DHARWAR

Area.—In 1885 an area of 68 square miles was transferred from the Badami taluka of the Bijapur district to the Ron taluka of this district. Important Public Works.—The Southern Maratha Railway, which runs through the district dividing into two branches at Hubli, was opened between 1884-86. One branch connects Poona and Bangalore, from which a second runs north from Hubli to Hotgi through Gadag and Bijapur. In 1910-11 there were 272 miles of metalled road and 539 miles of road suitable for fair weather traffic in the district. The

Factories.—In 1921 there were three cotton spinning and weaving mills with an average number of 2,037 hands employed daily, working 60,484 spindles and 514 looms. Besides these, there were in the district 78 cotton ginning, cleaning and pressing factories and a Railway workshop at Hubli.

Famine.—In 1891-92 there was slight scarcity in the district, which was tided over without recourse to elaborate measures of relief. Partial famine occurred in 1896-97, mainly due to failure of crops in the affected tracts, from the want of seasonable rain. The area affected was 857 square miles. Relief works were opened and continued for 14 months. The maximum daily average number relieved was 4,444 in September. Slight scarcity in 1899-1900 led to the opening of relief works, but they were practically unattended, only 256 persons being employed at the worst season. In 1900-1901, 357 square miles were slightly affected. Relief works were opened in February with a daily average of 360 workers, which rose to 1,892 in May. The number gratuitously relieved was 171 in April 1901. Since then the district has remained unaffected by famine.

Plague.—The first outbreak of plague occurred in the city of Hubli in November 1897, and the infection spread with rapidity. Throughout September, October, November and December 1898, the Dharwar district suffered from the severest epidemic recorded since the beginning of plague in September 1896. The infection was carried to Gadag in November 1898, over 320 places being affected by the epidemic. The district suffered very severely from 1901 to 1905; thereafter followed a period of comparative quiescence until in 1911-12 there was a most disastrous recrudescence of the epidemic.

The full revised rates came into force in 1902-03. Of the total area of 44,660 acres, 1,140 acres are forest land and 3,716 unarable. Unskilled labourers are paid annas 4 per diem and skilled artizans 8 annas ordinarily. The only village in the State where there is forest is Mulkeri, covering an area of 1,140 acres. The forest produce consists of bamboos and grazing, yielding an annual income not exceeding Rs. 300.

Trade.—There is no trade of any importance in the limits of the State. The only industry existing in the State is that of weaving coarse cloth, blankets, *lugdas* and *khans*. Cotton and especially *pan* leaves constitute the chief exports. The traffic in *pan* leaves has assumed large proportions since the opening of the Southern Maratha Railway. They are exported to distant parts of India such as Karachi, Delhi and Lahore.

Famine and Plague.—In 1899-1900 the rainfall was deficient and the outturn of all crops very poor. The ryots of the State however benefited by being able to sell their old stocks of grain at high prices to meet the demand for export to the famine-stricken parts of the Presidency. In the subsequent two years the two villages Kalival and Shiddapur suffered from insufficient rain. In November 1898 plague first appeared in the village of Jekinkatti. Since then the mortality from plague in the State has been —

Thus during 23 years it has carried off over 5505 persons or 16 per cent. of the population.

General.—There is no military force in the State. The State Police consists of 45 men and officers. The force is armed with 20 muzzle-loading rifles of the old pattern. There is a jail at Savanur with a daily average of 14·7 prisoners maintained at an annual cost of Rs. 1,751 in 1910-11. There is one municipal town, Savanur, with an annual income of Rs. 4,719, chiefly derived from a house-tax. The State has only one dispensary, at Savanur town, with a daily average attendance of 67·12 patients. The number of patients treated during the last 20 years was as follows :—
