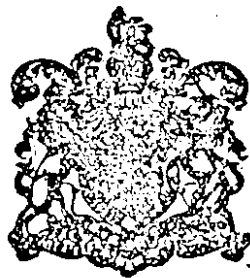

The reports from the Commissioner in Sind and the Commissioners of Divisions on the administration of local boards in the Bombay Presidency during the year 1916-17.

RESOLUTION.

*Number of boards.*—During the year under review the number of district and taluka local boards in the Presidency including Sind remained the same as in the preceding year, namely, 26 and 215, respectively.

2. *Area and population.*—Sind shows a nominal decrease of 9·74 square miles in the area administered by its local boards due to the erosion by the river Indus in the Upper Sind Frontier District.

The total population shown in Statement no. I appended to this Resolution is 18,072,041. This figure includes, however, the population of municipal areas. Orders have been issued to exclude the latter in future.

3. *Constitution.*—During the year under review the district local boards of Ahmedabad, Surat and Thana in the Northern Division, Ahmednagar, East Khandesh, West Khandesh, Nasik, Satara and Sholapur in the Central Division, and Belgaum, Dharwar, Kanara and Kolaba in the Southern Division were reconstituted by reducing the number of nominated members to one-half the number of elected members. The taluka local board of Peint in the Nasik district has been granted elective franchise, with effect from 1st February 1919. In Sind the elective franchise was extended to the district local board of Thar and Parkar, and the number of members was increased from 16 to 24.

4. *Elections.*—In the Northern Division triennial elections were held in all the boards in the Thana district, in the Central Division they were held in the Nasik and Sholapur districts, and in eight talukas of the Satara district, and in the Southern Division in the districts of Belgaum, Kolaba, Kanara and Dharwar. In no case was any interest evinced in the elections, while there were no candidates at all forthcoming for two groups in each of the Satara and Sholapur districts and for three groups in the Nasik district. In Sind fresh elections were held in the taluka local board of Johi in the Larkana district.

5. *Meetings.*—The total number of meetings held during the year fell from 1,465 to 1,445, of which 80 proved abortive for want of a quorum. The rule regarding the holding of half-yearly meetings was complied with by all the district boards except Thana where only one meeting was held. No explanation is forthcoming for this default. Two taluka local boards in the Northern Division, five in the Central Division and one in the Southern Division failed to hold the prescribed minimum number of meetings in the year. It is reported that the taluka local board of Kapadvanj in the Northern Division did not hold the fourth statutory meeting as there was no business to be transacted. No explanation is forthcoming in the other cases. The average percentage of members attending the meetings in the Northern, Central and Southern Divisions and Sind was 58·92, 51·56, 57·72 and 51·86 as against 62·91, 48·39, 53·8 and 53·85, respectively, in the previous year.

6. *Income.*—The aggregate income of the boards rose from Rs. 77,20,000 to Rs. 86,04,000, a notable increase of Rs. 8,84,000. The

following statement compares the receipts under the principal heads of revenue with those of the preceding year :—

7. *Land revenue.*—There was a net increase of Rs. 7,000 under this head. Towards this the Northern and Central Divisions contributed Rs. 21,000, while in the Southern Division and Sind there was a counterbalancing decrease of Rs. 14,000. As remarked by the Commissioner, S. D., the income under this head varies with the public demand for sand and kankar. In the Northern Division the increase was due to larger realizations from quarrying fees in the Ahmedabad and Thana districts. The receipts in the Broach district more than doubled and in the Panch Mahals nearly trebled those in the previous year. In Sind the districts mainly responsible for the decrease are Sukkur, Hyderabad and Larkana. This decrease was partly counterbalanced by an increase in the receipts on account of fisheries in the Nawabshah and Karachi districts.

