Persons who have any objection to urge to the draft rules are required to forward their objections in writing to the Secretary to Government, General Department, before the noon of 2nd May 1885:—

Under the provisions of Sections 11 and 12 (a) and (b) of the Bombay District Municipal Act Amendment Act, 1884, the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the Municipal Commission of Surat in the district of Surat shall consist of twenty-four members exclusive of the President, and shall be constituted partly by election and partly by nomination by the Commissioner, Northern Division.

The number of elected members of the commission shall be twelve and of those nominated by the Commissioner, Northern Division, shall be twelve, out of whom six may be salaried

servants of Government and six non-official private gentlemen.

The Governor in Council is also pleased to direct that "the District Municipal Election Rules" published under Section 12 (c) of Bombay Act II. of 1884, under Government Notification No. 115, dated 14th January 1885, with the addition made to them by Government Notification No. 561, dated 17th February 1885, shall apply to the said Municipal District of Surat, and in addition thereto to issue the following orders under Rules 2 and 5 (h) :—

For electoral purposes the said Municipality of Surat shall divide the municipal district subject to its authority into twelve wards and determine that one of the elective commissioners shall be elected in each ward. The boundaries of the several wards shall be as specified in Appendix A.

The minimum amount of direct municipal taxes, the payment of which shall entitle a person to have his name entered in the list of voters of the Municipal District of Surat, shall be Rs. 4 per annum.

"A large red conical buoy equal in size to the Mormugao Rock buoy has been placed 100 feet beyond the future end of the Breakwater or 1,900 feet from the root.

"Vessels should pass to the south of Mormugao Rock buoy and to the north of the Breakwater buoy.

"The Rubble Mound is now 1,200 feet from the root of the Breakwater, and the Breakwater itself is 450 feet from the root work."

2. Hitherto a fixed rate of 15 per cent. on the total outlay has been charged against Local Funds by the Public Works Department, in respect of any work executed by it at the cost of those funds, and it will probably be found most convenient both to the Local Boards and to the Public Works Department, that the cost of Establishment should, whenever possible, continue to be paid by a percentage rate.

3. The rate of 15 per cent., hitherto in force, included (1) the costs of audit, for which now, under Sections 46 and 60 of the above Act, a distinct charge, at the rate of 2 per cent., will be made, in accordance with Government Resolution No. 153 A.—175, dated 26th March 1885, and (2) some charge, calculated at about 1.75 per cent., for the services of the Executive Engineer, which now, in accordance with the proviso to Section 61 of the Act, are not to be charged for.

4. The deduction which ought, therefore, to be made from the 15 per cent. rate is 3.75; but the Governor in Council, being desirous of dealing liberally with Local Boards, and with a view to encourage agreements for percentage payments, is pleased to authorize Executive Engineers to accept payment for Government establishments employed by them in the execution of works for Local Boards, at the rate of 10 per cent. on the total outlay on the works for which they are employed. If any Local Board is, in any case, not willing to agree to these terms, the Executive Engineer should, before coming to any agreement based upon the actual cost of the Government establishment to be employed, report the circumstances through the usual channel of communication, for the orders of Government."
