Notification.—The Governor General in Council is pleased to direct, under Section 33, Act X. of 1862, that copies of all documents furnished, under the orders of any Court or Magistrate, to any Government Advocate or Pleader, or other person especially empowered in that behalf for the purpose of conducting any trial or investigation on the part of Government before any Criminal Court, as well as copies of all documents which any such Advocate, Pleader, or other person is required to take in connection with any such trial or investigation for the use of any Court or Magistrate, shall be exempt from the Stamp Duty prescribed by Schedule B of the said Act X. of 1862.

Notice is hereby given that every person within the Town and Island of Bombay who, by the Act XXXII. of 1860, for imposing Duties on Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, is liable to the said Duties, and to return his or her Profits or Income, is hereby required to fill in a Return of his or her Profits and Income in the prescribed Form, and to transmit such Return duly signed with the Declaration prescribed by the Act, to the Assessors of the Town and Island of Bombay aforesaid, at their respective Offices, within fifteen days from the date of the delivery of the Special Notice, under the penalties contained in the said Act.

Persons requiring Forms of Returns can procure them at the Office of the Assessors. Forms of such Returns will also be left at the usual place of Residence or Business of every person known or considered to be liable to the duties imposed by the said Act. But any person liable to the Duties who may not receive such Forms must apply for the same at the Office of any of the Assessors.

## MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

No. 48 of 1864.—Surgeon Major M. Style is appointed to officiate as Superintendent Medical Department and Surgeon European General Hospital at Aden, vice Davidson.

No. 49 of 1864.—The provisions of Horse Guards Circular dated 18th June 1861, No. 142, do not apply to Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Artillery, but only to the cases of Non-Commissioned Officers of Her Majesty's British Infantry.

The following Extract of a letter from the Horse Guards, dated 24th June 1858, relative to filling up vacancies that may be caused in Batteries of Royal Artillery by Non-Commissioned Officers embarking for England, is published for information and guidance:—

“When Non-Commissioned Officers (not belonging to Indian Companies) embark from England, they are immediately struck off the Home Establishment and their places filled up, and on their arrival in India they are to be absorbed in the first vacancies that may arise. In like manner, when any are invalided or sent Home from any cause, they are to be struck off your strength, and their places filled up, and on their arrival in England they will be absorbed in the Home Establishment of the Battalion or Corps to which they belong.

“In this manner both the Home and Indian Establishments can be kept to their full strength of Non-Commissioned Officers, and those on passage to or from India will be supernumerary until absorbed.”

2. When a Battery Troop or Company is divided, the Establishment must be proportionally divided, so as on the whole not to exceed the authorised numbers.

3. If Puckaulies be not procurable, Hand Bheesties may be entertained in the proportion of two for each Puckaulie.

4. Special charges are sanctioned for the supply of water to Plunge Baths, where these exist. The charges should be entered under the head of 'Plunge Baths' in the Bills for Regimental conservancy preferred by the Regimental Paymasters, or those performing their functions, on Divisional Paymasters, subject to the audit of the Pay Examiners.

5. The Establishments above ordered should not be exceeded on account of a temporary increase of strength without a special application explaining the necessity for increase.

6. In order to provide wholesome water for drinking and cooking, Filters, consisting of Gharras partially filled with sand and charcoal, may be supplied to the extent of four for each European Battery, Troop, or Company in Barracks, and for Hospitals and family quarters in proportion. Stands for the Filters may be supplied at a cost not exceeding four rupees and eight annas each.

7. The following fixed Conservancy Establishment is allowed to European Troops in all situations, camp or quarters. The Establishment will be employed in cleaning the barracks, out-offices, and vicinity of the men's quarters. It is also intended to meet the purposes set forth in G. O. C. Her Majesty's British Troops, dated Poona, 3rd January 1863, paragraph 12, page 5. The provisions for detachments include Depôts of Recruits, Volunteers, Invalids, and European Soldiers in general, and their families when not present with the Head Quarters of their Batteries, Troops, or Companies. "No. 55 of 1864.—Doubts having arisen as to the correct interpretation of some of the rules laid down in the General Orders noted in the margin, regarding the grant of leave of absence to Officers of the new Royal Artillery and new Line Regiments of Cavalry and Infantry, a further reference was made to Her Majesty's Government, and the following extracts from the reply of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India, conveyed in his Despatch No. 402 of the 24th November 1860, are published for information:—

QUESTIONS.

1. Whether, under the rules as they now stand, the Officers of the Artillery and new Line Regiments are absolutely subject to the new Furlough Regulations alone, or to the Regulations they originally elected before the amalgamation?

2. Whether the Officers of the new Regiments are entitled, as in the British Service, to avail themselves of leave at all times without restriction, on the understanding that the time passed on leave, beyond the amount sanctioned by the Furlough Regulations, will not count as service for pension?

3. Whether such of the Officers in question as entered the service prior to February 1854, have still the option of claiming the advantages of the old or new Furlough Rules at pleasure, as if they had continued in the local service?

ANSWERS.

To the new Furlough Regulations alone, as respects leave of absence, in the same sense as Officers of British Regiments serving in India have been hitherto under these Regulations.

Yes; subject to the exigencies of the service and the requirements of the rules regarding the number of Officers present with Regiments and Batteries.

No; except in regard to reckoning their service for pension.

No. 59 of 1864.—The following General Order by the Government of India, dated 25th January 1864, No. 62, is republished.

