APPENDIX.**Comparison of Forest Duty**

paid by Messrs. The Bombay Burma Trading Corporation, Limited, with amount paid by Messrs. MacGregor & Co.

Extracts from Forest Administration Reports of Burma for 1893-94. See page 8 of Pegu Circle, page 16 of Eastern Circle and pages 13 and 15 of Western Circle.

Messrs. MacGregor & Co. paid Duty on :—

14,448 logs measuring	Tons 18,583—20 c. ft.

Messrs. The Bombay Burma Trading Corporation paid Duty on :—

If the Corporation had had to pay the same duty as Messrs. MacGregor & Co. on the above logs the amount of the duty would be	Rs. 32,36,691

Now if this loss be taken on above basis for 8 years, say to end of Pyinmana Forest Leases, this would show a loss of Forest Duty of Rs. 1,44,93,128

If the Forest Department had worked the *Pyinmana* Forests on their own account the net profits would have been during the 6 years of 1889-90 to 1894-95 say tons 445,930 (estimated net value of logs after deducting all expenses of extraction from Forest to Rangoon Depot) at Rs. 45 per ton ... Rs. 2,00,66,850
