READ—

The reports from the Commissioner in Sind and the Commissioners of Divisions on the administration of Local Boards in the Bombay Presidency during the year 1913-14.

RESOLUTION.—During the year under review the number of District and Táluka Local Boards in the Bombay Presidency including Sind rose to 26 and 216 respectively from 25 and 215, the number in existence at the close of the preceding year. The increase of one in the number of District Boards was due to the creation of the Nawábsháh District with effect from the 1st April, 1913. Under this Board were placed the marginally noted Táluka Boards transferred from the Hyderabad and Thar and Párkar Districts, respectively. At

From Hyderabad. Sháhdápur, Sákran, Nasrat (now called Nawábsháh), Moro, Nausháho and Kandiáro. the same time the Digri Táluka Board was transferred from the Hyderabad to the Thar and Párkar District Board area. The increase of one in the

From Thar and Párkar. Siujhoro. number of Táluka Boards was due to the subdivision of the Daskroi Táluka of the Ahmedabad District into two talukas, North Daskroi and South Daskroi.

2. The Central Division shows a nominal increase of 27 square miles in the area administered by its Local Boards, due to the adoption by the Ahmednagar District Board for the first time of the figures of area recorded at the census of 1911. The total population of the area administered by the Local Boards of this Presidency was 18,062,041.

3. In the Northern Division the elective franchise was extended to the Panch Maháls Local Boards with effect from the 14th Constitution. April, 1915. In the Southern Division there was a decrease by two in the total number of members in the Dhárwár District, but this was counterbalanced by a corresponding increase in the membership of the Kánara Boards, so that the aggregate number of members serving on the District and Táluka Local Boards of the Presidency remained unchanged.

4. Triennial elections were held in the districts of Lárkána, Násik, Ahmednagar, Sátára, Sholápur, and Dhárwár. With Elections. few exceptions the elections aroused no particular interest.

5. The total number of meetings held during the year rose from 1,336 to 1,406, of which latter number only 38 were Meetings. adjourned for want of a quorum. The rule regarding the holding of half-yearly meetings was complied with by all the District Boards, but several Táluka Boards failed to hold the minimum number of four meetings prescribed in their case. In this respect the Boards of the Northern Division were again the worst offenders, no less than 11, including all those of the Panch Maháls District, being defaulters. There were no defaulting Táluka Boards in the Central Division, while in the case of the Southern Division all the Táluka Boards except those of Bijápur and Bágewádi held the prescribed number of meetings. The former Board was in default last year also and the explanation of the officers concerned is being obtained. In Sind the Kotri Táluka Board alone failed to hold the minimum number of meetings. Business can of course be disposed of by circular, but this expedient is intended only for cases of emergency and should never be resorted to so freely as to leave little or no business for transaction at periodical meetings. If the non-official members are to take any real interest in Local Board work, it is essential that they should be given opportunities of meeting as a body fairly frequently, and even if the agenda list is a slender one, such meetings,

especially when they are presided over by the Assistant or Deputy Collector, serve a distinctly useful purpose. The Governor in Council desires, therefore, that in future the rule as to the holding of quarterly meetings by Táluka Boards should be strictly observed, the reasons for instances of non-observance being invariably explained. The average percentage of members attending the meetings in the Northern, Central and Southern Divisions and in Sind was respectively 63·3, 56·5, 58·9 and 55 as against 58, 51·7, 53·4 and 57, respectively, in the previous year.

6. The aggregate income of the Boards rose from Rs. 74,60,000 to Rs. 81,28,000, a notable increase of Rs. 6,68,000.

The following statement compares the receipts under the principal heads of revenue with those of the preceding year:—

7. The increase of Rs. 42,000 under the head "Land Revenue" is principally due to the enhanced receipts in Sind (Rs. 31,000) which occurred in the Thar and Párkar and Hyderabad Districts. In the former district there was an increase of Rs. 18,500 under "Fisheries". Formerly the entire receipts from this source were credited to the Public Works Department, but under the orders of the Commissioner in Sind the *dhands* have now been classified, and receipts accruing from those classed as "revenue *dhands*" are now credited to local funds. The new Nawábszáh District accordingly returns an income of Rs. 17,000 from this source. In the Northern Division the increase of Rs. 5,00 under this head is due in large measure to a rise of Rs. 9,000 under the head of stone and quarry receipts in Thána. The Collector, however, explains that of this sum the real increase, due to higher auction bids, is only Rs. 2,300, the payment of certain refunds in the preceding year having caused an apparent reduction in the receipts for that period. Similarly in the case of Kaira, the figures for which apparently fell from Rs. 9,600 to Rs. 2,800, it is explained that the previous year's receipts were swollen by the recovery from metal contractors of certain arrears of royalty. In the Central Division the increase of Rs. 3,600 is due to larger realizations from sand and quarrying fees in the East Khándesh District, and to the increasing demand for building materials in Sholápur.

