WE, the Irish Land Commissioners, beg to submit to your Excellency this Report of our proceedings during the period from the 1st April, 1909, to the 31st March, 1910.

#### JUDICIAL RENTS.

During the year under review there were four Legal and sixteen Lay Sub-Com-Assistant Commissioners formed into Four Sub-Commission Courts at work in dealing missions, with applications to fix fair rents.

The number of Originating Notices to fix Fair Rents disposed of, during the period Fair rent stated, by the Commissioners as a Court of first instance, principally on consent, was 155; applications by the Sub-Commissions, 3,290, making for the Land Commission a total of 3,445; and disposed of 1, 17. by the Civil Bill Courts, as appears by returns furnished by the Clerks of the Peace, 242.

11, 23. These figures are divided as follows:—

For a First Statutory Term.—By the Commissioners, 79; by the Sub-Commissions, 1,616, total Land Commission, 1,695; by the Civil Bill Courts, 144, making a total of 1,839 cases in all.

For a Second Statutory Term.—By the Commissioners, 76; by the Sub-Commissions, 1,674, total Land Commission, 1,750; and by the Civil Bill Courts, 98, making a total of 1,848 cases in all.

The entire number of such applications disposed of both by Land Commission and Civil Bill Courts from the date of the passing of the Land Law (Ireland) Act, 1881, to the 31st March, 1910, was as follows:—For a first statutory term, 289,351; and for a second statutory term, 107,400; total, 396,751.

2,342 direct applications were made to the Land Commission to fix Fair Rents since 1st April, 1909, of which 1,187 were for a first statutory term, and 1,155 were for a second statutory term. In the same period 358 applications were made to the Civil Bill Courts, of which 130 were transferred to the Land Commission. Of the 358 applications so made to the Civil Bill Courts there were 216 first statutory term applications, and 142 applications were made for a second statutory term; of these 69 first term and 61 second term applications were transferred to the Land Commission in the year. Thus, during the year, 2,700 applications to fix Fair Rents were made to the Land Commission and the Civil Bill Courts.

Judicial rents have been fixed during the year by the Land Commission on the reports Valuers' of Court Valuers in 5 cases for a first statutory term, making a total of 2,214 of such cases in which judicial rents were so fixed up to the 31st of March, 1910; and judicial rents were similarly fixed in 3 cases for a second statutory term, making a total of 1,379 of such cases for a second statutory term up to the 31st of March, 1910. These figures include cases where the proceedings to fix rents on the reports of Court Valuers were taken under our Rules of the 9th November, 1898.

During the year the number of leaseholders who applied under the provisions of the Land Law (Ireland) Act, 1887, direct to the Land Commission was 23, and to the Civil Bill Courts 7; 7 applications were also made to the latter Courts during the same period to fix judicial rents in cases where ejectments were pending pursuant to the provisions of sec. 6 of the Act referred to. There were also 26 applications under the Redemption of Rent (Ireland) Act, 1891, which during the year fell to be dealt with under the Land Law Acts.

The total number of fair rent applications from leaseholders and grantees who have applied under the provisions of the Act of 1887, and under the Redemption of Rent (Ireland) Act, 1891, up to the 31st March, 1910, is 37,173, and of these applications 36,812 have been disposed of.

Under Section 65 of the Irish Land Act, 1909, certain classes of future tenants became entitled to apply to have fair rents fixed on their holdings as if they were present We issued our Provisional Rules under this Section on the 16th December, tenants.

In 185 cases the landlord consented to the redemption of the cases under rent. The total amount of the prices fixed in 98 cases, on 59 estates in which orders were Redemption made for redemption, was £110,129, in respect of a total rental of the holdings, as stated in the applications, of £7,365 3s. 11d., and the total advances sanctioned in respect of the prices so fixed was £98,394 Guaranteed Land Stock. Advances in cash under the Irish Land Act, 1903, amounting to £6,161, were sanctioned in 8 cases, the prices being fixed at £6,161 on a total rental of £331 6s. 3d. In 62 cases the applications for redemption were refused, and 17 cases had not been adjudicated upon at the 31st March last.

PROCEEDINGS UNDER THE LANDED ESTATES COURT ACT; SECTION 40, LAND LAW (IRELAND) ACT, 1896, AND SECTION 58 IRISH LAND ACT, 1903.

