ISSUED BY THE INCOME TAX COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN AND ISLAND OF BOMBAY UNDER ACT XXXII. OF 1860, SECTION XXXVII.

INCOME TAX

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST JULY 1862.

Notice is hereby given, that every person within the Town and Island of Bombay, who, by the Act XXXII. of 1860, for imposing Duties on Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, is liable to the said Duties, and to return his or her Profits or Income, is hereby required to fill in a Return of his or her Profits and Income in the prescribed Form (B), and to transmit such Return, duly signed with the Declaration prescribed by the Act, to the Assessors of the Town and Island of Bombay aforesaid, at their respective Offices within 15 days from the date of the delivery of the special Notice, under the Penalties contained in the said Act.

Persons requiring Forms of Returns can procure them at the Office of the Assessors. Forms of such Returns will also be left at the usual place of Residence or Business of every person known or considered to be liable to the Duties imposed by the said Act. But any person liable to the said Duties, who may not receive such Forms, must apply for the same at the Office of any of the Assessors.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

The following Rules relating to repairs of Public Works in this Presidency, and to Emergent Works, are published for general information :-

REPAIRS.

- Repairs are distinguished as "Current" and "Special."
- Current Repairs include all the usual periodical Repairs required for the maintenance of Public Works.
- 3. Special Repairs are such as are rendered necessary in consequence of unforeseen casualties, such as Fires, Floods, Storms, Epidemics, or from the effects of time, beyond what is provided for by Current Repairs.
- 4. No Repairs of any kind, unless emergent vide Rute 16, are to be undertaken, unless provision has been made for them in a sanctioned Budget.
 - 5. Current Repairs are sub-divided into "Ordinary" and "Petty."
- 6. Petty Repairs consist of white-washing or colouring walls, oil painting, surface repairs of walls, floors, or roofs, adjustment of tiles, repair of ceilings and of fixtures and fastenings, and replacing panes of glass.
- 7. Petty Repairs of Civil Buildings shall be executed by the occupants, unless they and the Public Works Officers shall agree in any case that such repairs may be more conveniently and advantageously executed by the latter, who may in such case undertake them.
- 8. Petty Repairs of Military Buildings shall be executed by the Public Works Department; those occupied by Troops; on requisitions made by Barrack Masters; and Departmental Buildings, on requisitions by Heads of Departments.
- Requisitions, by whomsoever made, shall not be deemed sufficient authority for executing Petty Repairs chargeable to the Public Works Department, with the exception of those specified in Rule 10, unless the Officer of that Department applied to concurs as to their necessity, and has funds at his disposal for defraying their cost. If, from either cause, the requisition cannot be attended to, the Public Works Officer must explain in writing to the applicant for the repairs the cause of the delay, and at the same time report his having done so to the Superintending Engineer.
- 10. Petty Repairs authorised by Government to be performed periodically, such as white-washing Hospitals, &c., should always be promptly undertaken on receipt of requisitions; Officers of the Public Works Department taking care always to reserve sufficient funds for the purpose.
- Petty Repairs of fixtures and fastenings and cowdunging floors of Military buildings occupied by troops are Military not Public Works charges. They should be undertaken immediately requisitions by Barrack Masters, or at stations where there are no Barrack Masters, by Staff Officers, are received. Bills for the same, vouched by the requisition and completion certificate, when audited by the Auditor of Public Works Accounts, being paid for in cash by Military Paymasters.
- 12. Current repairs of Public Works other than Petty repairs will be executed by Officers of the Public Works Department, or, in the case of Civil district Buildings, either by the Public Works Department or by Civil Officers as may be determined by those Officers and Superintending Engineers, on estimates framed by the Officers entrusted with the duty of carrying out the repair and sanctioned by the Superintending Engineer.
- 13. Occupants of Public Buildings are expected to bring the necessity for repairs to notice; but Executive Engineers are required to ensure that each of the Public Works in his District be inspected as opportunity may occur at intervals, never in any case exceeding fourteen months, by a competent person of the Public Works Department, lest any substantial repairs necessary to the security of the Building be overlooked. The date and result of such inspection should be reported to the Executive Engineer, and noted by him briefly in a book kept for that purpose. This book will be subject to the inspection of the Superintending Engineer.
- 14. Current Repairs of irrigational works, of embankments, and of Government salt works are always to be treated as emergent, and executed as soon as known to be necessary by the Public Works

Department if possible, otherwise by the Revenue Department, under advice from the Public Works Department, if obtainable. This rule is not intended to prevent proper provision being made in current Repair Estimates for current repairs to the works referred to, but to ensure the immediate execution of any repairs that may be necessary whether provided for in a Budget or not.