The very considerable increase of Rs. 1,92,000 under the head "Provincial Rates" was contributed to largely by the Central Division (Rs. 70,000), where the enhanced receipts were mainly due to the collection of suspended revenue and, in the case of the Ahmednagar District, to the advancement of the date of payment of the land revenue instalment from the 1st April to the 1st March. In the Southern Division the former of these causes resulted in an increase of Rs. 45,800 which was spread over nearly all districts. In the case of Bijápur there was an increase due to the fact that the contribution in lieu of the one anna cess on excise revenue, which had previously been credited to a different head, was this year shown under its proper head. In Sind the net increase of Rs. 37,000 is ascribed to a prosperous season in the Nawábszáh and Sukkur Districts, though extensive damage to crops in the Hyderabad District caused by heavy floods had a counterbalancing effect.

The considerable increase of Rs. 3,15,000 under "Education" was chiefly due to the grants made by Government for the opening of new primary schools and for the improvement of the pay of teachers in such schools, and, in a minor degree, to the fee receipts derived from recently opened schools. The small

increases under the heads "Police", "Scientific and other minor Departments" and "Miscellaneous" and the decrease of Rs. 7,000 under the head "Medical" call for no special remarks.

8. There was a net increase of Rs. 1,00,000 under the head of Civil Works. Towards this the Central Division contributed Rs. 35,000, the Southern Division Rs. 22,000, and Sind Rs. 47,000, while in the Northern Division there was a counterbalancing decrease of Rs. 4,000. The main sources of income under this head are (1) tolls on ferries and roads and (2) Government and popular contributions. Under the former sub-head there was, in the Northern Division, an increase of Rs. 13,500, for which the four districts of Ahmedabad, Broach, Surat and Thána were all more or less responsible. In the Central Division the receipts from tolls showed a net decrease of Rs. 9,000, which was chiefly due to the abolition from the 1st April, 1913, of two tolls on the old Poona road in the Sátara District and the tolls on the Jeur-Karkamb road in the Sholápur District, causes of decrease which were, however, in part counterbalanced by a considerable increase of Rs. 6,500 in the toll receipts of the Poona District. In the Southern Division there was an increase of Rs. 7,000 under this sub-head.

Under "Contributions from Government" there was, in the Northern Division, a decrease of Rs. 28,000, for which the districts of Kaira, Paunc Maháls and Thána were responsible. Kaira during the year under report received only its normal annual grant of Rs. 30,000, whereas in the preceding year, in consequence of the prevalence of *quasi-famine* conditions, it was the recipient of several special grants. The considerable increase in the Central Division is to be explained by the special grants made by Government for the improvement of communications in the Ahmednagar District and towards the construction of the Nawápur-Borzar road in West Khándesh, and by the donation of Rs. 6,000 from the Wádia Trust Fund towards the veterinary dispensary at Amaluer. In the Southern Division there was an increase of Rs. 6,700 due to a belated Government grant towards the cost of construction of the veterinary dispensary at Belgaum.

In Sind the increase under the head "Civil Works," amounting to Rs. 46,776 is more nominal than real and to some extent merely counterbalances a deficit of last year. Thus, in Karáchi, in the case of the Syedpur-Tanka ferry contract, the previous year's instalment of the deposit, as well as the instalment for 1914-15, was recovered during the year under report, while the previous year's arrears on account of the *pulla* fishery contract in Karáchi and Hyderabad were also recovered. A real increase was the Rs. 10,000 in advance of last year's figure obtained on the sale of the *pulla* fishery contract for the Karáchi District.

