Preamble

Extracts From the original Preamble to the constitution of the Society written by the illustrious founder, the late Gopal Krishna Gokhale, in 1905.

For some time past the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation -building in India when, for further progress the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required.

The Servants of India Society has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country a higher type of Character and Capacity than is generally available at present, and the advance can only be slow.

The Servants of India Society will train men, prepared to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian people. Its members will direct their, efforts, principally towards (1) creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seeking its highest fulfillment in service and sacrifice; (2) organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the public life of the country; (3) promoting relations of cordial goodwill and co-operation among the different communities; (4) assisting educational movements especially those for the education of women, the education of backward classes and scientific industrial education ; (5) helping forwards the industrial development of the country; (6) the elevation of the depressed classes.

Report for the year 1996-97

Introduction :

The Servants of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905. With the object of training of national missionaries for the service of India and the promotion, by all constitutional means, of the interests of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields.

Organisation:

The Headquarters of the Society is at Poona, where the members meet every year in June for its annual session. The society has active branches in Bombay, Nagpur, Allahabad, and Cuttack.

Dr. R. G. Kakade and Shri P.K. Dwivedi were elected President and Vice-President of the Society respectively, Shri S.S. Aijaonkar continued to be Secretary of the Society. Shri Aijaonkar Dr. Kakade Shri P.K. Dwivedi and Shri Damodar Sahoo continued to be Senior Members of Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad and Cuttack branches of the Society respectively. The Madras Branch was looked after by the Headquarters. Shri Atmanad Misra, Shri Ramakanta Lenka and Shri Milind Deshmukh were elected Members of the Council.

The society held each annual session and council meeting from 6th June 1996. All members attended.

The Society observed the birth anniversary of Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale on May 9, 1996.

Administration and Finances :-

1- The Council agreed to finalised to terms and condition of services of the employees at Headquarters and Mumbai. During the council sanction 97-98 at branches have been informed to forward the proposal by Dec. 1997, keeping in view latest traders in wages and salary as well as pay commission report as applicable to employees of projects with aid from State and Central Government and keeping and mind Bank rate on investment available in bank interest.

2- Investment :- The Society will keep in mind investment available at high rates of interest and available for trust fund.

2) Shri P.K. Dwivedi : Vice President

Shri P.K. Dwivedi senior member of the U. P Branch carried on various programme for the depressed class of the Society and maintained various continuing welfare schemes in for and wide rural areas as well as urban areas.

Education Development :

Shri P.K. Dwivedi continued to be the life member of Adarsh Kanya Junior High School Bazpur. He also continued to be the member and manager of Serv India Shiksha Samiti. As a Manager he received Rs. 90,000/- (Ninety thousand) only as grant-in-aid for building construction of Junior High School Mazravidhi.

During the year Shri Dwivedi maintained 16 Primary schools specially for tribal boys and girls, however the boys and girls of other down-trodden classes took advantage of these schools.

Women's & Child Welfare :

Under this programme shri Dwivedi conducted Creches in poor Bengalis and Buxa villages, where 175 enrolled poor kids of Bengalis and Buxa as well as their ailing monther were provided with nutritional food. to safe gaurd poor kids life. Shri Dwivedi directed his all Creche workers to participate National Drive for Pulse-Polio oral drop, held on 7th Dec., 96 and 18th Jan., 97.

Shri DWivedi launched a scheme of one year programme in computer for poor amd needy girls and women. The facility is being provided by Gokhale Institute of Modern Technology at Allahabad. The Institute was started in the memory of Late lamented Shri G.K. Gokhale the founder member of the Servants of India Society.

The entire welfare work has been devided into three regions:-

- 1) Vindhya Region - Under direct control of Shri A.N. Misra,
- 2) Tarai Region - Under direct control of Shri P.K. Dwivedi,
- 3) Plain Region - With the help of Shri A.N. Tripathi

3) Shri S. S. Ajagoankar :Secretary , Servants of India Society

Shri S.S. Ajagoankar looked after the Headquarters, with two visits every month, Bombay Branch and Supervised Madras Branch from the H.Q.

1) Social Service :- He was Vice President of the Social service League. Premiere Social service Organisation in the Country (Founded in 1911). The league was Started with ideals of reforms in social customs & practices. The Social Service League turned its attention to several fields of social services. including relief work for famine stricken people and rehabilitation of criminal tribes, spread of literacy (Audit Education) establishment of libraries, providing medical relief, starting labour welfare activity in relation to textile workers. promotion of co-operative credit Societies, dealing with juvenile problems, providing entertainment programmes like workers Dramas , Gymnasiums, Yoga Classes etc. Shri S.S. Ajagoankar, as the Vice-president, was actively associated with numerous Committees constituted to manage these activities.

2) Hony. Secretary of the Bombay Social Reform Association, (a non political, non party Organisation founded by the late Justice Narayan G. Chandawarkar and other fellow workers of Justice M. L. Ranade Guru of Gokhale).

3) A Member of the Florence Nightingale Village Sanitation Fund Committee of Social Service League, Bombay.

