Interest that may be claimable under this notice will, in case the Stock has been held consecutively by the same party or parties, be paid to the holder of the Certificate on application and production thereof in the Office of the Accountant General of the Presidency, in which the stock may be registered for payment of Interest, but in case of transfer intermediate between the 31st December 1834 and that of application for adjustment of Interest under this notice, the circumstances of each case and all particulars of the transfers must be submitted to the Governor General of India in Council, in order that His Lordship in Council may decide to whom the difference of Interest thus granted is payable.

Whenever Interest shall have been adjusted on any Stock Certificates the same shall be delivered up to be exchanged for other Certificates of the date of advertised discharge of the Original 6 per Cent. Stock thereof, viz. 10th August 1835 or 15th January 1836 respectively, according to the number of the Promissory

Notes as the case may be: and the holders of the resigned Certificates shall further receive broken Interest to the new date of half yearly payment to which the Stock will thus be changed—the payment in both cases to be receipted on the back of the exchanged Certificate in the usual manner.

The holders of *Promissory Notes* of the Government *Transfer Loan*, bearing date 31st December 1834, shall be entitled, until further orders, to transfer the same to the Book Debt Registers of date 10th August 1835 or 15th January 1836, according to the date of discharge of the Original 6 per Cent. Stock of such Notes respectively, and to receive on the occasion of every such transfer the difference of Interest and the broken Interest that may be payable on a similar adjustment, and renewal to be made thereon with that above prescribed for Stock Certificates of the same date.

The Accountant Generals of Calcutta, Madras and Bombay will make the adjustments of Interest and Transfers above authorized in respect to the Notes and Certificates registered for payment of Interest at those Presidencies respectively, without demanding any fee for the same, and it will be necessary that the fact of adjustment having been made be noted on the new Certificates to be granted. FORT WILLIAM.

16TH JANUARY 1837.

The following Draft of a Proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 16th January 1837:

ACT No. — OF 1837.

I. It is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for each of the Courts of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut, within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, to direct by an order authenticated by the official signature of the Register of such Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut, that the Cognizance of any Original Suit or of any Appeal which may be brought before any Zillah or City Court subordinate to such Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut, shall be transferred to any other Zillah or City Court subordinate to the same Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut.

II. Provided always, that whenever either of the said Courts of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut shall, in the exercise of the power given by the preceding Clause, direct the transfer of the Cognizance of any Suit, such Court of Sudder Dewanny Adawlut shall cause the reasons for such transfer to be recorded on its proceedings.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 6th day of March next.

MARINE DEPARTMENT.

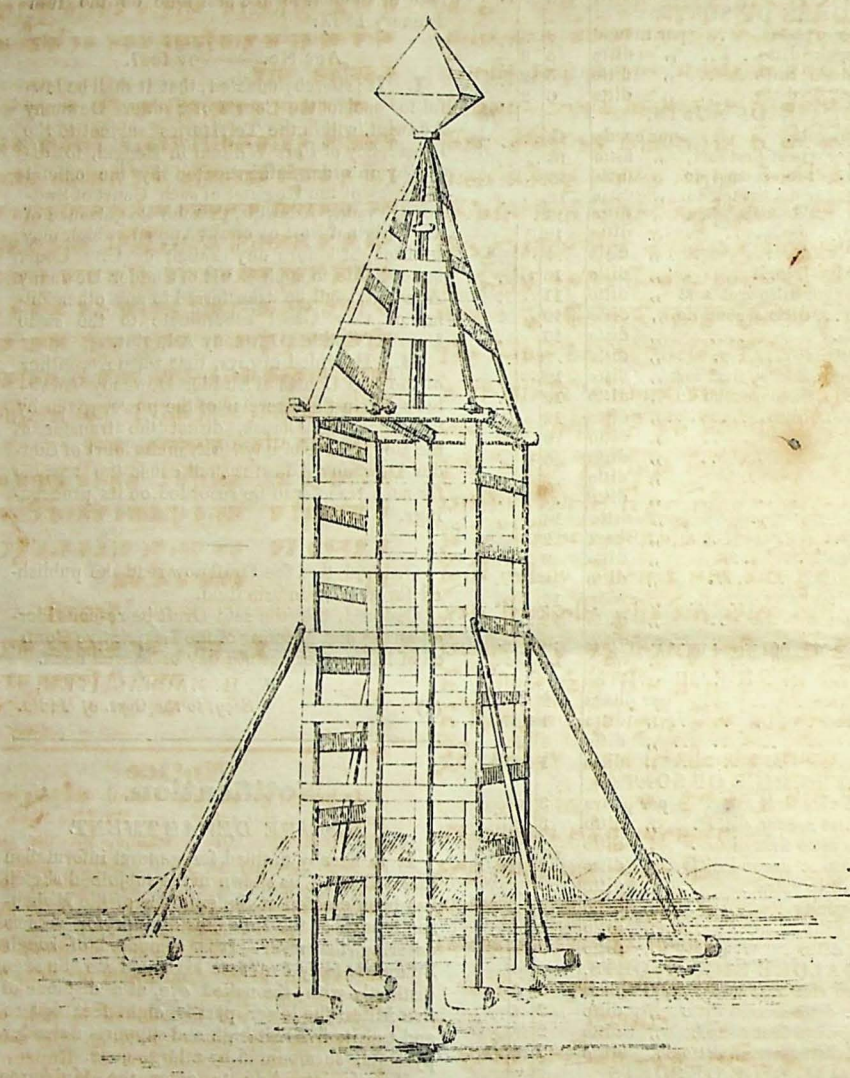
It is hereby notified for general information that a Beacon, as shewn in the subjoined sketch has been erected at the entrance of the Hujamree branch of the Indus, as a mark for vessels entering that river—It is composed of rough Spars, is forty five feet high and can be seen distinctly with the naked eye, at a distance of five Miles: the lower part is eight feet square and twenty five feet high and supports a slender pyramid, surmounted by a large cone.