9. The general increase in the income of the Boards is reflected in the incidence of income per head of population. This rose from 6 annas 7 pies to 7 annas 7 pies, while the incidence of taxation rose from 2 annas 9 pies to 3 annas 2 pies.

10. The aggregate expenditure of the Boards remained practically stationary, the figure for the year under review being Rs. 78,43,000 as against Rs. 78,28,000 in the preceding year.

The following statement exhibits the distribution of expenditure under the several heads as compared with that of the previous year :--

The more important variations in the above figures are commented on below :—

11. *Education.*—The expenditure under this head rose from Rs. 30,31,000 to Rs. 32,14,000, being an increase of Rs. 1,83,000 following on a previous increase of Rs. 2,95,000. The present increase was shared by all the divisions of the Presidency including Sind, and is attributable to the additional sums devoted to the improvement of the pay of teachers in local board schools, the opening of new local board schools, the consequent entertainment of additional teaching staff, and the purchase of equipment for schools. The progress made during the year in the opening of new schools was most striking in the Central Division, 45 new primary schools being opened in the Sátára District, 34 in Ahmednagar, and 19 in West Khándesh. In the case of the Southern Division also there was a notable extension of primary education, 21 new schools being opened in Belgaum, 22 in Bijápur and 20 in Kánara. Special attention seems to have been devoted in this division to the extension of female education. Two new girls' schools were opened in Belgaum, five in Bijápur and one in Kánara. The Bijápur District Board sanctioned a grant of Rs. 1,000 for scholarships to girls for regular attendance in schools, an experiment which is reported to have been attended with encouraging results and which is being brought to the notice of the other Boards of the division.

12. *Medical.*—The increase of Rs. 41,000 under this head, which was contributed to by all the divisions of the Presidency proper, is attributed partly to the revision of the pay of sub-assistant surgeons and partly to the larger consumption of medical stores and the opening of certain new dispensaries. In the Northern Division, the Surat District shows an unusual increase in its expenditure under this head from Rs. 5,000 to Rs. 16,000, and an explanation of this increase has been asked for. In the Central Division two new dispensaries were opened at Mádha and Shirálá in the Sátára District. In the Southern Division the increase in the case of the Belgaum District is due to larger grants to the Village Sanitary Committees. New dispensaries were opened at Rai in the Dhárwár District and at Devgad and Devrukh in the Ratnágiri District, while Khán Sáheb Bulsarvala's dispensary at Ankola in Kánara was opened a few days after the close of the year. In referring to the work of the District Sanitary Associations which have been started in Belgaum and Bijápur on the model of that first established in the Dhárwár District, the Commissioner, S. D., observes that in both districts these bodies are doing excellent work in awakening public interest in the improvement of the sanitation of villages and in the adoption of measures of precaution against such diseases as malaria and cholera. Government are glad to note the progress of these Associations and trust that efforts will be made to establish similar bodies in other districts of this Presidency.

13. *Scientific and other minor Departments.*—Under this head there was an increase of Rs. 8,000 in the Southern Division and Sind, counterbalanced by a decrease of Rs. 2,000 in the Northern and Central Divisions. In the Northern Division, Thána alone showed an increase of Rs. 1,000, due to the touring activity of one of the veterinary assistants, a larger contribution to Government, and new contributions to the agricultural shows held at Kalyán and Máhim. The horse show at Ahmedabad, which last year absorbed Rs. 1,000 of the District Board's funds, was not held during the year under review. In the Southern Division new veterinary dispensaries were opened at Byádgi in the Dhárwár, and Chiplun in the Ratnágiri District. A veterinary dispensary was also opened at Muddebihál in Bijápur just after the close of the year under review. The Collector of Belgaum reports that steps are in progress for the acquisition of the building in which the veterinary dispensary at Chikodi is located, the Board having provided a sum of Rs. 4,000 for the purpose. It is also reported that the Board has accepted the offer made by the Wádia Bequest Fund for the construction of a new dispensary at Bail-Hongal. The Dhárwár District Board contributed Rs. 1,200 and Rs. 1,600 to the Industrial Exhibition at Dhárwár and the Cattle and Agricultural Show at Ránebennur, respectively, both of which exhibitions were witnessed by His Excellency the Governor. A sum of Rs. 200 was contributed by the Kánara Board to the District Agricultural Show at

Honávar, and Rs. 1,000 were paid by the Bijápur Board to the Agricultural Association at Bijápur for the improvement of the experimental farm at Bijápur. In Sind the increase in expenditure was chiefly due to the greater cost of the maintenance of the veterinary dispensaries at Sujawal and Tatta in the Karáchi District hitherto housed in hired buildings, and to the holding of agricultural shows in the Lárkáua and Thar and Párkar Districts.

