Report on the Schools Committee's Accounts.

(Note.—The figures in this report are in lakhs of Rupees unless otherwise expressly stated.)

The year under report opened with a balance of Rs. .20. The grant sanctioned for the contribution to the Schools Committee including renewed and additional grants aggregated to Rs. 40.88 against this the actual contribution paid to the Schools Committee amounted to Rs. 39.92. At the end of the year a sum of Rs. .20 was left in the School Fund being the minimum cash balance required under By-law No. 10 of the Schools Committee's By-laws. In addition to this a sum of Rs. 1,05,291-13-0 being the amount of contribution drawn in excess by the Schools Committee and held by them on 31st March 1941 was treated as an advance in the accounts of the Municipal General Fund as on 31stMarch 1941.

During the year a sum of Rs. 391-13-0 being the excess or irregular payments made on account of salaries, allowances etc. covering about 53 cases were ordered to be recovered from the staff and the recoveries amounting to Rs. 189-9-0 covering 43 cases have already been made leaving 10 cases for Rs. 202-4-0 for which replies are awaited. Various other omissions and inaccuracies were detected in the course of test sudit and some have been got rectified and others are under correspondence. As already pointed out in the last audit report this state of affairs is due to lack of effective supervision and control over the day to day routine work to be done before any payments are made.

- 7. (i) Government Grant received during the year amounted to Rs. 9.50. As pointed out in previous audit reports estimated rents for Municipal Schools located in buildings built at Municipal cost or donated by public are not assessed and charged to the School Fund and consequently are not included in the figure of cost in respect of the Primary Education.
- (ii) Provident Fund—The suggestion made in the last audit report for tallying the Provident Fund balances shown in the Schools Committee's Accounts with those maintained in the Chief Accountant's Department by making proper adjustments for interest allowed on individual accounts or in the alternative to discontinue showing the liabilities on account of Provident Fund in the Schools Committee's balance sheet, has not been given effect to.
 - 8. Arrears of fees on 31st March 1941 as certified by the Secretary, Schools Committee were Rs. 2,274-9-0
- 9. The cash balance of Rs. 2,873-7-10 in office trasury was counted and found correct. The balance in the Bank as per Cash Book, viz., Rs. 1,39,655-14-4 was reconciled with the Bank Statements and the certificates.
- '10. The safe custody receipts for Government and other securities lodged with the Imperial Bank of India were examined and found in order.
- 11. A comprative statement showing the payments for the years 1939-40 and 1940-41 and detailed audit remarks on the Schools Committee's Accounts are appended hereto marked respectively Appendix A and Appendix B.
- 12. Appendix C gives month by month the position of the number of teachers to the pupils. These figures have been supplied by the Secretary Schools Committee.
- 13. The balances under Deposit Account, excepting the unclaimed wages deposits, as shown in the balance sheet could not be verified with the individual accounts as no deposit register in proper form is maintained showing the details.
- 14. Amounts of wages remaining unclaimed since the year 1934, are still held by the Schools Committee on the Deposit Account. In conformity with the practice followed by the Chief Accountant's Office such wage remaining unclaimed over 5 years should be written off and the amounts transferred to the Chief Accountant' Office.
- 15. During the year under report in one case rent for additional accommodation for a school at Rs. 22 per month for six months aggregating Rs. 132 was paid although possession of the accommodation was not taken by the Head Master of the School. This is apparantly due to the system of making payments of rents without obtaining monthly certificates from the Head Masters. The necessity of obtaining such certificates was already suggested in the Audit report for 1938-39.

APPENDIX 'B'.

Detailed audit remarks on the Schools Committee's Accounts.

Audit objections are grouped under the following heads:-

- I. Revenue and Receipts.
- II. Recoveries of excess or wrong payments.
- III. Extra measures resulting in increased expenditure.
- IV. Internal audit and control.
- V. Non-observance of Municipal Service Rules.
- VI. General.

I. Revenue and Receipts.

1. It was pointed out in the last year's report that two sub-tenants were in arrears of Rs. 200 and Rs. 110 M.C.A.1201 since 1937:—

28-6-1940

- (a) No legal steps were found to have been taken for the recovery of Rs. 200 as decided under Schools Committee's Resolution No. 1274 dated the 29th November 1939. The Secretary, Schools Committee was written to again in the matter and the Schools Committee have since approached the Standing Committee to write off the amount stating that the party is not traceable (vide Standing Committee's Resolution No. 2080, dated the 26th March 1941).
- (b) The other sub-tenant who was allowed to pay up his arrears amounting to Rs. 10 by monthly instalments of Rs. 5 from December 1939 was found not paying the same regularly. Attention of the Secretary, Schools Committee was drawn to this who placed the matter before the Schools Committee who under their Resolution No. 1633 dated the 12th February 1941 asked the Secretary to write to the party to clear up the arrears of rent by regular monthly instalments. There is still a balance of Rs. 80 remaining unrecovered from him.
- 2. A teacher who was in occupation of two rooms in a property handed over to the Municipality was

 allowed to continue to occupy the same on payment of a rent of Rs. 5 per month under Schools

 Committee's Resolution No. 1303, dated the 18th December 1940. It was noticed that his name was neither entered in the Sub-Tenant's Register nor the rent for December 1940 recovered from him. Secretary's Reply is awaited.
 - (3) In seven cases sub-tenants had run into arrears for periods from July 1940, on wards. The M.C.A.1523 Secretary, Schools Committee was written to for effecting recoveries of these arrears.

