The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 22nd of September 1849.

ACT No. -- 1849.

An Act to declare Aden a free Port.

Whereas the trade between the Western Coast of India and the Red Sea and places thereunto adjacent, will be improved by encouraging the resort of Vessels of all nations to the port of Aden in Arabia, It is declared and enacted as follows:—

- I. The port and settlement of Aden in Arabia, is a free port and settlement; and no duty of Customs is payable on any Ship or other Vessel, or on any Goods lawfully carried by sea or land to or from the said port and settlement.
- 11. The said port of Aden shall not be taken to be within the provisions of Act VI. of 1848.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 22nd day of December next.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 29th of September 1849:—

ACT No. -- 1849.

For the amendment of Procedure in Cases of Appeal to the Sudder Court.

Whereas inconvenience has resulted from the rule allowing petitions of Appeal to the Sudder Dewanny Adawlut from Judgments of principal Sudder Ameens or of the Judges of the Zillah or City Courts, to be presented either in the Sudder Court or in the Court in which the decision was passed, and from the rule allowing the specific objections to the Judgment and detailed grounds and reasons for preferring the Appeal to be, at the option of the party, either stated in the original petition of appeal, or afterwards filed in the Court trying the Appeal, as a separate pleading,

It is canced as follows, in modification of Section X., Regulation VI., 1793. Section III., Regulation XII., 1797, and Section VIII., Regulation XXVI., 1814, of the Bengal Code:—

1. Every petition of Regular Appeal in a case appealable to the Sudder Court, shall be presented to the Court in which the decision was passed within three months from the day of the decision: such petition of Appeal shall not contain the specific reasons of the Appeal; but shall state shortly that the party, being dissatisfied with the Judgment, is desirous of appealing from it.

- II. The proceedings held in the cause of Appeal shall be certified to the Sudder Dewanny Adawlut as soon as conveniently may be done; and notice thereof in writing shall be given to the Appellant.
- III. Within three months thereafter, the Appellant shall present to the Sudder Dewanny Adawlut the specific objections to the Judgment, and detailed reasons for preferring the Appeal; otherwise it shall be dismissed, unless he shall show reasonable cause to the satisfaction of the Sudder Court for his default.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 29th day of November next.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 6th of October 1819:

ACT No. - OF 1849.

An Act for regulating the Bombay Ferries.

Whereas it is expedient to regulate the Public Ferries within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay, It is enacted as follows:—

- I. The Governor of Bombay in Council may declare by Proclamation what Ferries within any part of the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay, shall be deemed Public Ferries, and at any time hereafter, by a like Proclamation, may establish new Ferries where they are needed, and from time to time change the course of any Public Ferry, or discontinue any Public Ferry that is deemed unnecessary.
- 11. Tolls according to such rates as shall from time to time be settled or approved by the Governor of Bombay in Council shall be levied upon all Passengers, Carts, Carriages, Cattle and other Animals, and on all Goods and Merchandize carried over any Public Ferry.
- III. No Tolls shall be leviable from any body of Soldiery on their march.
- IV. Boats shall be provided under the authority of the Governor of Bombay in Council for each Public Ferry, and Tindals, Boatmen, and other persons, shall be appointed for their due Navigation.
- V. At every Public Ferry-station a Toll-keeper shall be appointed, with a sufficient Establishment, whose duty it shall be to take the lawful Tolls.
- VI. A Table of Tolls, written or printed in the English and Native Languages, shall be hang up in some conspicuous place at every Ferry-station, so as to be easily read by all persons crossing the Ferry.
- VII. Every Toli-keeper, who shall neglect to haug, up and keep in good order and repair such Table of Tolls, or who shall wilfully remove, alter, or deface the same, or allow it to become illegible, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten Rupees.
- VIII. Every Toll-keeper, who shall ask or take any Toll other than is allowed by the Table of Tolls, or who shall wilfully delay any Passenger, Cart

Carriage, Animal, or Goods, shall be liable to a penalty of Fitty Rupees.

IX. Every person crossing at any such Public Ferry, who shall refuse to pay the Toll, or who, with intent of avoiding payment thereof, shall fraudulently or forcibly pass by or through any Toll-station without paying the Toll, or who shall obstruct any Toll-keeper or any of his Assistants in any way in the execution of their duty under this Act, and also every person who shall maliciously damage any Toll Bar, Boat, or any other thing employed in or about any Public Ferry, or who shall maliciously remove, alter, destroy, or damage any Table of Tolls hung up as hereinbefore directed, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Rupees, over and above the value of the damage which he has done.

