## BELGAUM

**Area.**—The area of the district has increased from 4,612 to 4,613 square miles to accord with the measurement of the survey carried out in 1910-11 and 1920-21.

**Recent Surveys.**—The Re-revision Survey of which the rates were introduced between 1910-11 and 1920-21 shows an increase in the total cultivable area of 44,199 acres. By the revised settlement the total assessment on the Government occupied land was raised by Rs. 2,27,548 from Rs. 11,17,225 to Rs. 13,44,773 equal to an increase of more than 11 per cent.

**Important Public Works.**—The West Deccan section of the Madras and Southern Maratha Railway crossing the district from north to south was opened in the year 1887. The line passes through the Khanapur, Belgaum, Chikodi, Gokak and Athni Talukas. At Londa the West Deccan section connects with the lines to Bangalore and Marmagao. In 1910—1920-21 there were 566 miles of metal road and miles of road suitable for fair weather traffic in the district. The new roads and works of importance constructed since 1875 are as follows :—

**Factories.**—There is a cotton mill in the district situated at Gokak with 2,829 operatives. The number of spindles in 1922 was 70,468 and the paid up capital Rs. 39,07,400. There are 21 cotton ginning factories, in 7 of which pressing work is done in addition, and one match factory of less importance. In each of these the operatives number less than 100.

**Famine.**—In 1891-92 there was slight scarcity in Belgaum which was easily tided over without recourse to elaborate measures of relief. Famine occurred in 1896-97, mainly due to failure of crops from the want of seasonable rain. The area affected was 1,642 square miles. Relief works were opened and continued for 14 months. The maximum number of persons receiving relief reached 20,088 in September. In 1899-1900 the rains again failed and the district suffered from scarcity. The area affected was 1,642 square miles, and the crop outturn only 50 per cent. of normal. Relief works were opened, the workers numbering 1,538, and were continued till October 1902 with two intermediate breaks. The maximum daily average number relieved was 4,677, the number in receipt of gratuitous relief being a little over 1,000. Special relief was also given to weavers in their own craft during the famine. The death-rate in the district was 42·81 per mile. The total number of deaths from all causes on relief works was 25, of which 10 were due to dysentery and diarrhoea and 12 to cholera. The percentage proportion of sexes and children among the relief workers in the district was 34 men, 44 women and 22 children. The average wage per worker unit was Re. 0-1-7. In 1900-01 the same area was again affected. The highest number in aid of relief on this occasion was 26,922 in August, 5,876 being gratuitously relieved. The death-rate per mile was 52·09. In 1901-02 scarcity again occurred, the area affected being 1,152 square miles. The maximum number on relief works was 6,358, and 3,628 were gratuitously relieved. The death-rate was 64·26 per mile. In 1904-05 there was slight scarcity in Belgaum which was easily tided over without recourse to famine measures, though gratuitous relief was given to some extent. In the following year, 1905-06, famine re-occurred owing to the premature cessation of the earlier and the almost complete failure of the late rains. The area affected was 1,862 square miles. The maximum number on relief works was 9,375, and 5,566 were gratuitously relieved. The death-rate was 28 per mile. In 1911-12, scarcity again occurred in Athni and Parashgad Talukas, the area affected being 1,214 square miles. The

daily average numbers gratuitously relieved were 66. In 1918-19 there was widespread and severe famine. The area actually affected was about 1,276 square miles consisting of the whole of Athni Taluka and parts of Chikodi, Gokak and Parasgad Talukas, where the existence of security was declared. In other parts the distress was met by distributing dole. The sufferings of the people were aggravated by the sudden rise of prices of food-stuffs due to the depreciation of money and the Great War. The daily average number gratuitously relieved was 2,528. There was again another severe famine in 1920-21, the area affected being 1,944 square miles. The daily average number gratuitously relieved was 3,275.

**Plague.**—The first case occurred on the 21st October 1897 in Kagwad village, the source of infection being probably an imported case from Satara. The City of Belgaum was soon attacked and the epidemic spread to Khanapur in January 1898, and soon after to the rest of the district. The deaths in the district up to the end of 1910-11 numbered over 1,83,000 or 11 per cent. of the total population. The district suffered severely between 1915-16 and 1917-18.
