AGRICULTURAL SEED

The agricultural seed sold in Vermont in 1934 was of good quality comparing well with that sold during most of the years since the seed law first went into effect in 1913. Almost 700 samples were tested. Their quality was excellent, only four being deficient in respect to purity and 30 deficient in respect to viability.

It is evident that good seed may be purchased. The discriminating farmer should be sure that the seed he buys is properly labeled and that its purity and germination guaranties are high.
