

INTRODUCTION.

My sympathy with your aspirations is whole-hearted; and I cherish an enduring faith in the future destiny of India. India deserves to be happy. And I feel confident that brighter days are not far off. There is a saying that every nation deserves its fate; and my confidence in the future of India is founded on the solid merits of the Indian people—their law-abiding character, their industry, their patient and gentle nature, their capacity for managing their own affairs, as shown in their ancient village organisation. Further I put my trust in the intelligence, the reasonableness and the public spirit of the educated classes. And last, but not least, I have confidence in the Congress, whose pious duty it is to guide the people in their peaceful progress towards self-government within the Empire.—SIR WILLIAM WEDDERBURN.—(Presidential Address, Supra. p. 24.)

THE Indian National Congress completed twenty-five years of useful activity and met at Allahabad to celebrate its silver jubilee in the Christmas week of 1910. When the Congress was first held in Bombay in 1885, could its founders have hoped for the brilliant future that awaited it? The success of the Congress is proof of the fitness of the educated people of India for a larger and a really potent share in the government of their country. There is not any single instance of the Congress having taken a wrong view of a subject touching the administration of the country and felt the necessity of changing an opinion once recorded. it is remembered that as much cannot be claimed for those responsible for the government of the country—that they have been obliged to adopt the Congress views of public questions notwithstanding their manifest inclination to the contrary—that reforms once ridiculed as senseless or unpractical have since been actually given effect to, no more need be said in vindication of Congress statesmanship. Not long ago, it would have been nothing short of heresy to suggest that Indians could be taken into the Executive Councils of the Governor-General and the Governors of Presidencies and the Council of the Secretary of State; to-day, not only are there Indian members in them, but an Executive Council has been established in a large province governed by a Lieutenant-Governor and an Indian member appointed to it, and it may be regarded as practically certain that sooner than later, Council government will be established in another large province with an Indian as a member of the Council. When the Congress was established, Indian Legislative Councils consisted of members of Executive Councils. and a few nominated members whose fitness was determined by their readiness to subordinate their opinions (where they had any, that is to say,) to the wishes of their official patrons. They were described by the orator of the Congress as 'gilded shams' consisting of 'magnificent nonentities.' In response to the agitation of the Congress the Indian Councils Act of 1892 was passed, and the Councils were expanded as well as reformed. But the concessions

were inadequate, and the Congress rightly refused to be satisfied with the little that was granted. Again, in response to Congress agitation, the Councils were enlarged and reformed, and, whatever may be the defects of the Regulations which are a matter of administrative arrangement, the statutory recognition of principles is as satisfactory as can be expected in present circumstances. inclined to think that it was in an inspired moment that Babu Surendranath Baneriea exclaimed at the Madras Congress that Lord Morley would be known in history as the Simon de Montfort of the Indian Parliament. The foundations of local self-government which were laid by Lord Ripon, the good, in 1882, have not been built upon, it is true, as they should have been; but Lord Morley in his famous despatch of 1908 called upon the Government of India to take action in the desired direction, and the Royal Commission on Decentralisation made specific recommendations to the These are engaging attention, and it is believed that the Government will, without much delay, announce the reforms which they have decided to carry out. An important feature of them will probably be the revival of village panchayats which are to be endowed with real power. In matters of administration, as distinguished from constitutional reforms, the substitution of Indian for excessive paid European agency in the higher offices of the public service is in actual progress, though possibly, more slowly than should be the case; the separation of magisterial from police and revenue duties has been definitely recognised as desirable and is near accomplishment in certain tracts; a more vigorous educational policy is being pursued, and the question of free and compulsory elementary education has come within the range of practical politics; Government sympathy for economic development has been quickened, while agricultural improvement and the condition of the agricultural population have been receiving greater attention. A period, we all hope, has been put to the increase of military expenditure, and the urgency of economy is expressly recognised by the Government. This does not exhaust, by any means, the list of improvements that are essential to the well-being and advancement of the people of India, and, even where some progress has been recorded, much more has to be accomplished. There can never be a full stop to progress. And at what pace it will be achieved depends very much upon the people themselves-their moral energy, their determined persistence, their patient and faithful devotion to their holy motherland. 'Nations by themselves are made.'

The 'subjective triumphs' of the Congress are more important still. Notwithstanding differences between Hindus and Mahomedans emphasised in recent days, the process of nation-building has been progressing as the result of Congress activities; national

self-consciousness and national self-respect are greater realities to-day than they were before the establishment of the Congress; patriotism has become a real live quality, and the number of public-spirited men is larger and on the increase. Movements for industrial development and social reform have been set afoot as adjuncts of the political movement. The Congress season is definitely accepted by growing numbers as the Week of National Service. Internal trouble there was, and at one moment everything appeared wrapped in unrelieved darkness. But the fabric on which irreverence laid its rude hands has been re-built to the satisfaction, if not of all, certainly of almost all the Congressmen. Those who preferred to withhold their help from the resuscitated Congress have fortunately been showing an increasing tendency to offer themselves again to its service. The first two sessions of the Congress after the Surat misfortune were perhaps less successful than some that had been held before, but last year at Allahabad—the city where the Constitution was adopted—the attendance was thoroughly satisfactory, large numbers having come from distant provinces, and it would have left absolutely nothing to be desired if the United Provinces had been even more largely represent-In fact, the last session was like any of the successful sessions of earlier years. It furnished abundant proof of the vitality of the national assemblage, and brought to mind the beautiful words of Dr. Rashbehari Ghose, that 'the Congress bears a charmed life and is fated not to die.'

