PREAMBLE

Extracts from the original preamble to the constitution of the Society written by the Illustrious Founder, the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale in 1905.

From some time past, the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation-building in India when, for further progress, the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required.

The Servants Of India Society has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country, a higher type of Character and Capacity than is generally available at present. The advance can only be slow.

The Servants Of India Society will train men, prepare to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian people. Its members will direct their efforts, principally towards -

- creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seeking its highest fulfilment in service and sacrifice;
- organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the public life of the country;
- promoting relations of cordial goodwill and co-operation among the different communities;
- assisting educational movements especially those for the education of women, the education of backward classes and scientific industrial education;
- helping forwards, the industrial development of the country; and
- the elevation of the depressed classes.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1999-2000

INTRODUCTION :

The Servants of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905. With the object of training of national missionaries for the Service of India and the promotion, by all constitutional means, of the interests of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields.

ORGANISATION :

The Headquarter of the Society is at Pune, where members meet every year in June for its annual session.

The Society held annual session and council meeting from 7th June 2000 to 13th June 2000. All members attended.

The Society observed the birth anniversary of late Gopal Krishna Gokhale on May 9, 2000.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE FOR 1999-2000 :

Investments :

On maturity of certain fixed deposits kept in banks, part of them were reinvested in those banks offering highest rate of interest in accordance with society's policy of making investments at high rates of interest. However, this year all nationalised as well as private sector bank reduced their F D Interest rates from 13% p.a. to 9% to 9.5% p.a. as per RBI guidelines. This has reduced HQ FD interest income considerably.

Routine Expenses :

Against the reduced income, annual expenses of the HQ at Pune, were increased substantially especially on repairs and maintenance of old buildings in the Campus area, increase of expenses in electricity bills, water charges bills and telephone bills was also experienced. Due to all round price inflation, members and staff honorarium were also required to be suitably increased.

Annual Report, 1999-2000

The Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics is one of the oldest research and training institute in Economics in the country. It was founded on the 6th June 1930.

Since May 1993, the Institute started functioning as "Deemed to be a University".

The Institute has completed 17 research projects during the year 1999-2000 and 37 research papers by the members were published in reputed journals. Sixty five students were studying in M.A. course while 21 students were working for their Ph.D. degree during 1999-2000. Twenty five successful students received their M.A. degrees at the hands of Professor Mihir K. Rakshit, Honorary Professor, Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta, Director, Project on Money and Finance in India, ICRA Ltd., who also delivered the Kale Memorial Lecture on "Post-Uruguay Round Trade Negotiations - A Developed Country Perspective". Two UGC sponsored refresher courses were also conducted during the year. Eighty-Seven teachers from various Universities and colleges attended the same.

Library :

The Institute shares the Library of the Servants Of India Society and has been mainly responsible for building it as one of the foremost specialised libraries in India with collection of 2,51,404 volumes and subscribes 468 journals. The process of computerisation of the library is in progress and so far a database consisting of 70,200 records has been created.