The Sub-Tenant's Register was found maintained in an unsatisfactory manner as in one case although no recovery was made amount was found posted as if recovered.

Reply of the Secretary in the matter is awaited.

There are very few cases of rent recoveries to be made by the Schools Committee and they should be attended to and recovered with scruplous care at the end of each month without piling up arrears which may require write off ultimately.

11.—Recoveries of excess or wrong payments.

(a) Out of the three cases of excess or wrong payments reported as outstanding in the last audit report recovery in one case has been made leaving the amount of Rs. 2-7-0 in two cases unrecovered.

The authorities should show more promptness to attend to these excess payments.

III.—Extra measures resulting in increased expenditure.

- (i) A lady-teacher deputed to the Training College as a stipendary was found granted leave on half

 M.C.A.1524 pay. The Secretary, Schools Committee was requested to state the authority under which both the stipends as well as leave salary were granted. As a result the leave granted was cancelled under the Schools Committee Resolution No. 1773 dated the 12th March 1941 and the leave salary amounting to Rs. 33-11-0 was recovered from her.
- (2) A scout and cub masters was paid 'out of pockt expenses' allowance for the period he was on leave for three months. Thes was objected to in Audit. And the Schools Committee under their Resolution No. 1336 dated the 18th December 1940 approved of the payment already made and decided that in future out of pocket expenses allowance should not be paid to the Scout and Cub-Master for the period of their absence on leave exceeding one month.
- (3) Certain Head Masters and teachers who worked in the Attendance Teachers' Scheme from 22nd

 M.C.A.1487

 July 1940 to 21st September 1940 on an allowance of Rs. 15 and Rs. 10 respectively were also
 paid grain compensation allowance although their monthly emoluments including the
 allowance for working the Attendance Teachers' Scheme exceeded the limit of Rs. 50
 fixed for the purposes of granting grain compensation.

A list of 37 teachers to whom an amount of Rs. 107-6-0 was paid in excess was forwarded to the Secretary Schools Committee for effecting necessary recoveries, with a request to submit a complete list of such other employees and to effect recoveries from them also. The Secretary however contended that as these teachers worked in the above Scheme during their leisure time and outside the scheduled hours of duty in the Schools, It was doubtful if the emoluments earned by doing additional work in their leisure hours could be taken into consideration while arriving at the total amount of salary drawn for grain compensation purposes. He further stated that the teachers were taking a serious objection to refunding the amount.

The Secretary's attention was drawn to the Commissioner's circular in which whole position is clearly stated. The grain compensation allowance is granted only to such employees whose monthly emoluments did not exceed Rs. 50, irrespective of whether the duties were performed within or without the scheduled time and that excepting house rent and conveyance allowance all other emoluments earned by the Municipal servants were to be taken into account. The Secretary was therefore advised to effect early recoveries of the excess amounts paid.

Similarly a lit of 24 teachers of the Morning Classes to whom an aggregate sum of Rs. 83-3-0 was paid in excess on account of grain compensation allowance for the period from January to March 1940 was sent to the Secretary requesting him to prepare a complete list of such teachers also and to effecte recoveries.

No reply is yet received.

IV. Internal Audit and Control.

- (1) Peons were being appointed in vacant posts by the Secretary, Schools Committee and paid as such M.C.A.1428

 4-10-1940 without obtaining requisite sanction of the Schools Committee. The Secretary was informed that the practice was not in order. He explained that it was misunderstood by his office that the Secretary, Schools Committee could make acting appointments in vacancies of any nature for a period upto three months and that care would be taken in future to obtain sanctions of the Schools Committee for appointments to vacant posts. The sanctions for the appointments already made were obtained subsequently.
- (2) A mistake of Rs. 100 in the total of grain compensation column of the summary of Urdu Schools M.C.A.1188

 pay-bills paid on 2nd May 1940 was detected. However as this was counter balanced by a corresponding mistake in the total of Provident Fund subscriptions column on deductions side the net amount payable remained unaffected. To a querry as to how the mistake in case of Provident Fund subscriptions could not be noticed by his Department through subsidiary books of Provident Fund Accounts, the reply of the Secretary, Schools Committee was that the office was busy with closing of accounts for 1939-40 and the mistake eacaped attention.
- (3) Payments made during April, May and June 1940 under supplementary pay-bills to the M.C.A.1268

 Superintendent's Office staff were not recorded in the respective Original pay-bills. It was pointed out to the Secretary, Schools Committee that this was a serious omission and carried to the bill clerk by the Secretary, Schools Committee in this respect.

