PREAMBLE

Extracts from the original preamble to the constitution of the Society written by the illustrious founder, the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale in 1905.

From some time past, the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation building in India when, for further progress, the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required.

The Servants Of India Society has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country, a higher type of character and capacity than is generally available at present. The advance can only be slow.

Every member at the time of admission shall take the following seven vows:

- The country shall always be the first in my thought and I will give to her service the best that is in me.
- In serving the country I will seek no personal advantage for myself.
- I will regard all Indians as brothers and work for the advancement of all without distinction of caste or creed.
- I will be content with such provision for myself and my family, as the Society may be able to make. I will devote no part of my energies to earning money for myself.
- I will lead a pure personal life.
- i will engage in no personal quarrel with any one.
- I will always keep in view the aims of the Society, and watch over its interest with the utmost zeal, doing all I can to advance its work. I will never do anything, which is inconsistent with the objects of the Society.

The Servants Of India Society will train men, prepare to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian people. Its members will direct their efforts, principally towards -

- creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seeking its highest fulfilment in service and sacrifice:
- organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the public life of the country;
- promoting relations of cordial goodwill and cooperation among the different communities:
- assisting educational movements especially those for the education of women, the education of backward classes and scientific industrial education;
- * helping forwards, the industrial development of the country; and
- the elevation of the depressed classes.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2003-2004

INTRODUCTION

The Servants Of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905 with the object of training of national missionaries for the Service of India and the promotion by all constitutional means of the interests of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields.

ORGANISATION

The Headquarter of the Society is at Pune, where members meet every year in June for its annual session. The Society has branches in Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad, Cuttack, Rayagada, Chennai and Kerala.

Dr. R.G. Kakade continued to be the President of the Society. Shri P.K. Dwivedi continued to be the Vice-President and Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar continued to be the Secretary of the Society. Dr. R.G. Kakade, Shri Ajgaonkar, Shri P.K. Dwivedi and Shri Damodar Sahoo continued to be the Senior Members of Nagpur, Mumbai, Allahabad and Cuttack branches of the Society respectively. The Chennai branch was looked after by the head quarters. Shri Atmanand Misra, Shri Ramakanta Lenka and Shri M.B. Deshmukh were elected members of the Council.

INCOME TAX

The Society furnished to all the banks necessary application in Form 15H, so that no tax is deducted at source by all banks.

TAX EXEMPTION

Application for renewal of Income Tax Exemption Certificate under Section 80 G of the I.T. Act, 1961 was made to the appropriate I.T. authority, Pune and renewal certificate was received for the three years from April 1, 2001 to March 31, 2004.

Application for renewal for further 3 years was made long back and the renewal certificate from 1.4.2004 to 31.3.2007 is awaited.

Application for renewal of Income Tax Exemption Certificate under Section 10(23)(c)(iv) was made to the appropriate I.T. Authority Pune, Kolkatta and New Delhi. Renewal Certificate is awaited for the assessment year 1999-2000 to 2001-2002 and 2002-03 to 2004-05.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE FOR 2003-2004

Investment

The sharp decline in fixed deposit interest rates is continued this year also. This has resulted into further decline in fixed deposit interest income of Head Quarter Pune. This trend compelled Head Quarter Pune to go for encashment of certain fixed deposits on their maturity to meet ever increasing demands of branches for Head Quarter grants to them. Now time has come to bring about substantial cut in Head Quarter grants to branches to save Head Quarter Pune from becoming bankrupt in the near future.

Central Government Grants

In the financial year 2003-2004, Rs.41,24,738/- are received as Central Government Grant for ongoing projects run at Bazpura Centre of Servants Of India Society, Uttar Pradesh Branch.

Mumbai Branch

Negotiations with Bank of India, Mumbai Branch by Secretary, Shri. S.S. Ajgaonkar were successful. The Society got increased rental for the space occupied by Bank of India.

