NOTICE

To the present issue of the volume of Financial and Commercial Statistics, the undermentioned additions have been made—

- (1) Five tables (Nos. 3—7) have been added to Section I—Area and population—stating the number of towns, villages, and houses, and particulars of the population classified according to sex, age, religion, and occupation, the figures being taken from the final tables of the Census of 1901. Similar tables relating to the Census of 1891 were last published in the seventh issue of this volume.
- (2) A supplementary table (No. 5—A) shewing the rates of countervailing and additional special duties levied on imported bounty-fed sugar under various Acts passed since 1899, has been inserted in Section VI—Customs Revenue.
- (3) Two detailed tables (Nos. 5 and 6) have been added to Section VIII—Income Tax—stating the number of assessees and the collections under parts II (Profits of Companies) and IV (other sources of income) of Schedule II to the Income Tax Act II of 1886.
- (4) A Supplementary table (No. 5—A) shewing the value of coins other than Government of India rupees received into the mints for recoinage since 1869-70, has been added to Section XV—Mint and Coinage.

Figures for the two years, 1902-03 and 1903-04, have been compiled and inserted in the Sections VII—Stamps, X—Telegraph, XI—Post Office, XIII—Savings Bank, XXIX—Joint Stock Companies, and XXX—Foreign trade and Shipping.