8. *Provincial rates.*—The very considerable increase of Rs. 5,81,000 under this head was shared by all the Divisions and Sind, the Northern (Rs. 3,24,000) and Central (Rs. 1,99,000) Divisions being the principal contributors. In the Northern Division the increase was distributed over all the districts, Kaira alone having contributed Rs. 1,75,582. An excellent season led to the recovery of the local fund cess which had been suspended in the previous year, in addition to the full collection of the cess for the current year. In the Thana district there were abnormal receipts on account of recoveries of non-agricultural assessment especially in Salsette and the sale of land or trees and other fluctuating revenue. In the Central Division the increase, which was spread over all districts except Sholapur, was mainly due to (i) the recovery of arrears, (ii) adjustments in last year's accounts and (iii) the introduction of the new system of accounts in Ahmednagar and East Khandesh. The decrease in Sholapur is ascribed to smaller collections of suspended land revenue. In the Southern Division the increase was shared by Belgaum, Kanara and Kolaba. In Belgaum it was chiefly due to the adjustment of cess calculated on the land revenue paid to Inamdars for the previous year and partly to enhanced rates owing to the revision settlement of Athni, Chikodi, and Sampgaon talukas. The increase in Kanara and Kolaba, however, was not real but only due to the change of system in accounts. The decrease in Bijapur was due to smaller collections in consequence of the postponement of the March instalment of land revenue up to the 5th April in 223 villages, in Dharwar to the fact that the advance receipts for the year under report (1916-17) were credited in the preceding year's accounts, and in Ratnagiri to the recovery of large arrears in the previous year. In Sind the increase occurred mainly in the Thar and Parkar, Nawabshah, Karachi and Upper Sind Frontier districts. In the first two districts it was due to the recovery of arrears, and in the last two to the expansion of cultivation consequent on an abundant rainfall and better inundation. A less favourable inundation in the canals higher up the river accounted for the decrease in the Sukkur and Larkana districts.

9. *Education.*—The increase of Rs. 1,78,000 in the receipts under this head was shared by all Divisions and was chiefly due to larger contributions from Government for buildings.

10. *Medical.*—Under this head there was an increase of Rs. 21,000 in the Northern and Southern Divisions and in Sind, counterbalanced by a decrease of Rs. 5,000 in the Central Division. In the Northern Division all

the districts except Surat and the Panch Mahals contributed to the increase. In the Southern Division the increase in the Ratnagiri district is illusory, being due to a change in the procedure of crediting Government grants towards dispensaries. In Sind the increases occurred in the Larkana, Upper Sind Frontier and Thar and Parkar districts. In the first two districts the increase is also ascribed to the change of system in the crediting of Government grants. The increases in the Larkana and Upper Sind Frontier districts are purely nominal; for, whereas hitherto the Government grant was administered by the Accountant General who allotted the savings after deduction of the expenditure to the district local boards, the full grant is now credited direct to the district local boards and the expenditure is also debited separately.

11. The increase of Rs. 20,000 under the head " Police " is due to very large receipts under the Cattle Trespass Act in the Central Division.

12. *Civil works.*—There was an increase of Rs. 98,000 under this head, towards which the Northern Division contributed Rs. 33,000, the Central Division Rs. 7,000, the Southern Division Rs. 40,000 and Sind Rs. 18,000. The main sources of income under this head are (i) tolls on ferries and roads and (ii) Government and popular contributions. As regards (i), annual recurring grants amounting to Rs. 19,800 have been sanctioned by Government since 1915-16 to the district local boards of Ahmedabad, Satara, Kanara and Bijapur as compensation for the abolition of tolls on their roads. Six other district local boards have also agreed to abolish tolls on their roads on the payment of compensation by Government.

During the year under report Broach, Surat and Thana in the Northern Division recorded under the sub-head " Tolls on ferries and roads " an increase of Rs. 10,000, while in the Central Division the receipts from this source showed an increase of Rs. 5,500. In the Southern Division, on the other hand, there was a falling off, Belgaum alone being responsible for a decrease of Rs. 9,000.

Under the other sub-head " Contributions from Government " all the districts in the Northern Division recorded increases in the revenue. In the Southern Division the decrease under " Tolls on ferries and roads " was more than counterbalanced by a rise in Bijapur and Ratnagiri (Rs. 49,000) on account of grants for school buildings and dispensaries. In Sind the increase was shared by the Karachi, Larkana and Sukkur Districts.

