Correspondence of the Agent, Governor-General, North-West Frontier, and Resident, Lahore, with Government, Miscellaneous Correspondence and translations of Vernacular Correspondence, 1846—1847.

- 1. 'The records of which this is a Press List are contained in Books Nos. 171, 173-177, 183-189 and 192-194. The books containing letters received from Government from the 1st January to the 25th July 1846 and during the first half of 1847, and letters issued to Government from the 25th September 1847 to the end of the year are missing. receipts and issues are filed separately, but in the Press List they have been combined and arranged chronologically. As noted in the Preface to Volume VII, Major G. Broadfoot, C. B., the Agent to the Governor-General for the North-West Frontier, was killed at the battle of Ferozeshah on the 21st December 1845. The exact date on which Major H. M. Lawrence, who was appointed Agent to the Governor-General, North-West Frontier. in succession to Major Broadfoot, took charge does not appear from the correspondence, but Mr. F. Currie, Secretary to the Government of India, held charge temporarily until the arrival of Major Lawrence from Nepál. Major Lawrence's first letter from Lahore is dated the 23rd February 1846. The Treaty of Lahore was signed on the 9th March 1846 and the Supplementary Articles of Agreement on the 11th idem. The treaty inter alia provided for the cession in full sovereignty to the British Government of the territory lying between the Sutlej and Beas Rivers, while under the Articles of Agreement the Governor-General engaged to leave at Lahore until the close of the year 1846 a British Force for the purpose of protecting the person of the Maharaja and the inhabitants of the city of Lahore duringthe reorganization of the Sikh Army, the Darbar, on its part, agreeing to pay to the British Government all the extra expenses connected with the said force.
- 2. On the conclusion of the treaty Maharani Janda Kaur (alias Jindan), the mother of Maharaja Dalip Singh, was recognised as Regent of the State, with Raja Lal Singh as Executive Minister under the advice and direction of the Agent to the Governor-General, North-West-Frontier. Serving under the Agent were two Commissioners and Superintendents, viz., Major F. Mackeson, C.B., for the Cis-Sutlej Territory at Ferozepore, and Mr. J. Lawrence for the Trans-Sutlej Territory at Jullundur, as well as the Hon'ble Mr. J. C. Erskine as Sub-Commissioner in charge of the Protected Hill States at Simla. The districts constituting the Cis-Sutlej Territory were Kaithal, Ambála, Ludhiána, Wadni and Ferozepore, while those forming the Trans-Sutlej charge were Jullundur, Hoshiárpur and Kángra, with the Hill States lying west of the Sutlej. Under the Agent to the Governor-General were three officers appointed "for foreign affairs," viz., Captain J. Abbott, Captain A. Broome and Lieutenant J. Nicholson. No Gradation Lists of officers are traceable, but from the correspondence filed in the books detailed above it appears that the following officers were employed in the North-West Frontier Agency during 1846 in the capacities noted against their names:—
 - CAPTAIN S. A. ABBOTT, Deputy Commissioner and Political Assistant, Kaithal and Lidwa. Was also in charge of Boundary and Settlement duties.
 - CAPTAIN J. ABBOTT, Commissioner for the adjustment of the boundary between Jammu and British Territory. Lieutenant R. Young of the Engineers was his Assistant.

- Mr. G. Blunt, Collector and Magistrate of Aligarh, officiating temporarily as Commissioner of the Trans-Sutlej Territory, vice Mr. J. Lawrence on duty at Lahore.
- CAPTAIN A. BROOME, on special duty in Jammu instructing Maharaja Golab Singh's troops.
- Mr. G. Campbell, Officiating Deputy Commissioner of Kaithal and later of Wadni.
- Mr. G. J. Christian, employed as an Assistant in Ambála and Wadni. Deputed in September 1846 to complete Settlement work in Kulu and on his return employed in the office of the Agent, Governor-General, North-West Frontier, vice Lieutenant H. B. Edwardes.
- Mr. R. N. Cust, Assistant Agent, Governor-General, in January 1846; later Assistant Commissioner at Hoshiárpur.
- CAPTAIN J. F. DANIELL, Assistant Commissioner at Ferozepore.
- LIEUTENANT H. B. EDWARDES, Assistant Commissioner: deputed to Jammu in September 1846 with Lieutenant Wroughton.
- Mr. W. Ford, Deputy Commissioner, Ambála.
- Mr. H. H. Greathed, in charge of Wadni.
- LIEUTENANT E. LAKE, Kángra and Jammu.
- CAPTAIN W. LARKINS, Ludhiána.
- LIEUTENANT H. B. LUMSDEN accompanied Colonel H. Lawrence to Kashmir in October 1846. On return he was deputed to Hazára; then to Pesháwar.
- CAPTAIN C. E. MILLS, Assistant Agent, Governor-General, Ferozepore, and later Deputy Commissioner of Ambála, where he died in December 1846.
- Major G. H. Macgregor, Deputy Commissioner and Political Assistant in the Trans-Sutlej Territory, on duty at Lahore.
- LIEUTENANT J. NICHOLSON, on special duty in Jammu.
- Mr. H. Scorr, Assistant Commissioner at Ambála and Jullundur.
- Mr. P. Vans Agnew, Assistant Commissioner, Ferozepore: deputed with Captain A. Cunningham to settle boundaries with Kashmir. Returned and posted to Ferozepore.
- MR. H. VANSITTART, First Assistant Agent, Governor-General, Ambala; Deputy Commissioner, Jullundur, and Settlement Officer.
- MR. W. WYNYARD, in charge of Boundary and Settlement duties, cis Sutlej.
- 3. Major H. Lawrence was at or near Lahore from the 23rd February 1846 to the 26th April, when he left for Kángra. From thence he went about the middle of June to Simla, where he stayed till the 1st October. On the 16th October he left Lahore for Kashmir and returned before the end of November. Mr. J. Lawrence, Commissioner of the Trans-Sutlej Territory, carried on the duties of Agent to the Governor-General at Lahore, in addition to his own, from the 21st August to the end of November 1846.
- 4. The object of Major Lawrence's visit to Kashmir at the head of a Sikh Force was to secure the transfer of that Province to Maharaja Golab Singh, which the Governor, Shaikh Imam-ud-din, resisted by force of arms, pleading the orders of Raja Lal Singh in justification of his resistance. On the surrender of Shaikh Imam-ud-din a Court of Enquiry was held at Lahore, presided over by Mr. F. Currie, Secretary to the Government of India with the Governor-General, who had been specially deputed for the purpose. It was fully established that Shaikh Imam-ud-din had been instigated in his resistance by Raja Lal Singh. Lal Singh was deposed and exiled to British India, and at the solicitation of the Darbar a fresh treaty was concluded at Bhyrowál in December 1846, by which, during the minority of Maharaja Dalip Singh, a British officer with a staff of Assistants was appointed with full authority to direct and control affairs in every department of the State, which

