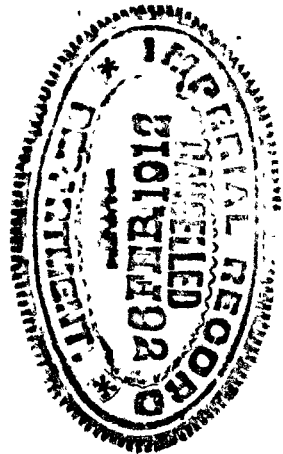

## N O T E.

The *Gazetteer* of the Gujrát District was prepared in 1881-83 by Mr. Ibbetson, B.C.S. The materials used in its preparation were Captain Mackenzie's Report on the Regular Settlement of the Gujrát District, Captain Waterfield's Report on the Revised Settlement, Census Report of 1881, Annual Departmental Reports on the Gujrát District, and notes furnished by the district authorities. The present work has been prepared, in accordance with orders contained in Punjab Revenue Circulars, on the completion of the Second Revision of Settlement. Statistics have, as far as they were available, been brought up to date and the new figures introduced have mainly been taken from the Census Report 1891, or from the official district returns.
