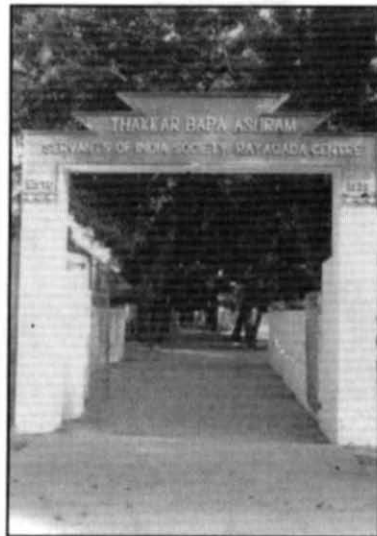

PREAMBLE

Extracts from the original Preamble to the Constitution of the Society written by the illustrious founder the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale, in 1905.

For some time past the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation-building in India when, for further progress the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required. The work that has been accomplished so far has indeed been of the highest value. The growth during the last 100 years of a feeling of common nationality based upon common traditions and ties, common hopes and aspirations, and even common disabilities has been most striking. The fact that we are Indians first, and Hindus, Mohammedans, Parsees or Christians afterwards is being realised in a steadily increasing measure, and the idea of a united and renovated India marching onwards to a place among the nations of the world, worthy of the great past, is no longer a mere idle dream of a few imaginative minds, but is the definitely accepted creed of those who form the brain of the community—the educated classes of the country. A creditable beginning has already been made in matters of education and of local self-government; and all classes of the people are slowly but steadily coming under the influence of liberal ideas. The claims of public life are every day receiving wider recognition, and attachment to the land of our birth is growing into a strong and deeply cherished passion of the heart. The annual meetings of Congresses and conferences, the work of public bodies and associations, the writing in the columns of the Indian Press—all bear witness to the new life that is coursing in the veins of the people. The results achieved so far are undoubtedly most gratifying, but they only mean that the jungle has been cleared and the foundations laid. The great work of rearing the

superstructure has yet to be taken in hand, and the situation demands on the part of workers devotion and sacrifices proportionate to the magnitude of the task.

The Servants of India Society has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country a higher type of Character and capacity than is generally available at present, and the advance can only be slow. Moreover, the path is beset with great difficulties; there will be constant temptations to turn back; bitter disappointment will repeatedly try the faith of those who have put their hand to the work. But the weary toil can have but one end, if only the workers grow not faint-hearted on the way. One essential condition of success in this work is that a sufficient number of your countrymen must now come forward to devote themselves to the cause in the spirit in which religious work is undertaken. Public life must be spiritualised. Love of country must so fill the heart that all else shall appear as of little moments by its side. A fervent patriotism which rejoices at every opportunity of sacrifice for the motherland, a dauntless heart which refuses to be turned back from its objects by difficulty or danger, a deep faith in the purpose of providence which nothing can shake equipped with these, the worker must start on his mission and reverently seek the joy which comes of spending oneself in the service of one's country.

The Servants of India Society will train men, prepared to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian People. Its members will direct their efforts principally towards (1) creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seek its highest fulfilment in service and sacrifice; (2) organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the

public life of the country; (3) promoting relations of cordial good will and co-operation among the different communities; (4) assisting educational movements especially those for the industrial development of the women, the education of backward classes and industrial scientific education; (5) helping forward the industrial development of the country; (6) the elevation of the depressed classes.

VOWS:

The country shall always be the first in my thought and I will give to her service the best that is in me.

In serving the country I will seek no personal advantage for myself.

I will regard all Indians as brothers and work for the advancement of all without distinction of caste or creed.

I will be content with such provision for myself and my family, as the Society may be able to make. I will devote no part of my energies to earning money for myself.

I will lead a pure personal life.

I will engage in no personal quarrel with any one.