The Reception Committee of Allahabad, at the head of which was placed most appropriately the first citizen of the capital of the province, was singularly fortunate in the selection it made of the President of the Congress. No Englishman or Scotchman, living or dead, and no Indian either, with the solitary exception of the revered Dadabhai Naoroji, has laboured for the welfare of India as devotedly and as incessantly as Sir William Wedderburn. Sir William had presided over the great Bombay Congress of 1889, but would the people of India be able to pay him their debt of endless gratitude even if they elected him President of the Congress every year in succession? How he has felt for us, what he has done for us, what he has sacrificed and suffered, what he has braved and borne, are matters of history. Sir William has an Indian soul encased in a Scotch body; and those who have faith in the doctrine of re-birth will perhaps have no difficulty in believing that he was an Indian in his past birth and may be again in his next. respect and affection which Indians feel for Sir William found eloquent expression in the speeches of the Hon. Mr. Gokhale. Babu Surendranath Banerjea and other leading members of the Congress. Indeed, we cannot have a more beautiful pen-picture of Sir William than what was drawn by Mr. Gokhale in the speech in

which he proposed the vote of thanks.* Sir William came to India on the arduous mission at imminent risk to his health at his advanced age of 72, and crowded into three weeks the work of as many menths. The credit was his of having successfully arranged the Congress deputation to his Excellency the Viceroy—an event that had not taken place before; and in this respect the last Congress was rendered memorable.† The thanks of Congressmen are due to his Excellency Lord Hardinge for having established a useful precedent, which has since been followed by the Governor of Madras who received a deputation of the Madras Provincial Conference. Another achievement of Sir William Wedderburn's was the Hindu-Mahomedan Conference which met at his residence at Allahabad on New Year's Day under his own presidency. It may not be unreasonable for one to doubt the success of this mission of peace, but that the motive was noble and the effort worth making no one will gainsay. thanks are due to Sir William for having brought together leading men of the two communities and earnestly tried to persuade them to make up their unnecessary and unfortunate differences.

Of the Congress address of Sir William it is not necessary to say much. A perusal of it (supra, pp. 24-31) will show that it was a unique one of its kind. If there be a task more difficult than another, it is for a political speaker to prepare an address which will have nothing but good words for all—all persons, all parties, all classes. Sir William Wedderburn succeeded in accomplishing this difficult task. He came to India not to agitate but to make peace; he preached conciliation, hope and united effort. He admonished the Hindus to be friends with the Musalmans, the non-officials to co-operate with the officials, Indians and Europeans to respect each other, extremists to abandon their wayward wanderings and come into the Congress fold. Sir William naturally emphasised the importance of political work in England on behalf of the Congress cause, and before he left, succeeded in raising a substantial sum of money for this object.

Of all the resolutions, perhaps the most important, certainly the most troublesome, was the one which dealt with Legislative Council Regulations. The preceding session at Lahore expressed its strong disapproval of communal representation by separate electorates. Should this be repeated or not was the question. A number of delegates was opposed to the re-affirmation, but there were others equally convinced that it should be reaffirmed. The Subjects Committee anxiously debated the question at three sittings, and the resolution as actually passed embodied a compromise between opposing views which satisfied almost everybody. It recognised the necessity of fair and adequate representation of the Mahomedan and other communities

where they were in a minority, but disapproved the existing regulations under which this was secured by means of separate This was the portion of the resolution which gave rise Everybody agreed that in other respects the to contention. regulations were seriously defective and required modification in order that the objects of the Indian Councils Act of 1909 might be truly given effect to. The resolution was in the capable hands of Dr. Satish Chandra Banerji, and his speech (supra, pp. 84-6) and the speeches of his seconder and supporters, Dr. Tej Bahadur Sapru (supra, pp. 86-7), Rao (now Dewan) Bahadur M. Adinarayana Iyah (supra, pp. 87-8) and Nawab Sadiq Ali Khan (supra, pp. 90-1) should be The learned Nawab is a patriotic gentleman who, wiser than many of his co-religionists, sees far into the future and has cast his lot with the nationalists as opposed to the separatists, and his words of earnest admonition deserve to be read, marked, learnt and inwardly digested by those short-sighted men who in the triumph of the passing hour, have been conducting themselves with a regrettable absence of prudence and patriotism alike. It was an altogether notable speech which Nawab Sadiq Ali Khan delivered. this subject was the resolution which followed. It was a part of the compromise that the application or extension to local bodies of the principle of separate communal electorates should be expressly condemned; and the condemnation was uttered by three distinguished Mahomedan delegates, one of whom is one of the founders of the The Hon. Mr. Jinnah moved the resolution, and Muslim League. the Hon. Mr. Haque and Mr. Syed Hasan Imam seconded and supported it (supra, pp. 93-5). Looking at the question from a practical point of view, Mr. Hasan Imam had no 'hesitation in declaring that the method of separate representation in the local bodies will introduce great complications that will subsequently get into the homes of every Indian, be he a Hindu or Muhammadan, Parsi or Jain, Christian or Sikh, or anybody else.' Two other resolutions which related to or arose out of the Morley-Minto reforms were, the fourth,—that section 3 of the Indian Councils Act of 1861 be so amended as to allow of advocates, vakils and attorneys being appointed to the place of Law Member of the Governor-General's Council—and the eighth, that Executive Councils be established at an early date in the United Provinces and the Punjab. The Hon. Mr. S. Sinha and Rao Bahadur B. N. Sarma did full justice to the former proposition (supra, pp. 35-6), and Pandit Gokaran Nath Misra and Mr.P. L. Rajpal to the latter (supra, pp. 54-8). Expansion of the rights of local self-government, beginning with the village as the unit, is the logical and necessary complement of the reform of Legislative Councils, and the Congress view of the subject, which was embodied in resolution IX, was elaborated with ability and knowledge by Dr. H. S. Gour from the Central Provinces and the Hon. Mr. G. Raghava Rao and the Hon. Mr. M. Ramachandra Rao from Madras. Students of this important question will find their speeches (supra, pp. 59-62) informing and instructive.

