

Total reported area 82 million acres




2. TOTAL CROPPED AREA IN 1914-15.

SIR,

I have the honour to submit the second volume of Agricultural Statistics for 1914-15. It deals with the Agricultural Statistics of Native States. As in the two previous issues, summary tables have been inserted to show the total figures relating to area, the classification of area, and the area under crops for each State or group of States, and the totals for all the reporting States. The total number of cattle as far as reported in each of the years 1905-06 to 1914-15 has also been included in the general summary table (No. 1). These statistics are defective for comparative purposes as additions have been made in the number of reporting States from time to time. Explanatory notes have been inserted at the foot of the tables. Two charts and an index for easy reference have been added to the volume. It should be noted that, for reasons explained below, the Agricultural Statistics of Native States are incomplete and are of far less accuracy than are those of British Provinces published in Volume I.

The total area of Native States in India is approximately 497,000,000 acres (777,000 square miles), with a population of 72 millions according to the Census of 1911. These are divided for the purposes of Agricultural Statistics into two main classes, namely, (1) States under the control of Local Governments and Administrations, and (2) States having direct political relations with the Government of India.

(1) *States under the control of Local Governments and Administrations.*—The total area of these States is 180,989,000 acres, with a population of some 27 millions. They are divided into the following main groups:—

The total areas of all these States (with the exception of the Shan States in Burma and the tribal areas in the North-West Frontier Province) are included in the areas of the several British Provinces stated in column 2 of table I of Volume I (British India), but are shown separately in column 3 of that table in order to arrive at the net area of British territory (in column 5) dealt with in that volume. Of these States, agricultural statistics are available only for the following twenty-eight States in the Madras Presidency and the Punjab and are dealt with in this volume :—

The total area of all the forty-six reporting States thus amounts to 188,861,000 acres, with a population of nearly 31 millions. These States, therefore, represent 38 per cent of the total area, and 43 per cent of the total population, of all the Native States in India.

* Arrangements are being made by His Highness the Nizam's Government to prepare agricultural statistics for the Hyderabad State. The statistics for this State, when prepared, will fill the biggest gap in the Agricultural Statistics of Native States in India.

Table I,
Total area.

From the total area of all the forty-six reporting States (188,861,000 acres), deduction must be made for 107,078,000 acres for which statistics are not available. These comprise chiefly unsurveyed areas and lands held on jagir, muafi, and other privileged tenures. The net area actually covered by these statistics is, therefore, only 81,783,000 acres by professional survey,* or 81,875,000 acres according to village papers.*

Table II,
Classification of area.

This area is classified, for the purposes of Agricultural Statistics, as shown in the margin. About 10,195,000 acres, or 12·5 per cent of the total, are occupied by forests; and the area not available for cultivation, that is, land absolutely barren, or unculturable, or covered by buildings, water, and roads, or otherwise appropriated to

uses other than agriculture, amounts to 19,507,000 acres or about 24 per cent. The balance, 52,173,000 acres or 64 per cent, represents the area available for cultivation. Of this, 15,062,000 acres, or 18 per cent of the total area, represent culturable waste, *i.e.*, land available for cultivation but not taken up, and 5,176,000 acres, or 6 per cent, were kept fallow in the year under report. The net area actually cropped in the year was thus 31,935,000 acres (or 39 per cent of the total area), which shows an increase of 3,177,000 acres as compared with the previous year. This net cropped area, however, excludes areas cropped more than once in the year. If areas cropped more than once are taken as separate areas for each crop, the gross area cropped in the year of report amounts to 34,676,000 acres as against 30,646,000 acres in the preceding year, or an increase of 4,030,000 acres or 13 per cent.

Irrigation.

The total area irrigated in the reporting States in 1914-15 was 6,049,000 acres as against 5,736,000 acres in the preceding year. Of this, 2,221,000 acres were irrigated from Government canals, 629,000 acres from private canals, 831,000 acres from tanks, 1,252,000 acres from wells, and the remaining 1,116,000 acres from other sources of irrigation. These figures, however, do not take into account areas cropped more than once during the year with the help of irrigation, but indicate the extent of land actually irrigated. If areas cropped more than once are counted as separate areas for each crop, the gross area of irrigated crops amounts to 6,522,000 acres, against 6,279,000 acres in the preceding year. Of this area, 5,658,000 acres, or 87 per cent, were under food crops.

Table III,
Area under crops.

The gross area cultivated with crops in the reporting States was, as stated above, 34 million acres in 1914-15 as against 30 million acres in the preceding year, or an increase of 13 per cent. The different classes of crops and the area occupied by each, so far as details are available, are stated in the margin. Of the total cropped area, food crops occupied about 28,111,000 acres or 82 per cent and non-food crops about 6,077,000 acres or 18 per cent. Of the food-crops, food grains (cereals and pulses) occupied as much as 25,769,000 acres or 75 per cent of the total cropped area, and other food crops (condiments and spices, sugar, fruits and vegetables, and miscellaneous food crops) together occupied some 2,342,000 acres or only 7 per cent of the total. Of the non-food crops, oilseeds occupied 2,056,000 acres or 6 per cent of the total cropped area, fibres such as cotton, hemp, etc., 1,807,000 acres or 5·3 per cent of the total, and fodder crops 1,370,000 acres or 4·1 per cent. The other non-food crops—dyes, drugs and narcotics (tobacco, tea, coffee, opium, etc.), and miscellaneous non-food crops—together covered some 844,000 acres or 2·4 per cent of the total.

