ADDENDUM

In paper No. XXXVI on page 69 of Section V—Property; *substitute* the following for "OMALŪR. In this district . . . at all [. . .]":—

They were all resumed by Haidar and have ever since been rented by the Brāhmins at about half their value, some rather more, others a little less. The three last are now fixed at half of the estimated rent, the two first from the scarcity of cultivators are considerably below it. A few of the Brāhmins have left Tappūr and Dāśasamudram, but those of the other villages are all present. Their having retained their former ināms so long on such favourable terms is to be ascribed to the influence of the Sarishtadār of Ōmalūr who held lands rent free in them all.

There are no inām or shrotri villages in Nangapalli.

In fixing the rents of all these villages which have been resumed either in whole or in part, I have in general rather been guided by my own opinion of what the amount ought to be than by accounts or by what was asserted to have been the custom of former times, for it is hardly possible to procure correct accounts of any of them because few of them have karnams appointed by the sarkar and because the kacheri people either by receiving money or by having shares in the lands were as much interested as the original ināmdārs in concealing every circumstance concerning their resumption and assessments and as to following precedent none could be drawn from the short period between 1784 and 1789 during which most of them were twice resumed. The greatest part of them are now assessed at about half the rent paid by ryots; one only is so high as ten-sixteenths while others are less than a quarter. These variations are occasioned by the different degrees of ability of the Brāhmins and by the plenty or scarcity of cultivators. All Brāhmins are in some measure ināmdārs for they seldom ever pay much above half the rent of other farmers. I have adopted this rate as the standard on the present occasion, for I have not considered the incumbents as entitled to any very particular indulgence merely because their lands were formerly inām. We meet in every district with lands at a low rent under the term of agrahāram, shrotriyam, etc., in the hands of Brāhmins but wherever the causes of such indulgence are thoroughly investigated they will almost always be found to originate either from bribery, from the revenue servants having relations among the ināmdārs or from their having a share of the lands. The greatest part of the ināms resumed by Haidar and Tipu have been long ago raised to the full rent. Those which are still below it, owe their exemption to some of the above causes, except the Swāmi villages which have no doubt been spared solely from motives of superstition.

It must have been at all times the practice to raise ināms when once escheated to the usual sarkar rent, for as all Hindu Princes were accustomed to give ināms; had they not assessed fully those which they resumed, the whole country would soon have been held either at a low quit-rent or in perfect inām."