(4) (a) M.C.A.1060	Absentee statements are not being verified with leave records. Variations in the leaves as shown

(b) Effective Certificates.—In several cases persons who remained absent after the submission of paybills were not reported in the effective certificates with the result that such persons were paid full amounts of salaries drawn in the pay-bills although they were not effective upto the end of the month. Some of the effective certificates were issued before the expiry of the period covered—by the certificates, while in some cases payments were made without obtaining such certificates. Some of the certificates were not signed by the heads of Schools. Variations between the dates of absence as reported in the effective certificates and as shown in the absence statements were also noticed.

- (c) In some cases payments of salaries were found made without obtaining discharge of payments from the employees.
 - (d) In a few cases certificates for the maintenance of motor car were not obtained in proper form.
 - (5) In two cases contrary to the Rules conveyance allowance was subjected to Provident Fund deductions.

 tions. On pointing out this to the Secretary, Schools Committee the deductions were refunded.
- (6) The practice of preparing annual promotion statements which had resulted in several excess payments in the past was allowed to be restarted on the representation of the Secretary, Schools Committee that it would avoid preparation of many supplementary bills. However while obtaining sanction of the Schools Committee under their Resolution No. 944 of 25th October 1940 for restarting the practice, a condition was laid down at the suggestion of this office that no payment should be made unless the dates and the amounts of increments were verified from the service books and Service records and the Secretary's orders obtained at the time of actual payments. It ws noticed that the promotion statements of Marathi Schools for 1940-41 were not accordingly verified and submitted to the Secretary, Schools Committee although the increments were allowed and paid through pay-sheets for October 1940. This again resulted in several excess payments of promotions.

The Secretary states that hereafter the increment statements will be prepared separately for each month and will be checked before payments are made.

- (7) Teachers who remained absent in continuation of X'mas Holidays in January 1941 were paid their salaries for the full month of December 1940 before their leave question was settled on the assumption that the X'mas holidays would be allowed to be prefixed to their leave. The Secretary, was informed that such payments made before leave questions were settled were irregular.
 - (8) Two part-time teachers and a part-time peon were found paid from the dates earlier than those sanctioned by the Schools Committee. In reply to audit reference the Secretary, Schools Committee stated that wrong dates were reported to the Schools Committee which were got rectified. (Resolution No. 1608, dated the 12th February 1941.)
 - (9) (a) In one case receipt acknowledged by a party was for lesser amount than that actually paid. M.C.A.1083

- b) Payments of bills were found made without obtaining certificates of having received the supply by the certifying officers in some cases.
 - (c) On several vouchers the word 'Original was not found written.

Such irregularities were brought to the notice of the Secretary, Schools Committee and got rectified.

- (d) Receipts for amounts of stipends exceeding Rs. 20 paid to teachers under training were not affixed with one anna revenue stamps in several cases. The Secretary was requested to quote the clause of the Stamp Act, if the stipends were exempted under the Act. The Educational Inspector, Bombay Division who was consulted in this matter by the Secretary, Schools Committee replied that no Government orders in this connection were traceable and that the Heads of the Training Institutions be asked to obtain stamped receipts for stipends. The Secretary has agreed to do this.
 - (10) In payments of subscriptions to magazines for libraries it was observed that in four cases the periods

 A payments of subscriptions to magazines for libraries it was observed that in four cases the periods noted in the Subscriptions were paid as stated in the bills did not agree with the periods noted in the Magazine Register, whereas in one case the bill dated the 17 th January 1939 was found paid on 26th March 1940 after a lapse of over a year. The usual certificates from the librarians that the magazines were received regularly by them and they were required for the period were also not obtained in several cases before making payments. A reference is made to the Secretary, whose reply is waited.
- (11) A teacher was paid his stipends for four months directly in the office of the Schools Committee

 without obtaining from the Principal of the Training College a certificate that he actually attended the College during that period. On a reference being made to the Secretary, Schools Committee, he replied that as the teacher was not paid his stipends for certain techanicality he had personally come to the office for inquiry when he was paid. The Secretary has been asked to get the claims of stipends certified by the training institutions before payments.

The usual agreement bond was not obtained from one teacher before payment of stipends to him. The M.C.A.1536 Secretary's reply is awaited.