Other resolutions related to administrative matters of more or less importance. The demand for simultaneous examinations, with which the Grand Old Man's name is inseparably associated, was reiterated in a resolution moved by the venerable President himself; while early redress of the grievances of Indians in the Medical Service was asked for in resolution XI which set out that an Indian Civil Medical Service wholly distinct from the Indian (Military) Medical Service should be constituted 'in the interests of the public. the medical service and the profession, as well as for the sake of economy in expenditure.' Sir Bhalchandra Krishna was appropriately put in charge of this resolution, which was seconded by Dr. D. R. Ranjit Singh of Allahabad and Dr. H. D. Pant of Lucknow (supra, pp. 69-72). Proposals for the better administration of justice by the separation of judicial from executive functions and the recruitment of judicial officers from among members of the legal profession, which came before the Congress not for the first time. were set forth in the speeches of Babu Jogendra Nath Mukerji, the Hon. Babu Braj Kishore Prasad and Mr. C. P. Ramaswami Iyer (supra, pp. 51-4). To the subject of supreme importance, viz.. education, the Congress devoted two resolutions, viz., resolution no. XIII, which asked for free and compulsory elementary education, and resolution no. XXI, which asked for larger expenditure on and a more popular policy in regard to secondary and higher education, and technical and industrial education. In the latter resolution the people were exhorted to supplement existing institutions and the efforts of the Government by organising for themselves an independent system of literary, scientific, technical and industrial education suited to the conditions of the different provinces in the country.' Mr. G. A. Natesan of Madras, who, as secretary of the South Africa Indian League in Madras, has bestowed particular attention on the subject and laboured harder in the cause of our suffering countrymen in South Africa than perhaps any other public man in India, brought up the resolution on Indians in the colonies in one of the best speeches of the session which made a deep impression, and his speech (supra, pp. 37-41) deserves to be read in its entirety. Mr. Manilal M. Doctor, an Indian barrister who resides in Mauritius, seconded the resolution and in doing so, spoke of the condition, which is sad indeed, of Indians in that island. Those living in this country lack information on the latter subject which however seems to call for earnest attention, and Mr. Manilal Doctor's speech (supra, pp. 41-4) should, accordingly, be read with attention. In two able speeches Mr. N. M. Samarth, a favourite on the Congress platform, and Mr. N. A. Dravid, one of the talented

band of the self-denying men who belong to that glorious organisation—the Servants of India Society, founded by the Hon. Mr. Gokhale. who himself is a 'perfect Servant of India'-spoke of the need for an enquiry into the growth of public expenditure in India, a reduction of which is urgently called for (resolution XIV, supra, pp. 81-4). To Mr. J. Chaudhuri was entrusted the resolution which asked for the repeal of the Press Act and the Seditious Meetings Act—a perfectly just prayer but which evidently stands no chance of being listened to by the authorities; while the standing grievance of Bengal, the dismemberment of that great and fair province, was dealt with in a speech of remarkable power—the most eloquent speech of the last Congress by common consent---by the veteran Congressman Babu Ambica Charan Mazumdar of Faridpur (supra, pp. 63-6). Dewan Bahadur C. Karunakara Menon, the able editor of the Indian Patriot, one of the best papers in India, made a statesmanlike speech in seconding the resolution (supra, pp. 66-7). The 'omnibus' resolution (no. XXIII) relating to police reforms, permanent settlement and military expenditure was moved from the chair.

The Congress passed the following resolution at the special desire of Sir William Wedderburn:—

"Having regard to the great improvement which has taken place in the general situation of the country as recognised by the late Viceroy and other high authorities, this Congress respectfully appeals to his Excellency Lord Hardinge to signalise the commencement of a new administration by an act of elemency to those who are undergoing imprisonment for purely political offences. In the opinion of this Congress, such an act of elemency will have the undoubted effect of facilitating the return of the country to normal conditions and will lead to a further improvement in the relations between the Government and the people."

The opportuneness and the wisdom of this recommendation will not be questioned by any impartial and sagacious observer of public events, and it is very much to be wished that the gracious visit of his Majesty the King-Emperor may be signalised by the act of clemency for which Sir William Wedderburn pleaded and which the Congress endorsed with one accord of heart and will. This is not a constitutional or an administrative problem in which it does not behave a constitutional monarch to intervene. It is always the Royal prerogative to show mercy, and the occasion will be peculiarly appropriate for our Sovereign Lord to exercise that benign quality.

The Congress appointed a committee to consider amendments to the Constitution and report them to the next Congress at Calcutta. This Committee is expected to meet at Allahabad in October next. Sir William Wedderburn made an appeal to members of the Congress to consider if they could not, without compromising the principles for which they stood, make it in some way easier for those to return to the fold who accepted the principles of the Congress but who 'are

not satisfied about the necessity of the steps taken by the leaders of the constitutional party, after the unhappy split at Surat, to preserve the Congress from extinction.' It is evidently this point which the committee appointed by the Congress will, among other matters, consider. An All-India Congress Committee was then appointed. Messrs. D. E. Wacha and D. A. Khare were re-appointed General Secretaries. On the invitation of the Hon. Babu Bhupendra Nath Basu it was resolved to hold the next session at Calcutta. The Twenty-fifth Indian National Congress came to a close amidst hearty cheers for the King-Emperor, his Excellency the Viceroy, Sir William Wedderburn, Mr. A. O. Hume and Mr. Dadabhai Naoroji.

May the Indian National Congress succeed ever more and more, will always be the prayer of every patriotic Indian whose pride it should be to labour for it 'heart within and God overhead'!

APPENDIX A.

Constitution of the Indian National Congress Organisation.

Adopted at the Meeting of the Convention Committee held at Allahabad on the 18th and 19th of April 1908.

Objects.

ARTICLE I.

The Objects of the Indian National Congress are the attainment by the people of India of a system of government similar to that enjoyed by the Self-governing Members of the British Empire and a participation by them in the rights and responsibilities of the Empire on equal terms with those Members. These objects are to be achieved by constitutional means,—by bringing about a steady reform of the existing system of administration and by promoting national unity, fostering public spirit and developing and organising the intellectual, moral, economic and industrial resources of the country. ARTICLE II.

Every Delegate to the Indian National Congress shall express in writing his acceptance of the Objects of the Congress as laid down in Article I of this Constitution and his willingness to abide by this Constitution and by the Rules of the Congress hereto appended.