Under " Other contributions " there was a decrease of Rs. 12,000 in the Northern Division, shared by all districts except the Panch Mahals. Surat showed a marked falling off from Rs. 12,605 to Rs. 7,623. The decreases were due to the absence of contributions from private persons.

13. *Expenditure.*—The total expenditure of the boards amounted to Rs. 81,60,099 against Rs. 85,35,691 in the preceding year. The following statement shows the distribution of expenditure under the several heads as compared with that in the preceding year :—

The more important variations in the above figures are commented on below :—

14. *Education.*—The expenditure under this head fell off by Rs. 35,000 as compared with the preceding year's outlay of Rs. 35,99,000. There was a

decrease of Rs. 53,000 in the Central Division and in Sind, counterbalanced by an increase of Rs. 18,000 in the Northern and Southern Divisions. In the Northern Division the expenditure showed an increase of Rs. 3,023, which was shared by Ahmedabad, Panch Mahals and Surat. In the Central Division all districts except Nasik contributed to the decrease, which was mainly due to the curtailment of expenditure on miscellaneous items of minor importance. In the Southern Division there was a marked increase of Rs. 20,000 in Dharwar owing to the grant of code pay and promotion to trained teachers. It is regrettable that in this division there was no marked progress in primary education, the number of schools remaining stationary. The demand for new schools in Bijapur could not be met as the villagers could not provide suitable buildings. In Dharwar the number of local board schools increased by one, but the number of aided schools declined by 54 as many of them which had been registered during the previous year were subsequently found ineligible for a grant and struck off the list. In Sind the decrease occurred in all the districts except Karachi and Sukkur and was chiefly due to fewer promotions to teachers and a smaller expenditure on furniture and class books. The noticeable increase in the Sukkur district was due to a contribution of Rs. 10,000 towards the construction of the Hopeful Academy at Shikarpur.

15. *Medical.*—The expenditure under this head showed a net decrease of Rs. 4,000 on the preceding year's outlay. The Central and Southern Divisions and Sind showed a decrease of Rs. 6,573, Rs. 2,381 and Rs. 6,393, respectively, which was counterbalanced by an increase of Rs. 11,261 in the Northern Division. In the Northern Division all the districts except the Panch Mahals contributed towards the increase, Thana topping the list with an increase of Rs. 4,000. The decrease in the Central Division calls for no remarks. In the Southern Division the decrease was shared by the Dharwar, Kanara and Kolaba districts. The remaining districts, *viz.*, Belgaum, Bijapur and Ratnagiri, showed an increase. The increase in Bijapur was due to the establishment of a new dispensary at Hungund and to the purchase of quinine worth Rs. 1,988 against Rs. 77 in the preceding year. In Dharwar, in spite of increased contributions (Rs. 2,437) made to the village sanitary committees, there was a considerable fall in the total expenditure, due to the refund in the previous year of Government grants amounting to Rs. 7,400. The Board purchased 5 lakhs of grains of quinine, of which 429,000 grains were distributed free, the rest being sold through the agency of the District Sanitary Association. The Collectors were asked by the Commissioner to advise the boards to introduce the Punjab system of quinization of children in schools situated in malarious tracts and to maintain a register of the children so treated and a record of spleen census. Under this system quinine is to be given in doses of 4 to 9 grains each according to the age of the students on two days in the week. Two schools in Dharwar acted on the advice with satisfactory results. The experiment was tried also in the districts of Karwar and Ratnagiri, but as it was not conducted throughout the year, no reliable inference could be drawn. In Sind the falling off in expenditure was shared by the Karachi and Sukkur districts.

16. *Scientific and other minor departments.*—Under this head there was a decrease of Rs. 9,000 in the Northern and Central Divisions and Sind, counterbalanced by an increase of Rs. 2,000 in the Southern Division. The decrease in the Northern Division is insignificant and calls for no remark, while the falling off (Rs. 2,274) in the Central Division has not been explained. In the Southern Division the increase in Belgaum was due to the fitting up of the veterinary dispensary at Athni and to the rise in the cost of drugs. Good work is reported to have been done by the district local board, Kanara, in checking cattle disease, 5,800 animals having been inoculated during the year. In Sind the decrease of Rs. 6,000 in Sukkur is ascribed to the fact that no horse or cattle show was held during the year under report and to the inability of the Board to purchase any stallions.

