1. If a Military subordinate, engaged in the Public Works Department, shall be guilty of habitual drunkenness on duty, or gross neglect, or carelessness in keeping Accounts, entailing loss to the State, or of any offence which would preclude his promotion as a Soldier, or render him liable to Departmental degradation, he should, as a general rule, be brought to trial before a District Court Martial.

Any Buggy or Bullock Cart detained by the hirer shall be paid for at the rate of 4 Annas for a Buggy, and 2 Annas for a Bullock Cart, per hour, so long as so detained.

For any distance not above specified, or therein included, the fares must be paid according to the following Rules:—

For any distance within and not exceeding 1 Mile, 4 Annas for a Buggy and 2 Annas for a Bullock Cart; for any distance exceeding 1 Mile, after the rate of 4 Annas for a Buggy and 2 Annas for a Bullock Cart for every Mile and for any part of a Mile over and above any number of Miles completed.

N.B.—This table is an extract from a more extensive yearly Return that is prepared for statistical purposes and chiefly for the detection of any removable sources of disease, with a view to improving the healthiness of the Island. As the principal object cannot be fully attained unless the true causes of death be recorded, persons of all stations are requested, in each case of death occurring in their circle, to obtain, in writing, from the Medical Attendant, the name of the fatal disease, that it may be delivered to the Policeman at the funeral place. Medical Practitioners particularly are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

TORRES STRAIT.

CAMPBELL REEF.—The Ship "Storm Cloud," in a recent passage through Torres Strait, by the great N. E. Channel, when running from the

* See Admiralty Chart, Torres Strait, Western Channels, No. 2375, scale, $d = 30$ inches, on which this danger is marked. Ninepin Rock to Wednesday Island, passed about 3 cables lengths from a Reef, which appeared to be a very narrow ridge, trending in a N. E. and S. W. direction, and about half a mile in extent.*

The Reef is nearly in line between the Easternmost and highest Double Island and Mount Ernest Island, distant about $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the former, and $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the latter island.

Caution.—As this newly discovered danger is in the route occasionally used by Vessels bound through the Prince of Wales Channel from the Eastward, and has hitherto escaped the vigilance of Surveying Officers, and as its exact position is yet

uncertain, the utmost caution is required in using this passage.

The prompt attention of the Commander of the "Storm Cloud," in reporting this danger to the Lords of the Admiralty, is acknowledged by their Lordship's naming it after the discoverer.

East Coast.—Outer Route.

On the East side boundary dangers, the position of Booby Reef is stated in Hydrographic Notice No. 5 to be in Long. $158^{\circ} 19' 23''$ E., it should be $158^{\circ} 31' 53''$ E. Bampton Reef (omitted), South West end is in Lat. $19^{\circ} 52' 22''$ S., and Long. $158^{\circ} 19' 23''$ E.

NOTIFICATIONS BY THE CIVIL AUDITOR.

No. 36.

In accordance with paragraph 1 of printed Circular No. 1309, dated 12th September 1860, and with reference to the previous Notification No. 35, from this office, dated 28th ultimo, regarding the printing of Abstracts, the attention of all Officers is requested to the subjoined Form, which exhibits exactly how entries should, in future, be made in the body and on the reverse of the new printed Abstracts.

2. Everything printed in Italics and Antique is supposed to be entered in writing by the Officer submitting the Abstract, and all that is not so printed to be a portion of the printed Abstract Form.

3. The Accountant General having ordered that Fines are not, in future, to be deducted as "Savings" from the total of Abstracts, but that they are to be treated in the same way as Income Tax in passing the bill, Officers will be good enough to exhibit them separately from the "Savings" on the reverse of their Abstracts in the manner shown in the Form.

4. It will be observed that there are to be four printed declarations at the foot of the Abstract. Officers will be good enough to remember that, when any of them do not apply, it will be necessary to notice the fact by passing the pen through the declaration which, or such part of it as, is not required, and INITIALING THE CORRECTION; thus, when new hands *have* been employed, the word "No" in declaration No. 2 should be struck out, and the number of new hands employed inserted above it; when there have been Absentees, the declaration No. 4 will be struck out, and an Absentee Return sent.

5. It is also to be borne in mind that ALL corrections made in the printed Abstracts will require to be initialed.

6. It may sometimes happen that a Junior Judge, Collector, or First Assistant Collector is appointed to a station the Abstract of which is printed at the highest rates, and in that case the sanctioned amount will be decreased. This decrease must be exhibited by corrections in the amounts with initials. On the other hand, a corresponding increase will take place in the Abstract, wherein *now* from a Junior in any of the above grades being entered the smaller amounts are shown. This increase must be similarly exhibited.

7. The Salaries of Supernumeraries of every grade should invariably be drawn in separate Abstracts.

8. In case of Abstracts in which the pay of Military Officers in Civil Employ appears, the rule laid down in Notification No. 31 of showing the Military nett pay on the reverse must always be followed, and this head of deduction should be entered immediately below "savings."