Sessions of the Congress.

ARTICLE III.

- (a) The Indian National Congress shall ordinarily meet once every year during Christmas holidays at such town as may have been decided upon at the previous session of the Congress.
- (b) If no such decision has been arrived at, the All-India Congress Committee shall decide the matter.
- (c) An extraordinary session of the Congress may be summoned by the All-India Congress Committee, either of its own motion or on the requisition of a majority of the Provincial Congress Committees, wherever and whenever it may deem it advisable to hold such session.
- (d) It shall be open to the All-India Congress Committee to change the venue of the Congress to some other town when such change is deemed by it to be necessary or desirable owing to serious or unforeseen difficulties or other contingencies of a like nature.

Component Parts of the Organisation.

ARTICLE IV.

The Indian National Congress Organisation will consist of:-

- (a) The Indian National Congress;
- (b) Provincial Congress Committees;
- (c) District Congress Committee or Associations affiliated to the Provincial Congress Committees;
- (d) Sub-divisional or Taluka Congress Committees affiliated to the District Congress Committees or Associations;
- (e) Political Associations or Public Bodies recognised as Electorates in accordance with clause (3) of Article XX;
- (f) The All-India Congress Committee;
- (g) The British Committee of the Congress; and
- (h) Bodies formed or organised periodically by a Provincial Congress Committee, such as the Provincial or District Conferences or the Reception Committee of the Congress or Conference for the year.

ARTICLE V.

No person shall be eligible to be a member of any of the Provincial or District or other Congress Committees or Associations or Bodies mentioned in clauses (b), (c), (d),

and (h) of Article IV unless he has attained the age of 21 and expresses in writing his acceptance of the Objects of the Congress as laid down in Article I of this Constitution and his willingness to abide by this Constitution and by the Rules of the Congress hereto appended.

Provincial Congress Committees.

ARTICLE VI.

- (a) To act for the Province in Congress matters and for organising Provincial or District Conferences in such manner as it may deem proper, there shall be a Provincial Congress Committee with its head-quarters at the chief town of the province in each of the following nine Provinces:—
 - (i) Madras;
 (ii) Bombay;
 (iii) United Bengal;
 (iv) United Provinces;
 (v) Punjab (including N.-W. Frontier Province);
 (vi) Central Provinces;
 (vii) Behar;
 (viii) Berar;
 and
 (ix) Burma.
- (b)!, The Provincial Sub-Committees of the Convention shall, in the first instance, form themselves into Provincial Congress Committees.
- (c) The Secretaries of the Convention Committee shall take steps to form separate Provincial Congress Committees for the Central Provinces, Behar and Burma.

ARTICLE VII.

Every Provincial Congress Committee so formed will add to its number-

- (a) Representatives elected in accordance with its terms of affiliation by every affiliated District Congress Committee or Association referred to in clause (c) of Article IV;
- (b) As many representatives of recognised Political Associations or Public Bodies referred to in clause (e) of Article IV as each Provincial Congress Committee may think fit to determine.
- (c) Such other persons in the Province as may have attended as many sessions of the Congress as Delegates as may be determined by each Provincial Congress Committee for its own Province.
- (d) All such ex-Presidents of the Congress or ex-Chairmen of Reception Committees of the Congress as ordinarily reside within the jurisdiction of the Provincial Congress Committee and may not have been enrolled as members of the said Committee in accordance with clause (b) of Article VI or by virtue of the provisions contained in any of the foregoing clauses of this Article.
- (e) The Joint Secretary or Secretaries of the Congress ordinarily residing within the jurisdiction of the Provincial Congress Committee, such Joint Secretary or Secretaries being added as ex-officio member or members of the said Committee.

ARTICLE VIII.

Every member of the Provincial Congress Committee shall pay an annual subscription of not less than Rs. 5.

District or other Congress Committees or Associations.

ARTICLE IX.

The Provincial Congress Committee shall have affiliated to itself a District Congress Committee or Association for each District, wherever possible or for such other areas in the Province as it deems proper, subject to such conditions or terms of affiliation as it may deem expedient or necessary. It will be the duty of a District Congress Committee or Association to act for the District in Congress matters with the co-operation of any Sub-divisional or Taluka Congress Committees which may be organised and affiliated to it, subject in all cases to the general control and approval of the Provincial Congress Committee.

ARTICLE X.

Every member of the District Congress Committee or Association shall either be a resident of the District or shall have a substantial interest in the District and shall pay an annual subscription of not less than one Rupee.

ARTICLE XI.

No District Congress Committee or Association or Public Body referred to in clauses (c) and (e) of Article IV shall be entitled to return representatives to the Provincial Congress Committee or Delegates to the Congress or to the Provincial Conference unless it contributes to the Provincial Congress Committee such annual subscription as may be determined by the latter.

ARTICLE XII.

Each Provincial Congress Committee shall frame its own Rules not inconsistent with the Constitution and Rules of the Congress. No District or other Congress Committee or Association mentioned in Article IX shall frame any Rules inconsistent with those framed by the Provincial Congress Committee to which it is affiliated.

The All-India Congress Committee.

ARTICLE XIII.

The All-India Congress Committee shall, as far as possible, be constituted as hereinbelow laid down:—

Provided, as far as possible, that one-fifth of the total number of representatives shall be Mahomedans.

All ex-Presidents of the Congress, residing or present in India, and the General Secretaries of the Congress, who shall also be ex-officio General Secretaries of the All-India Congress Committee, shall be ex-officio members in addition.

ARTICLE XIV.

The representatives of each Province shall be elected by its Provincial Congress Committee at a meeting held, as far as possible, before the 30th of November for each year. If any Provincial Congress Committee fail to elect its representatives, the said representatives shall be elected by the Delegates for that Province present at the ensuing Congress. In either case, the representatives of each Province shall be elected from among the members of its Provincial Congress Committee, and the election shall be made, as far as possible, with due regard to the proviso in Article XIII.

ARTICLE XV.