(12) A set of clothing was supplied to a peon of the Schools on 30th July 1938 and the bill for it amouting

To Rs. 6-5-0 was paid on 24th October 1940 on production of a duplicate bill by the dealer which was dated the 30th July 1939 debiting the grant for the year 1940-41 marking the duplicate copy of the bill as 'Original' and without a certificate from the Superintendent of Accounts thereon to the effect that the bill was not previously passed by him for payment. Explanation of the Secretary, Schools Committee is awaited.

(13) On test checking the account books in April 1940 of the Binding Class at Foras Road Marathi M.C.A.1042

Boys' Schools where the work of binding the books of Schools and Libraries is also done at the rates fixed by the Schools Committee, receipts for the months of February and March 1940 were found shown less by Rs. 4-10-0 whereas the expenditure incurred in February 1940 was shown in excess by Rs. 2-9-0.

The account books of the class were not being checked by any responsible officer of the Schools Committee. It was suggested that the class expenditure may be made on Imprest system and the charges for binding books adjusted periodically to proper grants. Reply of the Secretary, Schools Committee is awaited.

- (14) A teacher of the Gujarati Class at Lower Colaba School was granted an allowance of Rs. 5 per month from 1st July 1940 on coversion of that class into an independent school as Head Master of that school. The Committee's sanction quoted by the Secretary, Schools Committee for the grant of this allowance, viz., Resolutions Nos. 134(c) dated the 22nd June 1938 and 858 dated the 15th November 1938 relates to the Head Masters of Tamil, Telgu and Malyalam Schools only. The Secretary, has therefore been requested to place the matter before the Schools Committee for early orders in the matter.
 - (15) Tabulation Reigsters of expenditure were not being properly maintained to watch the progress of M.C.A.1106

 reconcilitation of the tabulations with the ledger was also found made.

It was pointed out to the Secretary, Schools Committee that unless these details were completed and the registers reconciled with the ledger it would not be possible for audit to ascertain that the expenditure booked under each head of account was within the sanctioned budget grant. It was also stressed that maintenance of tabulations and watching the progress of expenditure against the budget grants was the elementary and primary functions of the accounts section and under any circumstances it should not be neglected.

Occupied by the Schools were vacated. The cheques were cancelled and the amounts of the cancelled cheques were kept in deposit account instead of being credited back to the grant. The Secretary, was requested to effect the necessary adjustment and to explain the circumstances under which the cheques for rents not due were drawn and taken to deposit account. The Secretary in reply stated that the cheques for payment of rents are drawn in the first week of each month and it takes some time before complete order papers regarding the changes in the Schools premises are received by the Accounts Section.

The explanation of the Secretary could not be accepted as in these particular cases intimations of the premises hving been vacated were already noted by the Rent Clerk before the cheques were drawn. The Superintendent of of Accounts has been asked to state the reasons for overlooking these intimation and whether Rent Register on the authority of which cheques could be drawn was being kept upto date. Explanation is awaited.

- (19) Explanation of the Secretary, Schools Committee regarding payments made for cooking classes in two Gujarati Schools in excess of the amounts actually spent by Rs 103-8-6 as referred to in the last audit report is still not received.
- (20) In the Imprest Accounts of the Special Attendace Officer, Superintendent Aided Schools and Visual M.C.A.1820

4 1821 Instruction test checked in March 1941, the following kinds of irreglarities were noticed:

Imprest Account of the Special Attennance Officer.

- (1) Cash Box was not maintained and the Imprest amount of Rs. 30 was allowed to be kept with the clerk.
- (2) Sub-vouchers were not marked 'Original' and enfaced with stamp 'Paid from Imprest.'

Imprest Accounts of the Superintendent Aided Schools and Visual Instructions.

- (1) Balance in cash box including stamps was in excess by Rs. 5-13-0. The explanation of the clerk concerned was that stamps were purchased from his own money as on one or two occasions the key of the cash-box was forgotten by him at home and this money was not withdrawn from the Imprest.
- (2) Out of the advance of a sum of Rs. 2 was shown as with a peon who was on long leave. There was no acknowledgement from him for the same.
 - (3) No sub-voucher or receipt was obtained in one casé.
 - (4) The sub-vouchers were not marked as 'Original' and enfaced with stamp 'Paid from Imprest.'
 - (5) Payment of a sub-voucher was made without obtaining sanction of the Superintendent.
 - (6) Declaration of the expenses incurred was not obtained on a sub-voucher.

The Secretary replied that steps are taken to see that the irregularities do not occur again.

(21) A mistake of Rs. 5 in the total of a morning class pay-bill resulting in excess payment of Rs. 5 to

a Head Mistress of a School was noticed. The explanations of the employees who failed to
verify the paybill show that the burden of responsibility is shifted to one another. The
amount was subsequently refunded by the Head Mistress and necessary instructions have
been issued by the Secretary.