17. *Civil Works*.—The expenditure under this head fell off by Rs. 2,68,000 as compared with the preceding year's outlay of Rs. 37,46,295. The Southern Division alone contributed Rs. 1,28,800 towards this decrease. The expenditure for the whole Presidency represents 42·63 per cent. of the entire expenditure of the boards against a corresponding proportion of 43·9 per cent. in the preceding year. The following statement compares the charges under the various sub-heads with those of the preceding year:—

18. *Communications*.—The major portion of the outlay on "Civil Works" was, as usual, devoted to the construction and repair of roads and bridges. In the Northern Division all the districts recorded decreases amounting in the aggregate to Rs. 88,000 under "Original Works" and Rs. 29,000 under "Repairs". In the Central Division the expenditure on original works fell by Rs. 31,000 and on repairs by Rs. 40,000 owing to shortage of labour, while in the Southern Division the expenditure under this head fell from Rs. 4,98,000 to Rs. 4,23,000, and in Sind from Rs. 4,35,000 to Rs. 4,27,000.

19. *Water supply*.—The expenditure under this head showed a net decrease of Rs. 63,000 on the preceding year's outlay of Rs. 3,32,000, all the Divisions and Sind contributing. In the Northern Division the expenditure showed a net increase of Rs. 2,770 under "Original Works", to which Kaira, Broach and Surat contributed, the remaining districts showing a decrease of Rs. 18,000. The increase (Rs. 13,000) in Kaira was due to the carrying out during the year of original works for the improvement of water supply, which had previously been postponed owing to the small income from provincial rates. In the Thana district 27 new wells were constructed and completed at a cost of about Rs. 15,000, and Rs. 8,600 were expended on repairs to wells and other sources of water supply. Under "Repairs" the aggregate decrease amounted to Rs. 14,939, which was shared by all the districts. Thana heads the list in this respect with a decrease of Rs. 4,852 for which no explanation is forthcoming. The decrease of Rs. 20,000 in the Central Division was due to smaller expenditure on wells owing to an ample water supply. In the Southern Division the only important work was a well at Gandigwad constructed at a cost of Rs. 6,837 and provided with pumps. In Sind 28 new wells were sunk during the year against 35 in the preceding year.

20. *Arboriculture*.—The expenditure under this head fell off by Rs. 6,000 as compared with the preceding year's outlay of Rs. 1,48,000. The Northern, Central and Southern Divisions contributed towards the decrease, which was to some extent counterbalanced by an increase of Rs. 3,000 in Sind. In the Northern Division the decrease (Rs. 3,600) was shared by all the districts except Surat and Thana. In Kaira the local board took over from the Public Works Department the work of planting and preserving road-side trees on local board roads. In order to encourage the planting of trees the board decided to offer a reward of Rs. 2 to selected villagers for each well-established plant and to grant sanads when the trees were well established. In Surat the expenditure amounted to Rs. 7,674 as

against Rs. 7,227 last year. Of the former sum Rs. 4,967 were spent on roads in charge of the Public Works Department. Planting operations were in progress throughout the district. In some cases the trees perished owing partly to the unsuitableness of the soil and partly to lack of supervision. Mr. W. F. Hudson as Collector of Surat is reported to have done his best to make local officers take an interest in tree planting. In the Central Division Poona is responsible for a large decrease of Rs. 4,407, which was due to a smaller budget allotment under this head. In Sind the total length of roads newly planted with trees during the year under report was 115 miles.