Vessels intending to enter the Hujamree river ought, on sighting the Beacon, to stand in towards the land until they are close to the shoals, and then steer along them until the Beacon bears N. N. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E: they will then be at the entrance of the channel and may steer direct for it, until near the shoal water off the north point of the river, on which the Beacon is situated, when they must keep away N. E. by E. up the first reach.

Notice

Is hereby given, that verbal tenders will be received at this office, from 2 till 3 o'clock P.M. on Friday the 10th proximo, for the supply of any quantity of good cleaned gram that may be required at Poona and Kirkee, for the term of one year, from the 1st of April next.

Every person coming forward will be required to bid in the Ankoosee currency below the market price of gram, on the day which the sale takes place.

No person will be allowed to bid, or be present at the time of bidding, who has not previously deposited the sum of Rupees (500) five hundred, to be forfeited, in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract; and, as soon as the result of the sale, is declared, the deposits will be returned to all others than the person whose offer has been accepted.

The gram to be unexceptionable and of the quality and description generally used by the mounted corps at Poona and Kirkee, and, to be delivered free of all expense to Government, on account of carriage &c. at the Commissariat Stores at those stations, and, in case of any dispute, the opinion of a committee to decide the point and to be final. But it is to be understood, that all payments will be made in the Company's Rupee or any other coin issued

to this Department from the Public Treasuries, and at the Government rate of exchange between it and the Ankoosee Rupee.

A supply of at least one month's consumption during the fair season and of three months, during the monsoon to be constantly kept up at the Commissariat Stores above mentioned.

To prevent disputes hereafter, it is to be distinctly borne in mind, that the provisions of the contract, are only intended to extend to the demands made at Poona and Kirkee, but in the event of any of the cavalry marching, it will be optional with the commissariat officer, to take one month's gram or not for their use while on march, and the contractor will not be liable for any greater demand.

The contractor, will be personally bound for the due fulfilment of his contract, in the penal sum of rupees (1000) one thousand, and must also furnish unexceptionable bonded security, to the amount of (10,000) ten thousand rupees, on the same account.

Payment for the supplies, according to the quantity issued in the preceding month, will be made in the following month, on the requisite vouchers being produced.

No reason will be assigned for the rejection of any offer.

Further particulars will be made known on application at this office every day, from 10 till 4 o'clock, Sundays excepted.

BY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 14th FEBRUARY 1837.

GENERAL ORDERS BY THE RIGHT HON'BLE THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA IN COUNCIL.

FORT WILLIAM, 30TH JANUARY 1837.

The following Paragraph (5) of a Military Letter from the Honorable the Court of Directors, to the Governor of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, No. 54, dated 31st August 1836, is published for general information.

Letter dated 15th August 1835.

With reference to Court's Orders to Madras, of 5th August 1834, (a Copy of which was forwarded as applicable to Bengal, in Court's Letter of 11th February 1835,) regarding the allowances of General Officers on the Staff, while absent from their Divisions on leave, submit a representation of the injurious effect of the Regulation therein laid down, and urge the ground upon which the Court are requested to reconsider the Orders in question, and to grant the Officers so employed an immunity from any forfeiture of allowances while absent from their Divisions on leave within the limits of the Presidency to which they belong.

Para. 5.—In compliance with your recommendation, we shall not object to the continuance of the allowances of Officers on the General Staff, when absent from their Commands, within the limits of their respective Presidencies for a reasonable period, provided that no additional expense is thereby occasioned to the State.

FORT WILLIAM.

THE 30TH JANUARY 1837.

Resolution—It has been brought to the notice of the Governor General in Council that, Landed Property of great value within the jurisdiction of the King's Courts, is now held by Parsees, to whom it has descended in conformity with Parsee usages, but not in conformity with the English Law of Inheritance.

2. The national usages of the Parsees are not like the Hindoo and Mahomedan rules of Inheritance, Marriage, and Succession recognized by Law. Nevertheless it appears to His Lordship in Council that Parsees who are in possession of Land which they have inherited according to their national usages and with the acquiescence of all interested parties, ought not to be disturbed in that possession. This appears to His Lordship in Council to be one of those cases in which the strict enforcement of the Law would defeat the end for which Laws are made, would render property insecure, and would shake the confidence of the people in the Institutions under which they live.