V.—Non-observance of Municipal Service Regulations,

- (1) A complete list of employees whose pay was not in the stages of their respective time scale of pay—

 M.C.A.828 asked for—as stated in the last audit report has since been received from the Secretary,

 Schools Committee and the matter is being pursued further.
- (2) Objection raised on the payments made to certain peons acting in leave vacancies for the period of wacation when the permanent incumbents were treated as on duty as mentioned in the last audit report has not been yet replied to by the Secretary, Schools Committee.
- (3) The case of a teacher who was drawing Rs. 51 in the un-trained teachers' grade of Rs. 40-1-65 and who was allowed to draw Rs. 52, i.e., a stage higher than his substantive pay after he was granted the 1st year trained teachers' grade of Rs. 50-1-60-2-70 as reported in the last audit report is still under objection.
- (4) The cases of two peons who were continued in service after the completion of 55 years of their age

 M.C.A.412

 referred to in the last audit report have been now reported to the Corporation as advised and are before the Establishment Sub-Committee of the Standing Committee vide Standing Committee's Resolution No. 584 dated the 24th July 1940.
- (5) The list of the employees who were on military duty and were paid their full salary for the period they were on military duty which was asked for from the Secretary. Schools Committee as stated in the last audit report, was submitted by him. It was however returned to him requesting him to ascertain from the military authorities the pay which the employees mentioned in the list might have received from the military authoritie while on military duty.

Reply is awaited.

(6) In contravention of the provisions of Municipal Service Regulations 97(d) and 96(b) (ii) two teachers

M.C.A.1378

were found granted leave on average pay in excess of the limit of eight months including vacation. As a result of the audit objection the leave on average pay granted in excess of eight months was converted into leave on half average pay under Schools Committee's Resolution No. 1144, dated the 13th November 1940 and recoveries of excess amounts paid were effected.

(7) A teacher who was arrested on 20th July 1940 in connection with certain fradulent transactions in the affairs of the Schools Committee's Employees' Co-operative Credit Bank was suspended on 8th August 1940 after obtaining the sanction of the Schools Committee under their Resolution No. 623 dated the 7th August 1940. Suspension in such cases should take place from the date of arrest as laid down in Municipal Service Regulation 63. The Secretary explained that the teacher was arrested and released on bail and had actually worked and was paid for until the orders of the Schools Committee for his suspension were obtained. The teacher should not have been taken on duty until the Court proceedings against him were terminated. The Secretary, was requested to place the matter before the Schools Committee to avoid such occurances in future. The Schools Committee have under their Resolution No. 277 dated the 14th May 1941 authorised the Secretary to suspend an employee as soon as he gets information of the arrest of an employee and subsequently report the matter to the Committee for confirmation.

(8) In several cases it was observed that while on earned leave the employees under the revised leave rules were allowed to draw their leave salary equal to their susbstantive pay instead of equal to average pay as laid down in Rule 12(1)(a) of the leave rules for new entrants. Attention of the Secretary, Schools Committee was already drawn in the year 1939 to the breach of this rule and he agreed to see that it was duly observed in future. However, cases of breaches continued and the Secretary, was again requested to take proper steps to avoid recurrence

20-4-1939 of such cases.

(9) A clerk in the Schools Committee's Office was paid an allowance of Rs. 10 for doing the work of the local Committees during the period of his leave in addition to leave salary admissible under the Municipal Service Regulations. The Secretary was advised to see that in future no Municipal Servant should be allowed to work in any capacity and draw any such allowance while on leave

(10) A peon in Marathi School was on military duty and acting arrangement was made in his place. An employee on military service is treated as not on leave but on duty and two persons cannot be attached to one post at the same time. Audit reference was made and the matter was regularised by the creation of a temporary post under the Schools Committee's Resolution No. 246 dated the 14th May 1941.

The Schools Committee had under their resolution No. 1831 dated the 22nd March 1941 sanctioned Secretary's proposal to adjust the salary of a teacher on the basis of aggregate service rendered by him on the ground that the breaks in his service were teated as leave without pay by the Schools Committee. There is no provision in the Municipal Service Regulations for condoning the breaks in service of a Municipal employee for the purpose of fixing his salary on the basis of total length of service including the periods of service prior to breaks. The Corporation have also passed orders in similar cases disallowing such service being counted for fixing the pay under their Resolution No. 207 dated the 11th June 1940. The matter was reported to the Standing Committee (vide letter No. M.C.A./1862-II, dated the 3rd April 1941 underlying their Resolution No. 55 dated the 9th April 1941) for requesting the Schools Committee to reconsider the case and they have accordingly resceinded their previous orders under the Schools Committee's Resolution No. 287 dated the 14th May 1941.

VI. General.

(1) (a) Slates worth Rs. 496 were purchased by the Special Attendance Officer without inviting quotations and without obtaining Committee's approval for rates at which they were purchased.