Shri P.K. Dwivedi devoted his time for smooth management of Primary Schools, Creches, Boys Hostels, A.T.S. for Girls Typewriting Schools, Jr. High Schools and Higher Secondary Schools totalling 30 in numbers.

Working Women Hostel

To solve the residential problems of the working women coming from other districts, the Society maintained a working women hostel at a 1, P.D. Tandon Road, Allahabad. There are 22 working ladies are taking advantage of the Hostel. During the year, the total income from the Hostel was Rs.1,44,273.00 and total expenditure on the maintenance was Rs.1,86,489.55 only.

Shri Tripathi continued to be a member of Adivasi Intermediate College, Silthan, Birala Vidya Mandir, Myorpur and Raja Baldeo Das Birala Samghati Vidyalaya, Salkhan in Sonnebhadra District managed by the Society.

★ Lagna Mandapan

No doubt Lagna Mandapam is a good source of income. During the year, the total income from the Mandapam was Rs.2,83,500.00 and total expenditure on the maintenance was Rs.27,225.00.

Regarding the resolutions passed by the Council in June 2003, U.P. Branch has issued a notice to vacate the premises of the Society. Shri K.M. Seth has

filed a case in the District Court, Allahabad. The branch received a unsigned circular letter from Mumbai written by our Secretary place before the branch meeting. A sub-committee was constituted in the chairmanship of Mr. Damodar Sahoo. After proper negotiation, it was decided to allow Jeewan Sathi Guest House to perform marriage ceremony upto December 2004 in anticipation of the approval of the Council which is going to be held in coming June. The related documents were already sent to Head Quarters.

SHRI DINESH MISRA Member

Shri Dinesh Misra, Member, Incharge of the Palia Centre devoted his time during the year for the educational advancement of the Tharu Community. He looked after the day-to-day management of Balika Ashram Type School, Palia and Tharu Boys Hostel, Palia Kalan in Lakhimpur, Kheri District

The Society maintains a Tharu Boys Hostel at Palia Kalan with the help of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi. There were 42 students taking the advantage of the Hostel during the year. Hostel provides free fooding, lodging, clothing, reading and writing material to the students. A part-time doctor is also appointed to look after their medical care.

Shri Dinesh Misra continued to be a member of Narendra Memorial Shiksha Sansthan, Bazpur, through which a Nursery and Primary School named Modern Public School is being run. Shri Misra is also a member of Serv India Shiksha Samiti, Bazpur.

Shri Misra also continued to be a member of Managing Committee of Shri Nehru Gram Madhyamik Vidyalaya, Sarai Banshi in Allahabad and attended its meeting held during the year.

SHRI DAMODAR SAHOO Senior Member - Cuttack Branch, Orissa.

Shri Damodar Sahoo as the Senior Member of the Orissa Branch of the Society managed all the affairs of the Branch during the year 2003-2004.

He attended the official work of the Branch and complied the H.Q. of the day-to-day affairs, monthly accounts statement etc. time to time. During the year, Shri Sahoo paid regular visits and looked into the smooth management of 10 Creche Centres and 7 E.C.E. Centres run in the villages

During the year, 7 training batches were organised in the Anganwadi Workers Training Centre in which 245 untrained lady Anganwadi Workers were imparted with practical training in ICDS activities of Government. During the year, a new unit named Helpers Training Unit came into existence in the premises of the Choudwar Centre.

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo co-ordinated almost all the National Pulse Polio Program of the Government. A 5 days long MOP UP Polio Program was also organised in the Municipality area in which 60 workers were engaged in feeding Polio drops to the children at their doorsteps. Shri Sahoo co-ordinated such program as the Organiser.

Shrl Sahoo monitored National AIDS Awareness Campaign in the Choudwar Municipality two times during the year.

LEGACY OF GOKHALE

"What is the moral of Gokhale's life? What legacy has he left for us? These questions were answered



by Gokhale himself in his last words to the members of the Servants of India Society, who were present beside his death bed: Don't waste your time in writing a biography or setting up a status, but pour your whole soul into the service of India.
