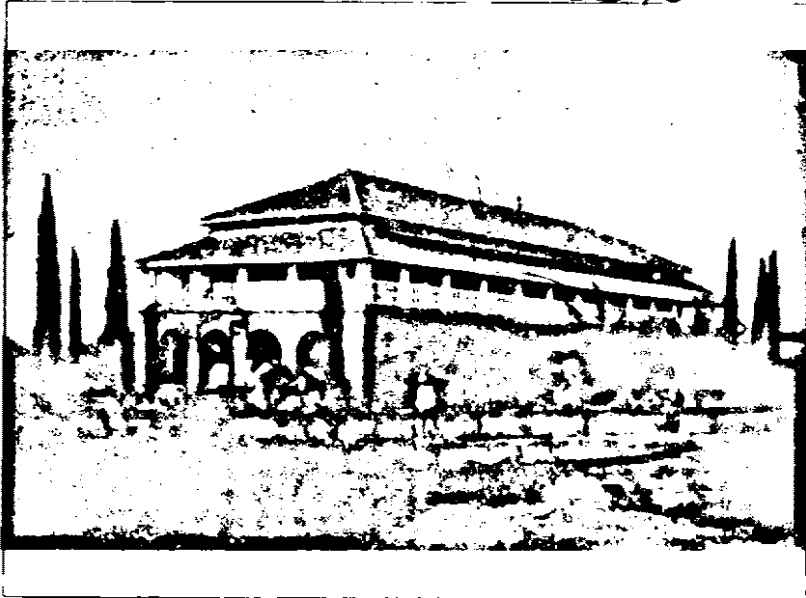

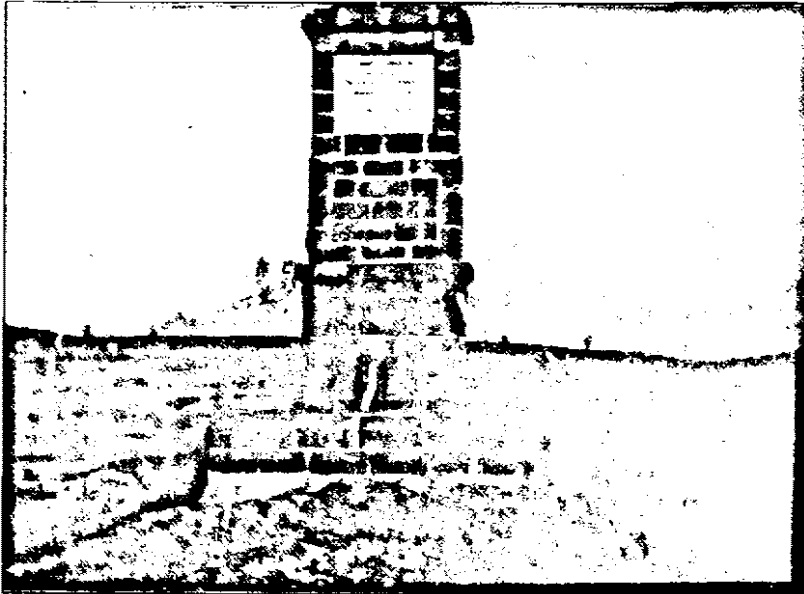

PREAMBLE

Extracts from the original preamble to the constitution of the Society written by the illustrious founder, the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale in 1905.

From some time past, the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation building in India when, for further progress, the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required.

The Servants Of India Society has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country, a higher type of character and capacity than is generally available at present. The advance can only be slow.

Every member at the time of admission shall take the following seven vows :

- ◆ The country shall always be the first in my thought and I will give to her service the best that is in me.
- ◆ In serving the country I will seek no personal advantage for myself.
- ◆ I will regard all Indians as brothers and work for the advancement of all without distinction of caste or creed.
- ◆ I will be content with such provision for myself and my family, as the Society may be able to make. I will devote no part of my energies to earning money for myself.
- ◆ I will lead a pure personal life.
- ◆ I will engage in no personal quarrel with any one.
- ◆ I will always keep in view the aims of the Society, and watch over its interest with the utmost zeal, doing all I can to advance its work. I will never do anything, which is inconsistent with the objects of the Society.

The Servants Of India Society will train men, prepare to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian people. Its members will direct their efforts, principally towards -

- ◆ creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seeking its highest fulfilment in service and sacrifice;
- ◆ organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the public life of the country;
- ◆ promoting relations of cordial goodwill and cooperation among the different communities;
- ◆ assisting educational movements especially those for the education of women, the education of backward classes and scientific industrial education;
- ◆ helping forwards, the industrial development of the country; and
- ◆ the elevation of the depressed classes.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2002-2003

INTRODUCTION

The Servants Of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905 with the object of training of national missionaries for the Service of India and the promotion by all constitutional means of the interests of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields.

ORGANISATION

The Headquarter of the Society is at Pune, where members meet every year in June for its annual session. The Society has branches in Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad, Cuttack, Rayagada, Chennai and Kerala.

Dr. R.G. Kakade continued to be the President of the Society. Shri P.K. Dwivedi continued to be the Vice-President and Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar continued to be the Secretary of the Society. Dr. R.G. Kakade, Shri Ajgaonkar, Shri P.K. Dwivedi and Shri Damodar Sahoo continued to be the Senior Members of Nagpur, Mumbai, Allahabad and Cuttack branches of the Society respectively. The Chennai branch was looked after by the head quarters. Shri Atmanand Misra, Shri Ramakanta Lenka and Shri M.M. Dhanore were elected members of the Council.

INCOME TAX

The Society furnished to all the banks necessary application in Form 15H, so that no tax is deducted at source by all banks.

TAX EXEMPTION

Application for renewal of Income Tax Exemption Certificate under Section 80 G of the I.T. Act, 1961 was made to the appropriate I.T. authority, Pune and renewal certificate was received for the three years from April 1, 2001 to March 31, 2004.

Application for renewal of Income Tax Exemption Certificate under Section 10(23)(c)(iv) was made to the appropriate I.T. Authority Pune, Kolkatta and New Delhi. Renewal Certificate is awaited for the assessment year 1999-2000 to 2001-2002.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE FOR 2002-2003

Investment

The sharp decline in fixed deposit interest rates is continued this year also. This has resulted into further decline in fixed deposit interest income of Head Quarter Pune. This trend compelled Head Quarter Pune to go for encashment of certain fixed deposits on their maturity to meet ever increasing demands of branches for Head Quarter grants to them. Now time has come to bring about substantial cut in Head Quarter grants to branches to save Head Quarter Pune from becoming bankrupt in the near future.

Central Government Grants

In the financial year 2002-2003, Rs.14,11,553/- are received as Central Government Grant for ongoing projects run at Rayagada Centre of Servants Of India Society, Orissa State Branch. However, much awaited and vigorously followed Central Government Grant for ongoing projects run at Bazpur Centre did not receive till the end of financial year ending on March 31, 2003.

General

On December 14, 2002, Shri M.M. Dhanore, Member of the Society since 1981 passed away at Pune due to serious illness. Shri M.M. Dhanore devoted himself to the upliftment of migrating contract labourers; organising shifting schools for their children, conducting relief work for victims of 'Latur' Earthquake. In his death, Servants Of India Society lost good social worker with rural background. The Society passed Condolence Resolution in its annual session held at Pune.