(b) A sum of Rs. 1,250 was advanced to the Supervisor Handicrafts on 28th March 1940 by debiting the grant to carry out repairs to the Schools furniture. It is not correct to debit grants at the fag end of the year by giving advance for expenditure to be incurred in the next year. Besides this technical question another objectionable feature is that the spending officers are entrusted with advances to incur expenditure and make payments themselves instead of calling from them the proposals for sanction after inviting quotations and making payments of the bills direct from office after the work is executed and bills are duly certified by the spending officers. The spending officers should have no hand in making such payments.

No reply is yet received to the audit reference in this matter.

(2) An amount of Rs. 2,620 was paid to the Assistant Organizing Commissioner Municipal Boy Scouts for making payments to the Scout and Cub Masters. This amount remained in cash with him for about 18 days before disbursement. The Secretary explained that it took time to disburse the amount after giving intimations and fixing date convenient to all the teachers. Such large amounts should not be allowed to remain with any individual officer. The date of payment should be fixed first and intimated to all the teachers and then on the date so fixed payments may be made to the disbursing officer. This has been noted for future guidance by the Secretary, Schools Committee.

- (3) (a) As reported in the last audit report some of the special teachers were being paid allowances during vacation and some were not. The Secretary was requested to place this irregularity before the Schools Committee for doing the needful. No reply has yet been received.
- (b) Three special teachers on Marathi Boys' Side who were not paid the allowance of Rs. 10 per month during the vacation of 1939 were allowed to draw it during vacation of 1940. Secretary's explanation is awaited.
- (c) During the year under report, the Boy-Scout and Girl Guide Organisers were not paid the allowance for May 1940 but were allowed to draw it for the remaining part of the vacation. The Secretary has been asked to state the authority who decided the payment.
- (4) Bai Jivkore Lallubhai Scholarship and Prize Fund.—As per the terms of the donation the balance after making provision for the scholarships and prizes is to be credited to the corpus of the fund. This was not being done as stated in the last audit report. The Secretary has been asked to place the matter in order.
 - (5) No reply is still received for the reference in respect of wanting receipts for certain vouchers.

(6) The work of removing school furniture from one builing to another or from stores to the Schools

M.C.A.1381 was being entrusted by the Schools Committee to a private agency. The bills for such removals during 1939-40 came to a sum of Rs. 1,751-6-0.

It was suggested that the work should be entrusted to the Transport Section of the Mechanical Engineer's Department which maintains necessary staff for such Municipal work.

The Schools Committee have under their Resolution No. 218 dated the 7th May 1941 left the work to be carried out by the private agency or through Mechanical Engineer at the discretion of the Secretary. It is hoped that all such work will in future be entrusted to the Municipal Department.

- M.C.A.1431 coolies to seven different schools although no furniture was removed by his men, the same having been already removed previously. The Secretary, Schools Committee has been requested to state the circumstances under which order for removing furniture was given to the contractor when the same was already removed and the person responsible for this extra cost to the Municipality Reply is awaited.
 - (8) In two cases the total charges for the same works were spilit into small amounts of less than Rs. 20

 M.C.A.1384

 and sanctioned by the Secretary. It was pointed out to the Secretary, Schools Committee that as the amount spent on each group exceeded Rs. 20 Committee's sanction was necessary which was subsequently obtained under Resolution No. 354 dated the 11th June 1941.
 - (9) No recurring charges register for payments of bills of recurring nature, such as electricity charges paid to landlords, telephone charges, monthly contingencies paid to libraries etc. was being maintained to guard against a claim being paid second time. On a reference being made the same has since been introduced.
 - (10) A sum of Rs. 300 on account of assessment bills in respect of rented schools premises was adjusted by debit to deposit account although the rent of the premises was not charged to grant and credited to deposit account. Nothing can be paid by debit to deposit account unless there is corresponding credit to that account. This was set right after audit reference was made.

The irregular mode of debiting the deposit account without ascertaining the amount standing to the credit of that account was due to not maintaining a proper Deposit Register. A new Deposit Register has been introduced only recently at the instance of audit. Even this Register is not being maintained properly in the following respects:—

- (i) All the previous deposits are not copied out.
- (ii) No columns are provided for amounts refunded or adjusted.
- (iii) Except the deposits from contractors no other deposits are entered therein.
- (iv) It requires to be maintained in sections for different kinds of deposits such as (a) deposits from contractors; (b) unclaimed rents deposits; (c) deposits regarding court attachements and (d) miscellaneous deposits etc.
- (v) Certificates of the existence of deposits on the refund vouchers are given without referring to the
- (vi) It is not reconciled with the ledger for opening and closing balances which are obviously incorrect as some of the previous deposits are not copied out therein.
- (11) A number of irregularities were noticed in the accounts rendered by the officers against the amounts

 advanced to them as given below:—

(i) Sub-vouchers were not enfaced 'Paid.'

(ii) Account rendered in one case was less than the amount advanced by Rs. 3.