The area under food-grains (25,769,00 acres) showed a net increase of 3,054,000 acres or 13 per cent as compared with the preceding year. The

actual increase or decrease under each kind of grain is stated in the marginal table. It will be seen that only rice showed a decrease of 134,000 acres, while all other food-grains showed an aggregate increase of 3,188,000 acres.

Oilseeds (linseed, sesamum, rapeseed, mustard, etc.) showed an increase of 362,000 acres or 21 per cent. The area under sugar decreased by 23,000 acres or 17 per cent, that under fibres (cotton, hemp, etc.) by 40,000 acres or 2 per cent, and that under fruits and vegetables by 59,000 acres or 10 per cent. On the other hand, the area under condiments and spices increased by 20,000 acres or 9 per cent, and that under drugs and narcotics by 53,000 acres or 24 per cent.

The total extent of land on which more than one crop was raised during the year was 2,741,000 acres as against 1,888,000 acres in the preceding year.

Tables IV, V, and VI are very incomplete, as figures for these tables are not furnished by many of the reporting States. Table IV is prepared by only eighteen States, namely, Mysore, Cochin, Gwalior, Indore, Bhopal, Rajgarh, Narsingarh, Barwani, Nagod, Bikaner, Marwar, Jaipur, Kishangarh, Alwar, Bharatpur, Jhalawar, Tonk, and Kotah. According to the latest statistics, the total number of live-stock of the bovine class (bulls and bullocks, cows, buffaloes, and calves) in these eighteen States is 13,875,000, that of the ovine class (sheep and goats) 8,428,000, and that of horses and ponies, mules and donkeys, and camels 410,000. The numbers of ploughs and carts are 1,898,000 and 546,000, respectively.

Table V (Land revenue) is prepared by seventeen States, namely, Mysore, Pudukkottai, Cochin, Gwalior, Indore, Bhopal, Rajgarh, Narsingarh, Barwani, Bikaner, Marwar, Jaipur, Alwar, Bharatpur, Jhalawar, Tonk, and Kotah; and Table VI (Transfers of land) is prepared by only four States, namely, Mysore, Cochin, Barwani, and Alwar.

The Appendix explains vernacular terms used in this volume, and the charts illustrate (1) the classification of the total area showing the proportion of cultivated and uncultivated lands, and (2) the total area cropped in 1914-15 with shares of food and non-food crops.

Column 2.—The professional survey is that carried out by the Survey of India in Northern India, and by the corresponding departments in Southern India. In States where there has been no professional survey, the figures are based on the best information available.

Column 3.—In this column is deducted the entire area for which the statistics required for Tables II and III are not forthcoming in whole or in part. This area comprises chiefly estates held on privileged tenures which have not yet been surveyed and which possess at present no agency for the annual collection of agricultural statistics. As surveys extend and the organisation of village statistical establishments develops, the area in this column is reduced, and that entered in the next column (4 and 5) and dealt with in Tables II and III is correspondingly increased.

Columns 4 and 5.—Column 4 is a check on the accuracy of column 5. In the latter, "village papers" means "the papers prepared by the village accountants." In States where no village papers exist, or where the source of information is the same for both the survey and the village papers, the figures in column 4 are necessarily repeated in column 5. The area in village papers may differ somewhat from that given by the Survey Department, (a) because, while the survey area is calculated in block, the area by village papers represents the added total of field and village areas, and (b) because the system followed as regards the inclusion or exclusion of areas covered by water, buildings, roads, and railroads is not always uniform in the two sets of returns.

Column 2 states the areas of state and district forests and of plantations.

Column 3 includes not only lands absolutely unfit for cultivation, but also lands reserved for pasture, and plantations intended for public use and therefore left unassessed. A large portion of the pasture lands is fit for cultivation, and is given out for cultivation from time to time under special orders, such lands when given out for cultivation being transferred from column 3 to 5 or 6 as the case may be.

Column 4 states unoccupied assessed waste.

Column 5.—There is no system of fallows, that is, lands are not systematically left uncultivated for the purpose of giving them rest. Individuals occupy large areas and pay full assessment thereon, leaving portions uncultivated, generally for the use of their cattle. For purposes of account the difference between the areas of the lands occupied by individuals and of those actually cultivated by them is taken as fallow. The lands occupied and assessed are sometimes unfit for cultivation, having been taken up on full assessment merely for use as pasture but the exact area of all such lands cannot be ascertained, though it cannot be large.