4) Member Education Committee of the Social Service League, Which arranged Bombay Excursions, trips, picnics, etc.

5) Member of the league's Supervisory committee for six industrial schools for women.

6) Member advisory committee N.M. Joshi Social Workers training classes.

7) Member Supervising Committee of the Social Service League of Mafatlal Gagalbhai Textile Institute.

8) presided over the meeting of the senior citizens of North Bombay and spoke on Nutrition and Ageing.

9) Shri S.S. Algaonkar is member of all the committees constituted by the league for supervising the following activities :

j) Florence Nightingale Village : Village sanitation Committee (Founded in 1916) with donation given by the sister of Florence Nightingale and Sir William Wedderburn to perpetuate memory of Florence Nightingale in India.

10) Medical relief member Supervising Committee of Bai Bachubai Kanji Charitable Allopathic Dispensary and Ayurvedic dispensary of the league.

11) The Association which stands for elimination of such disruptive forces as casteism, communalism and had spearheaded movements like Common Civil Code, National Intergration brought out Social Reform Annual, (much sought out by research scholars from the Country and abroad). The Association has distinguished record for furtherance of Social Reform in the Country and has played valuable part in bringing many beneficial measures on the Statute Book.

12) He contributed an article : A tribute to S.R. Venkataraman in the birth centenary volume brought out by the S. R. Venkataraman Centenary Celebration Committee at CHENNAI on 14th March 1997. Shri S.R. Venkataraman was the President of the Servants of India Society from 1978 to 1985.

13) He was a member of the Board of Management of the Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics(deemed to be university).

14) He was member of the Association of Moral and Social Hygiene (Maharashtra Branch)

15) He participated in numerous seminars, delivered lectures on various subjects and adressed gathering in Bombay. He was actively associated with Cultural bodies and sports organisations which kept himself busy throughout the year.

4) Shri A. N. Misra : Secretary, Servants of India Society, Mirzapur

Shri Atma Nand Misra, had second fracture in his right patella ,under went treatment during first half in year under report. Inspite of certain physical inabilities. Shri Misra carried on the following schemes under his charge.

He organised Bharat Scouts and Guides District Rally on the 29th & 30th Oct.96 in the premises of Adivasi High School Siltham, with the help of District Administration Sonebhadra.

5) Shri Dinesh Misra, Member, Servants of India Society, Bazpur

Shri Dinesh Misra was looking after the day to day management of Tharu Janjati Boys Hostel Tulsipur and Pachperwa with his headquarters at Tupsipur. He continued to be the member of Adarsh Kanya Junior High School Bazpur.

Shri Misra also continued to be the member of Seva India Shiksha Samiti Bazpur.

Shri Misra also inspired women to attend Pulse & Polio camp for oral drops to be given to their children.

Shri Misra with the help of some leading seeds companies got sown hybride seeds of Paddy and Whear by some tribal farmers in Kheri district which gave them better yeilding than that of ealier.

6) Shri A.C. Tripathi : Member, Servants of India Society, Allahabad

Shri Triparhi looked after the day to day affairs of the U.P.Branch-Allahabad and the schemes run under the aegsis of the Servants of Indai Society, under control and guidance of Shri P.K. Dwivedi, Vice-president of the Society.

He continued to be the member of women & child welfare committee, he was busy in developing the women and child welfare complex and its schemes

Work of Dr. Kunzru Nursery School, Dr.Kunzru Junior High School, Working Women Hostel, Gokhale Institute of Modern Technology, Ashram Type School , Harijan Typewriting & Short hand Institute-Sirsa (Allahabad), Tailoring Centre, Short Stay Home, Harijan Typewriting & Short hand Institute-Lucknow.

7) Shri Damodar Sahoo : Secretary, Servants of India Society,Cuttack

General : Shri Damodar Sahoo organised 130th Birth Anniversary of Gopal Krishna Gokhale, the founder of the Society on 9.5.96.

Choudwar Centre : As the secretary of the Choudwar Centre he was directly looking after the day -to-day management of (a) Leprosy Clinic (b) Servindia D.C. Home (c) Servindia L.N. Project (d) All vocational Units(e) S.S. Maternity Home and supervised the development work inside the campus of the Choudwar and welcome all the visitors visited the activities in different times. As the Founder Secretary of the Gokhale Ideal College at Shankarpur he has looked after the overall day-to-day affairs of the College and its development. He also managed the affairs of A.T.S. (For Tribal girls) at Berana.

Relief work

As the Founder member of 'Sarvodya Relief committee' he devoted his time for various relief work in the State specially in the drough affected areas of the State. He distributed relief to rhe affected Homeless families of Jaipur Dist. He organised a cataract eye-operation camp where 389 parients were checked up, given medicines and 52 parients were operated. He distributed clothes to the parients suffering from Leprosy at Choudwar.

Shri Sahoo gave a talk on 'Sishu hi Desara Amulya Sampada' broadcasted by All India Radio, Cuttack on 30.4.96. An interview with Shri Sahoo for 20 minutes also broadcasted by All India Radio, Cuttack on social welfare activities. He has also rendered his co-operation for smooth management of the activities managed by other members of the branch in the state.
