Notification.

POLITICAL DEPARTMENT.

Bombay Castle, 7th September 1885.

No. 69P.—His Highness Mahárája Sayájiráo Gaekwár of Baroda will arrive in Poona on Wednesday the 9th instant at 5 P.M.

2. His Highness will be met at the Railway Station by the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Governor, the Under Secretary to Government, Political Department, and an Aide-de-Camp to His Excellency the Governor, who will accompany His Highness in His Excellency's carriage to His Highness' residence escorted by a party of Native Cavalry.

3. On arrival at the Mahárája's residence the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Governor, the Under Secretary, Political Department, and the Aide-de-Camp to His Excellency the Governor will lead His Highness in, and after a short conversation will take leave.

4. The Military Department will issue the necessary orders for the firing of a Salute of 21 guns, for the attendance of the Escort of Native Cavalry referred to in para. 2, and for the attendance of a European Guard of Honor at the Railway Station and of a Native Guard of Honor at His Highness' residence. The Superintendent of Police should arrange for the attendance at His Highness' residence of a party of Savárs, two of whom should accompany His Highness when out driving.

5. Undress uniform will be worn.

On the following day, two of His Excellency the Governor's Aides-de-Camp will enquire after the health of His Highness the Mahárája. They will be met, on alighting from the carriage at His Highness' residence, by one of the Mahárája's principal attendants, and inside by the Mahárája himself. After a few minutes conversation, Attár and Pán will be presented by His Highness to the Aides-de-Camp, who will then take leave with similar ceremonies to those observed on arrival.

Undress uniform will be worn.
