“Recommendation in paragraph 12 of your letter 1894 of 8th July 1916, for levy of full old rates in Shahbandar division in present year, sanctioned. Orders on settlement reports will follow.”

RESOLUTION.—These papers relate to the revision settlement of the Shahbandar division of the Karachi district, comprising the four talukas of Mirpur Bathoro, Sujawal, Shahbandar and Jati. The reports of the Assistant Settlement Officer, Rao Bahadur Asardas Motaram, are very complete and have been fully summarised by the Collector of Karachi and criticised in detail by the Commissioner in Sind.

2. The grouping and the rice and other rates recommended by the Commissioner are sanctioned. The appended statement shows the rates sanctioned by Government.

3. The Assistant Settlement Officer's proposals regarding the enhancement in the four talukas of the maximum rates of the rebate allowance on account of karia clearance from annas 4 and 3 per acre to annas '6 and 4, respectively, for lift and flow, which are supported by the Collector and Commissioner, are approved.

4. Sanction is accorded to the Commissioner's recommendation in respect of the bhal dehs in Shahbandar, *viz.*, that the four bhal dehs (Bablo, Padwari, Takro and Batri) should be surveyed as soon as funds are available for the work, the assessment being levied by bighoti measurement till the survey is made, that in the remaining three dehs (Nind, Joshevare and Kalikot) the paka land should be similarly surveyed as soon as is feasible, while in the kacha land all makans and holdings should be roughly demarcated and all land-marks shown with a view to a regular survey later, and that in no case should leases be renewed.

5. Sanction has already been conveyed to the levy during the current year of the full old rates as recommended by the Commissioner.

6. The revised rates should be introduced during the current revenue year 1916-17, levied in and from the revenue year 1917-18 and guaranteed for a period of twenty years.

7. The petitions of objections do not disclose any grounds which would lead Government to modify the orders now passed.

8. The commendation of Government should be conveyed to Rao Bahadur Asardas Motaram for his meritorious reports.
