The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 28th of July 1849.

ACT No. -- 1849.

An Act to extend the operation of Section X. Regulation XXVI. 1814, of the Bengal Code.

Whereas it is expedient for the better administration of justice to extend the provisions of Section X. Regulation XXVI. 1814, and make them applicable to Suits instituted in the Courts of the Moonsiffs, It is enacted as follows:

I: From the passing of this Act, Section X. Regulation XXVI. 1814, shall be applicable to all Suits instituted in the Courts of the Moonsiffs, in the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Drast be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 28th day of September next.
