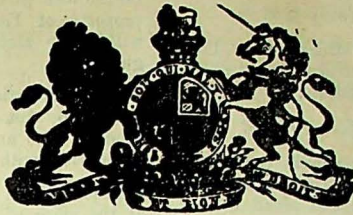

EMIGRATION.

Calcutta, the 17th January 1896.

No. 93—2-10.—Whereas a number of natives of India have been engaged and intend shortly to depart by sea out of British India under agreements made with or on behalf of Her Majesty's Government to labour for hire in East Africa on or in connection with the railway from Mombassa to

or towards Lake Victoria, Nyanza, now in course of construction, and it is considered desirable to exempt such labourers from the provisions of the Indian Emigration Act (XXI of 1883), the Governor General in Council is pleased, in exercise of the power conferred by section 106 of the said Act as amended by Act I of 1896, to declare that none of the provisions of the said Act shall apply to the said labourers or any of them.

No. 178-I.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 4 and 5 of the Foreign Jurisdiction and Extradition Act (XXI of 1879) and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor General in Council is pleased to apply to the Cantonment of Bhuj the provisions, so far as they may be applicable, of the following enactments:
