(Private and Government).

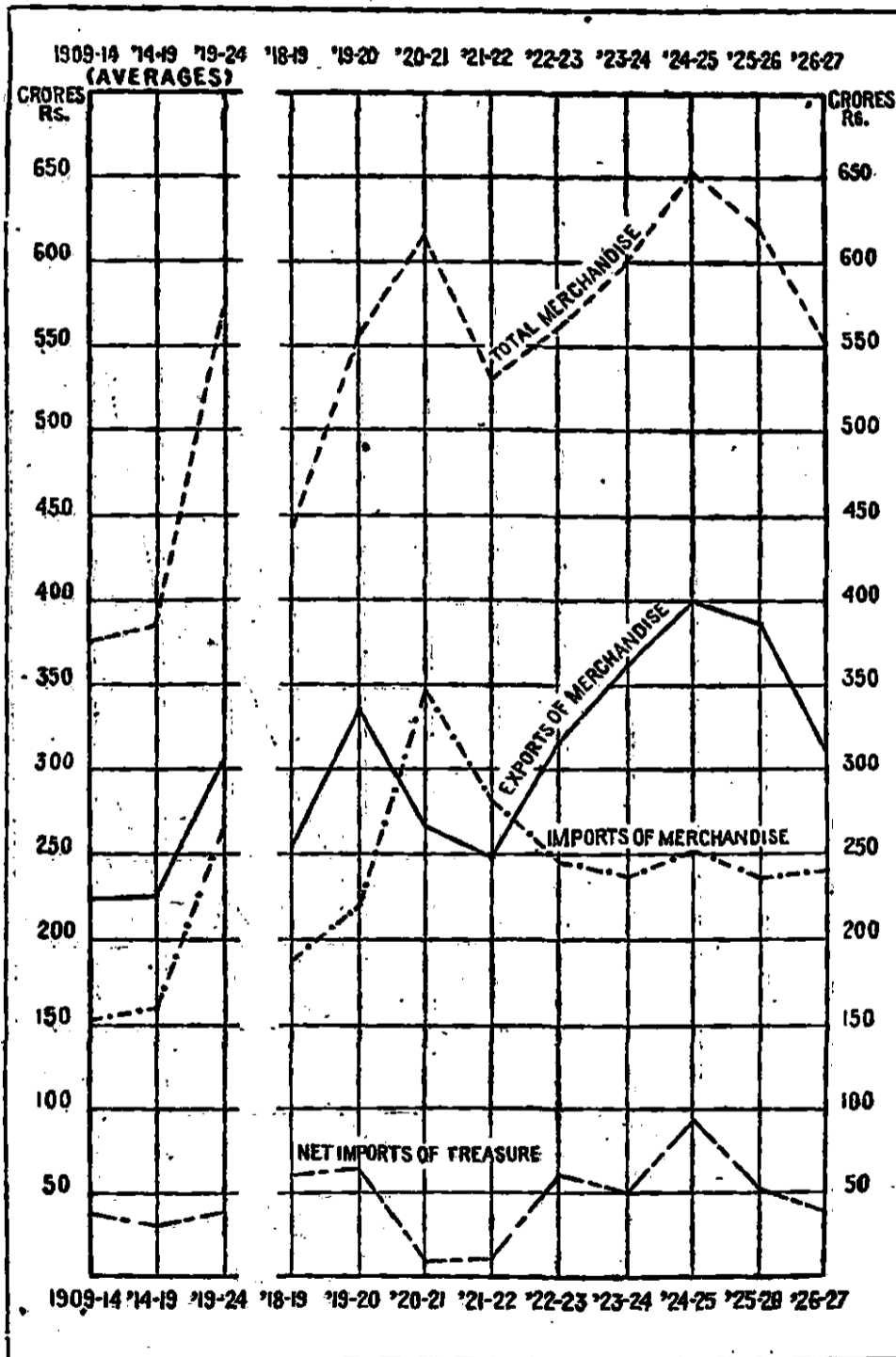

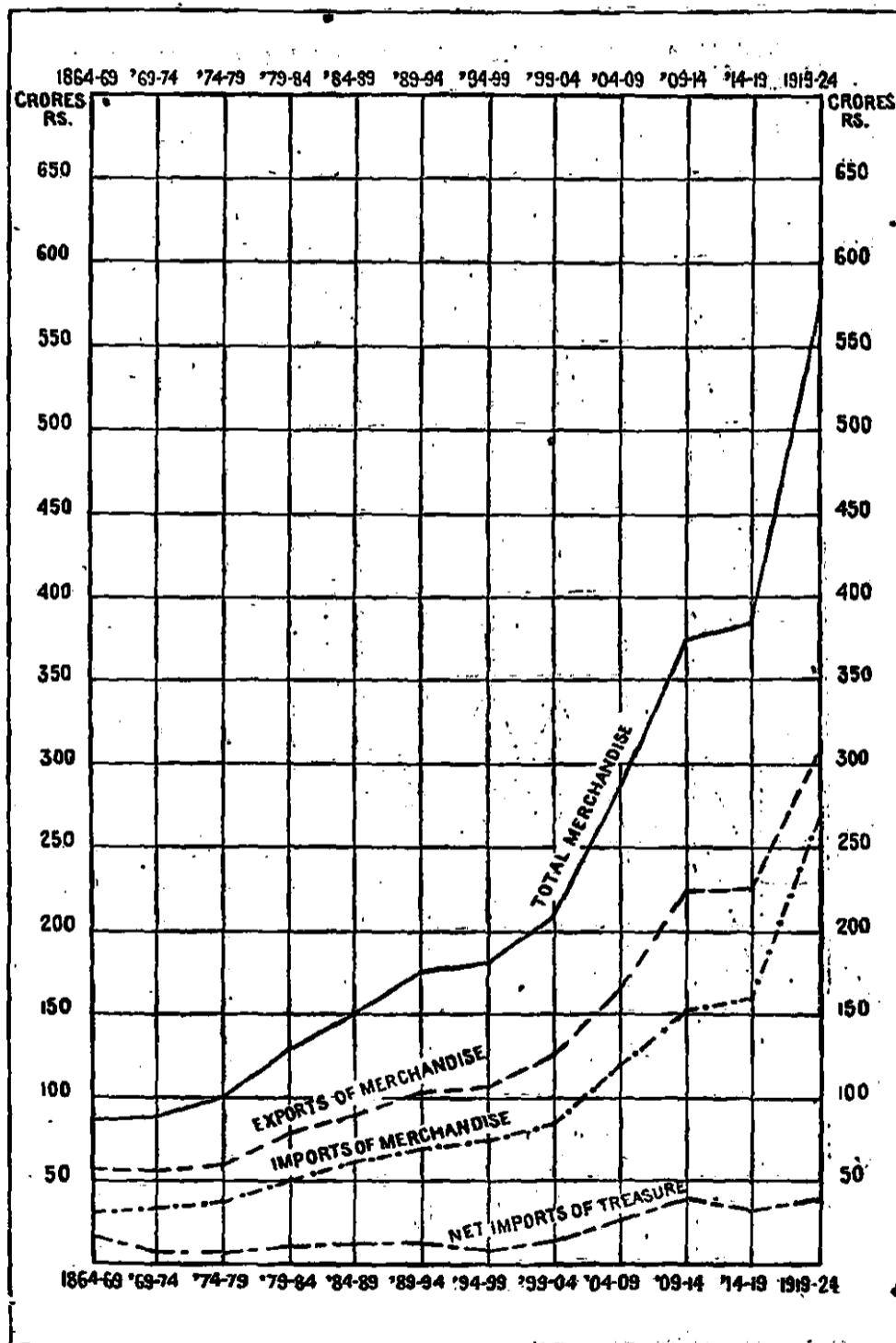

(a) Variations in the values of principal articles in the Import trade of British India during the last nine years as compared with averages of the pre-war, war and post-war periods.

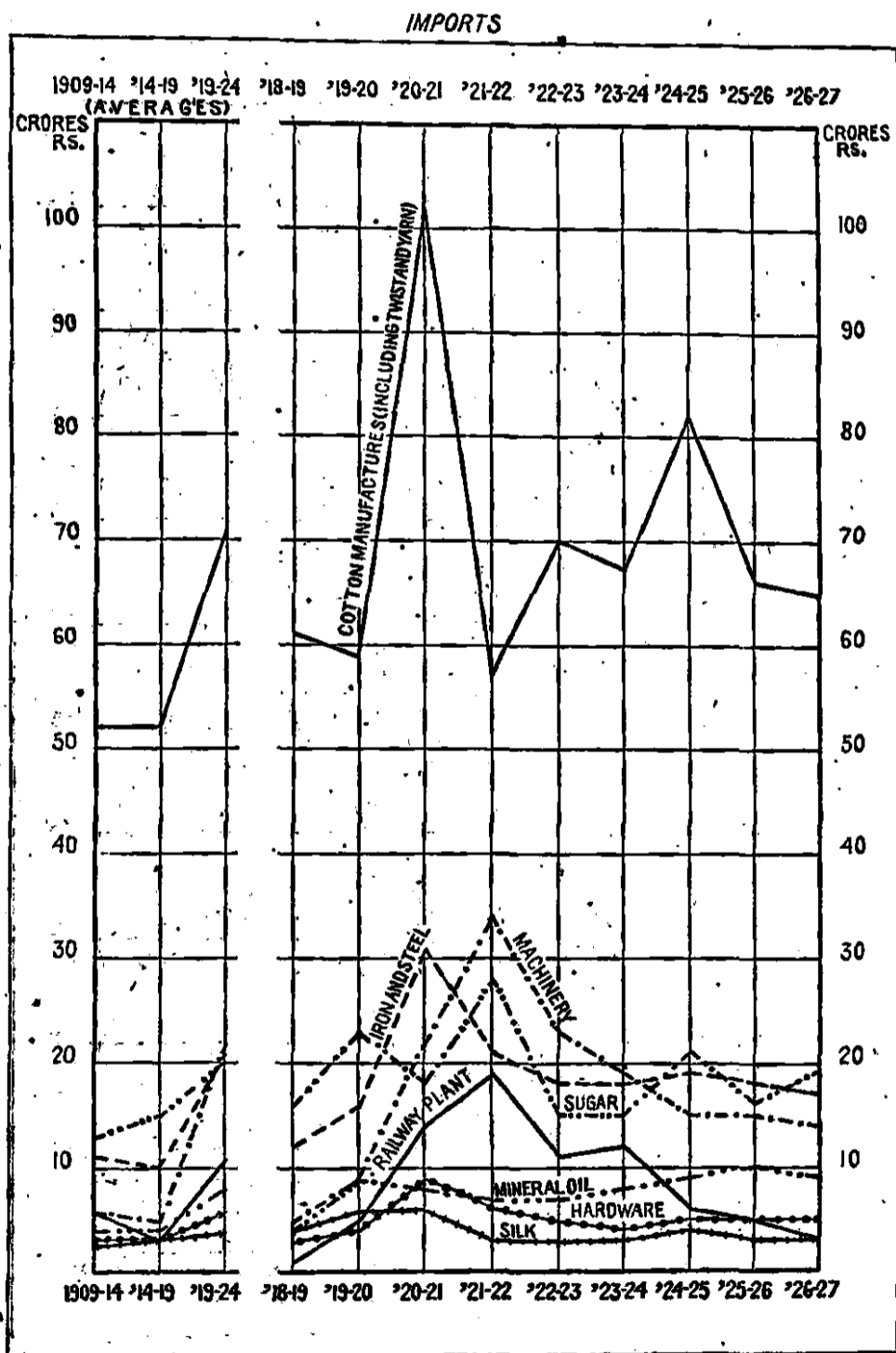
