Bill No. 3 of 1888.

A Bill to vest the Port of Aden in a Trust.

WHEREAS it is expedient to vest the port of Aden in a trust and to provide for the management of the affairs of the said port by trustees; It is enacted as follows:—

I .- PRELIMINARY.

Short title.

1. This Act may be called "The Aden PortTrust Act, 1888."

- 2. In this Act, unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context,—
- (4) (a) "port" means the port of Aden as defined for the purposes of this Act;
- Act XV of (2) (b) "high-water mark" means a line drawn through the highest points reached by ordinary spring-tides at any season of the year;
- Do. do. (3) (c) "low-water mark" means a line "low-water mark"; drawn through the lowest points reached by ordinary spring-tides at any season of the year;
- Do. do. (4) (d) "land" includes the bed of the "land"; sea below highwater mark, and also things attached to the earth or permanently fastened to anything attached to the earth;
- Bom. Act vI (5) (e) "master," when used in relation to any vessel, means any person having for the time being the charge or control of such vessel;
- Do. do. (6) (f) the word "goods" includes wares and merchandise of every description;
- Do. do. (7) (g) "owner," when used in relation
 to goods, includes
 any consignor, consignee, shipper or agent for the sale or
 custody of such goods; and when used
 in relation to any vessel, includes any
 part-owner, charterer, consignee, or mortgagee in possession thereof.

3. (1) The Governor in Council may, by Act. XV of notification in the 1859, s. 3.

Power to define and alter limits of port.

Bombay Government Gazette, define the limits of the port for the purpose of this Act, and may from time to time by a like notification alter such limits.

(2) Such limits may extend to any part of the navigable approaches to the port, and may include any wharves, tramways, warehouses, sheds and other works made on behalf of the public for convenience of traffic, for safety of vessels, or for the improvement, maintenance, and good government of the port, whether within or without high-water mark, and, subject to any rights of property therein, any portion of the shore within fifty yards of high-water mark.

II.—OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

trustee, or of his becoming incapable of acting previous to the expiry of his term of office, the vacancy shall be filled up, as soon as it conveniently may be, by the appointment of a person thereto, who shall hold office so long only as the trustee in whose place he is appointed would have held it if the vacancy had not occurred.

(2) If a trustee other than an ex-officio trustee departs from Aden with an intention of being absent for a longer period than three months, or if a trustee shall have been absent from Aden for such period, a person shall be appointed to act for such trustee during his absence, or until he shall cease to be a trustee, and the person so acting shall be deemed for all the purposes of this Act to be a trustee.

12. A person who has already been a trustee on one or more occasions shall, if not disqualified under section 13, be again eligible at any time for appointment.

Disqualifications of Trustees.

Disqualifications for shall be qualified to be a trustee:

(a) who, under any law for the time being in force is an uncertificated bankrupt or an undischarged insolvent, or

(b) who, unless he is an ex-officio trustee, holds any office or place of profit under the board, or

(c) who, unless as aforesaid, has, di-trustee for his attendance at all or any rectly or indirectly, any share or interest meetings during that one month week.

(d) who has been sentenced by a criminal court to imprisonment or to whipping for an offence punishable with imprisonment for a term exceeding six months, or to transportation, such sentence not having been subsequently reversed or quashed, and whose disqualification on account of such sentence has not been removed by an order, which the Governor in Council is hereby empowered to make, if he shall think fit, in this behalf;

(e) becomes disqualified for any of the aforesaid reasons, or

(f) is absent from the meetings of the board for a period exceeding six consecutive months, or, without the permission of the board, from six consecutive meetings of the board,

shall cease to be a trustee, and his office shall thereupon become vacant:

- (2) Provided always that no trustee shall vacate his office by reason only of his—
- (g) having a share in any joint-stock company which shall contract with or be employed by, or on behalf of, the board, or
- (h) having a share or interest in any newspaper in which any advertisement relating to the affairs of the board may be inserted, or
- (i) being interested in any loan of money to the board.

Remuneration of Trustees.

 Board may delegate powers to committees consisting of such trustees as they think fit. Any committee so formed shall conform to any instructions that may from time to time be given to them by the board, and the board may at any time discontinue or alter the constitution of any committee so formed.
- (4) A committee may elect a chair-man of their meetings, and, if no such chairman is elected, or, if he is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The management of the affairs of the Port of Aden is at present in the hands of the Resident, who, under the orders of Government, administers the Aden Port Fund. But the increasing importance of the port having appeared to make it highly desirable to establish a port trust, in which the commercial community should be duly represented, Bill No. 5 of 1886 was introduced for this purpose, and after full consideration by the Council was read a third time and passed on the 16th July, 1887. His Excellency the Viceroy and Governor-General having, however, withheld his assent to that Bill for the reasons which are stated in the Government of India's letter No. 860 of 23rd May, 1888, the present new Bill is introduced for the purpose of supplying the defects in the former measure which are specified in that letter.

- The alterations made and the new matter introduced into the present Bill are indicated in it by the use, respectively, of erased type and italics. The changes are principally in sections 6, 14, 20, 33, 40 and 41 and in the entire omission of section 42 of the previous Bill.
- Omitting mention of the amendments of minor importance, the object of the additional provise to section 20 is to require the board to defray from the port fund such share of the pensions and leave allowances of Government officers and servants employed in connection with the harbour previous to the constitution of the board as was earned during the time those officers and servants were so employed.
- 4. As Aden is essentially a fortress and naval depôt and Government has itself provided places and plant for landing and shipping of military and naval munitions and stores, it is reasonable that the Bill should admit of the landing and shipping of such munitions and stores at any place within the port, without payment to the board. This is provided for in the amended sections 33 and 40.
- The Government of India considers that the power to remit tolls, rates and charges in special cases should vest in Government rather than in the board, with the consent of Government and this is provided for in the amended section 41.
- 6. The reason for omitting section 42 of the former Bill is that it conflicted with section 143 of the Army Act, 1881 (44 and 45 Vic., c. 58), which exempts all officers and soldiers of Her Majesty's regular forces on duty from tolls on embarking or disembarking from or upon any pier, &c., in India or any colony.