During the period from the passing of the Land Purchase Act of 1896 up to and Proceedings ending the 31st March last, 341 requests had been received from the Land Judge under under Sec. the 40th Section of that Act, and reports were made upon 340 of such requests, respecting 40 Land the prices at and the conditions under which the sales under the Land Purchase Acts of the holdings to the tenants on the estates referred to in the requests could properly be made.

In 9 of the estates in which the 340 reports were made the estates were subsequently bought by the Congested Districts Board for Ireland by means of advances which were made under Section 43 of the Act of 1896, or under Sections 72 and 77 of the Irish Land Act, 1903, and the proceedings in 42 estates were cancelled by the Land Judge. In 285 estates the Orders of the Land Judge directing offers to be made to the tenants on such estates were lodged, leaving 4 estates in which no such Orders had been lodged with us to 31st March last.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF PURCHASE MONEYS.

All Purchase Moneys advanced for the purchase of Estates coming within Sections 1-23 of the Irish Land Act, 1903, including the Purchase Money of Estates sold to the Congested Districts Board under Section 79 of the same Act, and of lands taken under the Evicted Tenants Act, 1907, are distributed by a Judicial Commissioner, and in other cases of Advances under the Act of 1903 by one of the other Commissioners. Where the land is sold in the Land Judge's Court, the Purchase Money is transferred to the Land Judge for distribution by him.

From the commencement of the Act of 1903 to the 31st March, 1910, Advances to Vendors were made by the Estates Commissioners to the amount of £34,023,462. Of this £1,410,417 was transferred to the Land Judge for distribution by him, leaving £32,613,045 for distribution by a Judicial Commissioner. Of this amount £30,107,162 was distributed within the period mentioned, together with £256,284, representing payments in cash by tenant purchasers as part of the Purchase Money, and payments out of the Land Purchase Aid Fund to the extent of £3,562,941. The amount of Advances made in other cases to the same date was £1,305,198, of which £803,887 was transferred to the Land Judge and of the residue £498,977 was distributed.

On the 1st instant, an examination of the respective figures showed that Advances had been made by the Estates Commissioners to the amount of £34,542,656, of which £1,410,417 was transferred to the Land Judge, leaving £33,132,239 for distribution by a Judicial Commissioner. Of this amount £31,399,855 has been distributed, together with £265,053 cash payments by Tenant Purchasers, and £3,666,707 from the Land Purchase Aid Fund, while the amount of Advances made in other cases to the same date was £1,315,604, of which £803,887 was transferred to the Land Judge, and of the residue £508,347 was distributed.

#### REFERENCES TO JUDICIAL COMMISSIONER IN LAND PURCHASE CASES.

Pursuant to Section 23 (1) of the Irish Land Act of 1903 any question of law may, if the Estates Commissioners think fit, and shall, on the application of any person interested, be referred for the decision of a Judicial Commissioner. In the twelve months under review 15 such questions were decided by the Judicial Commissioner, making a total of 106 decided in the period from 1st November, 1903, to 31st March, 1910.

# Appeals to the Judicial Commissioner under Section 2 (8) of the Evicted Tenants (Ireland) Act, 1907.

Appeals in 7 cases have been made to 31st March last under Sec. 2 (8) of the Evicted Tenants (Ireland) Act, 1907, which provides that any persons aggrieved by any determination of the Estates Commissioners fixing the price of the land proposed to be acquired under that Act may appeal to the Judicial Commissioner, who shall hear in the prescribed manner and determine the appeal, in all of these cases the appeals had been determined by the 31st March last. In 2 of these cases the appeals to increase the prices fixed were dismissed, and in the remaining 5 cases the prices fixed were increased.

#### PAYMENT OF PURCHASERS' INSTALMENTS.

Payment Instalment Act of 1885 On the 1st November last, the total amount payable in respect of Advances under the Purchase Act of 1885 for the annuities which had then become due including arrears unpaid on that date, was £356,900, payable by 25,359 payers. Of this amount £344,030 had been paid on 31st March, 1910, by 23,987 payers, leaving £12,870 due by 1,372 purchasers. Of this sum £1,544 was due by 156 persons who owed more than one instalment. The £12,870 in arrear on the 31st March has been reduced to £4,020 due by 370 purchasers at the 1st instant. The yearly annuities payable by 25,347 purchasers under the Act of 1885 have matured for decennial revision pursuant to Section 25 of the Land Act of 1896.