15. The necessity of repairs to Irrigational works should be reported by the servant in charge, if any, otherwise by the village authorities, to the nearest Public Works Department Officer, and to the Mamlutdar and Sir-Carcoon of the district, each of whom will report immediately to his superior, so that

the earliest arrangements may be made for the execution of the repairs.

16. An Executive Engineer on receiving a requisition from a Divisional or Station Commanding Officer or Head of a Department, Civil or Military, or other person holding analogous authority, for the immediate execution of any repair on the specific ground of emergency, the nature of which should be explained in the requisition, is authorised to commence the work at once, provided the estimated cost does not exceed Rupees 50, or, if in excess of that sum, provided that he concur in deeming the work so urgent that the delay of a reference to higher authority would be decidedly detrimental to the interests of Government; and provided also that he makes an immediate report of the case, accompanied by a copy of the requisition and a rough estimate of the probable cost, to the Chief Engineer and Secretary to Government.

17. The above rule is to be held applicable likewise to any new work, addition, or alteration, deemed emergent.

18. If the cost of the emergent repair can be met by the "Special Repair" Fund, it may be sanctioned by the Chief Engineer, but if it be necessary to debit the Reserve Fund with the amount, the case must be laid before Government.

- 19. The administration of the amount sanctioned for Current Repairs is vested in Superintending Engineers, who will first allot to each Officer entrusted with the execution of Petty Repairs in their circles the sum they may deem necessary to cover the necessary expenditure on that account, and then distribute the balance, or such portion thereof as may appear to them to be necessary in sanctions for current repairs on Estimates framed by the Officers to whom the duty of carrying them out may be entrusted.
- 20. The administration of the amount sanctioned for Special Repairs is vested in the Chief Engineer; it will be available to meet expenditure on sanctioned extimates for work of the description specified in Rule 3, and on Emergent Repairs as provided in Rule 16.
 - 21. All portions of sanctions for Repairs unexpended at the close of any official year lapse. The following Notifications and Rules in Public Works Department are cancelled:—

3 .- Supply Bills will be granted on, and by the Bank of Bombay, under the authority of this De-

partment.

4 .- Specie Remittances to and from Bombay, will be similarly made under the same authority.

5,-The Bank of Bombay will recognise the Civil Paymaster's enfacements on Abstracts, Bills, &c., as orders for the payment of the amounts passed; and at the same time make such deductions as may be required therein, or, which may be otherwise requested, by a Credit to the proper heads of account.

6.-The duty in connection with the transfer receipts provided for in Rules VIII. and XV., in the Memorandum in continuation of Circular No. 3530 of the 20th April 1861, hitherto performed by the General Paymaster, has devolved on this Department.

7.—Railway, Educational, Police, Municipal, and other Deposits will be received and paid by the Bank of Bombay under the authority of this Department.

Fort William, the 12th March 1862.

Her Majesty's Steam Frigate Feroze arrived off the Dock Yard at half-past 3 o'clock P.M., having on Board the Right Honorable the Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, K.T., G.C.B., appointed by the Queen to be Her Majesty's Viceroy and Governor General of India. His Lordship was waited upon on Board of the Feroze by a Deputation of the Secretaries of the Government and Personal Staff of the Right Honorable the Governor General, and having landed immediately proceeded to the Government House. At a quarter before 6 P.M., the Right Honorable the Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, K.T., G.C.B., took the prescribed Oaths and his Seat as Viceroy and Governor General in His Excellency's Council.

The following Proclamation is published by Order of the Right Honorable the Governor General in Council:—

PROCLAMATION.

Whereas the Right Honorable the Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, and Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, a Member of the Queen's Most Honorable Privy Council, has been appointed by Her Majesty to be Her Viceroy and Governor General of India, and has

assumed the said Office, the said appointment is hereby notified; and it is proclaimed that the said Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, K.T., G.C.B., Viceroy and Governor General of India, has this day taken the usual Oaths and his Seat in His Excellency's Council.