I will always keep in view the aims of the Society, and watch over its interest with the utmost zeal, doing all I can to advance its work. I will never do anything, which is inconsistent with the objects of the Society.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2004-2005

INTRODUCTION

The Servants of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905. Its objects are the training of national missionaries for the service of India and the promotion by all constitutional means, of the interest of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields. The circumstances in which the Society was founded and the objects, which the Founder had in view in founding it, are explained in the preamble he wrote to its constitution in 1905, extracts from which are given in the preceding two pages. The Preamble has been a source of inspiration to the Society during the 100 years of its existence.

ORGANISATION

The Headquarters of the Society are at Pune, where the members meet every year in June for its annual session. The Society has branches in Chennai, Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad, Cuttack, Raygada and Kerala.

Shri P. K. Dwivedi is the President of the Society. Shri M. B. Deshmukh is the Secretary of the Society. Dr. R. G. Kakade, Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar, Shri Damodar Sahoo continued to be the Senior Members of Nagpur, Mumbai and Cuttack branches of the Society respectively. The Chennai Branch was looked after by the head quaters. Shri A. N. Mishra, Ramakanta Lenka were elected members of the Council.

2. In Association with the Gokhale Institute of Economics and Politics, arranged to carry out the land scaping and garden development in the Societys Head Quarter's as well as the Institute's Campus.
3. He entered in to the corrspondence with the Deccan Education Society and made efforts to rennovate the plaque of the Late Shri Gopal Krishna Gokhale on Hanuman Teddi in the Campus of the Fergusson College.
4. He ensured the vacation of the Society's residential quarters by the Peon Shri Panasare Peon with the help of the Court Orders.
5. Efforts to get cavated the Society's residential quarters vacated by Shri Atmaram Kedari, Peon and the case is in progress in the courts of Law.
6. Shri. Deshmukh is continuously pursuing the Court Cases on behalf of the Society in variousproperty disputes of the Society. Shri. Deshmukh regularly attends the hearings in the Courts in these cases.

SHRI DAMODAR SAHOO

Shri Damodar Sahoo, Senior Member, Cuttack Branche Manager the day to day affairs of the following projects.

SHISHU SADAN

The centre was started in the year 1975 for the handicapped children, Parentless, abandoned and childern in difficult situation, usually with

the age group of 0 to 6 years in the Society. The Society provided with all homely care and nourishment; special attention to physical, mental, emotional development. The Society provided more facilities like indoor and outdoor games, excursions, Library, Literary and Cultural meets.

As many as 230 children have been rehabilitated in the industrial services, teachership, official engagements small business and adoption etc., during the year 2004-2005.

As many as 215 children completed vocational training in various trades, during the year under report.

Marriage of 5 girl inmates and seven boys were arranged by the centre during the year under report

L. N. SPONSORSHIP PROJECT (Servindia Laxminarayan Project)

With the help of Christian Childern fund Bangalore an international level Social Service and philanthropic organisation, 1046 Children from economically backward families were enrolled under this programme. Society provided food clothing, reading-writing materials, health services etc., to these children

During the year 2004-2005, 219 poor families under the Micro Entrepreneurship development programme have been benefitted.

CRECHE AND SUPPLEMENTARY NUTRITION PROGRAMME

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo, member of the Society manages 10 Clreche centres in the remote villages of Tangi Chowdar Block. The Society provided all facilities of medical and care to the age group of 3 to 6 years.

SARASWATI SAHOO MATERNITY CENTRE

This centre provided all around medical assistance to the pregnant and alling women and children. in the locality.

LAXMI NARAYAN LEPRUSY CLINIC

Through this centre detection and treatment of leprosy diseases are made. The patients are provided with free medicines, mid-day snacks and winter clothes.

Tailoring School, Sadhucharan Power Loom Centre, Printing Technology Centre, Anganwadi Training Centre. All these centres are managed by the Chowdwar. In Anganwadi workers training centre there are 50 to 70 trainees per batch of the month.

GOKHALE IDEAL COLLEGE

The college conducts the final Annual council examinations in its own centre. Science laboratories are well-equipped with required instruments, chemicals etc.

Other activities like Laxminarayan Education Complex, National Public Polio Programme, National Leprosy Eradication Campaign, Aid awareness campaign, Mega eye operation camp are organised by the Society.