3. His Lordship in Council is disposed to enact that real property within the jurisdiction of the King's Courts shall, as regards its transmission by the Will of a Parsee Testator or on the death of a Parsee Intestate, be taken to be and to have always been of the nature of Chattels real.

4. This enactment will be restricted by two provisos. One of those provisos secures in their possessions all who hold such Property by what has hitherto been a strictly legal title. The other is intended to give legal validity to those family arrangements which Parsees have heretofore made according to their national customs, in cases in which no objection has been made to those arrangements.

5. In order that time may be given to Parsees who reside at a distance from Calcutta to express

their wishes, His Lordship in Council has determined to leave a longer interval than ordinary, between the first publication and the final re-consideration of the Act which has been prepared on this subject.

The following Draft of that Act is herewith published for general information :

ACT No. — of 1837.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from the — day of — all immoveable Property situate within the jurisdiction of any of the Courts established by His Majesty's Charter shall, as far as regards the transmission of such Property on the death and intestacy of any Parsee having a beneficial interest in the same, or by the last Will of any such Parsee, be taken to be and to have been of the nature of Chattels real and not of Freehold.

II. Provided always, that in any suit at Law or in Equity which shall be brought for the recovery of such immoveable Property as is aforesaid, no advantage shall be taken of any defect of title arising out of the transmission of such Property upon the death and intestacy of any Parsee having a beneficial interest in the same, or by the last Will of any such Parsee if such transmission took place before the said — day of —, and if such transmission were either according to the rules which regulate the transmission of Freehold Property, or else took place with the acquiescence of all persons to whom any interest in that Property would, according to the rules which regulate the transmission of Chattels real, have accrued upon the death of such Parsee.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 9th day of May next.

The following Act, passed by the Right Honorable the Governor General of India in Council, on the 6th February, 1837, is hereby promulgated for general information :

ACT No. I. OF 1837.

It is hereby enacted, that from the 1st day of March next, it shall be lawful for any one Justice of the Peace for the Town of Calcutta, to issue a Warrant of Distress for the recovery of Arrears of Assessment occurring under the Act of Parliament 33, George III. Cap 52, and every such Warrant shall have the same force as if it were under the hands and seals of two such Justices.

GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for general information the following Rules passed by Government on the 10th instant.

Rules for facilitating the entry and clearing out, of Vessels, in the Harbour of Bombay.

1st. On entry, the Commander shall, in addition to what is provided for, in the 1st and 2nd articles of Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation I. of 1820, deliver the following documents, vizt: Two manifests to the Collector of Customs.

One list of Crew and Passengers, to the Senior Magistrate of Police.

2nd. On clearing out, the Commander shall, in addition to what is provided for under the 2nd article of the Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation aforesaid, furnish the following documents, vizt:

One manifest to the Collector of Customs.

One certificate from the Police Office, as at present, to the Collector of Customs.

One do. from the Commissary Genl. to do. do.
One do. from the Marine Paymaster, to do. do.

3rd. The certificate from the Marine Paymaster shall comprehend all claims on account of the Dock Yards, for which purpose all Indents or requisitions for materials, or work to be done at the Dock Yards, shall bear an attested declaration, by the Owners, Agents, or other Residents of Bombay, that they will pay the charges for materials, or performance of the Work required, according to the sub-joined Form, and this Indent shall be immediately forwarded by the Controller's department, to the Marine Paymaster, while the transmission of a blank Indent from the Controller's department, will assure the Marine Paymaster that no demand exists.

4th. The furnishing of the following documents is discontinued, vizt:

List of Crew and Passengers, to the Superintendent of the Indian Navy.

Certificates from the Medical Board, and Controller of the Dock Yards, to the Collector of Customs.

Certificate of commencing and finishing of voyages, to do. do.

Three of the export manifests, to ditto.

5th. To enable the Superintendent of the Indian Navy to countersign the Port Clear-

ance, which, under the 2nd article of Rule, Ordinance and Regulation I. of 1820, is required to be accompanied by a list of persons on board &c. before it can be countersigned by that officer, the Inspector of the Port shall, in future, send that furnished to him under the provisions of the same article, to the Superintendent of the Indian Navy, and thus enable him to countersign the Port Clearance.

6th. The practice of sending the applications for Port Clearance, to the Secretary's Office, for the initials of a Secretary to Government, is to be discontinued.

7th. To enable the Marine Paymaster to grant the certificate required from his department, forty eight hours notice shall be given to him, of the Ship's intended departure, in order that he may obtain the requisite certificates from the other departments, to complete his own.

8th. The Register of Native Servants returning from England now required from the Commanders, is to be discontinued.

9th. The report at present made by the Master Attendant, to the Superintendent of the Indian Navy, and by the latter to the Post Master General, of the intended departure of Ships, is to be discontinued.

10th. The report made to the Superintendent of the Indian Navy, on the arrival of a Ship under Foreign Colours of her having been visited by the Inspector of the Port before the Pilot is permitted to bring her up beyond the Middle Ground, is still to be made.
