

BAY OF BENGAL.

TEMPORARY LIGHT NEAR THE GREAT BASSES.

Trinity House, London, 29th October 1869.

Notice is hereby given, that on or about the 15th March next, and thereafter during the time of building the Light House on the "Great Basses" Rocks, off the S.E. Coast of Ceylon, a Light Vessel will be placed in 12 Fathoms Water about One Mile N.N.E. of the Rocks;—and in order to distinguish her from the Light Vessel at the "Little Basses," which exhibits a White Flash every 1½ Minute, and which is 20 miles distant, the Light shown will be *Red*, revolving at intervals of 45 Seconds.

By day she will be distinguished by carrying two Balls Vertically at the Main Mast Head.

Notice.

On and after the 3rd January 1870 a competent Surveyor will be deputed to Toongar to demark such sites as have been already marked off on the Survey Map of the Hill.

A fee of Rs. 10 will be payable by all allottees of sites on account of demarcation, and defining of the

areas of their respective sites; which it is requested they will, on demand by this Office, pay as early as possible.

On the fee for demarcation being paid leases will forthwith be granted to occupants of sites; rent being chargeable from the current year.

The above fee will not include expense of putting a stone wall round sites, which will have to be done by occupants themselves.

Those to whom sites have been allotted should if possible visit the Hill, and ascertain from the Surveyor the area and limits of their respective occupancies.

Maps of the Hill can be obtained of the Surveyor at 12 Annas each.
