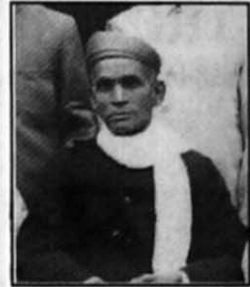

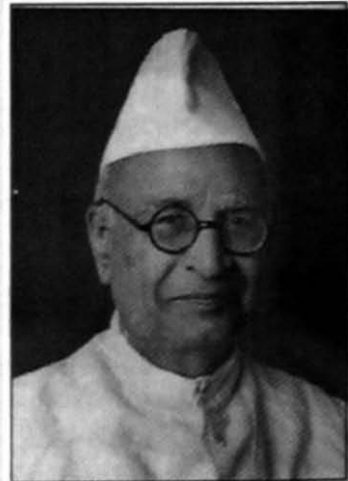

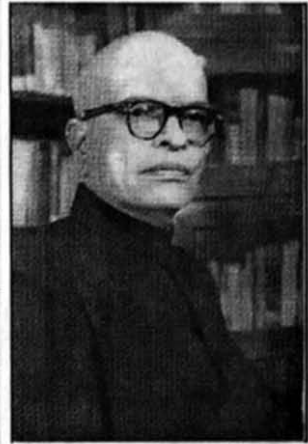

## **PREAMBLE**

Extracts from the original Preamble to the Constitution of the Society written by the illustrious founder the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale, in 1905.

For some time past the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation-building in India when, for further progress the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required. The work that has been accomplished so far has indeed been of the highest value. The growth during the last 100 years of a feeling of common nationality based upon common traditions and ties, common hopes and aspirations, and even common disabilities has been most striking. The fact that we are Indians first, and Hindus, Mohammedans, Parsees or Christians afterwards is being realised in a steadily increasing measure, and the idea of a united and renovated India marching onwards to a place among the nations of the world, worthy of the great past, is no longer a mere idle dream of a few imaginative minds, but is the definitely accepted creed of those who form the brain of the community—the educated classes of the country. A creditable beginning has already been made in matters of education and of local self-government; and all classes of the people are slowly but steadily coming under the influence of liberal ideas. The claims of public life are every day receiving wider recognition, and attachment to the land of our birth is growing into a strong and deeply cherished passion of the heart. The annual meetings of Congresses and conferences, the work of public bodies and associations, the writing in the columns of the Indian Press—all bear witness to the new life that is coursing in the veins of the people. The results achieved so far are undoubtedly most gratifying, but they only mean that the jungle has been cleared and the foundations laid. The great work of rearing the



superstructure has yet to be taken in hand, and the situation demands on the part of workers devotion and sacrifices proportionate to the magnitude of the task.

The Servants of India Society has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country a higher type of Character and capacity than is generally available at present, and the advance can only be slow. Moreover, the path is beset with great difficulties; there will be constant temptations to turn back; bitter disappointment will repeatedly try the faith of those who have put their hand to the work. But the weary toil can have but one end, if only the workers grow not faint-hearted on the way. One essential condition of success in this work is that a sufficient number of your countrymen must now come forward to devote themselves to the cause in the spirit in which religious work is undertaken. Public life must be spiritualised. Love of country must so fill the heart that all else shall appear as of little moments by its side. A fervent patriotism which rejoices at every opportunity of sacrifice for the motherland, a dauntless heart which refuses to be turned back from its objects by difficulty or danger, a deep faith in the purpose of providence which nothing can shake equipped with these, the worker must start on his mission and reverently seek the joy which comes of spending oneself in the service of one's country.

The Servants of India Society will train men, prepared to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian People. Its members will direct their efforts principally towards (1) creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seek its highest fulfilment in service and sacrifice; (2) organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the

public life of the country; (3) promoting relations of cordial good will and co-operation among the different communities; (4) assisting educational movements especially those for the industrial development of the women, the education of backward classes and industrial scientific education; (5) helping forward the industrial development of the country; (6) the elevation of the depressed classes.

**VOWS:**

The country shall always be the first in my thought and I will give to her service the best that is in me.