(iii) Bills produced as paid were not receipted by the parties in two cases. (iv) Amounts received back as unexpended balances which should have been credited to proper heads of account were kept under deposit.

Needful was got done in these cases.

(12) Receipts for some payments made from July 1940 to November 1940 were not attached to the respective vouchers. A register of such payments made pending receipts was suggested to be M.C.A.1742 introduced in order to watch receipts. No reply is yet received. 7-3-1941

(13) Electric bill of Dadabhoy Nowroji School and Library taken over by the Schools Committee was preferred by the B. E. S. T. Company in the name of a teacher who was sub-tenant in the said premises and was paid by th School Committee's Office. The bill included Government M.C.A.1781 19-3-1941 electricity duty from which the Schools premises are exempt. Moreover proportionate charges for the electric energy consumed by the sub-tenant were also not recovered from him. The Secretary has been requested to do the needful. No reply is yet received.

(14) On reconciling the bank balances with the cash book as on 30th June 1940 it was observed that cheques to the extent of Rs. 3,128-12-6 were drawn without bank balnce. The Secretary M.C.A.1317 explained that the cheques represented charges for April and May 1940 which were not likely to be issued then. The office was aware of short balance in the bank account and steps were taken to replenish the same before the outstanding cheques were issued. Attention of the Chairman, Schools Committee was drawn to this with a request that a statement of available bank balance may be called over at the time of signing cheques as it was always safer to draw cheques only to the extent of available bank balance.

(15) In several cases amounts were found debited to incorrect heads of accounts and M.C.A.1379 were got rectified. 17-9-1940 M.C.A.1423 2-10-1940 M.C.A.1083 4-5-1940 M.C.A.1526 27-11-1940

(16) Sanction of the Schools Committee was obtained by the Secretary for payment of scholarships to the pupils during the year 1940-41 under their Resolution Nos. 1331 dated the 18th Decem M.C.A.1779 ber 1940 and 1448 dated the 22nd January 1941. The sanctioned amount was in excess 19-3-1941 of the available balance in the grant. The Secretary being asked stated that the suggestion to restrict the proposals for the Committee's sanction to the balance available in the sanctioned budget grant was noted for future guidance.

However the office of the Secretary allowed excess expenditure to be incurred under the grant while making payments on 26th March 1941. The Secretary has been requested to place this before the Schools Committee.

(17) Under the Schools Committee's Resolution No 514, dated the 17th July 1940 a conveyance allowance of Rs. 20 was sanctioned to be paid to a clerk under the Superintendent Aided Schools M.C.A.1545 for four months only in a year. In the revised budget estimates for 1940-41 the provision for £12_1940 payment of this allowance was made for seven months. Again in the budget estimates for 1941-42 the provision for conveyance allowance for the staff under Superintendent Aided Schools was made in excess by Rs. 590 than the amount sanctioned by the Schools Committee. The Secretary has been asked to state the authority under which the increased provision for allowances had been made. Reply is awited.

It would be strongly advisable not to include any charges which are not specifically sanctioned in the budget or in the revised budget except in cases of urgency which should be specifically brought to the notice of the Committee by special notes.

(18) Under Schools Committee's Resolution No. 1249 dated the 22nd February 1939 the expenditure on Training Classes was directed to be shown under a separate head 'Training Classes' M.C.A.1778 under A Schools with sub-heads showing different items of expenditure. However in the 19-3-1941 budget estimates for 1940-41 and 1941-42 no effect has been given to the orders passed by the Committee in this respect.

On a reference being made the Secretary replied that steps were being taken to maintain the account as suggested.

(19) The teacher in charge of printing press of the Schools Committee used to place order for binding and ruling and pay the bills direct from the imprest of Rs 100 with him. The Secretary M.C.A.1463 being asked stated that no quotations were being invited by the teacher before placing orders. 15-10-1940

During the last year such charges paid out of the imprest to private parties amounted to Rs. 855-10-0.

Reference was therefore made to the Test Audit Officer (Printing) through the Municipal Commissioner inquiring whether the Municipal Printing Press can not carry out such work as can not be done by the Schools Committee's Press as a result of which the Secretary, Schools Committee has been informed by the Municipal Commissioner that all such work may in future be sent to the Municipal Printing Press.

- (20) Teacher in charge of the Schools Committee's Printing Press who holds an imprest of Rs. 100

 M.C.A.1601
 for the purchase of press materials and also handles stores and materials of the press had not furnished any security. The Secretary has been requested to get a security fixed for this post.
- (21) Paper required for the Schools Committee's Printing Press was being purchased by the Teacher-in
 M.C.A.1822

 charge of the press as and when required and the bills for the supply were forwarded to the
 office of the Secretary for sanction of the Schools Committee and payment. Such bills
 amounting to Rs. 1,711-4-6 were paid during 1940-41 upto 13th February 1941. It has
 been pointed out to the Secretary, Schools Committee that under the Schools Committee's Resolution No. 232
 dated the 5th July 1933 articles reqired by the press are to be ordered, received and properly certified by his office.