14. *Civil Works.*—The expenditure under this head fell off by Rs. 1,56,000 as compared with the preceding year's outlay of Rs. 36,94, 00. The Northern and Central Divisions contributed Rs. 1,50,000 and Rs. 75,000, respectively, towards this decrease, which was to some extent counterbalanced by an increase of Rs. 59,000 in the Southern Division and Rs. 10,000 in Sind. The expenditure for the whole Presidency represents 45·1 per cent. of the entire expenditure of the Boards, against a corresponding proportion of 47·2 per cent. in the preceding year. The following statement compares the charges under the various sub-heads with those of the preceding year :—

Communications.—The major portion of the outlay on "Civil Works" was, as usual, devoted to the construction and repairs of roads and bridges. In the Northern Division the districts which showed an increased expenditure under this head were Ahmedabad, the Panch Maháls and Surat. Apparently the desire to accumulate a large balance prevented any increase of expenditure in Kaira, while in Thána it appears that no important new roads were started during the year. The Collector, however, refers to the Murbádi bridge project, which, when completed, is expected to supply a long-felt want. In the Central Division increased sums were expended on communications in the East and West Khándesh and the Poona Districts. In the Southern Division the total expenditure during the year under review was approximately the same as in the previous year. The more important works were the construction of two main roads, viz., the Bágáni-Muñkavi and the Huvin-Hippargi-Talkot roads, in the Bijápur District, and the Dábhol-Dápoli road in the Ratnágiri District. The Collector of Belgaum reports that the Forest Department have undertaken the repair and maintenance of such of the roads belonging to the Board as pass near or through forests, on condition of receiving contributions from the Board. Certain roads have accordingly been handed over to them for management. With regard to this, the Commissioner, S. D., observes that as the maintenance of these roads does not lie within the ordinary functions of the Forest Department, the arrangement must be regarded as of an exceptional and temporary character, induced, apparently, by the difficulty experienced by the Board in securing the services of engineers of sufficient professional skill. He is accordingly instituting enquiries to ascertain whether this difficulty is experienced in a similar degree by other districts, and whether any Board has succeeded in solving the problem of the maintenance of an efficient engineering staff. The result of these enquiries should in due

course be reported to Government. In Sind the expenditure under "Communications" fell from Rs. 4,16,000 to Rs. 4,03,000, the outlay on original works having been somewhat reduced. The amount expended was devoted to the construction of several new roads and 25 new bridges in the Karáchi District, on four new bridges in the Hyderabad District, and, in the case of the other districts, on the embanking and repairing of old roads and the construction of new bridges.

The new works of construction carried out in the Presidency during the year under review include a large number of school-houses and dharamshálas, besides several medical and veterinary dispensaries.

Water-supply.—In the Northern Division activity in connexion with the improvement of water-supply seems to have abated considerably, the result probably of good rains, at any rate so far as the Kaira District is concerned. In the districts of Surat and Thána new wells were bored and old ones repaired, but no detailed information is forthcoming on the subject. In the Central Division the expenditure on water-supply also exhibits a decline, this being the case principally in West Khándesh and Sátára. Steps, however, are being taken by the Collector of the former district to devote larger amounts during the current year to this important head. The decrease in the case of Sátára is accounted for by the fact that the expenditure for 1912-13 included the annual contribution of Rs. 5,000 paid to the Sátára Municipality towards the cost of the Kas Water Works, which has now been discontinued by the District Local Board. Ten new wells were bored in the East Khándesh District, nine in West Khándesh and 49 in Poona. A large number of wells were also repaired and deepened in the Sholápur District. In the Southern Division a satisfactory increase in expenditure on water-supply is observable in the case of the districts of Dhárwár, Kánara and Kolába.