X. All Public Ferry-boats shall be numbered and registered as the Governor of Bombay in Council shall direct, and the names of all Tindals, or persons placed in charge thereof, and of all Toll-keepers, shall likewise be so registered.

The Magistrate of every Zillah in which there shall be a Public Ferry, and any Magistrate of Police of Bombay, whom the Governor in Council may appoint for such purpose within their respective jurisdictions, shall make Rules subject to confirmation by the Governor in Council, fixing the number of Passengers, Carts, Carriages, and Animals, and the quantity of Goods that may be carried in any Public Ferry-boat at one trip, and for the safe and convenient carriage of Passengers and Property, and for keeping the Ferry-boats in good order, and otherwise for the due discharge of their duty by all Tindals, Toll-keepers, and other persons employed at any Public Ferry; and any Tindal, Toll-keeper, or other person, infringing or disobeying any such Rule, shall be liable to make good any loss or damage which shall have been caused thereby, which may be summarily ascertained by any Magistrate within whose jurisdiction the offence was committed, and the amount thereof may be recovered as any penalty under this Act may be recovered.

XII. The Governor of Bombay in Council may bease any public Ferry by public auction, or private contract, from year to year, or any longer period, not exceeding seven years, on such conditions as he deems advisable; in which case a Contract, setting forth the conditions on which the Ferry is to be held, shall be executed by the Contractor or Farmer, and security shall by him be given for its due fulfilment.

XIII. If a Public Ferry is established between the Island of Bombay and the Mainland, the Ferry-boat shall cross each way at least () daily, unless hindered by stress of weather or other unavoidable accident.

XIV. Every person, who shall convey for hire or other consideration, any Passenger or any Cart, Carriage, Animal, or Goods, the property of any other person, across any River, Stream, Creek, or Arm of the Sea, within the said Presidency, otherwise than across the harbour of Bombay, to any point or place on the opposite bank or coast, by any boat or other means, within a distance of three miles above or below any Public Ferry, without the special license of a Magistrate of the zillah or town in which the Ferry is situated, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Hundred Ropees; but this prohibition and penalty shall not apply to any person specially hiring any bunder or other boat for the carriage of himself and family or friends, with their goods and servants, across the Sea between Bombay and the Mainland, nor to the person letting a boat or bunder to hire for such purpose.

XV. All offences against this Act shall be summarily heard and determined by the Magistrate of the zillah within the limits of which the same shall have been

committed, and if within the limits of the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Bombay, by any Magistrate of Police of Bombay. All penalties shall be recovered in the manner directed for the recovery of the fines specified in Regulation XIX. of 1827, Section XIV., Clauses 1, 2, and 3, of the Bombay Code.

XVI. All Tolls payable on account of any Public Ferry, and all rent payable on account of such of them as are farmed, and all penalties for offences against this Act, shall form a general Fund, which shall be applied in the first instance toward the expenses necessary for keeping up all the Ferries throughout the Presidency of Bombay; and the residue, if any, shall be applied under the directions of the Governor of Bombay in Council in the improvement of the public roads, ways, and thoroughfares, leading to and from any of the said Ferries.

XVII. The Governor of Bombay in Council may appoint such officers and other persons as shall be necessary for carrying this Act into execution, with such salaries as the Governor General of India in Council shall approve to be paid out of the Fund produced by the Tolls and Fines as provided by this Act; and the Governor of Bombay in Council may from time to time delegate any of the powers conferred on him by this Act to any Magistrate or other person, as he thinks fit.

No Tender for the Contract in question will be received unless accompanied by a cash deposit of Rupees (1,098) one thousand and ninety-eight, in cash, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal to execute the necessary deed of Contract, should his offer be accepted; in which latter case he must be prepared to give unexceptionable bonded security to the extent of Rupees (4,396) four thousand three hundred and ninety-

six, to be held by Government, for the due fulfilment of his Contract.

The party or parties whose offer may be accepted, will be required to sign and seal a Contract, stipulating to the above effect, that he or they will comply immediately with all emer-gent demands for the articles included in the above-mentioned list, and will meet other demands of less urgency within the periods stated in the requisitions made upon him or them; in failure whereof, or if the supply be condemned by a Committee of Officers, as aforesaid, the articles of Furniture, &c., or such other as may be required in lieu thereof, shall be purchased by this Department without reservation, at his or their risk and cost: and in all such cases, an advance of Rupees thirty (30) per cent. upon the amount of expenses incurred, or a fine of Rs. (50) fifty, at the option of the Executive Officer, will be levied as liquidated damages, for each and every such breach of Contract, as often as the same may occur; also the Contract may, in all such cases, be put an end to on the part of the East India Company.