In serving the country I will seek no personal advantage for myself.

I will regard all Indians as brothers and work for the advancement of all without distinction of caste or creed.

I will be content with such provision for myself and my family, as the Society may be able to make. I will devote no part of my energies to earning money for myself.

I will lead a pure personal life.

I will engage in no personal quarrel with any one.

I will always keep in view the aims of the Society, and watch over its interest with the utmost zeal, doing all I can to advance its work. I will never do anything, which is inconsistent with the objects of the Society.

## **REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2005-2006**

### **INTRODUCTION**

The Servants of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905. Its objects are the training of national missionaries for the service of India and the promotion by all constitutional means, of the interest of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields. The circumstances in which the Society was founded and the objects, which the Founder had in view in founding it, are explained in the preamble he wrote to its constitution in 1905, extracts from which are given in the preceding two pages. The Preamble has been a source of inspiration to the Society during the 101 years of its existence.

### **ORGANISATION**

The Headquarters of the Society are at Pune, where the members meet every year in June for its annual session. The Society has branches in Chennai, Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad, Cuttack, Raygada and Kerala.

Shri P. K. Dwivedi is the President of the Society. Shri M. B. Deshmukh is the Secretary of the Society. Dr. R. G. Kakade, Shri S. S. Ajaonkar, Shri Damodar Sahoo continued to be the Senior Members of Nagpur, Mumbai and Cuttack branches of the Society respectively. The Chennai Branch was looked after by the head quaters. Shri A. N. Mishra, Ramakanta Lenka were elected members of the Council.

### **INCOME TAX**

The Society furnished to all the banks necessary application in form 15 H, so that no tax is deducted at source by all banks.

## **BRANCH ACTIVITIES OF THE SOCIETY**

### **SHRI P. K. DWIVEDI**

The work done by Shri Dwivedi during the year under report is given below:

#### **EDUCATIONAL WORK**

To solve educational scarcity among Buxa (Preemptive Tribe) and Tharu Community, Shri Dwivedi played an important role by managing primary schools, Junior High Schools and Intermediate Collage in Udham Singh Nagar. He also managed five boys hostels for Tribal students, where fooding lodging, reading and writing, uniform and medical facilities were provided. For the advancement of the girls education. He maintained three residential schools where all facilities were provided free of cost. Besides this, he continued to be executive member of the Adarsha Kanya Intermediate Collage, Bazpur and Patron of the Servindia Shiksha Prashar Samit, Bazpur.

#### **WOMAN'S AND CHILD WELFARE WORK**

Keeping in view the betterment of the women, Shri Dwivedi managed Working Women Hostel at Allahabad to solve their residential problem. The working women coming from other district and stats were accommodated on nominal rent. He maintained crèches in Uttaranchal to provide proper care to the child of seeking and working mother. To create awareness among rural women, several rural women training camps were organized.

#### **GENERAL WORK**

Shri Dwivedi continued to be the patron of Dr. H. N. Kunzaru Memorial Seva Samit Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar. He continued to be

the member of executive committee of the Bhartiya Adim Jati Sevak Sangh, New Delhi and attended its Meeting held time to time. Shri Dwivedi continued to be the trusty of Purna Nand Tiwari Janhitcari Nyas Bazpur, which is maintaining library and Databya Ausdhalaya in Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar.

## **MONITORING OF THE CENTERS**

Keeping in view the monitoring of the schemes and centers Shri Dwivedi visited the centers of Orissa Branch. The destitute home managed by Choudwar centers was inspected by him in the month of February. This is real social service of the Servants of India Society. He also visited infant rearing centers, Anganwadi, Workers Training centers etc. and appreciated there functioning.

Shri Dwivedi also visited the Cuttack branch office and felt its needs for proper maintenance and repairing.

## **WORKING AS PRESIDENT – SIS**

Shri Dwivedi had to take up the major responsibility to look after the total activities of SIS, as President (August 2005). He had to face very big problem and spent most of his time trying setting things right.