Arboriculture.—There was an increase of Rs. 16,000 under this head, of which Rs. 12,000 were contributed by the Southern Division, where evidently considerable interest appears to have been taken in every district in this branch of local board enterprize. In the Northern Division the increase of Rs. 1,900 was shared by Kaira and Broach. In the Panch Maháls the work is reported to have been taken up unsystematically owing to the omission of the authorities responsible to prepare working plans for tree plantations. With regard to Surat it is reported that working plans have been prepared by the Board, and that it is expected that considerable progress will be recorded next year. A report in the same terms was received last year, and it is hoped that these expectations will soon begin to be realized. In Thána it is reported that there is practically little scope for enterprize in this direction, but, without a statement of the grounds on which it is based, the Governor in Council is not prepared to accept this explanation as justifying the cessation of all effort. In the Central Division, which shows an increase of Rs. 4,000, the plantation of roadside trees is said to be receiving attention generally and a special quinquennial report is promised. In Sind 198 miles of road were planted with trees during the year under review, but there was a falling off of Rs. 1,300 in the total expenditure.

15. The table appended to this Resolution shows, with divisional totals, the opening and closing balances of the Boards of the several districts of the Presidency. In the case of every division the closing balance represents a considerable increase on the opening balance. The aggregate of the closing balances of all the Boards of the Presidency amounted to Rs. $29\frac{3}{4}$ lákhs against Rs. $24\frac{3}{4}$ lákhs in the previous year. These closing balances are largely in excess of the prescribed minima, the total for Sind, for instance, representing nearly ten times the amount fixed. A considerable portion of these unduly inflated balances forms part of the Educational Fund, the spending of which is in most cases retarded by the delays incidental to the acquisition of sites and the preparation of plans for school buildings. In the Northern Division, Ahmedabad, which at the beginning of the year had a balance of only Rs. 9,100, has so far recovered as to conclude the year with a balance which is Rs. 96,395 in excess of the prescribed minimum. This excess, and also similar excesses in the case of the districts of

Braob, Surat and Thána, are partly accounted for by unexpected increases in income. It is reported that the Ahmedabad and Surat Boards have already taken steps to reduce their balances during the year now current. In the case of Thána the Collector reports that the general explanation of the failure to spend fully the amounts budgetted is partly the scarcity and dearness of labour and partly want of practical interest on the part of the members in the operations of the Board. In the case of Kaira the inflation of the District Board's closing balance seems to have been the result of a deliberate though not very intelligible policy, expenditure being curtailed and the Táluka Boards being compelled to refund grants previously made to them. What the real object of this parsimony was is not disclosed, since the report merely states that it proceeded from an endeavour to bring the balance of the Board to at least the prescribed minimum of Rs. 50,000. As that balance already stood at Rs. 97,000 and has, as a result of this policy, been raised to the inordinate sum of nearly Rs. 1,12,000, this explanation is not altogether satisfying. In the Central Division the closing balance of Rs. 1,51,000 in Ahmednagar includes, besides the educational portion of Rs. 63,000, a balance of about Rs. 18,000 from the special Government grant of Rs. 30,000 reserved for expenditure on roads. The explanation given in the case of the West Khándesh Board is that the Government grants for the Technical School and the Nawápur-Borzar road and certain popular contributions were received late in the year, while scarcity of labour prevented the execution by the Public Works Department of some of the works budgetted for. In Sátára about half the excess balance is educational, and the presence of the other half is attributed to the inability of the Táluka Boards to work up to their budgetted expenditure in the absence of qualified surveyors, who have, however, since been appointed. In the Southern Division the state of affairs in regard to the accumulation of excessive balances is generally ascribed to the dearth of labour, the inefficiency of such labour as is procurable, the difficulty of getting overseers, and the absence of contractors to undertake works. The Dhárwár Board has accumulated a balance of no less than Rs. $2\frac{1}{2}$ lákhs, a fact for which no explanation is forthcoming. In the case of Belgaum the Commissioner observes as follows:—

“It is surprising that works could not be undertaken by the Táluka Boards of Chikodi, Athni, Gokák and Parasgad and that the allotments were withdrawn by the District Local Board. The position is clearly unsatisfactory. It is closely connected with the difficulty of securing engineering staff noted above, but it is also uncertain whether the Boards fully recognize the necessity of working up to their budgets and avoiding the accumulation of large balances when they are not deliberately being accumulated for the execution of important schemes.”