With regard to the payment of the annuities payable under the Purchase of Land Act of 1891. Appendix Act, 1891, the amount receivable on the 1st November last, from 46,908 payers, was £505,536, as compared with 46,846 payers and £512,457 payable on 1st November, 1908, of this £492,866 had been paid on 31st March last, leaving £12,670 due by 1,714 purchasers. Of this sum £3,143 was due by 210 payers who owed more than one instalment. The £12,670 in arrear on the 31st March has, at the 1st instant, been reduced to £3,083 due by 308 payers. The yearly annuities payable by 19,973 purchasers under the Act of 1891 have matured for decennial revision pursuant to Section 25 of the Act of 1896.

Dealing with the payment of the annuities payable under the Irish Land Act, Act of 1903. 1903, the amount receivable on the 1st December last, from 76,048 payers was £951,338 as compared with 60,549 payers and £734,412 payable on 1st December, 1908, of this £933,673 had been paid on 31st March last, leaving £17,665 due by 2,456 purchasers. Of this sum £3,886 was due by 220 payers, who owed more than one instalment. The £17,665 in arrear on the 31st March has, at the 1st instant, been reduced to £4,588 due by 587 payers. In addition to the above £35,658 was collectible in respect of advances made to District Councils under the Labourers (Ireland) Act, 1906, all of which was collected.

In the Appendix will be found a Return giving particulars of all cases under the Cases in Land Purchase Acts, 1891 to 1903, where on the 31st March last, the payers owed two default. or more half-yearly instalments and where same were unpaid on the 1st instant.

The holdings of 203 purchasers under the Land Purchase Acts who were in default in payment of their instalments were advertised for sale during the year. In 142 of such cases the sales were withdrawn, the arrears having been paid; in 41 cases the holdings were sold to ordinary purchasers, and in 20 cases where there was no bidding at the sale the Land Commission have instituted proceedings to take possession of the holdings pending resale. In 15 of such cases, where possession was taken, the holdings were on 31st March last still in hands for resale.

#### INTEREST IN LIEU OF RENT.

During the year ended the 31st March last the total amount of Interest in lieu of rent collectible under the provisions of the 35th Section of the Purchase of Land (Ireland) Act, 1896, was £1,815,477 from 157,813 tenant purchasers, together with £42,263 arrears due by 6,047 payers from the previous year, making £1,857,740 in all, as compared with £1,608,517 (including arrears) from 165,991 payers in the previous year. Of this £1,815,759 was collected by the 31st March last, leaving an arrear of £41,980 due by some 5,294 payers. This figure has, at the 1st instant, been reduced to £19,063 due by 2,073 payers. The amount so collected was paid out to the persons entitled to receive it as rapidly as possible on its receipt.

#### LOCAL REGISTRATION OF TITLE (IRELAND) ACT, 1891.

Notices in the prescribed form were, pursuant to the provisions of Section 23 (1) (b) Current of the above Act, lodged with the Registering Authority during the year for the cases. purpose of having the titles of the tenant purchasers registered in all cases where the advances in aid of purchase were made in the year.

2,808 copies of Land Certificates, exclusive of copies "written up," were issued in the year free of charge to the Registered owners or their solicitors.

#### TEMPORALITIES OF LATE ESTABLISHED CHURCH.

In 3,323 cases covering an Annual Tithe Rentcharge of £17,370, the Statutory Declarations required had not been received from the Payers, or the queries issued upon their applications had not been discharged up to the 31st March, last.

Declarations have been received in about 8,000 cases from Tithe Annuity Payers

in support of their claims under the provisions of Section 1.

As has been stated in previous Reports the Perpetuity Rents payable to the Commissioners which numbered 779, and amounted to £49,626 14s. at the 22nd August, 1884, were reduced under the provisions of Section 90 of the Irish Land Act, 1903, from 1st November, 1903, by the applicable percentage as certified in the Dublin Gazette of 26th October, 1900. The reduction amounted altogether to £11,347 15s. 2d., or 22.86 per cent.

Arrears.

Decrease of liability since 1881.

By payments made since the property vested, the total liability inclusive of charges imposed by the legislature since 1881, has been reduced to £3,250,000 as against

The annuity of £20,000 ceased to be payable to the Royal University on the 1st July, 1909, and from that date one moiety thereof has been paid to the National University at Dublin, and the other moiety to the Queen's University at Belfast (8 Edw.


