LUDHIANA AGENCY.

Miscellaneous Correspondence from 1816-1840.

1. The records of which this is a Press List are contained in Books 92-112, 115, 116, 126, 137, 138, 143 and 148. The receipts and issues are filed separately, but for convenience of reference they have been combined in the Press List and arranged chronologically.

2. The office of the Agent to the Governor-General was moved from Ludhiána to Karnál in October 1815.

3. In November 1816 Lieutenant W. Murray, Assistant to the Agent, Governor-General, was transferred to Ludhiána to look after the members of the Kábul Royal family and also hold charge of the Treasury, Abkari Mahál and Police, and from that date (November 1816) onwards there was an Agency at Ludhiána subordinate at first to the Political Agent at Ambála and later to the Agent to the Lieutenant-Governor and Resident at Delhi.

4. Lieutenant Murray held charge at Ludhiána until the 6th of April 1823, when he was transferred to Ambála as Deputy Superintendent of Sikh and Hill Affairs. Pending the arrival of Lieutenant C. M. Wade on the 29th June 1823 the Officer Commanding at Ludhiána held charge of the Agency.

5. In May 1827 Captain Wade was deputed on a complimentary mission to the Court of Maharaja Ranjit Singh. In June 1827 Captain Wade's designation was altered from that of Assistant Agent to the Governor-General, Ludhiána, to Political Assistant, Ludhiána. In October of the same year, in compliance with a wish expressed by Maharaja Ranjit Singh, the Political Assistant, Ludhiána, was placed in charge of the Labore Dependencies and made independent of the Political Agent, Ambála. On the 30th of July 1832 the designation of Captain Wade was altered from Political Assistant to Political Agent, Ludhiána. On the 27th October 1832 Captain Wade was deputed on a mission to Labore and Baháwalpur in connection with the opening of the navigation of the Indus and Sutlej. Lieutenant F. Mackeson held charge of the Ludhiána Agency. until the 12th November 1832, when he was relieved by Major R. C. Faithfull, 14th Native Infantry, Commanding at Ludhiána, who carried on the current duties until the return of Captain Wade on the 12th April 1833.

6. In December 1836 Captain Wade was deputed on special duty to Lahore to explain personally to the Maharaja the views of the British Government in regard to Sindh and concert measures for the adjustment of the differences between the Amirs and the Sikh Darbar. He returned to Ludhiána on the 29th April 1837. During this period Mr. G. Clerk, Political Agent, Ambála, held charge of the Ludhiána Agency in addition to his other duties.

7. In July 1838 the Political Agent of Ambála was charged with the control of the affairs of Ranjit Singh's Cis-Sutlej possessions, while the Political Agent, Ludhiána (Captain Wade) was entrusted with the management of all our relations with Maharaja Ranjit Singh of Lahore as regards the affairs of the Punjab and His Highness' possessions beyond the Indus. 8. In November 1838 Major C. M. Wade, Political Agent, Ludhiána, was deputed on special duty with Shahzada Taimur, son of Shah Shuja-ul-Mulk, whom he escorted to Kábul. Major Wade held the local rank of Lieutenant-Colonel and returned to Ludhiána on the 23rd November 1839 on the completion of his mission. Mr. G. Clerk, Political Agent, Ambála, held charge of Ludhiána during Major Wade's absence. Lieutenant-Colonel Wade was knighted in January 1840 and was transferred to Indore as Resident on the 1st of April 1840, being relieved by Mr. G. Clerk, who shortly after became Agent to the Governor-General for the Affairs of the Punjab and North-West Frontier.

9. It may be noted that Lieutenant F. Mackeson, 14th Native Infantry, was employed as an Assistant to the Political Agent, Ludhiána. He joined in October 1832, and accompanied Captain Wade on his mission to Lahore and Baháwalpur in connection with the opening of the navigation of the Indus and Sutlej. He was stationed at Baháwalpur for a time, and from 1835—1838 was the British Agent for the navigation of the Indus at Mithankot and other places. In August 1838 he was deputed to accompany Shahzada Taimur to Pesháwar. In April 1840 he was posted to Pesháwar as Political Agent.