The names of the representatives so elected by the different Provinces shall be communicated to the General Secretaries. These together with the names of the ex-officio members shall be announced at the Congress.

ARTICLE XVI.

The President of the Congress at which the All-India Congress Committee comes into existence shall, if he ordinarily resides in India, be ex-officio President of the All-India Congress Committee. In his absence the members of the All-India Congress Committee may elect their own President.

ARTICLE XVII.

- (a) The All-India Congress Committee so constituted shall hold office from the dissolution of the Congress at which it comes into existence till the dissolution of the following Congress.
- (b) If any vacancy arises by death, resignation or otherwise, the remaining members of the Province in respect of which the vacancy has arisen shall be competent to fill it up for the remaining period.

ARTICLE XVIII.

(a) It will be the duty of the All-India Congress Committee to take such steps as it may deem expedient and practicable to carry on the work and propaganda of the

Congress and it shall have the power to deal with all such matters of great importance or urgency as may require to be disposed of in the name of and for the purposes of the Congress, in addition to matters specified in this Constitution as falling within its powers or functions.

(b) The decision of the All-India Congress Committee shall, in every case above referred to, be final and binding on the Congress and on the Reception Committee, or the Provincial Congress Committee, as the case may be, that may be affected by it.

ARTICLE XIX.

On the requisition in writing of not less than 20 of its members, the General Secretaries shall convene a meeting of the All-India Congress Committee at the earliest possible time.

Electorates and Delegates.

ARTICLE XX.

The right of electing Delegates to the Indian National Congress shall vest exclusively in (1) the British Committee of the Congress; (2) Provincial or District or other Congress Committees or Associations formed or affiliated as hereinabove laid down; and (3) such Political Associations or Public Bodies of more than three years' standing as may be recognised in that behalf by the Provincial Congress Committee of the Province to which the Political Association or Public Body belongs, provided that no such Political Association or Public Body shall be so recognised unless the said Political Association or Public Body, by a Resolution at a general meeting of its members, expresses its acceptance of the principles embodied in Article I of this Constitution and makes the acceptance of the same a condition precedent to new membership.

ARTICLE XXI.

All delegates to the Indian National Congress shall pay a fee of Rs. 20 each and shall be not less than 21 years of age at the date of election.

Reception Committee of the Congress.

ARTICLE XXII.

- (a) The Provincial Congress Committee of the Province in which the Congress is to be held shall take steps to form a Reception Committee for the Congress. Every one, who ordinarily resides in the Province, fulfils the conditions laid down in Article V of this Constitution and pays a minimum contribution of Rs. 25, shall be eligible as a member of the Reception Committee.
- (b) No one who is only a member of the Reception Committee, but not a Delegate, shall be allowed to vote or take part in the debate at the Congress.
- (c) The Reception Committee shall be bound to provide the necessary funds for meeting all the expenses of the Congress as also the cost of preparing, printing, publishing and distributing the Report of the Congress.

Election of the President.

ARTICLE XXIII.

(a) In the month of June, the Reception Committee shall consult the several Provincial Congress Committees as to the selection of the President for the year's Congress. The Provincial Congress Committees shall make their recommendations by the end of July; and in the month of August the Reception Committee shall meet to consider the recommendations. If the person recommended by a majority of the Provincial Congress Committees is accepted by a majority of the members of the Reception Committee present at a special meeting called for the purpose, that person shall be the President of the next Congress. If, however, the Reception Committee is unable to elect the President in the mauner mentioned above, the matter shall forthwith be referred by it to the All-India Congress Committee, whose decision shall be arrived at, as far as possible, before the end of September. In either case, the election shall be final.

Provided that in no case shall the person elected President belong to the Province in which the Congress is to be held.

(b) There shall be no formal election of the President by or in the Congress, but merely the adoption (in accordance with the provisions in that behalf laid down in Rule

3, clause (b) of the "Rules" hereto appended) of a formal resolution requesting the President, already elected in the manner hereinabove laid down, to take the chair.

Subjects Committee.

ARTICLE XXIV.

The Subjects Committee to be appointed at each session of the Congress to settle its programme of business to be transacted shall, as far as possible, consist of:-

All the above-mentioned representatives being elected in accordance with Rule 9 of the "Rules" hereto appended, by the Delegates attending the Congress from the respective Provinces.

The President of the Congress for the year, the Chairman of the Reception Committee of the year, all ex-Presidents and ex-Chairman of Reception Committees, the General Secretaries of the Congress, the local Secretaries of the Congress for the year, not exceeding six in number, and all members of the All-India Congress Committee for the year, shall, in addition, be ex-officio members of the Subjects Committee.

ARTICL & XXV.

The President of the Congress for the year shall be ex-officio Chairman of the Subjects Committee.

Contentious Subjects and Interest of Minorities.

ARTICLE XXVI.

- (a) No subject shall be passed for discussion by the Subjects Committee or allowed to be discussed at any Congress by the President thereof, to the introduction of which the Hindu or Mahomedan Delegates, as a body, object by a majority of $\frac{3}{4}$ ths of their number; and if, after the discussion of any subject, which has been admitted for discussion, it shall appear that the Hindu or Mahomedan Delegates, as a body, are, by a majority of $\frac{3}{4}$ ths of their number, opposed to the resolution which it is proposed to pass thereon, such resolution shall be dropped.
- (b) The President of the Congress for the year may nominate 5 Delegates to the Subjects Committee to represent minorities or to make up such deficiencies as he may think necessary.
- (c) In any representations which the Congress may make or in any demands which it may put forward for the larger association of the people of India with the administration of the country, the interests of minorities shall be duly safeguarded.

Voting at the Congress.

ARTICLE XXVII.

Ordinarily, all questions shall be decided by a majority of votes as laid down in Rule 21 of the "Rules" hereto appended, but in cases falling under Article XXX of this Constitution or whenever a division is duly asked for in accordance with Rule 22 of the "Rules" hereto appended, the voting at the Congress shall be by Provinces only. In cases falling under clause (1) of Article XXX, each Province shall have one vote, to be given as determined by a majority of its Delegates present at the Congress. In all other cases of voting by Provinces, the vote of each Province, determined as aforesaid, shall be equivalent to the number of representatives assigned to the province in constituting the All-India Congress Committee.