## **SHRI M. B. DESHMUKH**

1. Trustee / Member for Nav Jeevan Mandal, Mahila Seva Gram, Kalawati Adarsha Mahila Vikas Kendra and Niwara: Women and Men. Nav Jeevan Mandal works for the welfare and rehabilitation of the released prisoners.
2. Efforts to get the quarters allotted to Shri A. V. Kadam, vacated. Shri A. V. Kadam lost his case on the labour court and has now approached the High Court. As a Secretary of the Society, Shri Deshmukh is pursuing the case.

3. During the year Shri Deshmukh has been appointed as Secretary to the Society and hence he is carrying out all the functions of the secretary of the society at the Head quarter.
4. During the year, Shri Deshmukh as Secretary of the society has visited Nagpur and Mumbai Branches of the society in connection with Society's work.

### **SHRI DAMODAR SAHOO**

Shri Damodar Sahoo acted as the Secretary-cum-Senior Member of the Orissa Branch, looked after the overall management of the activities of the Society of different centres and Branch Office at Cuttack during the year under report. He organized meetings, seminars on different public issues in different times attended by educationists, Politicians, Journalists and intellectuals. The 139<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of the Founder of the Society was observed on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2005 followed by a public meeting held in Nari Seva Sangha, Cuttack. A meeting was held on the occasion of 12<sup>th</sup> death anniversary of late S. S. Misra, the then President of the Society. Meetings were held on the organizations i.e. State Naturepathy Council, Utkal Kendriya Bala Seva Sangh, Sarvodaya Relief Committee where Shri Sahoo was acting as the President and Secretary of the institutions.

### **CHOUDWAR CENTRE**

As the Secretary of the Choudwar Centre he devoted his time for smooth management of the institutions i.e. Servindia D. C. Home, Leprosy Clinic, Vocational Units, Training Centres etc. managed by the Society. He organized 43<sup>rd</sup> Death anniversary of late L. N. Sahu and 33<sup>rd</sup> Foundation Day of Servindia D. C. Home at Choudwar. He devoted most of his time for the care and protection of the children admitted in the Home. He welcomed the visitors visited the Centres in different times including govt. officials. A report written by Shri Sahoo was published in the newspapers on the incident. He also gave a report on the issue in the

Executive Committee meeting of Bharatiya Adim Jati Sevak Sangh held in New Delhi.

Shri Sahoo as the Founder Secretary of G. I. College, President of Choudwar Girl's High School, Member Child Welfare Council, District Development Committee, Poly Technic Society, State Co-ordination Committee, Staff Selection Committee for ICDS Programme, Chairman, Swarnalata Smruti Samsada, President, Sarvodaya Relief Committee attended the meeting and shared in smooth management of the organizations. Some articles were published in Newspapers written by Shri Sahoo. His talk on "Gandhi Bichar and Hind Sevak Sangh O Gokhale" in Oriya broadcasted in All India Radio, Cuttack.

As a devotee of Bhagawan Satya Sai, he devoted his time in Seba with a love for all and serve for all.

### **SHRI A. C. TRIPATHI**

Shri Tripathi continued to be a member of Adivasi Intermediate College Siltham, Birla Vidya Mandir Muirpur and Raja Baldeo Das Birla Soneghati Vidyalaya Salkhan in Sonebhadra District Managed by Servants of India Society.

As a member of the Advisory Committee of Working Women's Hostel, Shri Tripathi attended its meetings held during the year.

During the year, Shri Tripathi persuaded case filed by Shri Bachau and Sons Contractor and eviction of unauthorized occupants of Kahatik in the district court at Allahabad.

Besides these, as a Member In-charge Shri Tripathi looked after the management of various schemes in Allahabad and Mirzapur districts of Uttar Pradesh running under Servants of India Society, in the guidance and instruction of his Senior Member, Shri P. K. Dwivedi.



Name of the Schemes and their brief reports are given below:

### **ASHRAM TYPE SCHOOL KHANTARA**

With financial help from Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi. The School was maintained by the Society at Khantara in Mirzapur District.

During the session 2005-2006 the beneficiaries' no. on the roll was 60 who were from the SC communities. The Ashram School provided books and stationary fooding, lodging and clothing facilities to the students free of charges.

