This volume, of which the present is the third issue, has taken the place of two publications which until 1893 were issued annually by the Government of India. These were the "Finance and Revenue Accounts and Miscellaneous Statistics relating to the Finances of British India, Part III," of which the 15th and last issue was published in 1893, and the "Statistical Tables relating to British India," of which the 17th and last issue was also published in 1893.

The present issue contains, in addition to all the features of the second issue, a new section (Part II of the volume) shewing for twenty years the revenue and expenditure of the Empire under the prescribed heads of account.

A new table has also been inserted in Part V, Excise (No. 17).