The British Committee of the Congress.

ARTICLE XXVIII.

The Reception Committee of the Province in which the Congress is held shall remit to the British Committee of the Congress, through the General Secretaries of the Congress, half the amount of the fees received by it from Delegates.

General Secretaries.

ARTICLE XXIX.

- (a) The Indian National Congress shall have two General Secretaries who shall be annually elected by the Congress. They shall be responsible for the preparation, publication and distribution of the Report of the Congress. They shall also be responsible for the preparation and circulation of Draft Resolutions of the Congress, which they must send to the Provincial Congress Committee at the latest in the first week of December.
- (b) The All-India Congress Committee shall make adequate provision for the expenses of the work devolving on the General Secretaries, either out of the surplus at the disposal of the Reception Committee or by calling upon the Provincial Congress Committees to make such contribution as it may deem fit to apportion among them.

Changes in the Constitution or Rules.

ARTICLE XXX.

No addition, alteration or amendment shall be made (i) in Article I of this Constitution except by an unanimous vote of all the Provinces, and (ii) in the rest of this Constitution or in the "Rule" hereto appended except by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the votes of the Provinces, provided, in either case, that no motion for any such addition, alteration or amendment shall be brought before the Congress unless it has been previously accepted by the Subjects Committee of the Congress for the year.

Transitory Provisions.

ARTICLE XXXI.

- (a) The Committee appointed by the Convention at Surat on 28th December, 1907, for drawing up a constitution for the Congress shall exercise all the powers of the All-India Congress Committee till the formation of the latter at the next session of the Congress.
- (b) The Secretaries of the said Convention Committee shall discharge the duties of the General Secretaries of the Congress till the dissolution of the next session of the Congress.
- (c) The President and Secretaries of the Convention Committee should, in consultation with the Secretaries of the several Provincial Sub-Committees, arrange for the holding of a meeting of the Congress during Christmas next in accordance with this Constitution.
- (d) For the year 1908, the Reception Committee may, in electing the President, consult the Provincial Congress Committees in the beginning of October, before the end of which month, the Provincial Congress Committees, on being so consulted, shall make their recommendations, and the rest of the procedure prescribed in Article XXIII should be followed and completed, as far as possible, before the end of November.

Rules for the Conduct and Regulation

ΛF

INDIAN NATIONAL CONGRESS MEETINGS.

Adopted at the Meeting of the Convention Committee held at Allahabad on the 18th and 19th of April 1908.

- 1. The Indian National Congress shall ordinarily hold an annual session at such place as may have been decided upon in accordance with Article III of the "Constitution" and on such days during Christmas week as may be fixed by the Reception Committee. An extraordinary session of the Congress shall be held at such town and on such days as the All-India Congress Committee may determine.
- 2. Each Congress session shall open with a meeting of the Delegates at such time and place as may be notified by the Reception Committee. The time and place of subsequent sittings of the session shall be fixed and announced by the President of the Congress.
- 3. The proceedings on the opening day and at the first of each Congress session shall, as far as possible, consist of:—
 - (a) The Chairman of the Reception Committee's inaugural address of welcome to the Delegates.
 - (b) The adoption of a formal resolution, to be moved, seconded and supported by such Delegates as the Chairman of the Reception Committee invites or permits, requesting the President elected by the Reception Committee, or the All-India Congress Committee, as the case may be, to take the chair. No opposition by way of a motion for amendment, adjournment or otherwise being allowed to postpone or prevent the carrying out of the said resolution.
 - (c) The President's taking the Chair and his inaugural address.
 - (d) Reading or distribution of the Report, if any, of the All-India Congress Committee and any statement that the General Secretaries may have to make.
 - (e) Any formal motions of thanks, congratulations, condolences, &c., as the President of the Congress may choose to move from the Chair.
 - (f) The adjournment of the Congress for the appointment of the Subjects Committee and the announcement by the President of the time and place of the meetings of the Delegates of the different Provinces for the election of the members of the Subjects Committee and also of the first meeting of the Subjects Committee.
- 4. No other business or motions in any form shall be allowed at the opening sitting of the Congress session.
- 5. The Chairman of the Reception Committee shall preside over the assembly at the first sitting until the President takes the chair. The President of the Congress shall preside at all sittings of the Congress session as well as at all meetings of the Subjects Committee. In case of his absence and during such absence, any ex-President of the Congress present, who may be nominated by the President, and in case no ex-President is available, the Chairman of the Reception Committee shall preside at the Congress sitting; provided that the Subjects Committee may in such cases choose its own Chairman.
- 6. The President or the Chairman shall have, at all votings, one vote in his individual capacity and also a casting vote in case of equality of votes.
- 7. The President or Chairman shall decide all points of order and procedure summarily and his decision shall be final and binding.