SHRI A. C. TRIPATHI (Allahabad Branch)

Shri A. C. Tripathi Resident Member of Allahabad Branch. Shri A. C. Tripathi manages the day to day affairs of the schemes of this Branch..

ASHRAM TYPE SCHOOL, KHANTARA

With the financial help from Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi. The Residential school was maintained by the Society at Khantara in Mirzapur District.

The Ashram provides food, lodging, playing material, reading and writing material to 60 Adivasi Students.

The society arranged the educational facilities to the day scholars belonging to SC community only.

WORKING WOMENS HOSTEL

To solve the residential problems of the working women coming from other Districts, the Society maintained, a paid Hostel for working women, at P. D. Tandon Road, Allahabad. There are 22 working ladies who are taking advantage of the Hostel.

The expenditure on maintenance was Rs. 1,68,980/-

SHRI RAMAKANTA LENKA

1. Thakkar Bapa Ashram, a residential hostel for SC/ST students.
2. Educational Complex for ST girls.

Shri Lenka was suffering from Cardiac Problem during November, 2004, which was detected as a case of complete Heart Block. The natural electrical functioning system, which makes the Heart to beat at regular intervals was blocked. Finally a dual chamber pace maker was implanted in the upper portion of his left side of chest. He was admitted in the Care Hospital, "Heart Institute", Visakhapatnam on 17th November 2004 and discharged on 26th November 2004. Shri Damodar Sahooji and Shri Madhusudan Sahooji came over to Rayagada to enquire about his health problem and Shri Lenka was very much thankful to all brother members of our Society who wished God-speed recovery.

During the year Shri Lenka devoted his time for smooth management of the activities of the Rayagada Centre. Due to his illness during November 2004 the 135th Thakkar Bapa Jayanti could not be celebrated in a big way. The celebration was limited to garlanding of Statue of Thakkar Bapa and a Children's rally which moved round the Rayagada town.

Shri Lenka was nominated as a non official visitor for Sub-Jail, Rayagada by the Collector and Dist. Magistrate, Rayagada.

Shri Lenka attended and participated in the National Conference on Panchayati Raj Extension to Schedule Areas (PESA) organized by the agragamee at CYSD, Bhubaneswar on 17th and 18th 2005.

Shri Lenka President over a workshop on Media consultation on Water issues at Koraput Organised by Agragamee and supported by OXFAM.

Shri Lenka attended the workshop on prevention of HIV/AIDS organized by the District. Red Cross Society, Rayagada. This workshop was organized in order to sensitize people on menae of HIV/AIDS, which is spreading across the globe.

BALIKA ASHRAM TYPE SCHOOL, PALIAKALAN

With the financial help from Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi the school is maintained by the Society.

During the year 2005 total number of the beneficiaries were 101, from SC communities. The Ashram provided Fooding, lodging, clothing, books, stationery medical facilities to the inmates free of charge.

The total expenditure was Rs. 5,38,190/-

THARU BOYS HOSTEL, PALI KALAN

Managed with financial help from Government of India, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi. The Hostel was maintained by the Society.

During the year 2005 total number of beneficiaries on Roll was 40 from Schedule Tribes communities. The Hostel provided fooding, lodging, books, stationery and other facilities to the students free of charge.

SHRI MADHUSUDAN SAHOO

Shri Madhusudan Sahoo was engaged in the Sadachar Shiksha programme in a number of schools around Balakuda in the district of Jagatsinghpur, Orissa. During the year he visited 19 schools and took Sadachar Siksha classes to teach the students the principles of character building. About 2500 students attended these classes.

Shri Sahoo has so far published 19 booklets in Orissa on different aspects of the subject, such as : (1) proper use of Time (2) Money, its use and abuse (3) Influence of Intoxicating materials on students (4) Practice of Yogasana (5) Adolescent and untold Topics (6) Importance of Diary writing (7) I and god (8) God and Religion (9) G. K. Gokhale etc.

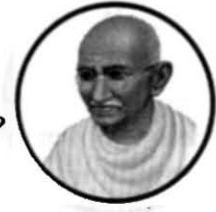
