PROCLAMATION—Bombay to Wit.—

By virtue of a precept to me directed, I hereby proclaim and give notice, that the Sessions of Oyer and Terminer, and General Gaol Delivery, will be holden before the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay, at the COURT HOUSE on Friday the Eighteenth day of March inst. at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, and other Felonies, Perjuries, Trespasses, and other Crimes and Misdemeanors, had done, or committed, within the Town and Island of Bombay, and the limits thereof, and the Factories subordinate thereto, and also to enquire, hear and determine, in like manner, all Treasons, Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries, Crimes, Extortions, Misdemeanors, Trespasses, Wrongs, Oppressions, had done, or committed, by any of Her Majesty's British Subjects, in any of the territories which now are subject to, or dependent upon the said Government of Bombay, or within any of the dominions of the Native Princes of India, in alliance with the said Government.

And also, that, at the same time and place will be holden a Session of Admiralty, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, Piracies, Robberies, Trespasses, Misdemeanors; and other crimes and offences had done, perpetrated or committed, on the high seas.

And I hereby require and enjoin all persons bound to prosecute and give evidence at the above Sessions, or in any way concerned therein, to attend at the time and place abovementioned, and not to depart without leave of the Court.—Dated this Seventh day of March in the fifth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.

Request to be informed from what date the appointment of Captain Davidson, Assistant Deputy Commissary General, is to be considered to have taken place.

4. On the 17th March 1840 Captain Davidson applied to be "now nominated to the existing vacancy of Deputy Commissary General," although he then wanted about eight months to complete his twelve years service in the Department required by the

Regulations to qualify him for that office, and it was our intention by the orders given on the 2nd December 1840 to comply with this request, the Commissary General now recommends that the nomination may have effect from the 22nd November 1838, the date of Captain Davidson proceeding upon Field service. We can not comply with this recommendation. The appointment will accordingly have effect from the 17th March 1840.

Letter dated 12th July 1841, No. 78.

Memorial from 2nd Lieutenant H. River of the Engineers, regarding his rank and standing in that Corps.

5. Mr. River's detention at the Cape of Good Hope, having been unavoidable, the rank assigned to him in the List No. 1 of 1841, will be preserved to him.

Letter dated 19th July 1841, No. 82.

Memorial from Mr. Bellew, Deputy Assistant Commissary of Ordnance, praying to be allowed to retire on the pension of a Commissary.

9. We have fully enquired into the circumstances of Mr. Bellew's service, and whilst we duly appreciated his merits and claims. We are under the necessity of declining to depart from the established Regulations in fixing the amount of his pension

on retirement.

No. 176 of 1842.—By a resolution passed in the General Department under date the 2nd instant, First Hospital Apprentice Wamun Gopall of the 21th Regiment Native Infantry, is attached to the Civil Oculist's Department, vice Soba promoted.

- Note.—A. The Second Class Servants here specified are for 100 Patients, in excess of that number an additional Ward Cooley, and Sweeper, are allowed for every 25 Patients, and an additional Dhooby and Cook, for every 50, a Barber is allowed for every 60 sick. The Assistant Apothecary is allowed Rs. 60 per Mensem instead of Rupees 40.
- B. This Assistant is in the regular service, but is paid from the contingent allowance specified in Article 13, Section XVII. of the Medical Code of Regulations.
- C. The Situation of Compounder will cease with the present incumbent or when a proper opportunity offers of employing him in some other Department. The establishment of 2d Class Servants is calculated for 50 Patients in this Hospital as well as in those at Ahmedabad and Poona, a proportional increase to that granted in the Native General Hospital at the Presidency being allowed according to the additional number of sick. The pay of the Male and Female Keepers in the above Hospitals to be fixed at Rs 12 and 8 respectively; on vacancies taking place.
- D. The situation of Apothecary to cease with the present incumbent.
- E. Six Peons allowed for the charge of the Insane Patients on account of the openness and insecurity of the Hospital compound. Bullock Bheesties are allowed on account of the distance from which water is brought.
- F. The Leechman to be made available for the three establishments at Ahmednurgur, inserted in this table.
- G. The 1st Assistant in charge of the Political Agent's Establishment at Sadra, receives Rupees 15 per mensem in addition to his pay. The 2d Assistant is employed at Edur.
- H. The situation of Apothecary will cease with the present incumbent.
- I. This 2d Assistant in the regular Service, but is paid by the Rancee.
- K. The 1st Assistant in charge of the Civil Establishment at Angria's Colabah receives Rupees 15 per mensem in addition to his pay.
- L. These Hospital Assistants are in the Regular Service, but are paid by H. H. the Rajah.

Superintending Surgeons of Divisions are authorized on extraordinary occasions of sickness to grant a temporary addition to the 2d Class Servants, but the circumstance is to be immediately reported to the Medical Board for their sanction.

Second Class Servants attached to the Civil Medical Department are to be paid by the Commissariat Department prospectively at the rates usually allowed at the places where they may be required, all those at present in employment continuing on their present rates of pay. On reductions incident to the present arrangement, those 2d Class Servants last employed to be discharged, but to retain a preference, if willing to return to the Department on vacancies taking place.

The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to republish for general information the following Proclamation issued by the Government of India under date the 28th ultimo.

PROCLAMATION.

Whereas the Right Honorable Edward Lord Ellenborough, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, hath been appointed by the Honorable the Court Directors of the East India Company to be Governor General of India and Governor of Fort William in Bengal, upon and from the time of his arrival at Fort William in Bengal, or upon and from the time of his joining the major part of the Supreme Council of India, and Whereas General Sir Jasper Nicolls, K. C. B., Commander in Chief in India, hath been appointed to be an Extraordinary Member of the Council of India, and William Wilberforce Bird Esq., Major General Sir William Casement, K. C. B., and Henry Thoby Prinsep Esq. have been respectively appointed to be the first, second, and third Ordinary Members of the said Supreme Council of India, and Whereas the Honorable the Court of Directors have declared and confirmed Andrew Amos Esq., to be and to continue the fourth Ordinary Member of the said Council, and Whereas the said Right Honorable Edward Lord Ellenborough hath on the day and date hereof arrived in Calcutta, and assumed the said Offices of Governor General of India and Governor of Bengal. The above recited appointments are hereby notified, and it is further Proclaimed, that the said Edward Lord Ellenborough, Governor General of India, hath this day taken the usual Oaths and his Seat in the Supreme Council of India, and that William Wilberforce Bird Esq. Major General Sir William Casement, K. C.