- 8. The President or Chairman shall, have the power, in cases of grave disorder or for any other legitimate reason, to adjourn the Congress either to a definite time or sine die.
- 9. The election of the members of the Subjects Committee shall take place at meetings of the Delegates of the different Provinces held at such place and time as may be announced by the President. Each such meeting, in case of contest, shall have a Chairman who will first receive nominations, each nomination being made by at least five Delegates, and then after announcing all the nominations he may ask each Delegate to give in a list of the members he votes for, or he may put the nominated names to the vote in such order as he pleases, or if there are only two rival lists, he shall take votes on these lists and announce the result of the election and forthwith communicate the same to the General Secretaries of the Congress.
- 10. The Subjects Committee shall deliberate upon and prepare the agenda paper for the business to be transacted at the next Congress sitting. The General Secretaries shall, as far as practicable, distribute among the Delegates a printed copy of the agenda paper for each sitting before the sitting commences.
- 11. At each sitting of the Congress, the order in which business shall be transacted shall be as follows:—
 - (a) The resolutions recommended for adoption by the Subjects Committee.
 - (b) Any substantive motion not included in (a) but which does not fall under Article XXX of the "Constitution" and which 25 Delegates request the President in writing before the commencement of the day's sitting, to be allowed to place before the Congress, provided, however, that no such motion shall be allowed unless it has been previously discussed at a meeting of the Subjects Committee and has received the support of at least a third of the members then present.
- 12. Nothing in the foregoing rule shall prevent the President from changing the order of the Resolution mentioned in Rule 11 (a), or from himself moving from the Chair formal motion of thanks, congratulations, condolences or the like.
- 13. The proposers, seconders and supporters of the Resolutions recommended for adoption by the Subjects Committee shall be Delegates and shall be selected by the said Committee. The President may allow other Delegates to speak to the Resolutions at his discretion and may allow any distinguished visitor to address the Congress. Nothing in the foregoing, however, shall prevent the President from moving from the Chair such Resolutions as he may be authorised to do by the Subjects Committee.
- 14. An amendment may be moved to any motion provided that the same is relevant to the question at issue, that it does not raise a question already decided or anticipate any question embraced in a resolution on the agenda paper for the day and that it is couched in proper language and is not antagonistic to the fundamental principles of the Congress. Every amendment must be in the form of a proposition complete in itself.
- 15. When amendments are moved to a motion, they shall be put to the vote in the reverse order to that in which they have been moved.
- 16. A motion for an adjournment of the debate on a proposition may be made at any time and so also, with the consent of the President or Chairman, a motion for an adjournment of the House. The President or Chairman shall have the power to decline to put to vote any motion for adjournment if he considers it to be vexatious or obstructive or an abuse of the rules and regulations.
- 17. All motions, substantive or by way of amendment, adjournment, &c., shall have to be seconded, failing which they shall fail. No motions, whether those coming under Rule 11 (b) or for amendment, adjournment, closure, &c., shall be allowed to be moved unless timely intimation thereof is sent to the President with the motion clearly stated in writing over the signatures of the proposer and seconder with the name of the Province from which they have been elected as Delegates.
- 18. No one who has taken part in the debate in Congress on a resolution shall be allowed to move or second a motion for adjournment or amendment in the course of the debate on that resolution. If a motion for adjournment of the debate on any proposition

is carried, the debate on the said proposition shall then cease and may be resumed only after the business on the agenda paper for the day is finished. A motion for adjournment of the House shall state definitely the time when the House is to resume business.

- 19. A motion for a closure of the debate on a proposition may be moved at any time after the lapse of half-an-hour from the time the proposition was moved. And if such motion for closure is carried, all discussion upon the original proposition or amendments proposed to it shall at once stop and the President shall proceed to take votes.
- 20. No motion for a closure of the debate shall be moved whilst a speaker is duly in possession of the House.
- 21. All questions shall be decided by a majority of votes, subject, however, to the provisions of Articles XXVII and XXX of the "Constitution." Votes shall ordinarily be taken by a show of hands or by the Delegates for or against standing up in their places in turn to have the number counted.
- 22. In cases not falling under Article XXX of the "Constitution," any twenty members of a Congress sitting may demand a division within 5 minutes of the declaration of the result of the voting by the President and such division shall be granted. Thereupon the Delegates of each Province shall meet at such time and place as the President may direct and the Chairman of each such meeting shall notify to the President the vote of the Province within the time specified by the President.
- 23. Every member of a sitting of the Congress or of the Subjects Committee shall be bound (a) to occupy a seat in the block allotted to his province, save as provided for in rule 30, (b) to maintain silence when the President rises to speak or when another member is in possession of the House, (c) to refrain from hisses or interruptions of any kind or indulgence in improper and un-Parliamentary language, (d) to obey the Chair, (e) to withdraw when his own conduct is under debate after he has heard the charge and been heard thereon, and (f) generally to conduct himself with propriety and decorum.
- 24. No member shall have the right at a Congress sitting to speak more than once on any motion except for a personal explanation or for raising a point of order. But the mover of a substantive motion (not one for amendment or adjournment) shall have the right of reply. A person who has taken part in a debate may speak upon an amendment or motion for adjournment moved after he had spoken. The President or Chairman shall have the right to fix a time-limit upon all speakers, as also to call to order or stop any speaker from further continuing his speech even before the time-limit expires, if he is guilty of tedious repetitions, improper expressions, irrelevant remarks, &c., and persists in them in spite of the warning from the President.
- 25. If a person does not obey the President's or the Chairman's orders or if he is guilty of disorderly conduct, the President shall have the right, with a warning in the first instance, and without a warning in case of contumacious disregard of his authority, to ask such member to leave the precincts of the House and on such requisition the member so ordered shall be bound to withdraw and shall be suspended from his functions as a member during the day's sitting.
- 26. If the President considers that the punishment he can inflict according to the foregoing sections is not sufficient, he may, in addition to it, ask the House to award such punishment as the House deems proper. The Congress shall have the power in such cases of expelling the member from the entire Congress Session.
- 27. The Reception Committee shall organise a body of such persons as it may deem fit for the purpose of keeping order during the meeting of the Congress or of its Subjects Committee or at divisions. There shall be a Captain at the head of this body and he shall carry out the orders of the President or the Chairman.
- 28. Visitors may be allowed at the sitting of the Congress on such terms and conditions as the Reception Committee determines. They may, at any time, be asked to witndraw by the President. They shall be liable to be summarily ejected from the House if they enter the area marked out for the Delegates, or if they disobey the Chair, or if they are guilty of disturbance, or obstruction, or if they are in any wise disorderly in their behaviour.