The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 5,11,991.34 during the year under report.

### **DR. KUNZRU PRIMARY AND JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL**

The school was maintained with its own resources for the educational advancement of the poor class students.

During the session no. of students on roll was 142. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 1,03,307.20.

As Resident member of the Allahabad Centre Shri Tripathi was looking after the day to day management of Working Women Hostel as well as Jeewan Sathi Guest House in Allahabad.

The Nagar Nigam Allahabad has exempted the Society from the House tax during the year under report.

## **SHRI RAMAKANTA LENKA**

Shri Ramakanta Lenka managed the following activities:

1. Thakkar Bapa Ashram
2. Educational Complex for ST girls

During the year Shri Lenka devoted his time for smooth management of the activities of Rayagada Centre. Shri Lenka organized 136<sup>th</sup> Thakkar Bapa Jayanti in the premises of Rayagada Centre. A children Rally moved round the town and a Public meeting was held on the occasion.

Shri Neve was associated with Apang Vichar Manch and Shri Dajisaheb Dnyan Vistar Sanstha in Nagpur.

## **SHRI DINESH MISHRA**

Shri Dinesh Mishra Continued to be a member of Narendra Memorial Shiksha Sansthan, Bazpur. Through which nursery and Primary school name Modern Public School is being run. Shri Mishra also a member of Serve India Shiksha Samiti, Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar.

Shri Dinesh Mishra also continued to be member of management committee of Shri Nehru Gram madhyamik Vidyalay, Saraibanshi in Alahabad District and attended its meetings held during the year.

As the member incharge of the Palia Centre he looked after the day-to-day management of the Tharu Janjati Boys Hostel and Balika A.T.S. in the District of Lakhimpur Kheri in Uttar Pradesh under the guidance of his senior member, Shri P. K. Dwivedi.

Brief report of the project is given below:

### **BALIKA ASHRAM TYPE SCHOOL PALIA KALAN**

With financial help from Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi, the Residential School was maintained by the Society at Palia Kalan in Lakhimpur Kheri District for educational advancement of girls belonging SC community.

During the session 2005-2006 the total number of the beneficiaries is 101 who were from the SC communities. The Ashram School Provided fooding, lodging, clothing, books and stationary and medical facilities to the inmates free of charges. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 9,34,203.00 during the year under report.

### **THARU BOYS HOSTEL PALI KALAN**

With financial help from Govt. of India, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi. The Hostel was maintained by the Society at Palia Kalan in Lakhimpur Kheri District.

During the session 2005-2006 the total number of beneficiaries on Roll was 42 who were from the Schedule Tribes Communities. The Hostel provided fooding, lodging, books and stationary other facilities to the students free of charges.

The total expenditure on the maintenance of the hostel was Rs. 4,19,878.00 during the year under report.

### **SHRI GANGADHAR SAHOO**

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo looked into the regular activities of the units of the Choudwar Centre of the Servants of India Society, assigned to him.

During the year, Shri Sahoo paid regular visits and looked into the smooth management of 10 Creche Centres and 7 E.C.E. Centres run in the villages of Tangi-Choudwar and Athgargh Block of Cuttack District along with Choudwar Municipality. In these centers more than 600 children within the age group of 0-6 years are being provided with supplementary nutrition and education through play way method in a beautiful homely atmosphere. 35 nos. of trained lady workers are engaged in these centers to take care of the children. Shri Sahoo attended several meetings and get together of villages of the concerned villages, adopted for Creche and ECE activities. He also attended zonal committee meeting of staff members of the said program.

During the year, 8 batches of training were organized in the Anganwadi Workers Training Centre in which 234 untrained lady Anganwadi Workers from various ICDS projects were imparted with practical training in ICDS activities. Shri Sahoo looked into the overall management of the said unit and took the trainees out for field placement in various ICDS Projects. During the year, Anganwadi Helpers Training Unit in the Premises of the Choudwar Centre, covered 8 batches of training and imparted training to 390 untrained Anganwadi Helpers of various ICDS Projects. Shri Sahoo looked into the overall management of such unit.