21. *Closing balances.*—The table appended to this resolution shows, with divisional totals, the opening and closing balances of the district local boards. The aggregate of the closing balances of all the boards of the Presidency amounted to Rs. 28½ lakhs against Rs. 23¼ lakhs in the previous year. These closing balances are considerably in excess of the prescribed minima. It may be noted that a considerable portion of these balances belongs to the educational fund, the spending of which is in most cases retarded by the delays incidental to the acquisition of sites and to the preparation of plans for school buildings. In the Northern Division the President, district local board, Broach, reports that efforts are being made to reduce the balance gradually to the prescribed minimum. The only district recording a falling off (Rs. 21,161) below the prescribed minimum (Rs. 60,000) was Surat. The Collector explains that the reason why the prescribed minimum was not maintained was that after the budget was passed, the board received a demand for Rs. 22,991 for urgent repairs to the Hope Bridge and that although the board was not responsible for its management, yet as it was essential that the repairs should be carried out during the year, the board paid their share of the cost by drawing on the balance. The Commissioner, N. D., should be requested to inform the board that the sanction of Government should have been obtained to the reduction of the balance below the prescribed minimum. No reasons are forthcoming for the excess of Rs. 1,37,816 in the Thana District.

In the Central Division the unspent balances of the boards at the end of the year aggregated Rs. 9,23,845 as against Rs. 7,90,191 in the preceding year. The discrepancy between the closing balance shown in last year's report and the opening balance shown in the year under report for the Central Division is due to the subsequent adjustment of accounts. In Ahmednagar, East Khandesh, Poona and Sholapur districts the surplus balances include a large amount of unspent educational funds. The excess in West Khandesh is due to the fact that a sum of Rs. 22,400 was held in reserve for specific purposes in the supplementary budget, and works amounting to Rs. 50,000 could not be carried out owing to the prevalence of plague. The excess in Nasik includes (i) Rs. 14,800, being the unspent portion of the educational fund; (ii) Rs. 4,800, being the cost of medical stores for which bills were not received; (iii) Rs. 16,000, which represents the amount budgeted for district local board works in charge of the Public Works Department but not utilized as the works were not carried out; and (iv) sums allotted for taluka board works, which remained unexpended. In Satara the excess is partly owing to the advance of Rs. 45,000 on account of local fund cess due for adjustment and partly to the large amount of the educational portion of local funds which remained unspent for want of establishment needed for the preparation of plans and estimates for school-houses. The Commissioner, S. D., observes that as works are carried on in April and May and the cess collections are made in January, February and March, the 1st April generally shows the local board chest full. The balances are still large in Belgaum, Bijapur, Dharwar and Ratnagiri. The reason for this accumulation is that large Government grants were received during the past three or four years and the bulk of the balances represent educational balances for school buildings which could not be constructed. In Belgaum the educational balances are decreasing, but a greater portion of them was intended for new school buildings, the construction of which was postponed owing to the announcement made in Government Circular, Educational Department, no. 3390, dated the 22nd November 1915, that in respect of all proposed educational buildings not actually commenced or of sites or equipment for



such buildings not actually purchased, the payment of any grants which might have been promised by Government to local bodies would be suspended until the financial situation improved. The conditions of the Circular have since been relaxed and all local boards and municipalities have been informed that claims for grants which have been promised by Government but the payment of which has been suspended under the terms of the circular will now be considered if renewed and that new applications for building grants will also be entertained, subject, however, to the distinct understanding that such claims and applications will be met in so far only as the funds available for the time being for this purpose permit. In Bijapur most of the works provided were carried out. Some water works in Sindgi and many in Bagewadi were not undertaken as the wells were full owing to heavy late rains. In Dharwar the balance still continues to be large. In Kanara the balances were due to budgeted works not having been completed during the year. For the accumulation in Kolaba and Ratnagiri no special reasons have been given, but the usual difficulties connected with labour may be responsible for the excess. In Sind the balances show an increase of Rs. 1,79,286 over those of the previous year. As regards this increase the Commissioner in Sind remarks as follows:—

“ It is a matter for regret that the closing balances of all the districts in Sind exceed the previous year's balances and are still considerably in excess of the prescribed minima. Possibly this may be due to the general feeling that all expenditure during the war should be curtailed, but it is an old fault and one to which the Commissioner will again draw the attention of all the boards. It is not a proper excuse that certain works could not be completed within the year. There are many urgent needs in all districts, and it is a common feature to find towards the end of the year each board stating that it has no balance to sanction further work and then declaring a balance when the year is closed. Care and caution in the expenditure of public money is essential; but the timid finance of the district local boards will always, if persisted in, diminish the value of their administration. 42 per cent. of the balances represents funds ear-marked for educational purposes, which are at the disposal of the Educational Department. To this extent the boards are not responsible.”