were to be carried on by a Council of Regency. Further, a British Force was to remain at Lahore at the expense of the Darbar, and the British were to be at liberty to occupy any fort or position they thought advisable in the Sikh dominions.

5. Under orders dated the 26th December 1846, Lieutenant-Colonel H. M. Lawrence, C. B., was appointed Resident at Lahore, as well as Agent to the Governor-General for the North-West Frontier, with the following staff :-

One Chief Assistant (Mr. A. H. Cocks, C. S.).

Two Principal Assistants, one at Lahore (Major G. H. Macgregor) and the other at Pesháwar (Major G. St. P. Lawrence).

Three Assistants, one of whom was to command the Corps of Guides. The Assistants were Lieutenant H. B. Edwardes, Lieutenant H. Lumsden, Commanding the Guides, and Lieutenant J. Nicholson.

Two Extra Assistants, viz., Lieutenant R. G. Taylor and Mr. P. S. Melvill.

6. The arrangements for the administration of the territories, cis and trans Sutlej, were modified, the Commissioners and Superintendents of those territories being henceforward placed under the direct control of the Government of India instead of that of the Resident at Lahore, and being assisted by a staff of Deputy and Assistant Commissioners. The officers appointed were-

- 7. The Assistants to the Resident appear to have been employed as follows during the year 1847 :-
 - CAPTAIN J. ABBOTT, Commissioner for the settlement of boundaries and later in charge of Hazára.
 - Mr. L. B. Bowning, joined as an Extra Assistant to the Resident on the 13th May 1847; Pind Dádan Khan in November 1847.
 - Mr. A. H. Cocks, Chief Assistant: deputed to Jhang in October 1847.
 - LIEUTENANT H. B. EDWARDES, on deputation to Bannu Tank from 13th February to 27th May 1847, and again from 13th November 1847. In June 1847 he was Assistant to the Resident at Lahore.
 - LIEUTENANT H. B. LUMSDEN, Yusafzai, in command of the Guides.
 - LIEUTENANT J. NICHOLSON, deputed to Jhang, Multán and Dera Gházi Khan in March 1847 and the Sind-Ságar Doáb in June 1847: He was at Ráwalpindi in November 1847 and was ordered to make a settlement of the districts north of the Salt Range in the Sind-Ságar Doáb in the same month,

- LIEUTENANT F. R. POLLOCK, joined as an Extra Assistant to the Resident in November 1847.
- Mr. P. S. Melvill, joined as an Extra Assistant to the Resident in March 1847 and was deputed to Kashmir in August to assist Lieutenant R. G. Taylor.
- Lieutenant R. G. Taylor, joined in March 1847 as an Extra Assistant. Employed in Kashmir, Hazára and Pesháwar. Transferred to Bannu in November 1847.
- Mr. P. A. Vans Agnew, Hazára in March 1847: deputed to Gilgit in June 1847; in Kashmir in November 1847.
- 8. Lieutenant-Colonel H. Lawrence was absent at Simla from the 21st August to the 17th October 1847, during which period Mr. J. Lawrence, Commissioner and Superintendent of the Trans-Sutlej Territory, acted as Resident and Agent, Governor-General, North-West Frontier, at Lahore in addition to his other duties. On Colonel Lawrence's return, Mr. J. Lawrence remained at Lahore on special duty to help him in devising a scheme for the introduction of a Summary Settlement into the Punjab. Colonel Lawrence left Lahore on the 30th November 1847 on sick leave, making over charge to Mr. J. Lawrence, who officiated as Resident, Lahore, pending the arrival of his successor, Sir F. Currie, on the 6th March 1848.
- 9. Sir F. Currie was Secretary to the Government of India with the Governor-General until February 1847, being succeeded by Mr. H. M. Elliot.