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo coordinated almost all the National Pulse Polio Program of the Govt. Organized during the year including the programme on 15<sup>th</sup> April 2006 and 21<sup>st</sup> May 2006. 70 lady social workers of the Choudwar Centre of the Society fed polio drops to 4500 children of Choudwar Municipality area time to time. In the programme the volunteers went to every doorstep, for two days, in each programme and covered 100% children within the age group of birth to five years of the area by feeding polio drops.

Shri Sahoo monitored National AIDS Awareness Campaign in the Choudwar Municipality two times during the year. 46 lady social workers

of the Choudwar Centre paid doorstep visits, distributed AIDS related leaflets and made the people aware of AIDS and its prevention.

Shri Sahoo, during the year attended Block level and District level Disaster Management Preparedness Committee meetings as a representative of the Society. The social workers of the Choudwar Centre have made survey of 6 adopted Panchayats of the Tangi Choudwar block and tained the people of said Panchayats on their preparedness at the time of natural calamities. Shri Sahoo visited several State Govt. offices and had discussion with the officials on various problems of the area.

Shri Sahoo attended 3 days long meeting in “framing of policy on establishment of Creches, organized by the NIPCCD and BAJSS at Thakkar Bapa Smarak Sadan, New Delhi. Shri Sahoo also attended the General council meeting of BAJSS New Delhi. He actively participated in the 139<sup>th</sup> Gokhale Jayanti organized by the Orissa Branch of the society. He also took part in the 35<sup>th</sup> Foundation Day Celebration of Sishu Sadan and 43<sup>rd</sup> death anniversary of Padmashree L. N. Sahu organized in the premises of Choudwar Centre. Shri Sahoo continued to be the honorary correspondent of the leading Oriya daily newspaper “The Prajatantra”.

### **SHRI A. N. MISHRA**

Shri Atma Nand Mishra continued to be the zonal Secretary of Vindhyachal Divison and a member of State Advisory Committee of the Uttar Pradesh Vidyalaya Prabandhak Mahasabha (U. P. Manager’s Association) but during the year under report he could not conviene any meeting of the Sabha due to frequent operations of his eldest son who had met an motorcycle accident on the 5<sup>th</sup> May 2005. His first operation was held on 8<sup>th</sup> May 2005 in the Apex Hospital Varanasi but because of carelessness of the doctors he got some infection in his bone as a result of which though once he was relieved from the Hospital, his wounds could not heal up upto October 2005. In the end of October 2005 (after his return from Pune) when he met the Doctor, he advised that one more



operation is required. Hence the second operation was held on the 29<sup>th</sup> October 2005. But this operation also could not give any success and the pus formation could not be stopped. Then Shri Mishra consulted another doctor in Motilal Nehru Distt. Hospital Allahabad and on his advise third operation was held on 10<sup>th</sup> January 2006 from where he was relieved on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2006. Thus, out of twelve months of the year under report for nine months Shri Mishra had no other job except managing money for operation after operation and attending the treatment of his son.

Meanwhile, the re-imposed land ceiling case on our Ghuwas land was decided against the Society in the court of prescribed authority Shri Mishra filed an appeal in the court of commissioner. Vindhyachal division but as was anticipated, there also he could not get Justice and then managed to file the appeal in the High Court Allahabad.

Though Shri Mishra was badly disturbed on mental, economic and physical level during the year report, he tried his best to manage the Society's schemes under his charge and members will feel glad to know that our Adivasi Intermediate College Siltham has got place in 'A' class list of the U. P. Education board on the basis of its results of High School and Intermediate Examinations held in the year 2005.

Following cases were continuing in different courts which are brought by or against the Society which were properly looked after by Shri Misra, Members will feel glad to know that premises of our R.B.D.B., Songhati Vidyalaya Salkhan which was situated on the ceiling land (i.e. Govt. land) is now transferred in the name of R.B.D.B.S.V. Salkhan by the A.D.M. (Finance and revenue) Sonebhadhra and this chapter has been closed.