22. *Works Committees.*—In the Northern Division works committees were appointed in all the districts for the supervision of works in progress. In addition to these, 50 village committees were formed in the Kaira district which proved useful for supervising the works and procuring carts and labour for them. With a view to ascertaining whether works were occasionally supervised by the members of the works committees, the system of maintaining a visitors' book was introduced in Kaira and the Panch Mahals. In Surat the members generally are said to evince little interest in local board works. In Ahmedabad, Kaira and Broach the members are reported to have taken a fair amount of interest in the performance of their duties. In the Central Division the works committees in West Khandesh are reported to have done well, but those in East Khandesh and Satara have not proved a success. At Belvandi the villagers showed considerable interest in the construction of the village chavdi, dharamshala and school-house. In last year's review it was observed that in the West Khandesh district the system of giving small works on contract to village patels and village panchas did not find favour with villagers and that the Commissioner had asked the Collector to make a special inquiry into the matter and to report the result. The Collector's report shows that in the larger villages the villagers sometimes agree to do the work but that in the smaller villages—particularly where there are Bhil Patils—the system does not work. In the Southern Division with the exception of a few non-official members little interest was taken by the members in local board works. As regards the system of electing village committees for supervising and carrying out village works, to which reference was made last year, the Collector of Kanara reports that these committees were constituted in all talukas but that it was only in Kumta that works were entrusted to committees for execution and that the latter showed keen interest in carrying them out.

This system was commended to other boards. The boards of Bijapur, Kolaba and Ratnagiri have adopted it, and those of Dharwar and Belgaum are considering the question of its adoption. In Sind the works committees in the Karachi, Sukkur and Larkana districts showed keen interest in local fund works. The other district officers have not directly touched on the working of these committees, but reports have been received that the non-official members in the Nawabshah, Thar and Parkar and Upper Sind Frontier districts are apathetic as regards the supervision of works. The Commissioner is asking the officers concerned to give in their future reports more detailed information regarding works committees.

23. *General.*—Although presenting no features of special interest the administration of local boards in the Presidency during the year under review appears on the whole to have been of a satisfactory character. The income of the boards rose from Rs. 77,20,000 to Rs. 86,04,000 while the expenditure fell off by Rs. 3,75,600 as compared with the preceding year's outlay of Rs. 85,35,700. The increase in income chiefly occurred in the Northern and Central Divisions owing to the recovery of local fund cess which was suspended last year.

Instances of a movement on the part of the people in the direction of themselves undertaking works of a purely local character instead of remaining entirely dependent on grants from public funds are noticeable in the Northern Division. Very useful work is reported to have been done of recent years in some villages of the Kaira district in extending overcrowded and congested village sites by the acquisition of land outside the village. A similar improvement was effected during the year for the extension of the village of Tarapura in the Anand Taluka, and the whole of the cost of acquisition was paid by the Waghiris, for whose benefit the land was acquired. The people of Jalapur have built a dispensary costing about Rs. 12,000 and handed it over to the district local board with an endowment of Rs. 5,000 and a contribution of Rs. 1,200 towards its maintenance during the year under review.

Increased grants from Government have helped the boards to effect some improvement in the pay of teachers. Roads are a great desideratum in the Broach and Surat districts, but the financial condition of the boards arrests progress. The question of provincializing some of the local board roads is under the consideration of Government. In view, however, of the situation created by the war it does not seem possible for a long time to find funds for the purpose.

In Sind various successful cattle and agricultural shows were held during the year, and the activity in this direction was well maintained. At such shows held in the Nawabshah district races were organized and the surplus of donations received from the zamindars over expenses amounting to Rs. 3,200 was presented to the war relief fund.
