The Tables embody the changes made in the following Notifications of the Punjab Government :—

- (1) No. 994, dated 17th October 1901, constituting the Miánwáli and Isa Khel Tahsils of the Bannu District and the Bhakkar and Leiah Tahsils of the Dera Ismail Khan District into the District of Miánwáli.
- (2) No. 995, dated 17th October 1901, transferring the Attock Tahsil from the Hazára to the Ráwalpindi District.
- (3) No. 992, dated 17th October 1901, transferring 31 villages from the Dera Ismail Khan to the Dera Gházi Khan District.
- (4) No. 993, dated 17th October 1901, transferring 2 villages from Dera Ismail Khan to the Miánwáli District.

In all cases, unless otherwise stated, the figures for the Bannu District include the Tochi Valley Posts, and those for Dera Ismail Khan include the Post at Wána.

The data for Tables VII, VIII, X, XI, XII, XIV and XV are not available in the cases of the Biloch trans-Frontier and the Shiráni Country, therefore Tables VII, XII, XIV and XV exclude the populations of those tracts, but in Table VIII they are shown under ages not returned, in Table X under languages not returned, and in Table XI as born in the Punjab part unspecified. Further in the case of Table III details are not available for the Biloch trans-Frontier, and the total population only is shown in that Table.