- 29. The meetings of the Subjects Committee shall be open only to the members of that Committee and the meeting of the Delegates of each province at divisions shall be open to the Delegates of that Province only, subject in either case to the provisions of Rule 27.
- 30. The Chairman of the Reception Committee and the President as well as the Secretaries may, at their discretion, accommodate on the Presidential platform (1) Leading members of the Congress, (2) Distinguished visitors, (3) Members of the Reception Committee and (4) Ladies, whether delegates or visitors.
- 31. The foregoing Rules shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to the Provincial or District Conferences organised by the Provincial Congress Committees as provided for in Article VI of the "Constitution."

waited upon His Excellency the Viceroy and Governor-General of India. Ambica Charan Majumdar, (Bengal) and the Hon'ble Mr. Sachchidananda Sinha (Allahabad) were also present. Dr. H. S. Gour of the Central Provinces was unavoidably absent. The members of the deputation assembled on the grand staircase and were received by the Private Secretary Mr. J. Du Boulay, C.I.E., I.C.S., and Captain the Hon'ble W. Cadogan, Aide-de Camp to the Viceroy. They were conducted to the Throne Room, where, on the arrival of His Excellency the Right. Hon'ble Baron Hardinge of Penshurst, P.C., G.C.B., G.C.M.G., G.M.S.I., G.M.I.E., Viceroy and Governor-General of India, Sir William Wedderburn read the following address:-

"We, the President and members of a deputation, appointed at the twentyfifth session of the Indian National Congress, beg leave to approach your Excellency with an expression of our deep and heartfelt loyalty to His Majesty the King-Emperor, and an assurance of our earnest desire to co-operate with the Government in promoting the welfare of the country.

"We wish to express at he outset our grateful appreciation of the measures. of reform carried out in accordance with the gracious Declaration of the late King-Emperor, made on the occasion of the Jubilee of the Proclamation of 1858. The expansion of the Legislative Councils on a wider representative basis gives to the people of India a larger opportunity than they had before of being associated with the Government in the administration of the country; while the appointment of Indians to the Executive Council of the Viceroy and of Local Governments, as also to the Council of the Secretary of State, shows the determination of His Majesty's. Government to obliterate distinctions of race in filling some of the highest offices. of executive responsibility. These measures have done much to bring about a better understanding between the Government and the people, and we venture to express on this occasion our confident hope that the regulations in connection with the Councils, which have evoked criticism, will be modified in the light of experience.

"We avail ourselves of the opportunity, so graciously accorded to us, to draw your Excellency's attention to certain broad questions affecting the welfare of the masses of the people. Foremost among these comes the need of education. We rejoice to know how favourably the Government is disposed in this matter and we would urge a liberal increase in the expenditure on all branches of educationelementary, technical and higher education—but specially on the first of these branches, as being the first step towards promoting the well-being of the masses. The poverty of a large portion of the agricultural population and their inability to withstand the attacks of famine and disease is a constant source of grave anxiety; and in order to prepare the way for practical measures for a gradual improvement of their condition, we would earnestly recommend the economic village inquiry approved by the Congress and prayed for by the Indian Famine Union in a memorial, signed by representatives of all the influential classes in England. We trust also that your Excellency will view with favour the proposal to separate the Executive and Judicial functions of public servants. This reform has long been recommended by the Congress, has had the support of many eminent personages who have held some of the highest judicial and executive offices in India, and has been recognized by the Government as calculated to improve the efficiency of the administration of justice.

"The Resolutions of the Congress will, as usual, be duly forwarded to your Excellency in Council. They deal with many important Imperial and some pressing Provincial questions, which we feel assured will receive your Excellency's careful consideration.

"Before concluding, we beg to tender to your Excellency a most hearty welcome on your assuming the high office to which you have been called. We look forward to a period of peace, progress and prosperity for India under the guidance of one who was a trusted friend of our late beloved King-Emperor, Edward the Peacemaker, whose loss we shall never cease to mourn."

The address was printed on silk, embroidered with gold, and was enclosed in a casket of silver ornamented with gold.

His Excellency, was pleased to reply as follows:-

"I have received with satisfaction the expression of deep and heartfelt loyalty to his Majesty the King-Emperor on the part of your deputation from the Indian National Congress and the assurance of your earnest desire to co-operate with the Government in promoting the welfare of the country. To any student of the history of this country during the past 100 years, it must be clearly evident that it has been the aim of England to promote the material welfare and happiness of the Indian people, and the prosperity and progress that are visible on all sides at the present day are indisputable proofs that this policy has been attended by a considerable measure of success.

EXPANSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCILS.

"To the material advancement of the Indian people has now been added a large measure of political concession in the expansion of the Legislative Councils on a wider representative basis, and in the appointment of Indians to the Executive Council of the Viceroy and of the Local Government as also to the Council of the Secretary of State, thus giving them a larger share in the management of public affairs. These reforms are still in their infancy and require careful consolidation. It will be my constant endeavour to maintain a jealous watch over them and to see that the object for which they were instituted is attained.

Broad Questions.

"In the body of your address you refer to various broad questions affecting the welfare of the masses of the people, which I can assure you the Government of India have entirely at heart. The realisation of some of these proposals would entail a very considerable increase to the normal expenditure of the Government and would in all probability require a new source of revenue to meet it.

NEW EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

"The educational problem is one, however, that the Government of India have taken in hand. The creation of a separate department to deal with education may be regarded as an earnest of their intentions. I notice that a large number of those present here to-day are members of my Legislative Council or of Provincial Councils through whose intermediary these and other questions such as those enumerated by the Congress, can be brought in due course before the Provincial and Imperial Legislative Councils. I am confident that in such case they will receive in Council the most careful consideration, the aim of the Government of India being to promote the material welfare and moral development of the Indian people and to mete out even-handed justice to all races, classes and creeds.

PRESIDENT OF THE CONGRESS.

"I am pleased to see here your President Sir William Wedderburn; whose efforts to conciliate the existing differences between Hindus and Mussalmans have my entire sympathy and my best wishes for their complete success. I thank you for the cordial welcome that you have extended to me on assuming the high office that has been confided to me by our King-Emperor and I warmly reciprocate your desire that my term of office may be marked as a period of peace, progress, and prosperity for India. At the same time I wish to thank you for the lovely casket in which your address is enclosed."

The members of the deputation were then presented to the Viceroy and then the deputation withdrew.