He now states that no quotations were invited for the purchase of paper and assures that the same would be indented from the Municipal Contractor for press paper and instruction given by the Schools Committee in their aforesaid resolution would be followed.

- (22) For the advances given to the officers and Head Masters for contingent expenses, certificates from all the officials acknowledging the balances at the close of the year 1939-40 were not produced and balances tallied with the ledger balances.
- (i) There was a difference of Rs. 2-11-0 between the amount of advance as per ledger account and as per acknowledgements received from the Head Masters of Marathi Schools.
- (ii) A Head Master of a school who had given an acknowledgement of Rs. 6-8-0 as advance standing with him refunded Rs. 7 on amalgamation of his school with another school.
- (iii) The teacher-in-charge of the Printing Press did not acknowledge the advance of Rs. 20 which stood against his name in the ledger account. Attention of the Secretary was drawn to these irregularities. His explanation for the difference of Rs. 2-11-0 was that the amount was recovered in excess from the Provident Fund Claim of a Head Master who held the advance. This amount has since been transferred to deposit account. The excess of As. 8 refunded by the Head Master on amalgamation of the school has also been transferred to deposit account pending explanation of the Head Master which has been called for by the Secretary.

Regarding the fixed advance of Rs. 20 standing in the ledger account against the teacher-in-charge of the Printing Press, the Secretary explained that no advance was made to the teacher but the advance payment was booked through error to 'fixed advances to the officers'. The matter was placed before the Schools Committee who under their Resolution No. 1649 dated the 19th February 1941 sanctioned to write off the advance of Rs. 20 and referred the matter to their Finance and Establishment Sub-Committee to report the circumstances under which the anamoly had taken place. The result is awaited. The fixed advance of Rs. 20 has been wiped off by passing a journal entry debiting the grant for 1940-41. The voucher has been asked for.

Such discrepancies could have been avoided if acknowledgements of the officers had been called by the Department and tallied with the ledger balances.

 Tebruary 1941 and 1765 dated the 12th March 1941 to pay certain charges incurred during the year 1939-40 out of the grant for the year 1940-41 on the ground that the grant for the year 1939-40 had lapsed. Charges for the previous years cannot be debited to the budget grant for the current year. The Secretary, Schools Committee was therefore requested to place the matter before the Schools Committee and to take necessary measures to prevent recurrences of this type.
- (24) Some of the vouchers paid during February 1941 were found signed by the Acting Secretary

 M.C.A.1913 who took charge from 7th March 1941 instead of by the permanent Secretary who was then
 in charge. The balancing of cash book for February 1941 at the close of the month was also
 not signed by the Secretary. On a reference being made the Secretary explained that some
 of the vouchers passed and paid in February 1941 remained unsigned by the retiring Secretary owing to pressure
 of work which were subsequently signed by the acting Secretary and arrangements are being made to obtain
 the signature of the permanent Secretary on the balancing of the cash book for February 1941.

It is hardly necessary to say that the vouchers when signed become pay orders authorising the Cashier to make payments. The Secretary has been informed that in future no payments should be made unless the vouchers are duly signed by him.

Toom in the Schools Committee's Office has been debited to the Budget Grant for 'Auditor's Remuneration'

The Secretary, Schools Committee on being asked stated that privision was made for fan and light under that head and the amount was correctly debited to that grant. This shows that the Department pays little attention to the proper classification of budget provisions according to the nature of expenditure. The cost should have been debited to the grant under '8 Miscellaneous Expenses, the fan being an article of dead stock and entered in that Register.

(26) Out of the realizations of the Handi Craft articles placed in the exhibition held from 8th March

M.C.A.2029

1941 to 14th March 1941 a sum of Rs. 241-9-6 was paid into the office by the Handi Craft

Supervisor on 5th May1941, i.e., nearly 7 weeks after the close of the exhibition. His explanation was that he could not send this earlier as the accounts were not checked and he was otherwise busy in examination work. It is also learnt on enquiry that no list of the articles exhibited, articles sold and the articles left at the end is available and it is difficult to understand how the office of the Secretary can keep necessary check over the articles and their realizations in absence of such a list. Explanation in this matter is awaited. The Secretary should also see that in future no recoveries are allowed to remain in the hands of the Supervisor for more than 24 hours.

(27) Inspection on 3rd May 1941 of the cash book and other Registers for the year 1940-41 showed M.C.A.1980 various kinds of defects for which a separate report has been made to the Standing Committee under No. M.C.A.1980-II, dated the 7th May 1941 underlying Standing Committee's Resolution No. 186 dated the 14th May 1941.