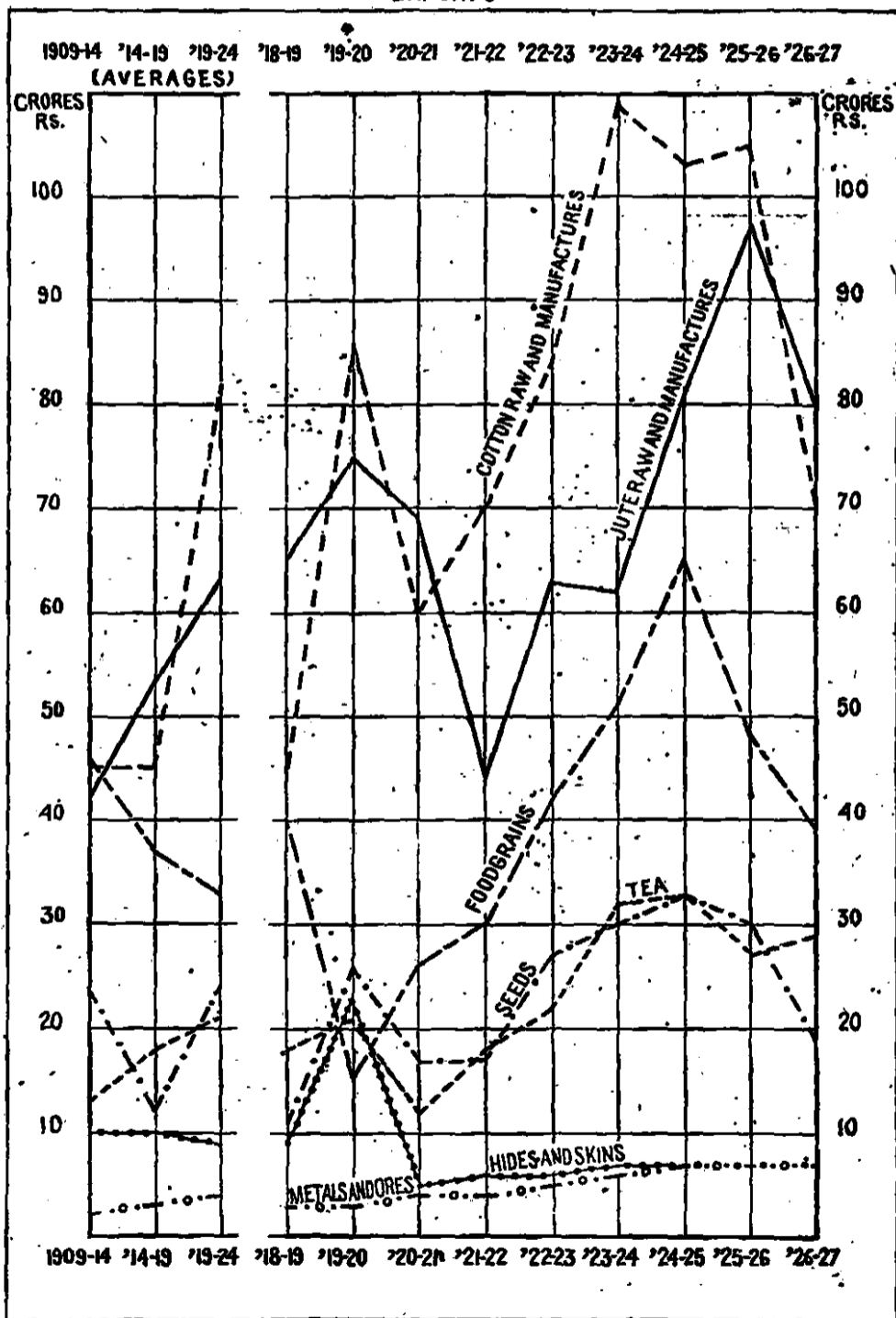
