PART I.

Notification.

Under instructions from the Military Secretary to the Viceroy, it is hereby notified that His Excellency the Viceroy and Governor General will hold a Leveé at the Council Hall, Poona, on Monday the 11th November 1895, at 5 P.M.

All Civil, Naval and Military Officers, also officers of the Consular Service and Native Officers of the Native Regiments and other Gentlemen at Poona are invited to attend.

Gentlemen entitled to the Private Entree are requested to bring Cards with their names legibly written upon them, to give to the Military Secretary to the Viceroy before being presented.

All Officers and Gentlemen attending the Leveé are requested to bring with them two Cards with their names legibly written upon them: one Card will be delivered to the Aide-de-Camp at the Entrance, and the second to the Military Secretary to the Viceroy at the time of presentation.

Gentlemen wishing to attend the Leveé, who have not already been presented, are requested to notify the same to the Military Secretary to His Excellency the Governor of Bombay at least four days before the date of the Leveé, after which time such notifications cannot be entertained.

Officers and Gentlemen wearing Uniform should appear in Full Dress: Gentlemen not wearing Uniform should appear in Evening Dress.

Clergymen being University Graduates, and other Gentlemen entitled to wear Robes or Gowns on account of Judicial or Academical office or status, should appear in such Robes or Gowns.

Officers of Regiments and Batteries are requested to pass by collectively, the Native Officers to be presented by their Commanding Officers.

The carriages of Gentlemen who have the Private Entree will set down at the Main Entrance. All other carriages will set down at the East Door.
