### APPENDIX A.

- Table V—Total, Presidency, of married females should be 4,013,857.  
 Table VI—MUHAMMADAN Females never married in Aden, age 25—29, should be 75.  
 " Jain Females widowed—The Presidency total for 50—59 period should be 6,377.  
 Table VII—In the third foot-note on page 26—for "in Appendix C" read "at the end of Volume I."  
 Table XII-B—In BOMBAY CITY 158 cowdung-fuel sellers and 30 charcoal sellers should be subtracted from Order XV, Sub-order 2, and entered respectively under Order XIII, Sub-order 1, and Order XIV, Sub-order 2. In Hyderabad one preparer of gourd-flots shown as a diver, under Order VII, Sub-order 4, should be entered in Order X, Sub-order 5.