The Governor in Council concurs in the last remark and deprecates the aimless accumulation of unnecessarily large balances. While recognizing that the labour difficulty constitutes in many cases a serious obstacle to rapid and regular expenditure on budgetted works, he considers that the difficulty is not insurmountable if organized measures are taken and if the interest and co-operation of the non-official members and the people can be secured. Among the organized measures indicated the principal one is the engagement of an adequate and efficient engineering staff, a requisite in which most of the Boards are evidently lacking. The Governor in Council trusts that the Presidents of the Boards will give their special attention to this question.

16. So far as the Northern Division is concerned, there appears to have been nothing noteworthy in connexion with the working of Works Committees. In the Central Division these bodies are reported to have done useful work in East Khándesh. In West Khándesh the Committees of the eastern sub-division evinced much interest in the supervision of the works in their respective charges, but in the western sub-division the non-official members were found to be apathetic. Works Committees have recently been appointed by the District and Táluka Boards of the Násik District. In Sátára, only the Táluka Boards have such Committees, as the works of the District Board are practically all carried out by the Public Works Department. With regard to the Sholápur District it is remarked that the entire burden of

supervision fell on the official members of the Committees. In the Southern Division, Works Committees have for some time been in existence in connexion with all Táluka Boards, but it is reported that few of the members realize the responsibility entrusted to them or take the trouble to visit the works regularly and report progress. The Collector of Kānara states that the works under execution in his district were generally assigned to individual members for supervision and that visitors' books were maintained in order to ensure regular inspection and reporting. This system is not referred to by the other Collectors, and the Commissioner, S. D., is enquiring whether it is in force elsewhere. The Governor in Council is disposed to think that procedure on these lines might with advantage be adopted generally. The Commissioner in Sind should be requested to include information regarding Works Committees in his future annual reports on the administration of Local Boards.

17. Although presenting no features of special interest the administration of the Local Boards of the Presidency during the year under review appears on the whole to have been of a satisfactory character.

General remarks. It is gratifying to note that steady progress is being maintained by the Boards towards meeting local needs, and that, within the rather rigid limits of their resources, they are working conscientiously to improve the amenities of life in the areas which they control. More extended communications and the improvement of village water-supplies continue to represent the principal needs of these areas, notwithstanding the fact that for many years these objects of expenditure have consistently absorbed a large proportion of their revenues.

The interest of the non-official members in the practical work of the Boards does not yet appear to have been generally aroused. Nevertheless there are indications of an improvement in this respect which are distinctly hopeful. In the institution of Works Committees and the due encouragement of the active members of such bodies lies, as is observed by the Commissioner, C. D., the best hope for the future. The fact that so considerable a proportion of the Boards' funds is absorbed by such objects as education, which is largely under departmental control, establishments, and the upkeep of existing works, while the openings for improving their revenues are so restricted, accounts to a great extent for non-official apathy. Local fund administration, however, offers a considerable field of activity for those non-official members who are willing to sacrifice their time and devote their energies to the supervision and inspection of works undertaken for the benefit of their constituents, and the Governor in Council is desirous that every effort should be made to enlist the assistance and co-operation of such members in this direction. He is glad to notice further indications of co-operation on the part of the rural population in carrying out minor works of local utility. In Ahmedabad active interest in local fund works appears to be generally confined to the *mukhis* and other leading men of the villages, but in the Surat District the villagers as a body are reported in several instances to have given assistance both in cash and labour. An example is the construction entirely at their own expense of a school building at Saniahamad in the Chorāsi Táluka by the villagers and its presentation to the Local Board. In the Central Division the system of entrusting small works to villagers was attended with fair results in the Ahmednagar and West Khāndesh Districts. In the eastern tálukas of the former district in particular, several works were satisfactorily carried out entirely by the villagers themselves. In the Southern Division and in Sind no such instances of co-operation on the part of the people are reported this year, although the preceding year's review contained a special reference to the successful institution in the Ratnágiri District of a system of getting petty village works carried out by voluntary labour. It is most desirable that a movement of this character should be encouraged in every way possible, and Government trust that endeavours will be made to extend it throughout the areas administered by the Local Boards of this Presidency.

18. Copies of this Resolution should be submitted to the Secretary of State and the Government of India, and should be forwarded to all Commissioners and Collectors and to the other officers and departments concerned.