It is to be distinctly understood, that Bills for the quantities of articles included in the above-mentioned list, supplied under this Contract, shall be preferred within or before the expiration of one month from the date of the delivery of the articles; in default of which, the Contractor shall be liable to forfeit the full value or amount of the supplies for which Bills have not been so preferred, unless it shall clearly appear that the delay was unavoidable.

The amount of retrenchments made by the Military Board on the Contractors' Bills, will be recovered from the first Bills preferred for payment by the Contractors; but in the event of such retrenchments, or any portion thereof, being remitted, the amount, or so much of the amount as shall be so remitted, will then be refunded to them.

The annual outlay on the above Contract is estimated at Rupees 21,978, or thereabouts. All further particulars will be communicated on the receipt and opening of the Tenders.

The following revised Rules for the Management of Staging Bungalows, having been approved of by Government, are published for general information.

The public will observe, that, under the new Rules, priority of arrival gives no exclusive right of occupancy; and also, that every individual, above the age of 14 years, taking shelter in a Staging Bungalow, must pay the Fee of One Rupee.

STAGING BUNGALOW RULES.

1. The Establishment, Furniture, and Management of Staging Bungalows, are generally under the Post Masters who reside nearest them.

Those on the Grand Trunk Road, and not at a Post Office Station, are under the Executive Officers of the Division. The number of persons attached to each building is determined by the locality, and greater or lesser resort of Travellers to it.

The most trustworthy Servant at each Bangalow is to have charge of a Book, with Columns in it, of which the heading indicates where Travellers are to write down the sums which they pay, and the dates of their arrival and departure.

2. Every European Traveller, and every Traveller by Dâk, whether a Native or European, can claim shelter for 24 hours in a Staging Bungalow, on paying a Fee of One Rupee. Two Rupees become due for twenty-five, three Rupees for forty-nine hours' occupancy, and so on. No charge will be made for Children under 14 years of age.

In conformity with the orders of the Right Honorable the Governor General, Post Masters are required to obtain payment from every person who may take shelter in a Staging Bungalow, whether travelling at the public expense or not.

Officers commanding Troops, or other Gentlemen marching, who do not wish to enter a Bungalow, are requested not to pitch Tents in the enclosure, since by doing so, they may incommode occupants, or prevent Travellers from availing themselves of the building.

Whoever declines to use a Bungalow, but causes the Servants to work for him, or gets provisions cooked in the kitchen, must pay as if he occupied one of the rooms.

The Book-keeper is to be provided with two Books; he will send one of them with the amount of collections for the month preceding on the first of every month, using the other at the Bungalow.

This person, who must be able to write, is, besides, to keep a Journal of his own, noting the hour of every Traveller's arrival and departure, and the sum he pays, which the Post Master is to compare with the entries in the Book.

In Bungalows on the standard plan—that is, in which there are two rooms, two dressing and two bathing rooms—one room, one dressing and one bathing room are allotted to Ladies; the other rooms and a bathroom to male Travellers.

In Bungalows in which there is a centre common room, the private rooms will be allotted according to priority of arrival, one-half the accommodation being reserved, if necessary, for Ladies. Travellers arriving after all the private rooms are occupied, will have the use of the common room and a bathing room.

No person can claim shelter in a Staging Bungalow for more than 24 hours; after the expiration of that period, he is bound to remove, if called on to do so, by another Traveller.

The Khidmutgar at each Bungalow will cook any provision furnished by Travellers; but those who employ him to supply catables, must submit to his terms.

Travellers are expected to bring their own Table Linen; when they do not, the Khidmutgar is directed to spread a Napkin, about 2 feet square, before each person: the Napkin is not to be used a second time until it has been washed and ironed. The Post Master will punish the servants whenever he discovers that they neglect to keep every thing in the Bungalow, and connected with it, perfectly clean.

Whoever breaks or injures any thing, will pay for the same. The Servants are immediately to report when an article becomes unserviceable, and get it replaced.

Tatties are provided during the hot winds; but an establishment to water them being entertained only when wanted, the Traveller who chooses to order it must defray the expense, in addition to other charges.

The buildings, as such, are kept in order by the Executive Officers, the Post Masters reporting to them whenever repairs are necessary.