"No. 62 of 1864.—The following Military letter from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India is published for general information:—

*From H. M.'s Secretary of State for India, to the Right Honorable the Governor General of India in Council, No. 352, dated 8th October 1863.*

MY LORD,—I have received and considered in Council your letter No. 210, dated 8th July 1863, requesting a reconsideration of the decision communicated to you in my Despatch No. 82 of 25th February last, regarding the case of Officers of the Staff Corps who hold appointments the consolidated pay of which is less than the pay of their rank in the Staff Corps, and soliciting that pending a decision on the general question of Staff salaries, the recommendation of the Committee of Secretaries, viz., that any excess of the Staff Corps pay above the consolidated salary should be treated as an item of Military expenditure, may be allowed to remain in force as it has been hitherto acted upon.

2. The decision of Her Majesty's Government on the subject of the Staff salaries to be attached to offices held by Military Officers in India, was communicated to you in my Despatch No. 311 of the 31st August 1863.

3. You will have learnt from that Despatch that the principles proposed by the Committee of Secretaries in the determination of this question have been generally concurred in, that in the case of Military Officers in Staff employ, a certain salary has been fixed for every appointment, to be drawn in addition to the Staff Corps pay of their rank, and that, in a few cases only, and those appointments of the highest class, the salaries of Officers so situated are to be consolidated. The salaries of Military Officers holding appointments connected with the Civil administration of the country, will be consolidated and fixed without reference to the rank of the incumbent.

4. Under this system it can very rarely happen that the salary attached to any office will be less than the Staff Corps pay of an Officer.

5. You have observed, in your letter in the Financial Department, No. 134 of the 14th October 1862, that you consider it objectionable in principle that Officers should receive different rates of pay for doing precisely the same duties, and the Committee of Secretaries, in recommending that the salaries of all Civil appointments should be consolidated and fixed without reference to the rank of the incumbent, observe that "the principle needs no comment; it is simply to the effect that, where a Military man is appointed to a Civil Office, he should draw the same salary as if he were a Civilian." "This is the established principle with regard to such appointments, and it would be invidious now to introduce a distinction."

6. I concur in this view of the subject.

7. I consider it of importance that the salary drawn by an Officer employed in the Civil administration of the country, should be the same, whether such Officer belong to the Civil or to the Military Service.

8. I regret, therefore, that I cannot sanction the adoption of the rule recommended by you, that any excess of the Staff Corps pay, above the consolidated salary, should be treated in such cases as an item of Military expenditure.

9. With regard to the objection raised in the 5th paragraph of your letter under reply, I have only to observe that, as remarked in a subsequent paragraph of that letter, it must be of very rare occurrence that Officers of 20 and 26 years' service, holding the rank of Major or Lieutenant Colonel, should be employed in situations the salaries of which are not far in excess of the Staff Corps pay of those grades, and that, in such exceptional cases, it would of course be optional with such Officers either to retain the appointment in question, or to remain unemployed until otherwise disposed of.

*From H. M.'s Secretary of State for India, to the Right Honourable the Governor General of India in Council, No. 328, dated 24th September 1863.*

My Lord,—In accordance with the suggestion contained in your Lordship's letter dated 11th July, No. 45A, I sanction the promotions of Officers of the Cavalry and Infantry, succeeding to vacancies caused by retirement, being made from the date of the retirement, and the promotions of those succeeding to death vacancies being made from the day following the casualty, in the same manner as the promotions of the Officers of the late Indian Artillery and Engineers have been recently arranged.

2. It is to be distinctly understood that no additional expense is to be occasioned by this arrangement.

No. 61 of 1864.—The following General Order by the Government of India dated 26th January 1864, No. 68 is republished:—

"No. 68 of 1864.—With reference to Government General Order No. 456 of the 22nd April 1862, the following letter received in the Financial Department, is published for information and guidance:—

*From the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for India to His Excellency the Right Honourable the Governor General of India in Council,—(No 185, dated India Office, London, the 24th October 1863).*

I transmit a copy of a letter from the Under Secretary of State for War, dated the 8th instant, proposing that when a regiment proceeds to or from India in two or more divisions, the Pay Master and his Clerk should remain in this country or in India for a short time after the embarkation of the Corps, and then proceed by the Overland route, so as to arrive in India or England before the first division of the Regiment.

2. I have consented to this proposal being carried into effect, subject to revision, should you see any objection to the arrangement.

*From Major General Sir E. Lugard, K.C.B., Under Secretary of State War Office, to the Under Secretary of State for India, India Office (dated the 8th October 1863).*

Applications having been made to this Department by Pay Masters of the Regiments under orders for India for permission to proceed separately to that country by the Overland route, I am directed by Earl de Grey and Ripon to acquaint you that he is of opinion that when a Regiment proceeds to or from India in two or more divisions, it would be more advantageous to the public Service that the Pay Master and his Clerk should remain in this country or in India for a short time (say a month) after the embarkation of the Corps, to adjust financial matters connected with his public accounts, and then proceed to India or England by the Overland route, so as to arrive before the first division of the Regiment, than that he should proceed by sea with one of the divisions, as is now the regulation.

On the Pay Master's arrival in the Presidency, he would place himself in communication with the Pay Department, provide himself with the local forms, Regulations, &c., requisite for his Office in that country, and make himself conversant with the nature of his Indian duties, which in the hurry of disembarkation and immediate despatch inland cannot, it is assumed, be so advantageously done under the present arrangements, even supposing he arrived with the first division; but as under ordinary circumstances he would embark with the last division, this could rarely be the case, and he would necessarily reach India or England after the Regiment had commenced cash transactions with the Pay Department.

As the principal object cannot be fully attained unless the true causes of death be recorded, persons at out-stations are requested, in each case of death occurring in their circle, to obtain, in writing, from the Medical Attendant, the name of the fatal disease, that it may be delivered to the Policeman at the funeral place. Medical Practitioners, particularly, are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all *single* cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

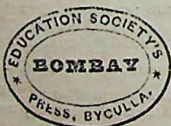
