No. 436.—The following report of the Committee on the awards of the Mayo Prizes for 1884 is published for general information:—

REPORT ON THE MAYO PRIZES FOR ART-WORK-MANSHIP AWARDED IN 1884.

Silversmith's Work.

A prize of Rs. 180 and a silver medal for the best specimen of silversmith's work.

Two specimens in repoussé work were sent by Oomersi Mawji and eleven specimens by Hirji Devsi, both these sets being of Kutch work.

Eleven ornaments also were sent by Prabha son of Subha, from Hushiarpore in the Panjáb.

The prize was awarded to Oomersi Mawji for his *lota* in silver repoussé work, the form and design being very good, while the animals and

birds were executed in a style far above the average Indian work.

The silver plate submitted by Hirji Devsi was considered worthy of commendation.

Enamelling.

A prize of Rs. 180 and a silver medal for the best specimens of enamelling.

Three insignificant specimens were received from Prabha son of Subha, which the Committee decided were not worthy of the prize.

The Committee regret that one of the oldest and most important art industries of India should have been so unworthily represented, especially as the terms of the competition were so widely circulated.

No. 1781.—The Governor in Council is pleased to make the following amendments in the rules for the general administration of local fund business published provisionally in Notification No. 9248 at pages 1043 to 1093 of the *Bombay Government Gazette* of 27th November 1884, Part I., and confirmed by Notification No. 78, published at page 17 of the *Bombay Government Gazette* for 8th January 1885, Part I. (viz.) :—

(1). In Rule 42, cl. (4), for the words “and signed” substitute the words “signed by the officer or servant who has taken the measurements of the work and countersigned ;”

PART I.

Notification.

GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

Bombay Castle, 9th March 1885.

No. 877.—In exercise of the power conferred by Act I. of 1870, the following Rules for Quarantine against Cholera have been made by the Government of Bombay, with the previous sanction of the Governor General in Council: they will take effect from the 4th instant in the Port of Aden as a temporary measure:—

- I.—The Commander of every vessel, including buggalows or other native craft, arriving from the Ports of Bombay and Madras shall, before entering the harbour, indicate by signal the port from which such vessel has come.
- II.—Such Commander shall not, except as hereinafter provided, allow any communication, either with the pilot boat, except orally, or with the shore, or with any other vessel or boat in the harbour.
- III.—Immediately on any such arrival being signalled, the Health Officer of the port shall go alongside the vessel, and, if communication with the shore is desired, shall direct the Commander to take the vessel to the quarantine anchorage, duly appointed and notified in that behalf by the Resident, there to remain for a period of seven days from the date of arrival in the harbour, or for the shorter period prescribed in Rule IV., and undergo disinfection, which should apply as well to crew, passengers, effects and susceptible goods. The Health Officer shall also direct the Commander to prohibit, during the period for which the vessel remains at the quarantine anchorage as aforesaid, all communication, except such as is hereinafter provided for, between such vessel and the shore, or other vessels and boats in the harbour. If communication with the shore is not desired the vessel shall anchor at such place as may be pointed out by the Port authorities, having regard to the season of the year, and no communication shall be allowed with the pilot boat, otherwise than orally, or with the shore.

IV.—If the Health Officer of the Port has sufficient evidence that no cases of a suspicious nature have taken place on board during the voyage, and if the vessel is besides in good hygienic condition, the duration of the quarantine will be diminished according to the following scale :—

After eight days of voyage	six days of quarantine.
Do. nine do.	five do.
Do. ten do.	four do.
Do. eleven do.	three do.
Do. twelve do.	two do.
Do. thirteen do.	and upwards	...	twenty-four hours of quarantine.

V.—If during the period a vessel is at the quarantine anchorage aforesaid, any case or cases of cholera should occur on board, the said vessel shall remain in quarantine for a period of seven days from the date of the last case occurring, and be subject to all the prohibitions provided for in Rule III.

VI.—When any vessel has been placed in quarantine as aforesaid, the Health Officer may direct the removal of so many of the passengers and crew as may not be suffering from illness, and whose services may not be required on board the vessel, to such particular spots as may from time to time be selected by the Resident as places of quarantine, there to remain for a period of seven days. If a case of cholera occurs among such passengers and crew during any such period, they shall remain in a place of quarantine for a period of fifteen days from the date of the occurrence of the last case of such illness.

VII.—Any mails or cargo which may be brought by any vessel so arriving shall be landed under such precautions as the Health Officer may deem necessary to prevent the spread of the disease.

VIII.—It will be the duty of the Port Officer to facilitate the conveyance to all vessels in quarantine of such supplies of provisions, stores and other articles as may be required by those on board. Such supplies will be placed on the boats of the vessels in quarantine to be subsequently removed by members of their crews.

IX.—All vessels arriving at Aden which may have communicated with vessels coming from the Ports of Bombay and Madras shall be subjected to the same quarantine as vessels arriving at Aden from the Ports of Bombay and Madras.

X.—All vessels which have undergone quarantine in the manner above prescribed should have the fact clearly stated on their Bills of Health.
